



Congratulations to the top winners in our group! Kevin Hooper, although home for this convention, still managed to represent himself well by winning BOB with a super Gray Doe.

The Mullinax's had a very primed Black Jr. Buck, and Miss Marissa Wells had an armful between awards and holding the winners when she took home BOB and BOS Youth honors with a pair of super Blacks! Good job everyone and congratulations to all that topped your classes!

We have a new addition to our board with the changes in leadership that have recently transpired. Mr. Al Gerhart has been appointed to fill Rick Billup's spot with Ricks moving up into the Vice President's position. Al will add some new energy and we look forward to working with him in the future. Our board had a lengthy meeting on Friday night (a personal thank you to all of you sitting for that time frame) in which we shared thoughts and new ideas on the direction we hope to continue seeing our club going in. It involves some changes as well as building on some of what we already have in place. What we all really want to encourage our membership to do is keep in touch with us on any concerns, suggestions or feedback you have. We represent you and want to make sure this is a club driven by the membership and not just a few select individuals. Your district directors have their phone numbers and emails in the DR so please feel free to get in touch with them as you need to.

The committee reports will be listed in the secretary's report in this issue of the DR and will have some of the ideas each respective group will be targeting. As I mentioned in our general membership meeting, the

Hall of Fame is somewhat of a "hot button" with many members, especially in regards to the criteria involved in the selection of a recipient of this award. It is going to be a big priority with Chair Rick Lehmann and his group to hammer out the details so if anyone does have suggestions, please contact him. We now have a booth committee for the ARBA conventions! Plans are in the making for a design to tie into the Kentucky Horse theme and our booth will be more than able to stand side by side with other breed groups that are decorated so nicely!

Two other new committees are the Historian and Convention Liaison committees. The Historian committee will be in the able hands of history buffs Rick and Julie Billups. Now that their daughter, Rachel is at an age that allows them to become a bit more involved in the club, they were excited to take these reins when asked. We have some wonderful history behind our club and we cannot let it fade as our senior members leave us. Rick will be conducting interviews and recovering information that we can be sharing in DR's, the website and through records we'll keep on disks as we come across it. Did you know we used to have an AOV class in the Dutch world and they were allowed to be exhibited right along side of the six colors we have today? When did that change? At some point, you'll know that answer.

The Convention Liaison committee is one that has already taken off. Dennis Kline has been putting together ideas on this for the past month, and together with Phil Lape, will be focusing on the rules, suggestions and guidelines for each ARBA and NDS convention. Our goal is to have a packet with information available to hosting clubs to help with all the planning that goes along with a show of this magnitude. Dennis will be checking with the clubs along the way to make sure timelines are being met and to identify any problems popping up early on that need to be solved.

Our new publicity chair, Todd Uran, along with Dan Monahan had a great start with new merchandise at the booth in Bloomington. Dan was telling me their goal was to test the water to see what people were navigating towards, listen to requests, and then build up more inventory for the fall. They are also looking into a newer online ordering company for some clothing items as well. There should be even more things to chose from in KY, and if you have a request on a size, please email Todd. Good job, guys!

If you did not have a chance to check out our new carriers, please do so at the next convention. They worked very well this year and we will be adding more for the fall. They are designed to collapse back into their trays after use so less space is needed for actual storage and transport. We will be fine tuning the design just a bit more for the next group of pens but thus far, the cages the membership present at ARBA's general Dutch meeting voted to purchase have been put to hard use and did their job!

We will be starting to work on an updated guidebook this coming year. There was already one person that expressed an interest in working on it. We will need to have a small group to gather appropriate photos, articles, and data. If you have an interest in this, please contact either Rick Billups or me so we can get you on the group

list. It will come out after we rework our club bylaws, getting them up to today's standards so they will be correct when the guidebook is eventually published. It is a huge undertaking and will take long hours from dedicated members, but when you think of it, the guidebook is such a vital part of our club that we need to devote that time to making it as good as we can.

