Jim Rydell, Ron Claussen , Wes Nelson, have reviewed the following accounts for October 1 thru December 31, 2010 for the American Dutch Rabbit Club and note the following;

It was reported that there were two outstanding checks that hadn't cleared the bank as of 12/31/10. Check #671 in the amount of \$20.00, and check #698 in the amount of \$40.00. These have already been deducted from the General Fund Account Balance that is listed on the Balance Sheet. The actual balance from the 12/31/2010 bank statement for the General Fund checking account is \$9790.58.

The financials appear to be well documented and in good order. A running journal of all the transactions is being maintained, along with copies of the receipts and checks involved in all transactions. No problems noted.

In reviewing the activity in each account from the 12/31/2009 ending balances we note the following change;




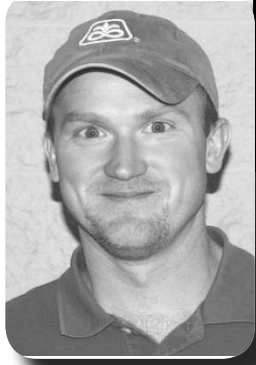

Director's Report District Three

and Youth Programs*

Part I: Building an Endowment

At the past two National Dutch Shows, the American Dutch Rabbit Club (ADRC) Board of Directors have discussed the possibility of building an endowment to permanently fund the ADRC Youth Scholarship Program. We can all agree on the utility of this type of program. Personally, I would like to see the ADRC take the lead again and demonstrate how to develop a permanent funding mechanism. To date, the ADRC Scholarship Committee has done a fantastic job in raising funds for the annual scholarship program. Building an endowment would channel monies to the principle so that the funds available annually will continue to grow.

An action plan needs to be developed to raise enough funds so that the interest earned from the principle would generate enough money to fund the annual scholarship; the problem being the ever fluctuating market. Honestly, a minimum of \$20,000 should be raised to generate a suitable return. Wow, that seems like a whole lot of money. But you know what, if we don't start somewhere, we'll never start. So let's make that our initial or primary goal. Do not worry for now about the rate of return, focus on the principle fund.

So, how do a bunch of Dutch rabbit breeders get the job done? My first and probably my best thought is to engage and challenge the primary,



potential benefactors: Youth. Who has more energy, charisma and great ideas than the junior exhibitors in our club? The big payback from this challenge results in a sense of ownership and accomplishment in the young Dutch breeders in the ADRC. Couple that with the membership of several of the Dutch specialty clubs throughout our country, we certainly have a winning combination.

Now, the challenge: As many of you know, I have been breeding, showing, judging and selling Dutch rabbits for over 40 years. I cannot sufficiently express with words how this breed and people who raise/raised Dutch have helped me develop both personally or professionally. On July 1, 2011, I will send the ADRC Secretary-Treasurer, Rick Billups, a check for \$2,000 to be deposited in an interest-earning account with the following conditions:

1. The funds will stay in that interest-earning account for one year;

2. During that year, if any youth group or youth member raises money for the Youth Scholarship endowment and sends the same to Rick Billups to be deposited in the endowment account, 10% of the value of what is sent to the ADRC will be drawn or encumbered from the special interest-earning account. For example, if a group of California Youth Dutch breeders raise \$1,200 for the scholarship endowment; \$120 will be encumbered from the \$2,000 account and permanently added to the youth scholarship endowment;

3. On July 1, 2012, if any of the \$2,000 remains; it will be returned minus any interest it has earned. My hope is that I will not get any of the \$2,000 back. In other words, if the youth in our great club raise at least \$20,000 for the ADRC Youth Scholarship Endowment, the principle will actually be \$22,000;

4. I challenge any Dutch specialty club or person to help this fund grow. Help our youth with ideas to generate capital for the principle or make a direct contribution to the fund. I would recommend to the ADRC Board of Directors to develop a method of appropriate recognition for capital investors;

5. Share ideas as to how to generate endowment capital. For example, many states have a very good recycling program. Collecting aluminum cans and plastic bottles to recycle can generate significant capital. With minimal effort, \$100 may be raised by recycling in a very short period of time. Multiply this times

several youth members or groups recycling, the endowment can grow very quickly. So many other ways to raise capital for the endowment may be designed by the young, bright minds I spoke of earlier...

