President's Report

The coldest part of our winter season is approaching this upcoming weekend, along with the first show of the new year in this part of the county! We are expecting quite a few in open as four of the youth in Ohio, and one from Michigan are moving to open! Now, that may not mean much in some parts of the country, but between these four exhibitors, they usually show at least 50-60 Dutch! Add that to the fact we normally have close to 100 Dutch in open at this show, and you have the makings of the start of some very nice sized showings of Dutch! These four not only bring with them some good numbers, but many Best and Best opposite wins from the youth NDS and ARBA Convention shows! I wish each of them much success as they move into the open division!

I have heard from several breeders who are having some trouble with their does raising babies this winter. That does not make a lot of sense due to the mild winter we have had until about the January 20. One would think that the mild winter would lead to a much better success rate, but not from what I have heard from some! I know I went through that the last two years, and it is mighty frustrating! First, you have the difficulty getting them bred, then when you do, you still have nothing to show for your efforts. This in one winter, when I surely can't complain!

I have lost some, but the conception rate has been good, and the litter survival has been good as well. I usually have plenty of empty pens this time of year, but those are few and far between now! For those of you who have had trouble, hang in there, spring is coming!

You will find that the Sweepstakes Standings are not only up to date, but the final results should be in this issue as well. **Now, please note, that while we say final, that does not mean that if you find that you have the incorrect number of shows that a correction cannot be made.** It simply means that we have reached the date that all show reports should have been in and processed. If you find an error, drop an email to Valerie notifying her of the error.

We (officers of the Board) have been having much discussion as how to handle some of the issues with our sweepstakes. Now, I don't want to steal the thunder of our Secretary, but here has been the problem.

We have a husband and wife who have a membership in the club paying the husband/wife fee. They usually show under one combined name such as Floppy and Mopsy Rabbit. However, some show reports come in listing them shown by Flopsy, instead of both Flopsy and Mopsy. So, how is the Sweeps chair to interpret this? Is she to think the show secretary erred, and list them as combined?

Or, is she to list them separately, because at one show, not only were there rabbits entered under Flopsy & Mopsy, but some under Flopsy, and some under Mopsy? Are they doing this to get legs and if so, how is the Sweeps chair to handle this?

The ADRC Secretary is addressing this in her column. Most likely the way it will be handled, will be that the member will have to notify us which way they want their points done. This only occurs with Husband/Wife, family and youth memberships. Keep in mind that if you show under one child's name one time, and under another the next, those points won't be combined. Be consistent in how you enter!

We are heading to Michigan twice this year for our National Dutch Show, and the ARBA Convention! The NDS is the last weekend in April, while the ARBA Convention is the middle of October. Both should be large showings of Dutch and are great opportunities to learn more about the Dutch breed. Please see information regarding these shows elsewhere in this issue.

This issue also contains the entire ADRC membership list (with email addresses!) The addition of the email should enable the membership to have better communications! This issue should also have a list welcoming those new members! We have become more proactive in our efforts to grow the membership! We are now sending out renewal notes from the ADRC office. We also will be sending an invitation to join to those nonmembers who show at our sanctioned shows! (If you forget when your membership expires - consult the mailing label of your DR.)

Around this time of year, I'm thinking about the breeders in the Midwest, or anyone that has the same weather conditions we have in January, and am wondering how in the world these does we have do what we want them to do when their biological clocks are saying, "hunker down, stay warm, and dream about the springtime, not being a mommy right now". It seems as if breeders across the states are experiencing difficulties with litters either not showing up or dying once they get here. We are working against Mother Nature so it takes diligence on our part as breeders to create an environment that stimulates the does to make those Dutch babies we all want. Even if one is fortunate enough to have a heated barn or breeding area, the amount of light the does get on a constant basis is also extremely important in pushing them

into breeding mode. The magical number is around 16 hours of artificial light daily. Whenever I have started this regimen, I've had positive results within a week with most does I've been wanting to get bred at that time.

Now, having live litters is another thing. This particular year has been a hard one for quite a few breeders I've talked with. The impact on the junior class may show this in April for NDS. When I would call Warren Wiltman from District 2 to ask if he's getting any babies, I would hear an exasperated laugh on the other end of the phone. Babies have been slow to show up in his barn. Melody Stremkowski, our webmaster, has also reported a slow start. And then when I talked with Kevin Hooper, he had trouble finding time to tattoo the 13 Tort junior bucks all ready to be separated. Kevin reported having a tremendous start to his year and was enjoying his full-to-the-brim nestboxes. As it usually happens, once March and April show up, the litters do as well, and any breeders that have been waiting for babies are back in business. It would sure be nice, though, if we could just start the business in a big way when we want it!

The beginning of January proved to be an interesting one for me. My husband and I went down to Florida for a week of golfing and some sun. At a show in our neck of the woods, I was talking with Erik Bengtson while he was judging, and mentioned that I was headed to Florida soon. Ironically, we were to be in the Sunshine State at the exact time the Florida Rabbit Breeders State Convention was to be held. After talking with Erik, who would be judging there, I tried to hatch a plan to somehow work a few hours visiting a Florida rabbit show in between hitting the ball around the golf course. In the end, the Norovirus visited my husband on the day of the show and I was told to go enjoy the convention and visit with some fellow rabbit breeders while he spent the day recovering.

The show was about an hour south of Orlando and the drive there was enjoyable as the temperatures continued to climb into the mid 80's. I found the building, went inside and immediately saw a bunch of guys I only get to see twice yearly, if even that, during our National Conventions. Anyone who knows Herb Kelso can attest to his smile being as big as his heart. He came and gave me a hug, and wanted to know if I brought rabbits all the way from Wisconsin for their show. Sorry Herb! No room with the clubs along! I also found Mr. Fred Mullinax, Mr. Dale Graberbauer, Mr. Ricky Wood, and Mr. Marv Cummings, all in a huddle watching Erik Bengtson judging. Of course, the stories and boasting of having "the good one" were also flying. They were having a great time being together and sharing their hobby. I had the opportunity to see some super junior torts with outstanding heads and type that Dale had and some very sharp, well colored grays from the Kelso barn. Talk about ring color! Fred had an outstanding black junior doe that has been burning up the show circuit near him and had won BOB honors at the first show that day. Marv's blues looked deep in color and had very good fur on them, something that was a feat with weather that gets to the extremes it does where these members live. And Ricky Wood, known for his rich

colored chocolates, had a Sr buck that not only caught the eye of judge Bengtson, but also those of the judges picking Best in Show. Ricky walked away with top honors with this buck that will make you stop in your tracks if he happens to be shown at NDS this spring. The 12 hour trip to the convention turned out to be worth it for Ricky!