Now that spring is here, litters are coming along in nestboxes that stayed empty over the winter months. Many expressed difficulty getting does bred and raising litters. As the days lengthen the does cycles are more in sync with what we want them to do. With the prices of fuel to get to shows, and feed for the rabbits, herds may be reduced in size to accommodate the reserves in our wallets. It doesn't have to affect the quality of what we raise, though; I think back to the depression era when people still raised rabbits. They didn't have the quantity some have in their barns today but they did have litters on a regular basis. They just kept the best which eventually helped the breeds recognized back then to survive. Just how many does are needed to continually produce good animals?

Mr. Wilbur Williamson placed a call to me the other day and we had a chance to chat about what he feels is important with our club growth and future. He is a big supporter of the youth and has long been in favor of all the good that comes from 4-H and other groups that encourage youth to take on responsibility, find out the personal satisfaction in doing so, and eventually use these experiences to help shape them as they grown into adulthood. As he talked, it through me back into time when I was a youth breeder and how I looked at those DR's coming in with excitement. I read my guidebook over and over, highlighting articles, dreaming of having Torts like the infamous Don and Nelly Brady had in their ads. The youth are like sponges when presented with new information, and those that have been around for some time would be a great resource for them to go to for guidance. Wilbur had more suggestions that I would like to implement at the coming NDS and for the new guidebook. Thank you, Wilbur, for your insight and dedication to helping the youth!

One of the items I closed our directors meeting with, and will close with this here as well, was the need to put communication between the board and the members to the forefront. Without it, the club will not function as effectively as it can. The NDS is the hardest time to squeak in both the board and the general meeting. We would like to be able to talk as we did this past fall at the upcoming ARBA convention in KY, getting input from you and hearing what you have to say. We now have a suggestion box that will come to our National shows, courtesy of Mr. John Milroy. We are exploring ways to hold meetings online between directors and committees to facilitate better communication in a more timely manner. Lots of things are happening and we are continuing to be dedicated to making our club and the experiences we have the best they can be. See you in Kentucky!

Vice-President's Report Rick Billups





I read the article in the last DR about registering rabbits and while I don't disagree with the reasons for not registering. I do have a different opinion on why people should register their rabbits. There are very few people who enjoy the reputation and success that Kevin does. As such, he can sell a rabbit without a pedigree and people would wait in line to buy it, myself included. So it really doesn't matter if his rabbits are registered or not, he can still find plenty of buyers. When looking to buy a rabbit from someone I don't know, I will look at the pedigree for the colors and the weights of the animals in the background. Next I will look to see how many of the rabbits from this breeder are registered. While it is true that registering only means they meet the minimum for the standard of the breed it also tells you that there are animals in this line that are free from disqualifications such as malocclusion, missing dewclaws, freckles or one testicle. Next I will look to see how many of the rabbits in the background are Grand Champions. If there are several and the breeder shows in highly competitive parts of the country, then I know he is not only producing showable animals but also winning animals. This is good information to determine if we are willing to buy that rabbit from an unfamiliar breeder. It is also system I use when looking at rabbits in an auction or sellers class. And as for the cost of registering your rabbits if you have a large herd, I agree that it is very expensive. But you can do as I did and get a registrars license and now your cost is cut in half. You can also register rabbits for others to offset the cost of registering your rabbits completely. While the registration system may not be perfect for our breed, since you can get a "Best In Show" animal out of two mismarked and disqualified animals, it does give some help and guidance to other breeders.

And finally I would ask that everyone take the time to read the minutes of the board and membership meetings when they are printed in the Dutch Reporter and also the Domestic Rabbit magazines. Staying informed about the direction and the workings of your club not only makes you a better member, it makes a better club.



ASK THE JUDGE

What is the proper way to examine the neck marking? It seems that there are a number of different techniques that judges use to check the neck marking, including pulling the ears apart, blowing into it and brushing the fur down etc. Please describe the proper way to evaluate this marking.