The accounting responsibilities for this endowment will fall on the shoulders of our very capable Secretary-Treasurer, Rick Billups. Although I have not yet visited with him about the extra work, I am confident that Rick will gladly provide the time and expertise to guarantee the success of capitalizing the endowment.

Hopefully, the “buzz,” brainstorming and work will yield substantial funds for the endowment. I am confident that the ADRC junior exhibitors and youth members will charge toward this challenge, never retreating, since they are the same individuals who may directly benefit from a permanent endowment designed to continually grow. In addition, most of the rabbit breeders I am proud to consider friends are very goal-oriented. The goal for this year has been outlined, challenging each of you to develop and implement a plan to generate endowment capital.

Part II: Take pride in your Dutch

At the 2011 National Dutch Show, I offered to reimburse any ADRC YOUTH member for the cost of a Grand Champion certificate (\$4.00 each). In order to claim this incentive, a junior or youth ADRC member must send me a photocopy of the Grand Champion certificate:

You can send just one photocopy of the Grand Champion certificate or photocopies of 15+ different certificates in each mailing. The Grand Champion certificates must be dated May 1, 2011 or after. The incentive will run approximately one calendar year. So, by June 1, 2012, I must have received all ADRC Youth Grand Champion certificates.

The ADRC is very fortunate to have such quality junior/youth exhibitors. I hope that I have challenged you to develop a plan, set and complete a goal and feel great about your accomplishments. Success is based on planning, goal setting, hard work and commitment. Do you have what it takes to succeed? I know that you do, let's show other rabbit breeders how to enjoy success!

MINUTES OF ADRC BOARD MEETING APRIL 29, 2011

The Membership meeting was called to order by President Sue Hill. Directors in attendance were: President Hill, Vice President Rick Lehmann, Secretary-Treasurer Rick Billups, District 1 Directors: John Graybeal and Allan Gerhart, District 2 Directors: Dick Gehr, Julie Hume, and Dan Schwandt, District 3: Directors Troy Ihrke and Scott Williamson. Excused from the meeting were Directors Billy Bounds and Anthony Campbell.

Dan Schwandt moved to approve the minutes from the board meeting held at the 2010 ARBA Convention in Minnesota as printed in the 2010 Oct-Nov-Dec Dutch Reporter, Al Gerhart seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Rick Billups provided a 1st Quarter 2011 Treasurer's report which stated a net income of \$492.40. Rick also reported bank account balances of \$10,905.74 in the Contingency Fund, 10,060.14 in the General Fund and \$3,581.59 in the Scholarship fund. Rick Lehmann moved to accept the Treasurer's report as stated by Rick Billups, and Troy Ihrke seconded that motion. Motion passed. Rick also provided the board with an updated account statement as of 4/23/2011.

Committee Reports

ARBA Booth Decorating: Sue Hill asked that the board consider setting a budget for this committee. Previous board discussions had only given a range of \$125 to \$175. A motion was made by Rick Lehmann to establish an annual budget of \$175.00, motioned was seconded by Scott Williamson. Motioned passed.

Website: Julie Hume discussed the idea of moving the "Ask the Breeder" column from the Dutch Reporter to the Website. The board approved the idea of moving the questions to the Website and reimbursing Julie for all annual expenses associated with www.formmail.com, roughly \$13.00 per year plus \$39.00 for the previous 3 years. The motion was made by Dan Schwandt and seconded by Scott Williamson. Motion passed with Julie Hume obtaining from the vote.

Sweepstakes: No report

Sanctions: No report

Seller's Class: No report.