I had a chance to talk with a few people about rabbit barns in the heat of the south. A common feature seemed to be very high ceilings with vents located along the peak. This effectively kept the hot air way above the rabbits and prevents it from building up down around where the rabbits were. The vents moved the hot and stale air out and kept the temperatures moderate most of the time. Sides were mostly all a heavier gauge wire and went up to the roof line, leaving a totally open sided building. This promoted good airflow and kept the unwanted critters on the outside. The rabbits seemed to adapt to this method of housing quite readily and stressed over the heat much like any other would in various parts of the country during the summer months.

One of the most intriguing things about this show was that there were no show remark cards used. There was only a control sheet much like what we have at NDS and ARBA conventions. When I talked with the show secretary, she said they had not used remark cards for so long that they did not miss them in the least. Finding someone to donate their time writing became such an issue that this was the club's solution. It worked well and may be worth some smaller clubs looking into, especially if the show is a pre-entry show as this one was.

One of the goals of the ADRC board of directors is to reach those non members that we see at the shows around the country. If you have the opportunity to talk with one of these exhibitors, encourage them to consider joining the club. Become familiar with who your director is in your district and introduce prospective members to them if you have the opportunity. We have a great group of people raising the Dutch rabbit and would love to have the "non" members become "new" members. It was nice to have some past members that had opted not to continue their membership rejoin our club back in Texas at ARBA. Glad to have you all with us!

As the 2007 show season starts up, good luck with planning litters and raising those babies. If you have some thoughts you'd like to share with the rest of the group that you think may be helpful, consider writing about it. If you are not comfortable with writing, then contact a director or someone that has had past articles to help put it down. If you have questions, consider sending them in for us to use in another DR where we can feature several different breeders comments.

Best of luck with your litters and hope to see many of you in Michigan this April!

HOW YOU ENTER YOUR RABBITS AFFECTS YOUR SWEEPSTAKES

Did you know that entering your rabbits differently at shows will affect your sweepstakes standings? For instance, we have a husband and wife, Dennis and Barb, most of the time they enter shows as Dennis and Barb together but they happened to enter at several shows as Dennis individually and Barb individually. They do this because they needed another exhibitor to get legs on their rabbits. By doing this they have now created 2 new exhibitors in the sweepstakes standings. They will receive credit for the year as Dennis and Barb together and also as Dennis individually and Barb individually. This could cost them the points they need for first place. This is why sometimes you may wonder why you don't get credit for the correct number of shows that you entered. Sweepstakes is calculated and credited to the exhibitor name entered.

Another example is children from the same family. By entering their rabbits together they will place higher in the

sweepstakes standings than if they enter all separately. Cody and Dan each take care of certain rabbits at home and also show those particular rabbits. Cody enters his own rabbits and Dan enters his own rabbits. They may end up 4th and 6th in the standings but if they would have entered their rabbits together as Cody and Dan they would have ended up 2nd in the standings. Yes, they will earn fewer legs for their rabbits if they show at shows where there are not enough exhibitors but what is more important legs or sweepstakes?

If you have a husband and wife membership or a family membership, please contact me and let me know how you will be entering your rabbits so that proper sweepstakes credit is given to you. Occasionally, show secretaries do take the easy route and just list the husband and not the wife. When you get your show results back, check and make sure that your exhibitor name is listed correctly. If it is not, please contact the sweepstakes chairperson and let them know that the show secretary made a mistake.

ADRC Board Meeting Fort Worth, TX October 29, 2006

The meeting was called to order by President Kevin Hooper at 5:18 p.m. Directors present: Kevin Hooper, Sue Hill, Warren Wiltman, Bob Bergene, Pete Nelson, Jill Pfaff, and Dick Gehr. Dick had to step out several times due to commitments at the ARBA booth. Committee reps present: Val Worzella (sweepstakes), Angie Aisbet (publicity), Theresa Kortbein (elections) and Scott Williamson (judge selection).

A motion was made by Sue Hill and seconded by Bob Bergene to dispense with the reading of the minutes. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Jill Pfaff and seconded by Warren Wiltman to approved the treasurer's report as given. Motion carried.

Committee reports:

Website: Kevin Hooper read Melody Stremkowski's report, who noted there was alot of business now being conducted through the website. There are now 19 states represented on the breeder advertising list. ARBA continues to be the largest avenue for referrals. The online store is up and running. Scholarship information is now listed. Membership will at some point be accessible online.

Publicity: Angie brought her computer and scanner with her. She is planning on new items for next year and is asking for other ideas. She would like to tie in some ideas with both conventions being held in MI this next year. She is interested in ideas for a newer, fresher logo to have on clothing and other items.

Standards committee: Jill Pfaff reports the group has not yet met at the Fort Worth convention yet. There has not been much new info to present to the membership at this time.

Sweepstakes: Val Worzella reports she is inputting July results now. She stated doing the updated membership listing is very time consuming as she has to redo results at times. A concern from Val is the time it takes to update the website. She said it takes two days to run the report. Kevin noted that Barb is already working on getting monthly updates to membership. There continues to be delays with mailings going to the past two secretaries. Val (How about "We"as this was what Barb and I wanted, not Val?) would like to try and recruit members using the listing of the non members that are on the show reports.

Scholarship committee: Kevin read from Barb Kline's report. She requested a new chair with her current new role as ADRC secretary. Scott Williamson suggested using corporate sponsors for an endowment fund. Other thoughts included a memorial to raise funds. Kevin will put together a new committee and will contact Fran Schettler for financial advice and Rick Billups for corporate connections.