From Kevin Hooper:

There may be a number of different techniques used to examine the neck marking, but there is only one proper way. The thing to remember when examining our Dutch is to do so without distorting what is actually there. The best way is to hold the ears together and erect, and look behind to see how the neck marking appears. If we brush the fur down, that will change the marking. If there is a question as to a spot in the neck, then blowing into or using your fingers to move some fur may be warranted.

From Jan Coffelt:

This may be too simple of an answer for you but it is the way I examine for the neck marking.

With the rabbit sitting on the table I gently take the tips of the ears and gently pull them forward and exam the neck marking. If the neck marking looks clean that is all I do. However if the neck appears ragged I might blow into the area looking to see if there is a distinct spot. I do not think it is necessary to dig or prod the area looking for a disqualification.

From Keith McNinch:

I pull the ears apart and blow into the fur to observe the underlying marking, similar to evaluating other markings like the undercut on Grays. This is the only true way to ascertain the correctness of the neck marking, especially when the fur is not in good condition. When the fur happens to be in good condition, the surface characteristics will generally confirm the results of the earlier close scrutiny. After all these years, I've never been instructed about the "proper" way to assess the neck marking, but instead have relied upon my earlier days of raising Dutch. If I utilize the same essential techniques when examining animals in a class, then all exhibitors will be treated fairly.

ASK THE BREEDER

I just bought some Dutch rabbits that I want to show, but I am confused about feeding. Some people tell me to buy high protein for the feed and some say regular protein. Some say to feed hay, others say they don't need it. I have heard that show animals should have sunflower seeds, linseed oil, wheat germ oil, oats, calf manna, etc. Others say I should not feed vegetables like carrots and lettuce. I would like to know what people who successfully breed and show rabbits feed.

From Kevin Hooper:

I am a believer in simple is better. Find a good quality pellet which is high in fiber - 25%, but not that high in protein - 15-16%, and let them eat it. I do not use any conditioners or treats. I feed about 2/3 of a cup (measuring cup) of pellets per day. If the feed is of a good quality, then you are giving them a balanced meal, and anything else you may add will throw that out of balance.

I know the rabbits like the conditioners/treats/veggies/fruits, but I like ice cream, and if I eat too much, too often,,,,,,,,,,,,,,,,,,

I do have a few Dutch which are more active. For those I will feed a higher energy feed than what I normally give the others. This may mean a higher protein feed for you. For me, it means a feed which has some grain, unlike my regular feed which is all forage based.

Give them a balanced meal, then if you have the genetics, they will do the rest!

From Jill E. Pfaff:

I recommend a good quality feed with 15 to 16 % protein for Dutch, I personally use Heinhold 15-20 show along with Heinhold Starter pellets for does with litters. I feed lots of hay-almost daily and I use high quality grass hay with large leaves so it doesn't fall through the cage floor as easily, sometimes I put the hay in toilet paper rolls (a trick I learned from my friend Pete Nelsen). For show rabbits I do supplement with a seed mix I make and call Jill's treat mix which includes: black sunflower, safflower, flax seeds along with rolled oats, barley, and a little calf manna. I recommend 1/2 tsp daily on top of feed or in a separate bowl and the rabbits really seem to like it and it helps give the coat a healthy glow.

I also feed treats from the house with moderation like leftovers from salad makings: carrots, broccoli, celery, squash but not lettuce, sometimes apples and bread.

From Fran Schettler:

You should feed a high quality, fresh rabbit pellet with about 16% protein (regular protein) to your show rabbits. Breeding does or unweaned kits may benefit from a higher

protein 17% pellet but that is an individual choice. That plus water is all that is absolutely necessary. As a side choice, you may also choose to feed your show rabbits one the supplemental feeds such as Doc's Rabbit Enhancer or another grain or vitamin mixture that might be available in your local area. This will frequently have many of the items you listed in it and may add to the competitiveness of your animals by maintaining the best possible condition for longer. Make sure it is a mixture that is commonly used by rabbit breeders and not someone's whim or some pet market brand. Some people swear by feeding a good quality hay weekly but it is not necessary for Dutch.