Scholarship: Sue Hill mentioned that Sharon Mixdorf has asked to be replaced as Chairman but that she would like to remain on the committee. Al Gerhart suggested we consider a 50/50 raffle for future NDS and Conventions as a source of fund raiser. It would make the raffle consistent with the prize for each at NDS and Convention.

Publicity: Jeff Brown reported on the financial status of the committee. The committee currently has \$8,673.00 in inventory and \$2,106.97 in the bank. Jeff also reported they had received several great suggestions for items to consider carrying and that they encourage other ideas from the membership.

Standards: No report given.

Dutch Reporter: No report given. Sue Hill asked Dick Gehr how long it takes to create the DR and his reply was 7-10 days to create the file once he's received everything from the membership. The printer is allowed 1-2 weeks to print and mail the DR.

Historian: No report given

Hall of Fame: Sue Hill reported that Stan Goelein had gone back in time and created a list of 25 past members to be recognized for their contributions to the ADRC. After lengthy discussion a motion was made by Scott Williamson to approve the list of 25 people and to allow the membership to select a "title" for this group of individuals since they are not being inducted into the Hall of Fame. Motion was seconded by Dan Schwandt and approved by the board.

Scott Williamson has donated \$50.00 to be awarded to the member who comes up with the name for this new group of inductees.

Youth Liaison: Al Gerhart reported that there were 20 entries in this year's Royalty contest, 16 girls and 4 boys. Discussion also took place at this time concerning parents grooming their children's rabbits. It was suggested to post a reminder in the showroom as well as in all future NDS Show Catalogs.

Scott Williamson and John Graybeal will work together to create a set of proposed rules to submit to the ARBA Show Rules Committee.

ARBA Judges Committee: Scott Williamson was contacted by the host of the 2011 ARBA Convention to add 1 extra judge to both the Open and Youth due to the numbers of entries expected. Paul Jurgelonis has been added to



the open list and will judge with Allen Barr and Joe Lugo. David Moll has been added and will judge with Kelli Slack. It's continued to be a challenge to secure judges so far in advance.

Al Gerhart and Dan Schwandt were added to this committee.

Financial Review: A written financial review report was submitted to the Board. The review covered the 2010 fourth quarter financial documents and was performed by James Rydell, Ron Claussen and Wes Nelson. The committee reported the financials were well documented and in good order. No problem noted.

Old Business

Judging Order: Kevin Hooper had previously suggested to the board that we consider allowing the Senior Judge to choose which class they would start judging. The Senior Judge currently starts with Black Senior Bucks. Kevin's suggestion would allow the Senior Judge to select which class he/she would like to start judging. Motion by Scott Williamson and seconded by John Graybeal to leave the judging order as we currently have it. Motion passed.

Past DR's on the web site: The board agreed that DR's older than 1 year can be posted on the web site.

Committee Appointments: Sue Hill submitted her suggested committee appointments for 2011. The board is to review them and let he know of any possible concerns or suggestions they may have. Sue asked the board to consider a new committee called the "minutes committee". This group of members would review minutes from the prior membership meeting and recommend to the membership to approve these minutes. Motion was made by Al Gerhart and seconded by Julie Hume to skip the minutes committee and let the membership continue to approve the minutes. Motion passed.

ADRC Guidebook: Kelli Slack reported her committee is moving ahead and have a goal of providing the board with a rough draft of the Guidebook at the 2011 ARBA Convention. The guidebook with be 3-hole punched and in a binder. The committee is soliciting ads for the guidebook and is offering a discount for ads placed by May 15th and all ads are due by July 1st. The committee is still accepting articles for the guidebook. Target date for the new guide book is late 2012. Kelli is working with printers for quotes on printing 1,000 guidebooks.

New Business

Better communication within the board: Sue Hill led the discussion on how to improve email communication between the board. The board agreed to conduct electronic communications in the following manner.

1) Copy all board members on open discussions then once a vote is called the board members have 2 weeks to respond.

2) All votes conducted by email are to go to Sue Hill only, no other members should be copied.

3) Sue Hill will tally the votes and then send out a follow up email to all board members with the results.