Sanctions: Jill has processed approximately 2000 sanction requests to date. Some delays are continuing due to mailings going to the past two secretaries. A suggestion was to send out postcards to local club secretaries with the updated secretary and sanction info

and fee schedules to decrease mail delays. Jill noted instances in which requests for sanctions would come extremely late and very close to the actual date of the show. It was decided at this time to double the sanction fee for shows requesting sanctions less than 30 days in advance. This will come into effect as of January, 2007.

Dutch Reporter: Dick said it should be in the mail soon, having been sent to the printer last week. He suggested a new deadline of the 15th of January, April, July, and October. The printer costs are reasonable at this time. He is requesting pictures and articles for future publications. There were suggestions of listing events such as upcoming show on a quarterly basis.

Scott Williamson suggested a calendar be put together with events being listed monthly. He felt we could easily sell space for pictures and have information such as ideal times to have breedings planned for NDS and ARBA conventions. The calendar could be sold as a fund raiser possibly for the youth scholarship award. The timing would be important as it would be most appropriate to have ready at the ARBA convention in the fall.

Election committee: Theresa Kortbein said 174 ballots were collected. She had some suggestions to update the ballots, including differentiating potential Hall of Famers from those already in.

Judge selection: Scott Williamson (and committee members Warren Wiltman, Billy Bounds, Dennis Kline, and Bob Bergene) handed out a table listing judges names selected from 2006 thru 2012. Dick Gehr stated at this point he was going to be withdrawing his name from judging any future shows due to his commitment to both the ARBA booth and other work commitments.

Youth committee: Andrew Craig was not present. We had a report he was healing well from his injuries and was showing again.

A motion was made to accept the committee reports as presented by Pete Nelsen and seconded by Bob Bergene. Dick Gehr was excused at this time to attend another meeting.

Old Business:

We are continuing to compile a list of email addresses. A goal is to have upcoming sanctioned shows added to the website. Paypal membership payments will be set up on the website. There was talk of increasing the breed info on the website.

New Business:

The guidelines for the seller's class were discussed. There were to be two entries per household with a sign up time for entries prior to the end of judging. ARBA awards were ordered and paid for by the ADRC and it was the general consensus of the board that this should continue in the future as well.

Kevin asked for ideas for a scholarship chairperson to replace Barb Kline.

The specialty ribbons were addressed with a possible idea to help decrease costs by ordering future ribbons on a roll. They would then be individually hand cut. Barb Kline volunteered to help if this is the way we decide to approach the ribbons the next time they are ordered.

The ARBA BOARD committee met in regard to the complaint filed by the ADRC in regards to Briony Barnes and her negligence towards the club secretarial duties. The ADRC board has revoked her judging privileges at the NDS shows from 2007-2008.

There were some proposed changes to the ADRC Constitution and Bylaws that were listed in a letter from President Kevin Hooper from October 17, 2006. More discussion will follow on these.

elected as
National FFA President

Beau Williamson of Clovis, CA was elected as the National FFA (Future Farmers of America) President at the National FFA Convention on October 28, 2006 in Indianapolis, Indiana. Beau is the son of Scott Williamson and Dianne Williamson, Clovis, CA and the grandson of Wilbur Williamson of Indiana. Beau has

been showing prize wining Dutch rabbits since he was a preschooler and could carry a rabbit to the table. He used his breeding rabbit project as one of his FFA enterprise projects along with breeding and market swine. Beau is currently a student at California State University, Fresno, majoring in agriculture education. He will take a year off of college to complete his duties as National FFA President.

The process to becoming a national officer has consumed much of Beau's past semester. Beau served as a state officer as the California State Sentinel during the 2005-2006 school year. He has been studying approximately four hours each day to prepare himself for the national officer process.

Each state can nominate only one person to run for national office. Beau interviewed in June and was selected as the California delegate. In October, he started the process with a written test and wrote an essay about biofuels. The next day, the candidates were interviewed by a nine member nominating committee that consisted of FFA officers representing different regions of the United States. The candidates had to take another written test and write about their Supervised Agricultural Experience projects which included Beau's rabbit breeding project. The candidates also gave an impromptu speech about urbanization. That evening the nominating committee made its first cut and narrowed the group to 22 candidates.

On the third day, the remaining candidates were given an hour to prepare a team building workshop to present to the committee and 10 local freshmen FFA members. The candidates then participated in a conversation round where they each met with an adult agriculture expert while the nominating committee watched and critiqued their ability to represent the agriculture community. The process ended with another interview by the nominating committee. It was four full days of testing, writing, and talking. The nominating committee presented a slate of officers to the membership present at the National Convention of 55,000 FFA members in attendance. On the last day of the convention, the new officer team was officially elected at the Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis. They represent the FFA organization with almost 500,000 members.

The whirlwind has only just begun for this team. Over the next year each officer will travel approximately 100,000 miles representing FFA. The team has already made an eight day trip to California to tour California agriculture. They will visit Japan for 10 days in January. In July, the national officer team will present the State President's Conference and meet with President Bush. During the

Spring, an officer will be present for every state FFA convention in all 50 states and Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Way Back When

When many people see that you raise rabbits, they usually assume three things. The rabbits just about take care of themselves, they multiply at the drop of a hat, and your making this small fortune selling all these baby bunnies. Obviously these people don't raise Dutch rabbits or they haven't been in it very long. Yes, there are times when it does go well. There are also many times when rabbits don't want to breed, when they do have a litter they're dead, etc. etc. etc. I'm sure I don't need to explain further. I happen to be having one of these forgettable times and it got me thinking, "Way Back When".

It was about a hundred years ago and I was in the seventh or eighth grade. My breed of choice at that time was the New Zealand White. I would take some to the County Fair in Fall and sell ten week old young to a neighbor for meat. I only had enough pens to keep three does for breeding and of course a buck.

That Spring I decided I needed to keep more does so I could sell more young rabbits to our neighbor. All three does had nice litters with plenty of young does in them to choose from. The only problem, where to keep them. My only choice was an old portable chicken coop with holes all over the floor. I got to thinking. If I put these does together when they're young, why couldn't I keep them that way until they were old enough to breed?