For my show Dutch and herd bucks, I feed rabbit pellets plus a local grain mixture made by Barbi Brown here in California plus water. That's it! I do not recommend feeding veggies or fruit unless it is a bit of carrot, a bit of apple or a bit banana. Notice I said a "bit". That means a small quantity every once in awhile and only as a treat or as a food source in a carrying cage!

From Olivia Wismer:

Excellent question and one that I'm sure will provide many different answers, I have had rabbits for 10yrs and currently show in youth (for one more year) In those 10 yrs (4 as a breeder and exhibitor) I have found a breeding program that works for my rabbits.

First, let's think about pellet and protein. For my rabbits I use Purina, I have tried many other brands but keep going back to Purina. I use the green bag with 16% protein. I feel that is the highest percentage of protein that you want, I have tried 18% but just didn't get the flesh condition or the fur condition I got with 16. I also do not feed pellets free choice; I limit my rabbits intake to 1/4 cup in the morning and night. .Pellets were originally designed to feed lab rabbits that would typically not live to their full life span and therefore are low in fiber and high in carbs. Which brings me to the next very important part of my rabbit's diet and it is Hay. My rabbits all have hay racks that are filled every night with mixed grass hay or timothy hay. Rabbits are herbivores and are well adapted to a high fiber diet, so the more fiber it eats the healthier it is. GI track will be. Hay is the only thing that my rabbits are fed free choice.

I also have a 3rd part to my rabbit's daily diet, and is for some reason controversial. I feed my rabbits greens everyday at night. They are given about 1 cup of dark leafy greens such as Kale, collards, red leaf etc. Many breeders believe that greens are bad for rabbits and should not be fed at all, but actually they are very good for them. If the rabbit is eating hay it's body is already used to the high fiber content, that greens will also provide. A few reasons that breeders believe that greens are bad for rabbits was because people would give a large helping of greens to a rabbit that was eating only pellet, this resulted in diarrhea since the digestive system was given too much fiber too fast. But if the rabbit is eating hay there is typically no reason the rabbit cannot have greens. I have been feeding greens for 4 yrs now and have had no problems at all, The one compliment I get at almost every show is what a nice coat and condition my rabbit/s have. I do not feed any extras such as sunflower seeds, except for during molt or sometimes in the winter, but my rabbits keep their condition, without it. I hope this helps. I recently wrote a paper for my pre vet class on rabbit nutrition So, alot of this information in from my own research and my own experience and of course some trial and error! You can find more information on my feeding program at www. freewebs.com/creekside_rabbitry .

From Bob Bergene:

To the prospective Dutch showmen that just bought some rabbits and wants to show them I would first stress CONSISTENCY in feeding. Feed them the same amount of feed each day at the same time. Do not full feed them, but limit feed them by feeding them about 1/2 cup of feed per day. Now, as far as what to feed, I would suggest that you look for a feed that is about 15% protein, 20% fiber and about 3-4% fat. You can find this information printed on the ingredient tag on the feed bag. Manufacturers will put the major ingredient first and then in declining amounts the other items they put in the feed. I would not select a high protein feed as this has a tendency to produce a molt condition. A high protein feed would produce more heat energy in the rabbit and that is something that you do not necessarily need when you are conditioning rabbits for show in the summer and early fall. The rabbit pellet that you are feeding will have about 40% dehydrated alfalfa pellets, so you do not need to actually add hay as they are getting adequate hay in the diet. It does not hurt to give them a small handful of hay occasionally, so they get a different texture feed from the pellet, but keep in mind that the pellet that we recommended that you use is a BALANCED FORMULA. When you start to add a lot of things to the rabbit's diet in addition to the pelleted feed, you no longer have a balanced formula. The BALANCED FORMULA has the correct amount of protein, fat, fiber, vitamins and minerals that your Dutch needs for growth and reproduction. You also asked whether to feed linseed oil, wheat germ oil and sunflower seeds, these ingredients will have a tendency to put on a desirable finish on show rabbits, but may not be necessary to use. Many of the "show formula" feeds will have a higher fat content like 4% instead of the 2% in regular feeds. If you are using a show formula feed you will note that it will have higher fat content and this is from adding some type of oils to the feed ration. Most people that show rabbits will have their own ideas of what to feed, how much to feed and whether you should supplement with show treats. So you will get a wide range of ideas from people and the main thing is to decide on a feed and stick with it. Remember what we said about consistency. That means do not change feed, if your rabbits do not win at this show or that show.