Present and Future Presentations/Bids for NDS: Sue Hill introduced the bid from Kansas to host the 2014 NDS. The bid was submitted by Nancy Kennedy on behalf of the Kansas State Dutch Club. Scott Williamson made a motion to accept the bid, seconded by Dan Schwandt. Motion passed and the 2014 NDS was awarded to Kansas.

Al Gerhart submitted a verbal bid on behalf of the Ohio State Dutch Club to host the 2015 NDS in Wilmington at the same show site as the 2010 NDS. Troy Ihrke also mentioned that his local Dutch club has interest in possibly hosting the NDS. After much discussion the bid was tabled. The board would like all bids for the 2015 NDS to be submitted to the board prior to the start of the 2011 ARBA Convention.

ARBA Convention Breed Chairs: Sue reminded the board that Val and Kelli Slack are Breed Co-Chairs for the 2011 ARBA Convention in Indy. The Dutch Headquarter Hotel will be the Staybridge Suites just 15 minutes north of the fairgrounds.

Nancy Kennedy has offered to be Breed Chairman for the 2012 ARBA Convention in Wichita Kansas. The board accepted her offer.

Continuation of Youth Reps from each district: Sue Hill asked if the board would like to continue having Youth Reps from each district. The board agreed to keep the current format.

Resumes for Directors/Officer: Sue Hill reminded the board that all petitions to run for a Director position were due to Secretary Rick Billups by May 1, 2011.

A motion was made by Dan Schwandt to adjourn the meeting seconded by Rick Lehmann. Motion passed.

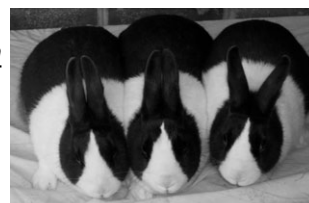

During the spring I had 3 junior does (luckily a black, a blue, and a tort) that were very nice. The black doe BELL went to 2 shows and recouped well. In 2011, the Upper Midwest Dutch Rabbit Club created a very memorable National Dutch Show for all in attendance. Manitowoc, Wisconsin will always be a great landmark in my Dutch Show memory. In 2005, in the same city (Manitowoc, WI), I was honored to be selected for the ADRC Hall of Fame with my good friend, Fred Mullinax. I was not able to attend the 2005 NDS, but I was sure delighted to have been at this one!

The Black Senior Doe that won the 2011 Open National Dutch Show is Doc's Farewell Nancy. I would personally like to acknowledge and thank

each fellow Dutch breeder and other friends who have extended their congratulations to me. Doc's Farewell Nancy rode from California to Wisconsin courtesy of my good friends, Travis & Colby Seymore and Brian & Blaine Mills (44 hours). Any exhibitor who lives on the extreme East or West coast understands the challenge of transporting our rabbits to our national shows. I am truly grateful to the Mills and Seymore families for their friendship, loyalty and help.

6. Doc's Farewell Nancy has won 2 Best in Shows and 5 Reserve in Shows, so far

Thank you to the great show committee, the wonderful judges and my friends who raise and show the finest rabbit in the ARBA, the Dutch! Remember, you can't be the Dutch or the people who raise them!

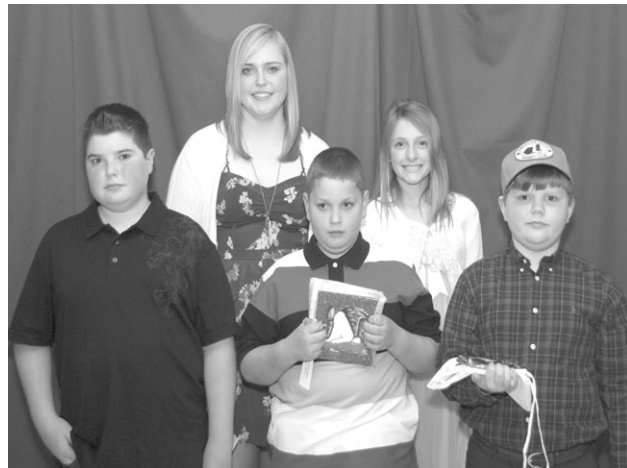

NOTE RECEIVED FROM BRIONY: I would like to thank John Milroy and Melody Stremkowski for their purchase of my bred blue senior doe in the Seller's Class at the 2011 NDS. I had hoped she would bring a good price, but had no idea she'd sell for \$520 and break the record for the highest sale! I hear she did produce a litter, and I hope it's the first of many litters of top-notch Dutch!