I patched up the chicken coop floor with some used boards, laid down some straw, and I was set. I picked out eight does that I liked from the litters I had and let them go on the floor of the old coop.

Everything actually went very well, I couldn't even remember the rabbits fighting. It was to the point where they were all at least six months old and ready to breed. Now, what would be the best way to handle this? Farmers will let the bull run with a herd of cows, so why not? On the coop floor went the buck with the eight does. He chased does around for about two days. After that he just did a lot of lying there, being a little exhausted. How long should I keep him in there? It was after two weeks I decided to put him in his own pen. All those does should certainly be bred by now.

Another week had passed and there was only about one more week before I would start getting some baby bunnies. What should I do with these eight does? After much thought I decided it probably was the best to separate them before the young were born. I had located some used plywood and divided the coop into eight pens that were only about two feet high so I could step from one to the next. Each doe had her own cosy cubical and I was set for the litters to arrive.

As time went on I got more excited about these litters being born. I would always run outside first thing in the morning to check on these does, and one morning low and

behold the process began. One doe had a nest of babies and three more had a pile of fur pulled just waiting for the birthing to begin. The whole thing took four days but I had eight nests of bunnies on the floor of that old chicken coop. However everything didn't go perfectly. One of the mothers didn't take care of her young and they were dead in a couple days. But what more could I have asked for?

If I would have tried that this year, four of the does wouldn't of had any young, one doe would have chewed through the floor and I wouldn't know what happened to her, two others would have had the young spread out across the floor dead, and one would have had a nice nest of babies that would eventually have been eaten by the mink that got in through the hole where one had chewed it's way out to begin with. Oh well! It seemed so easy way back when.....

PREPARATION FOR THE NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW

For those of you that have attended the NDS before, this article may not be any news to you, but for those of you who have never attended and are interested, it may be beneficial. The National Dutch Show is held every spring in April or there about. Not only is this show an honor to exhibit in, but it also is a great time to network with fellow breeders that have the same interest in that special little belted rabbit, the Dutch, that we are all so passionate about. The NDS is an excellent way to find quality breeding stock for purchase from breeders across the country that maybe you wouldn't otherwise have the opportunity to buy. I look forward to the NDS every spring to catch up with all of my Dutch Friends from all over the country, as well as meet new friends to talk "Dutch" with. This year the NDS is in Kalamazoo, Michigan and is being put on by the Michigan Dutch Rabbit Club. The show runs from Friday afternoon through Sunday morning. On Friday evening you can bet on a number of fun classes that provide for a good time, as well as the fur class judging. Saturday is when the breed judging takes place. The showroom is full of the hustle and bustle of running rabbits, taking remarks, and watching the judging take place. The judging is followed by the Dutch Auction and then the Banquet where awards are handed out, recognition given and good camaraderie is enjoyed by all. So now that you have the general description, here are some things that you should keep in mind when planning to make the trip.

I am writing this article late January, so by this time you should have your hopefuls already out of the nestbox. Ideally you want your juniors to be about 4 or 5 months old at NDS so they should have been born late November or early December. Personally I am happy with litters born thru early January too. Keep an eye on those hopefuls, watch how they develop, cull as needed throughout the process and keep the very best.

When I attend NDS I always bring the following items with me and have found them either useful and/or necessary during my trip.

?Feed and Water that the rabbits are currently used to at home. It is important to maintain the same feed while on the road with your Dutch. Some people will just use the feed and water that the sponsoring club supplies at the show, but this can cause your Dutch to go into a molt or even worse go off of feed and stop eating all together. Try to keep things as normal for your rabbits as possible. On that note rabbits can go off of feed due to the stress of it all, so I like to bring along good grassy hay and other "treats" like rolled oats, whole grain conditioner, etc. Bring what works for you and your rabbits.

?Feed and Water dishes for your rabbits. Most times at national shows the sponsoring club will supply dishes for the rabbits, but I recommend that you bring your own

because you never know what you are going to get. It is safest to bring enough dishes from home that you know are clean and this way you will have them when you need them.

?Bring cardboard. Yes, cardboard....you may be wondering why....well, dividers of course. In addition to the cardboard, bring a utility knife to cut it with. After being cut to the proper size, the cardboard will work nicely to block spray from another buck, also gives a sense of security to your Dutch and provides added protection from the terribly feared "nose bite" from another Dutch that somehow got to close. Basically an all around protective barrier.

?Cage cleaning equipment - Since the cooping usually has solid flooring and shavings are utilized for bedding, you will need to bring something to clean out the cage. I like to use a dustpan and a small scraper. The shavings are usually supplied by the hosting club so you shouldn't need to bring any, but while your rabbits are there, it is your responsibility to clean out the soiled bedding and keep the cage clean.

?Cage Signs or Cage Markers - There will be a lot of Dutch rabbits at the show and it is always nice to have some sort of marking on your rabbit's coop to distinguish it from others. The Dutch are all cooped according to variety, sex and age so if you are exhibiting different varieties you can bet that your Dutch will not all be in the same area. Signs also come in handy if you are planning to offer any animals for sale during the show. Signage can provide for good information for the prospective buyer.

?Wire False Flooring - Many exhibitors will bring false flooring for their rabbits which will keep the rabbit off of the solid floor/shavings and keep them cleaner. This is not necessary, but I have used them and they work well. I do like to utilize them if I have room to pack them along. If you plan on using these find out from the show officials the size of the cooping that will be used at the show. It does you no good to bring false flooring that is too large for the cooping provided.

?Grooming Supplies - This would include at the very least a carpet or grooming table (if there is room), a brush, a nail clippers, cloth/towel and some type of stain remover. The brush and nail clipper are a given, as far as the stain remover, this goes back to the fact that Dutch bucks are notorious sprayers and sometimes your show rabbit gets hit. Personally I like to use Listerine with a cloth. Just blot the area until it appears clean and then blot and brush dry. Works pretty good. I stay away from the eyes though. Before showing, go over each rabbit and do any needed grooming. Make sure that toenails are clipped. It is a shame when a rabbit catches a long toenail and rips it out during judging. Something that could have been prevented with proper clipping.