Good luck feeding and showing your Dutch and I hope that the feed you decide to select produces many champions for you.

From Allan Gerhart:

We try and keep it simple when it comes to feeding our rabbits, and feed mainly pellets. We use Nutritional (Bunnets) 17% for does with litters and Jrs up to 3 months of age, and 15% for show rabbits, bucks, and idle does. We do give a little calf manna to does with litters, and sometimes hay or straw if we have a rabbit go off feed to get them eating again. But mostly we just feed pellets once a day usually in the evening.

From Sue Hill:

I feed two protein levels in my rabbitry but my Dutch are always on 18%. My Netherland Dwarfs are on 16% and I've had some Dutch on it as well, but I seem to get

the best growth on my youngsters well into adulthood by being on the greater protein feed. Rarely do I have a rabbit that is overweight because I measure out their feed daily to the amount of 1/2 cup for a single rabbit. Does with litters are fed more according to the age of the litter. When I go to feed each evening, I want my rabbits at the front of their pens, looking for those pellets.

I also feed a good quality grassy hay quite often and really push it with animals that are molting or with a mom and a litter. A bale is stored in tall plastic garbage cans with wheels that I pull one down the aisle when I'm giving it to the bunnies. The nursing does and those with litters really like the hay addition to their diet and they get it just about every morning. I always pick out bales with grassy hay instead of alot of rich alfalfa based hay. Depending on where you live, a little investigating with people you know who raise horses or have a farm will point you towards someone with a good hay (such as Timothy). Hay cubes work best for some breeders that don't have the room to store hay. The cubes are nice to be able to bring to shows for a treat. Unfortunately, my rabbits like to throw them around their pens, and I end up having to clean up a soggy mess in the pens with crocks.

One of the interesting things about raising rabbits is finding out what others feed their herd. Some have a "secret" mix of conditioner, sunflower seeds, oats, and other goodies that they personally mix up. Others purchase one of the premixed conditioners available through most rabbit supply companies. The key is to think of it as a treat or conditioner and it shouldn't make up the base of the rabbit's diet. Warren Wiltman feeds a conditioner only at certain times during the season, but when he does, he feeds his pinch to each rabbit first thing while doing chores, and then goes back and starts feeding pellets. By that time, the conditioner is eaten and he's not dealing with bunnies digging out expensive feed to get to the goodies.

When I separate out babies, I make sure they have a sprinkling of the conditioner I use (which really seems to keep them eating well), and a handful of hay. They seem to adjust a bit better and stay eating. I haven't found the conditioner to be too hot for any age of rabbit so I am comfortable in using it liberally with my herd. I also bring some with me to each Nationals to try and keep them on their feed during that stressful time.

One of my favorite things to give rabbits is dandelions! They absolutely love them and I enjoy knowing they are getting a good fresh treat. Of course, if you are treating your lawn with a weed killer or fertilizer with a weed preventative in it, you don't want to be giving those dandelions to the rabbits. I have enough of them that grow in my yard and in my flower beds that I can harvest without that concern. I'll give a doe and her litter an entire plant, and enjoy just watching the yellow flower disappear as they crunch away. I've also dried them for winter and they go over well with the critters. Lettuce and spinach from our garden is a big hit in the summer. I personally stay away from iceberg lettuce and anything that produces gas with humans (broccoli, cauliflower, brussel sprouts). On occasion they get carrots but, more often, they get carrot tops. Again, the key is moderation.