On the long drive home I had plenty of time to think and wondered if this was still the highest sale if previous Seller's Classes had been adjusted for inflation. I searched through the issues of the DR posted on the website, recorded the highest selling price at NDS auctions from 1981 on, and plugged them into an online inflation calculator. The answer?

I'm not even close! At the 1983 National Dutch Show, Les and Louise Johnson (also Kansas breeders!) entered a black doe who was purchased by Bill Lorenz for \$310. In 2011 dollars, that sale amounts to \$700.01! There were several other sales in the past 30 years that, adjusted for inflation, were upward of \$350. This included another Johnson rabbit which, in 1986, sold for the equivalent of \$533.54.

I'd like to encourage everyone to consider entering a quality rabbit in the Seller's Class at the next NDS or Convention. Kristy Hume told me she enters her best sale rabbit. Why not do the same? Choose the best you're willing to part with, advertise it ahead of time and at the show, and see if you can take the record away from Kansas!

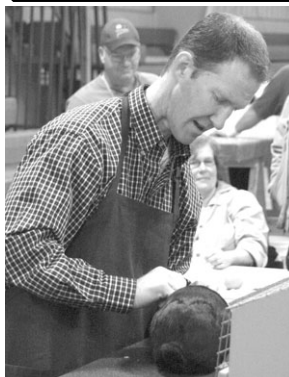

Proposed ADRC Constitution and By-laws

AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB CONSTITUTION & BYLAWS

Constitution

Article I – Name: The name of the club shall be the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Incorporated, hereafter referred to as (ADRC).

Article II – Organizational Purposes:

1. Promote, encourage and improve the breeding of Dutch rabbits by maintaining an organization to uphold the standards, encourage showing and provide services to all of its members.
2. Offer opportunities for all members to gain organizational and leadership skills while being a member of the ADRC.

Article III – Affiliation: This club shall be affiliated with the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc, hereafter referred to as (ARBA)

Article IV – Organization: This club is organized into three geographical Districts as follows:

District 1: Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, District of Columbia, and West Virginia.

District 2: Alabama, Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Tennessee, and Wisconsin.

District 3: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington, Wyoming, and all Countries outside the United States.

Article V- Membership:

Section 1: Eligibility: A person may become a member of the ADRC upon completion of an application with the current membership fee to the club Secretary-Treasurer, hereafter referred to as (Secretary).

Section 2: Membership in Good Standing: A member must have a fully paid membership and not be currently under any disciplinary action imposed upon by the club.

Section 3: Memberships: Memberships are offered as;

- A. Youth: An individual membership available to a person up to the age of nineteen (19) at the time the membership application is processed.
- B. Adult: An individual membership available to a person nineteen (19) years or older at the time the membership application is processed.
- C. Family Membership: A membership consisting of two or more individual(s) that reside in the same household at the time their membership application is processed.
- D. Life Membership: Any member who has been an adult member in good standing for thirty-five (35) consecutive years, regardless of



age, shall be granted a life membership at the beginning of his/her Thirty-Sixth year of membership, and will be exempt from paying any membership dues. Any member who has twenty-five (25) consecutive years of membership shall be granted a life membership upon reaching the age of sixty-five (65), and will be exempt from paying membership dues.

Section 4: Membership Dues: Membership dues will be reviewed as necessary by the Board of Directors. If a modification is recommended, it shall be the decision of the Board of Directors whether or not any modifications in membership fees is made. If the membership dues are modified, the change will take effect on January 1st of the year following the vote.