?Cable ties - I like to bring the plastic cable ties to secure the cage door closed and also if there is a loose top or divider in the cooping it can be secured as well using cable ties. If you are going to use the cable ties make sure to

bring a scissors or wire clipper to remove them prior to judging and after the show is over.

?If you plan to sell any of your stock, make sure that you bring the pedigree for that rabbit. Most times a buyer will like to see this before a purchase. Also when donating an animal to the Dutch Auction a pedigree is required.

?Long sleeves - As mentioned earlier in this article, you will be handling a lot of rabbits during the course of the weekend especially if you volunteer to carry and run rabbits which is always needed and greatly appreciated. The long sleeves will protect your arms from scratches and mishap. Be sure to bring some hand sanitizer if you do handle other peoples rabbits or be diligent in hand washing.

?Raffle Donation - Each year at the NDS they hold a raffle and donations are always welcome. Many people will bring something from their home state, maybe a basket of goodies or Dutch related items, something along those lines. The profit from the raffle supports the American Dutch Rabbit Club. Don't forget to buy your tickets!

?Bring a camera too - there are always good memories to be captured and also the pictures that you take of the National Dutch Show are always a welcomed submission to the Dutch Reporter. The members that are not able to make the trip do appreciate seeing the photos and the people that did attend NDS usually get a kick out of seeing themselves pictured, especially when they didn't expect it!

So there you have a few of my recommendations, I may have missed something, but I hope that this helps your planning and also makes your National Dutch Show a fun and well organized trip. Remember if you have more specific questions contact the show officials for this year's NDS or for general NDS questions contact a fellow Dutch breeder that has attended past National shows. See you in Michigan!

Ask The Judge

When rabbits are placed in the holding cages behind the judge's table, I have seen instances of the rabbits getting injured by animals next to them. If a rabbit is placed beside an aggressive animal, would it be appropriate to ask to place my animal in a carrying cage until it is time for BOB?

From Jan Coffelt:

I believe that before I would see the face of my Dutch torn up by an aggressive animal I would say something. However, you do have to think before you do. I would address the situation to the table writer or ramrod in a quiet manor at first if possible. I would offer a carry cage of my own to help the situation. The cage could hold my animal or the aggressive one. Using words that do not inform the judge and others that the animal in question is mine. Just saying something to the effect that the animals are fighting should make the judge aware there is a problem. Most judges would want to prevent an injury to the animals in their charge. Further if nothing is done about the situation I would continue to find someone including the show superintendent to intercede. Last ditch effort I would pull the animal from the class. It would not be worth it to me to have the animal injured.

If the judge is not holding just the BOV'S and BOSV'S behind the table, but perhaps animals from a very large class you could not remove the animal from the area. Therefore the carry cage would have to be left in the judging area.

From Keith McNinch:

I would personally honor the request from an exhibitor asking that an animal be moved to avoid possible injury. The animal could be moved to a distant holding pen instead of a carrier, but action would be taken. The aggressive animal could also be moved and isolated from the others. Notification from exhibitors about conflict in the holding area, unbeknownst to me, would be welcomed.

From Briony Barnes:

Unfortunately this is a common problem, but the statement "my rabbit" is ALWAYS inappropriate. You should never identify your rabbit to the judge or, since our hearing is better than some exhibitors think, anyone else at the table.

If you see aggression or fighting between animals that are being held back for a possible award, a better solution would be to say, "I have noticed those animals fighting. Would you mind if we use carrying cages instead of the holding coops?" Be prepared to offer up your own carriers, which should be clean and have solid dividers. Offer to assist the judge and/or ramrod in placing all the animals (not just yours) in the carriers. A good judge will be concerned about the well being of the animals and will appreciate your finding a solution that doesn't compromise the show rules.

From Kevin Hooper:

As in many cases, it is not what you ask, but it is how you ask. As a judge, I want those animals to remain safe as well! So, I would suggest notifying the judge of the potential problem, even if it is someone else's rabbit. By letting the judge know they are fighting or about to be injured, without letting them know who owns the rabbit, you are doing

what all of us would want to see, the animal remains safe, while the judge just moves someone's rabbit.

Ask The Breeder

When trying to decide what animals to keep for a breeding program, I always keep the best-typed animals; but in your opinion, what marking flaws are unacceptable?

From Fran Schettler:

Assuming that an animal is well typed, marking flaws should be looked at in a few different ways, depending on your particular needs. Keep in mind that some marking flaws are a disqualification, while others just reduce the competitiveness of the rabbit.

First, for example, if your rabbits typically have stops that are too short, you may not want to keep a rabbit that has even shorter stops. You might even consider keeping a rabbit that has stops that are too long, so as to try to breed away from your trend of too short stops. Try to breed for balance and to counteract a particular fault.

Secondly, I prefer to keep a rabbit with one large marking fault rather than one with multiple smaller marking faults and I prefer that the doe carry the marking fault(s) as

opposed to the bucks. Bucks impact the herd much faster than does do, and I don't want his marking faults bred in too strongly. I am therefore much harder on my bucks at culling time than I am on the does.

Thirdly, it takes as much care, effort, and expense to keep a badly marked rabbit over a well-marked rabbit. If you only have a few holes, you may not have room to keep a mismarked rabbit. Why keep a mismark when you could have a show marked one that can go the shows with you?

Fourth, if you are a supporter of the ARBA registration system, keeping a mismarked dq'd rabbit will keep you from registering, thus breaking your chain of registered rabbits on the pedigree.

Personally, I particularly dislike very high cheeks, very low cheeks, badly hooked cheeks, huge undercut or saddle jogs and very long stops and will seldom keep animals with these faults. I also don't usually keep animals with large drags of color onto the shoulder area. I find that these faults are not only very ugly to look at, but seem to breed through more readily than some of the other faults.

From Jill Giron:

In my breeding program I never breed the rabbits with the following DQ's:

White ears (larger than a few hairs), spots in the eyes or freckles on the nose or lips.

From Allan Gerhart:

What marking flaws are unacceptable?