You might find a need to change feeds to something that is bringing out the condition and coats you want in your rabbits. Feel free to talk with breeders that continually place well for their thoughts on their feeding

routine. Become familiar with the code on the bag of feed located on the strip of paper that is sewn on the seam of each end. It should have a location and date marking so you can see how fresh your feed is. Usually the date is marked by the number day of the year it was milled. If you need help interpreting it, ask you feed dealer to show you. The major feed companies all have representatives (akin to your own directors) so feel free to call them for more information. Ask questions and in the end, you'll feel more comfortable knowing that what you chose to feed your rabbits will give you the results you are looking for.

From Kristy Hume:

The breeder I bought most of my initial stock from, Tom Dietrich, was a Purina Ambassador and recommended their feed and gave us some coupons. So I have been feeding Purina Rabbit Chow Complete Blend (the green bag) my entire time raising rabbits. The Complete Chow is 16% protein, and my rabbits seem to eat it well and I have been pleased with their condition. The one thing I would caution is to check the manufacturing date on the feed bags. Sometimes it sits at the store too long and loses quality. Before we began checking the dates, some old feed got into our barn and some of the rabbits lost condition. As far as feed goes, if something is working for you, don't change it! Consistency is the key. Other than that, our rabbits get a small handful of hay daily, and we like to give the young rabbits, mothers, and any rabbits under stress, a bit of oatmeal.



I am formally declaring my intent to run for the office of President for the ADRC. My name is Sue Hill and am you current President after taking over for Kevin Hooper in April. I have been



the ADRC Vice President since being appointed to the position five years ago. Throughout this time, I have had the opportunity to work with Kevin and the rest of the board, and have enjoyed doing so very much and now look forward to building on some ideas we have been working on, as well as bringing in some new ones.

I have had Dutch since 1975 when I was given a chocolate Dutch buck as a birthday gift. Even though he was poorly marked and had a rotten personality, he was, to me, the most beautiful creature behind welded wire on the planet. One day I saw a sale ad in the local paper for black Dutch. I bugged my dad for a black doe until he finally gave in and let me go see them. I ended up going home with two after the guy selling them had not sexed them properly, and, of course, the best of the litter was a buck. Soon afterwards, I attended my first show and was hooked. My herd endured my going to college and keeping just the bare bones for my line, to a substantial sized herd that it is today.

I was introduced to 4-H as a youngster and eventually it became a big part of my life. At age 16, I took over the rabbit project at a time when having rabbits in the backvard in town was still considered commonplace. We did Rabbit Fun Days, workshops throughout the year, and had work days before each fair getting plans together for how we would display the rabbits in our barn. I was able to work with the Parks Department to have money set aside for new pens when the fairgrounds moved, and involved the youth and the families in the rabbit (and poultry) projects to build the new bottoms needed to support the new pens. I still enjoy going back to the old fairgrounds and seeing the signs, barrels and show tables being used that I either helped build or paint designs on. What is perhaps most enjoyable for me is seeing kids I worked with in the Rabbit or Poultry project now involved with their own kids in the same manner I was.

In the past, I have been Secretary for the Winnebago County Fair Association, and am currently the President for the Blackhawk Country Netherland Dwarf Club here in Wisconsin. I belong to the ARBA, ANDRC, NMRRC, WSRBA, the local Mini Rex Club and another Dwarf Club in our area, as well as the Upper Midwest Dutch Club. I am also a director for the Michigan Dutch Rabbit Club.



Being a member of the ADRC since 1974, I have actively raised









Winning Best Dutch with a Love Her/Hate Her Brood doe

This year I was fortunate enough to have the Dutch which was awarded the top honors at our National Dutch Show. However, she was only a brood doe! (I'm not being cocky, so read on.)

Before I get into the meat of this story, I must first thank a couple of people, or not only would this win have not been possible, not even this show for me. The winning doe was out of a gray buck I raised, but I had sold to Denny and Barb Kline the last time the NDS was in Wisconsin. We have been swapping the buck for the past year after the brother to this gray buck I had kept was sterile. So, many thanks to the Klines!

Then there was the issue of getting to the NDS. As most of you know, I skipped this years NDS due to the fact my wife and I were expecting our second child. (The due date is today, and still no baby.) I was not comfortable being that far away when we had had some complications with our first child. So, how would I get my Dutch to the show?

