

ADRC Distinguished Service Award

- The Distinguished Service Award is created to recognize ADRC Members that have selflessly given of their time and talent to the ADRC.
- Any ADRC Member, past or present, living or deceased, can be nominated for this honor.
- The Distinguished Service Award Nomination Form will appear in the Dutch Reporter at least once a year.
- The Distinguished Service Award Nomination Form will be available on the ADRC website and upon request from the ADRC Secretary.
- The Distinguished Service Award Nominee has:
 - served the ADRC with the generosity of their time and talents for the betterment of the club and promotion of the Dutch breed not only a national level, but also a local level.
 - demonstrated a genuine dedication to the future of the Dutch breed which may have been done through the guidance of youth and education of new Dutch breeders.
 - shown integrity and strength of character through their service to the ADRC.
 - set an example of how we can all be active within the ADRC.
- The Nomination for the Distinguished Service Award can be made at any time of the year by a current ADRC member and submitted to the ADRC Secretary.
- The ADRC Secretary will then provide the nomination to the President for discussion with the ADRC Board of Directors.
- The decision for this award is made by the ADRC President in collaboration with the ADRC Board of Directors.
- The Distinguished Service Award will be announced at the National Dutch Show Awards banquet or the ARBA Convention Dutch Awards Ceremony.