Lets start out with bucks, we like to keep two Sr bucks for breeding in each variety. By limiting breeding bucks to only two it helps us save on cage space for does and upcoming Jrs. So we don't want any flaws on our bucks. The faults that they do have I would consider them to be small or slight flaws. We want a well-balanced buck with good bone and substance. We want our breeding bucks to do well on the show table, as well or they won't stay in our barn very long. I looked at the winnings of our six best bucks; two blacks, two blues, and two steels. Those six bucks have a combined total of 66 G.C. legs, an average of 10.6 per buck. So for breeding bucks we only keep the best of the very best that we have.

As far as does go we are a lot more forgiving on marking flaws as long as we have adequate cage space. We still keep mostly does that don't have any DQ'S. One major fault is acceptable if the doe has everything else going for her. We have kept does with poor under cuts, offset saddles, and dirty necks. I would rather see short stops than long stops and have kept does with splits stops in the past. What we like to see are good cheeks (void of drags into the neck) and as round as possible. A good blaze is also important. It's just hard to look at a Dutch with a bad looking head. So a doe with one big flaw or a couple of small flaws would be acceptable in our breeding program.

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From Jill Pfaff:

For the question concerning marking flaws that I find unacceptable: I never keep animals for breeding who have eye spots, white tipped ears or tails, very high cheeks or long stops. I have a few very productive brood does in my herd with colored patches or a large spot on the white collar area along with a split stops and a close tied elbow. In my experience these traits are much less heritable or passed on to the next generation.

From Bob Bergene:

Determining which marking flaws are unacceptable will vary from one breeder to another. As a breeder achieves a degree of perfection in his breeding stock, he will tolerate less marking flaws and he or she also has to look where there is strength and weakness is in their blood line.

I sell a lot pets from my herd in the Kansas City market and when I go through my Dutch litters when they are four to 5 weeks old, there are certain marking flaws that will make it an automatic pet. I like to get a second opinion also, so when I sort litters for potential show, breeding and pet stock, I enlist the help of my fellow breeder and neighbor, Rich Lehmann. Sometimes we don't agree, but for the most part, we are on the same page. However before we even look at the markings, we first look at the type, -- does it have enough depth to go into the herd despite any marking flaws? Depth is very important. Now, we are ready to look at markings.

LONG STOPS - stops approaching the hock area are a definite no no. I prefer short stops and will tolerate a split stops. But I don't like long stops.

EARS - ears that are long and thin are undesirable. Also if they have a white spot on them, this is not good and they are pets. However, I will keep a good rabbit (markings and type) if they have a slight frosting of hairs inside the ear, as it sometimes disappears after the baby fur molts out.

CHEEK MARKINGS - I do not like cheeks running into the mouth. I would sooner have a nice round high cheek than a low cheek.

SADDLE - I have recently started to cull for very short and narrow saddles & also for very wide band saddles. In your herd if you are having trouble with biased saddles, you might want to consider looking closely at that trait when selecting replacement stock.

FRECKLES - it's a pet

EYES - china blue eyes or an off color eye is a pet

At our rabbitry, we are more lenient on markings of does than for bucks, as I keep back fewer bucks for show and breeding than does.

From Kevin Hooper:

Great question. Here is a less than clear answer. It depends. I don't know if there is a specific marking flaw I will not keep if it is on an animal that is great in all other aspects! Now, whatever that fault may be, if it is severe, it had better be the only marking flaw on the animal, and the parents had better not have that same flaw. I have kept

many does with a severe flaw, but not many bucks. If I have a fantastic doe, with a spot in the saddle, or a small white tip on the ear, or a tied elbow etc., and their parents did not have this fault, I will keep that animal.

With that being said, I have recently been culling harder than ever on markings. I now consider any stops longer than 1/2 of the hock a DQ - at least for my breeding program.

Jack Wireman told me years ago, it is a lot easier to get color off of a Dutch, than to put it on! This means, lower cheeks are better than high cheeks and shorter stops better than long stops, etc.

Keep your markings even or balanced- stops, cheeks, and once you have what you want in type, don't tolerate less than what you expect to produce!



**Killing with Kindness -
or just making them a little sick!**

I began showing when I was a kid in the late seventies. I knew no more, probably far less, than many of you when you started raising rabbits!

Over the years, you pick up little things that someone may have told you, but you ignored the advice, until you decided it was your idea and you would try it. Then you discover, Wow! that really works, and later on you remember it was someone else's idea! In other words, most of what we do to care for our animals is not new, just maybe not known by us. I want to touch on a few things that I do when attending one of the big shows, as well as a few things I may do ahead of time.

First, let us look ahead of time. The show is coming up and you think your promising buck juts needs to fill out, and he will be ready. but, he won't eat as much as you think he needs. what to do? I have had this happened more than once, and I now turn to sweet potatoes! They almost all like them, and you only have to slice off a small piece - 1/2 inch - per day. They eat these, as well as the normal ration, and they gain weight! (Credit - Andy Barton) (Banana can also be used, but is more messy.)

Then comes toning a rabbit up! That's right toning them up. You want the animals to be firm in flesh. Genetics should do most of it for you, but for those you want to tighten up a bit, what do you do? Give them exercise! Now, that does not mean turn them out to run, unless you can run faster! You can get them exercising in their own pen. This will tighten up the back and loin. (I won't tell you how to get them exercising as I have to keep one secret, but involve the rabbits doing one of the things the rabbits is known for - and it is not breeding.) (Credit - Glenn Morgan)

Watch what you feed prior to the show. I used to use a pinch of good alfalfa starting about three weeks before the show. What I found was that this put on too much condition and they became a bit soft to the touch.

Many will tell you to give this or that to condition them. Me, I feed pellets. If you get a good quality pellet, that combined with good genetics will be adequate. I feed no conditioners, just pellets.

What do you do to "condition" them? Pray that the timing works out! Rabbits will go into a molt when nature tells them to do so, not before, not after. Good genetics will give you those animals who look good even when in molt! Some stay in a continual ugly molt - cull these! Some stay in a continual good coat - keep those!

Now, what do you do at the show? Well, at the weekend show like the National Dutch show, treat them just like you do at home. Same feed, same feed amount. I might add a bit of straw as this gives them something to munch, but only adds fiber. This usually keeps them right on eating.