Rick Billups, along with his wife Julie, and daughter Rachel were generous enough to not only haul my animals, but to care for them at the show! Many thanks, for the work and care you provided!

Going into the show, I thought I had a chance to win two Sr Buck classes, and four Sr Doe classes. Both of the Sr bucks placed, while three of the senior does won their class! The one doe who failed to win her class, my black senior doe, had been on and off feed for the previous few weeks, and she was placed down for that very reason.

Of the other three I thought had a chance to win their class, I had a nice steel doe, a nice tort doe, and a nice gray doe.

The Steel doe had done very well the first three shows in '07, winning Best out of about 110, 98, and 170. She then blew her coat just before the '07 NDS, and placed second. This year, she was very open in her coat at entry time, but came into her new coat very quickly! I was not sure how she would do beyond her class, as I knew there were many raising nice steels lately? She managed to win Best Steel! (She had lost her litter the first part of March or she would not have been there!)

My favorite going into the show, and still is, was my tort sr doe. She had not been to one of the big shows before, had just turned senior, and was too young to make the trip last fall. I had been watching this doe for a while as she has balance not only to her markings, but what I believe is the perfect length and depth to her body, and great Dutch type! She was also my helpful in the fur class! It has been a really long time since I was excited about the chances of one of my torts in the fur class, let alone the chances in the whole show! She did win her class, and went on to win her variety!

Lastly, was my gray senior doe. She has been a love her, or hate her type of doe by the judges. I first showed this doe the third weekend of September last year when she was 11 weeks old. She had matured well for that age. The first showing that day, she was about 7th out of 10. I thought she would do much better than that, but sometimes, she was not one who liked to sit. Then, in the second show, she won Best Dutch, and followed that with Best In Show! Would she mature enough to win at the upcoming ARBA Convention only three weeks away?

Well, her growth slowed as she was off feed a bit after that show, but then she started coming into condition right before the Convention. She was still a young doe at only 3 ½ months old! She won her class at the Convention, and was selected Best Gray. How far would she go? The voting was done, and she received votes from two of the three for Best Dutch, but not nearly enough to be in the running for BOB. One judge, gave her no votes? Remember - love or hate her!

The only other show she went to last fall was our Ohio Dutch fall show. Always good numbers and great quality, how would the doe due? Well the gray junior doe class came up, and she was 7th out of 8! The judge did not like her at all. Love or hate!

Now she was growing and it came time that she hit six months of age. Should I breed her or hold her off for the NDS, which was still almost four months away? I did not get anything bred then due to the fact work was busy, so I was not in the barn. Then, I had a show to attend the first weekend in March. I looked at her, and she was looking pretty good. She won her class both times, but that was all.

Prior to the show, I was grooming my animals, and she was the last one I worked. She was in good condition, but had a big bunch of matted hair on her tail. She was sitting great on the table and looking good, but I had to clean up that tail! I managed to get a good bit off, but when I worked it she did not sit!! How much should I push to clean that tail? The second and only other time I had her out was Thursday before the show - looked good, but that tail! Same result, I removed more dead fur, and tried to clean the stain. Although it looked better, she did not like me messing with it!! Would this cause her not to sit at the show?

The Gray Sr doe was judged. My doe won the class! Loved her!

The Best of Breed balloting was done - the Gray doe had three out of four votes for first place! She won! Loved her!

Now, the lost interesting part of this - the judged that hated (or did not like her) at the ARBA Convention - Scott Williamson, and the judge that did not like her at the fall Ohio Dutch show - Glen Carr - two of the three judges who voted her first place! Love her or hate her, but remember I had relegated her to brood doe status!

udging at a National Jutch Show is one of the most exciting privileges an ARBA judge Everyone can have. attending the show is always enthusiastic and There are friendly. no exhibitors at any show more passionate about their breed than Dutch breeders. truly appreciated the opportunity to attend the show and see all of my friends as well as

all of the fantastic rabbits. This year the show topped all expectations. The set-up was fantastic. I just wish the weather could have cooperated more.