What about water? Well (pardon the pun), that depends on your water source. If you have city water/county water, I guess you can use that water. The key is we want to make as few changes to their diet as possible. I had cistern water growing up that I used for the rabbits, followed by well water (dirty well water), then another cistern, now a good well. I used to add electrolytes to the water at the location, followed by adding a teaspoon of Terrimycin (misspelled I'm sure). Now, I bring my own water. I have three five gallon kerosene cans I use for hauling 15 gallons to the show (enough to water 50 Dutch for a week at the ARBA Convention). This is done to keep the same bacteria in the water that the rabbits are used to. Even treated city water has bacteria, and the bacteria in Fort Worth Texas would be different than that in Columbus, Ohio for example. Introduce a new bacteria, throw them off feed, until they adjust to the new bacteria, then take them home, and introduce them to the bacteria they used to know. A vicious cycle!

That brings me to the title of the article! I had been watering my rabbits with their own water all week at this year's convention. They were eating great! Showroom was cool, none were off of feed! Wednesday morning, I had to go to the Standards Committee meeting, and I watered my animals. I knew I had ran out of water in that can, and did not have time to get the other out of the truck. I would get it later! Upon returning from my meeting one of our members (name omitted to protect the innocent), thought it was terrible (put in a nice way) and that I had not watered my big winner of the show! I told them I thought I had, and I made a mental note to check her. They said she sure acted thirsty! I knew I had added shavings that morning to her cage, but had I missed watering her?

Well when I got over there, and checked her, she did have water, but the cup was nice and clean, no shavings or anything. So, she has water, but I didn't clean the cup, so they watered her?

As usual, I got busy doing something, and had not had a

chance to bring in my other water, so I would get it in a while. Well, a while became late afternoon. no big deal she had water!

Well to make a long story short, the doe is fine. But, of the 18 rabbits I came home with from Texas, one was off of feed for about five days, not eating anything, and you guessed it, it was the big winner, who had kindness bestowed upon her by one of our generous breeders! Now, I laugh at this now, as all turned out well. Even if it had not and I had lost the doe, I would just shake my head. So, the moral of the story is even though what you are doing may be out of the total goodness of your heart, kindness can kill as well (or throw off feed)!



**Cold Weather Litters,
Nest Boxes,
Heat
(and a little Luck!)

This morning I went out to check on a litter that was due in my rabbit barn, which is just a separate detached garage north of my home. I heat it to 42 degrees during the winter and usually have fairly good success with litters even when it is bitterly cold outside, such as it is of the writing. Temps today are supposed to dip down into the -25 with the wind chill. My furnaces are running most of the time on these super cold days but at least the temperatures remain constant for me. After talking with a number of other breeders in the upper Midwest who are battling the freezing temperatures without the benefit of a furnace, it was interesting to hear what everyone comes up with to give babies the best chance possible during a time of the year when rabbits really aren't designed to even be having litters. Since these were the sort of articles I read and re-read as a youth breeder until the edges of the DR were tattered, I hope to share some of these ideas coming from several breeders to perhaps help your Dutch babies during the cold times of the year. For the sake of this article, I'm going to assume the rabbits are housed in a building of some sort and not an outdoor free standing hutch.

One easy way of adding heat to the barn is by placing a temporary heating lamp over the pen of the newborn babies. Kevin Hooper said he has found this to work extremely well and helps babies make it through some of the real cold snaps we get during January and February. He secures the lamp approximately 24 inches above the box by attaching it to a hook driven into a 2 x 4 or beam placed at the right height above the pen. The babies can group together closer to the heat if they are chilled, or move away when they are warmed enough to stay comfortable.

With this method of heating, though, it is obviously critical to make sure the light is well secured so there is no chance of it falling or causing a fire. It also would be limited to the pens that were either the top one in a stacking set, or to those suspended in a frame or hung from the ceiling. John Milroy from WI has his does kindle in the top pen and tries to have the nest boxes end to end up against the cage sides so a heat lamp can cover two boxes at one time. In a smaller barn, such as one of those kits from a home building center, a heating lamp may be enough to keep the entire set up just above freezing, giving the doe a good chance of raising a live litter. Regardless, heating lamps seem to be a choice a many breeders to get through the colder months.

Kevin also mentioned he tried something new recently with a sheet of pink insulation material that is easily attainable at any home improvement store. He cut it to fit the outside of the pen and then secured it, and just that extra insulation really helped the litter on the inside of the enclosure stay nice and toasty. I have done this in the past with chicks and actually built a temporary brooder out of this same insulation board. I put it together with the simplest means possible--three inch nails that I pushed into the corners to hold them together--and with the addition of the heat lamp on one open end, the "brooder" worked as good as any expensive contraption with electrically equipment heating elements or bulbs.

Melody Milroy has a newer 1 1/2 stall car garage that she quickly claimed for the rabbit building when she and her husband, Bill, purchased their home in Amherst Junction, WI. The rabbit section has insulation on the inside walls which was then covered with shower board for ease of cleaning. In the middle of her barn is an oil filled heater that has a thermostat. She is able to heat the barn easily in this radiant heat to both take the chill out of the air and keep the ice from freezing. Melody said she keeps her does due to kindle on either the top or middle section of her three tiered stacking pens so litters are away from the colder floor and exposed to more of the heat as it rises.

Another way to combat the cold, albeit a time consuming one, is to bring the nest boxes in the house during the day and take them out to the doe during feeding time. When I have done this myself (have a nestbox in the guest bathroom right now on the "to the barn daily" plan), the doe has fed the babies soon after the box is placed back in the cage. I will start feeding on the opposite side of the barn so the doe is pretty much finished nursing the kits by the time she hears the feed being dumped in her dish. After chores are done, the nest boxes come back in and sit until the following evening. Several breeders I have talked with over the last few weeks have been doing this and it has paid off. The litters are strong and are ready to stay in the barn on a continual basis by the time they are 10 days to two weeks old.