The classes I judged were Black Senior Does, Blue Senior Bucks, Chocolate Junior Does, Steel Senior Does, Tortoise Junior Bucks, and Gray Senior Bucks. Our Dutch continue to improve as a breed due to the ongoing efforts of you the outstanding breeders. There were only a handful of animals that did not have good type. The heads on most of the animals were fantastic. The top 12 Black Senior Does and top 10 Gray Senior Bucks were a joy to handle. The animals at the top of each class were very well marked. Unfortunately, some of the better animals were not quite finished in coat and color, which prevented them from competing for Best of Breed.

The only recommendation I have is for the Steel and Gray breeders to keep working on color as there was a vast difference in color in these varieties. As a class the Chocolate Junior Does were the deepest class I judged and it was great to see the tremendous improvement in depth of the class compared to some in the past. Those of you that do not raise Chocolates better be ready for some stiff competition for best of breed in the next few years as these breeders are serious!

The new process for picking specials was different for everyone. I think the judges were all a little apprehensive when it started. However, when all the rabbits on the table for specials are very nice it makes for a fun job. I want to congratulate everyone that exhibited at the show. The owners of the Gray Senior Doe and Black Junior Buck deserve special recognition; however, to each of the class winners I salute you!

Finally, congratulations and thank you for everyone that contributed to making the show a success. The writers and rabbit carriers were dedicated, organized and courteous. I hope to get the opportunity to judge the show again in the future.

From the Sweepstakes Chair

It was a pleasure seeing so many of you at the 2008 NDS in Illinois, and also getting to visit just a bit with those that I haven't seen since Grand Rapids or before. I especially enjoyed meeting so many that I have only had the opportunity to visit with via written correspondence. This is always an added treat for anyone! The 2008 NDS was very well represented with both Dutch exhibits and exhibitors, and I want to extend my early best wishes for the same great turnout for the Kansas group in 2009! Please support them in any way possible!

Now, I'd like to take just a minute to discuss the processing of those sanctions received here. I want to emphasize that I will gladly accept late requests for ADRC sanctions provided that they arrive here noting a postmark date PRIOR to the date of the actual show. I will not issue a sanction for any show that has already been held. Individuals requesting that a show be sanctioned MUST have the permission of the show sponsor before this can be done. If you want to sanction Dutch at an upcoming show, you must first contact the show sponsor and receive their approval. All ADRC sanctions are then issued to the show's secretary, as this is the individual who will complete and return the report at the show's completion. Sanctions will not be issued if the required sanction fees and the ARBA numbers are not provided along with the request.

If you haven't yet received your ADRC sanction numbers for an upcoming show, please first check with the individual who actually sent for the sanctions to make certain as to when they applied for them. Unfortunately, I am finding more and more that one individual applies for the sanction, but someone else might then email only a week or so later to ask why they haven't yet received their numbers. What usually happens here is that those checking on the sanction status might have been told that they were sent for a month or two ago, when in fact, they were only sent for a week or so before. This happens much too frequent making it appear as though some simply don't want to say that they only just applied for the sanction after their original intent to send the request in a month or so before. I keep the original envelope that clearly shows the postmark date of the request, plus my files not only show the day it was received here, but the check number used in payment. This usually makes it easy to determine what or who may have created any delay in receipt of their numbers.

This issue of the DR includes 154 show reports. If you feel that there is an err in a listed report, please don't hesitate to contact us here. Since I haven't yet found the ability to part any water anywhere, I'm simply going to have to admit to making some mistakes. I've also found mistakes on the submitted report itself, as well as the exhibitor sometimes being in err in their thought. So, should you have any questions, please ask, but be sure to include any information that you can on the particular show. You might also want to remember that if a show is NOT YET listed, any points you may have earned there have not yet been included in the standings posted.

As always, I wish each of you a terrific "Dutch" show season, and many "Best In Show" wins.

Winter will be here before we know it. Let's hear from everyone with your tips and secrets for getting your rabbits through the cold months.