Whether or not your barn is heated may not factor in to your ability to raise babies. Several breeders have been able to raise litters in the dead of winter without the added benefit of heat. Some people choose to raise babies from

the early Spring time through the Fall because they have little success when trying to have live litters during the cold winters. Others heat a small room instead of the entire barn. Roger Guetschow from Arlington, WI, has a little nursery with four sets of stacking pens that is heated by a little electric heater. Babies are kept in the nursery for approximately four weeks and then are transferred to the unheated barn until they are ready to be separated. Roger makes sure the weather is not so cold that the babies have trouble adapting to the temperature change.

However your barn is set up, it has to be done to adapt to the climate it is in. Our brethren to the south and west have another set of circumstances that are equally challenging with the heat of the summers. It would be nice at some point to talk with several warm weather Dutch breeders to see what works well with them. The nice thing about our hobby is that when someone has an idea that may work for another person, they are more than willing to share it. If you have a barn that you would like to highlight in a future Dutch Reporter, consider contacting Dick Gehr for suggestions on how to put your article together. Picture are always welcome and help when others are planning to build or improve their barn. Perhaps your way of raising rabbits could be one that others would benefit in knowing about. There is something special about being able to have those babies warm and toasty while the snow piles up outside, the temperatures plunge and winter refuses to give way to spring.

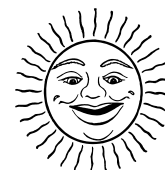

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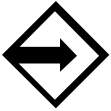


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WINTER BREEDING

Wintertime is again upon us here in the Midwest. With the coming of winter, so come the added challenges of breeding Dutch. During this time of year, a breeder will possibly see lower conception rates in does as well as a higher mortality rate in kits. Being that our National Dutch Show is usually in April and you want your juniors to be at least 4 to 5 months old, this means that breeding during the winter months for your prospective show winners is necessary. Luckily Dutch are a very hardy and maternal breed that can successfully kindle and raise a litter even in freezing conditions. As most experienced breeders know, the lower conception rate during the winter is due to the shorter length of daylight. Winter in general is an unnatural time for reproduction in rabbits. Some breeders will leave the lights on in the rabbitry to extend the day for the rabbits, which can be very effective. This is something that I have not tried as of yet, but someday when I have my dream rabbitry I will do so, until then...

What I am doing now seems to be working fine or at least well enough that I have been content with the results for the last few years. Currently when breeding during the winter I will breed the chosen pair together and then repeat the mating in maybe a half hour to an hour later. I also like to do this the next day as well. With doing this I don't have too many missed litters provided that the doe is receptive. I do not do this multiple breeding during the warmer months with longer days as I have found that this will increase the litter size and I prefer a litter of 5-6 kits, not 10. When it is warm and the days are longer I only breed once. A non-receptive doe is another challenge of winter breeding but as we all know this can happen any time of the year, just more in winter. If the doe is not receptive to the buck that I have chosen, I will try a different buck and see if that makes a difference, sometimes the doe is just picky believe it or not. I have also found that taking the doe and placing her in the buck cage (without the buck, basically switching cages) will do the trick as the new smells may get her interested. Another trick, if the timing is right, take her to a show. With all the stimulation of smells and the change in the environment (temp/noise level etc.) the doe may become receptive. Of course there is also the method of table breeding, which is giving the pair assistance by a controlled, hands-on technique on a solid, carpeted surface. I don't particularly prefer this method and rarely use it, as the results that I have gotten or should say have not gotten do not impress me. After about 2 weeks I will check the doe back with the buck. If she is not receptive at that time and seems upset by the whole thing (growling and grunting), I progress as if she is bred. Keep in mind that this check-back is not always reliable and I don't solely rely on it. In addition, I also use palpation as a

tool to assess whether the doe is bred. I will do this around the 3rd week of gestation when which time you can easily feel for the unborn kits. When my doe is ready to kindle I place a nestbox in with the doe filled with at least 1 inch of pine shavings in the bottom and then stuffed with soft grass hay. I like to stuff it full because I figure that she will eat some and some hay will be lost due to "rearranging" by the doe. I know other breeders will utilize heat lamps and nestbox warming pads, but I have not done so up to this point. I will not claim that I haven't lost litters, but I will say that I do raise a lot of bunnies successfully during these cold Wisconsin winters. Dutch make great mothers and they have little trouble kindling successfully in temperatures down to the single digits. When you get below zero is when I have more of a concern, although amazingly enough I have had success at that time too. Once the doe has kindled, I check the box frequently and make sure that the kits are warm. If the doe has not plucked enough fur to keep the kits warm, I will either use fur from another doe or if unavailable, cotton balls make a nice addition to the nest for warmth. In the past I have tried bringing the boxes into the house and only returning them to the doe daily, long enough for her to nurse them. I have had good and bad results with this method. It has worked well for some does and I have also had a few that quit taking care of their litter so I ended up fostering the bunnies to another doe. Due to this, I no longer utilize this practice. I prefer to just let the doe raise her litter while keeping a watchful eye on the process. As the bunnies mature I will continually add soft grass hay to the nestbox for added bedding/insulation and they like to nibble on it too. I free-feed the doe and litter, just watching them grow.

As the bunnies mature it is important that they stay in the nest until they are ready to leave, meaning they can get back in as well. It is unfortunate but common for a bunny to get out of the nestbox and then is unable to get back into the warm nest. This can happen as the doe hops out of the box while nursing them and they are pulled out still holding onto the doe or just jumping out on their own accord. Either way if they are not returned to the warmth of the nestbox, especially with winter's cold temperatures, the kit won't last long out on the wire. This is yet another reason for a watchful eye. It seems to me that when the weather is milder the kits will be more adventurous and come out of the box too soon as opposed to when the weather is frigid. Using a taller nestbox can help with this but there are no guarantees. As we know bunnies can be lost on the wire or out of the nest during the summer months as well, just not as frequently. In conclusion, I try to be aggressive with my winter breeding program, as in my opinion it is the best way to be effective and successful on the Springtime show table. Yes, you may lose some, but you will also produce some. You never know, those winter bunnies may lead to a win at the National Dutch Show.

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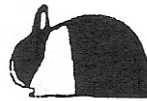

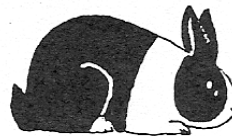