Section 5: Membership Term: All memberships, with the exception of the life membership, will be for a period of one (1) year from the date the application is processed by the club Secretary. An applicant may pay for multiple years of

membership provided the appropriate dues are submitted at the time their membership application is processed.

Section 6: Lapsed Membership: After a membership has expired, the member(s) named within that membership have a grace period of sixty (60) days from the expiration date to renew their membership(s). All privileges afforded an ADRC member are forfeited if not renewed within the grace period.

Section 7: Membership Reinstatement: If a membership lapses beyond the sixty day grace period, it may be reinstated and backdated to maintain continuous membership in the ADRC.

- A. If the membership has lapsed for less than one (1) year, only the current membership fee will be charged.
- B. If the membership has lapsed beyond one (1) year, the requirement will be to pay the current membership fee for each year of lapsed membership as well as an additional twenty-five (\$25) dollars.
- C. The reinstated membership(s) include ONLY the original join date. No Sweepstakes points, Dutch Reporters, or awards will be reinstated.

Section 8: Voting Rights: All adult members in good standing shall have the privilege to vote.

Section 9: Membership Benefits: Each individual adult, youth or family membership shall receive a copy of the club guidebook and a one year's subscription to the club's publication, the Dutch Reporter. All members in good standing and those in accordance with Section V, Article 6, are eligible to compete in the club Sweepstakes competition per current Sweepstake rules at any sanctioned Dutch show.

Section 10: Name Infringement: No member or candidate for membership may infringe upon the name of the ADRC or any specialty Dutch rabbit club.

Article VI: Membership Meetings:

Section 1: Meetings: A membership meeting will be held during the National Dutch Show and the ARBA National Convention. The meeting time will be determined and posted during the opening days of both conventions. A full membership meeting requires the physical presence of twenty-five (25) voting ADRC members in good standing to satisfy quorum requirements.

Section 2: Participation in Meetings: All members in good standing may participate in the meetings of the full membership, and all members, with the exception of the youth members, may vote on any club matter requiring a vote of the membership.

Section 3: Special Meeting of the Membership: In addition to the Spring and Fall meetings, the President or Board of Directors have the discretion to call a Special Meeting of the membership at either the National Dutch Show or the Annual ARBA Convention.

Section 4: Board of Directors meetings: A minimum of five (5) days advance notice will be provided to all Directors for meetings to be held during the NDS and ARBA conventions. Meetings of the



Board of Directors may be held in person, by conference call or by other electronic means (i.e., Internet meetings), or a combination of in person and otherwise, and the participation of a 2/3 majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum. Special meetings may be called as determined by the President.

Section 5: Order of Business: The membership meetings of the club shall adhere to the following order of business unless modified by the Board of Directors:

1. Calling of Meeting to Order
2. Roll Call
3. Reading and/or Correction of Minutes from the last meeting
4. Reading and/or Correction of Financial Report
5. Report of Board of Directors
6. Standing Committee reports
7. Special Committee reports
8. Unfinished Business
9. New Business
10. Adjournment

Article VII: Election Procedure:

Section 1: Becoming a Candidate: Any adult member in continuous good standing for two (2) consecutive years prior to May 1st of the election year shall submit a resume stating the position for which they wish to become a candidate to the club Secretary no later than May 1st in the year the position is up for election. The resume will be printed in the April-May-June issue of The Dutch Reporter. All candidates must be current ADRC and ARBA members, and must be actively breeding Dutch rabbits. No one person can run for more than one position in any given election. Not more than one person from the same household may serve on the Board of Directors. Household members refer to individuals, whether related or not, who reside in the same home as their primary residence.

Section 2: Ballot Distribution & Counting: Final election ballots shall be printed on numbered, colored watermarked paper to be mailed out by August 1st to eligible voting members. Ballots shall then be marked and placed in pre-addressed envelopes, and received by the Committee Chairman no later than September 10th. The Election Committee shall then tabulate the final ballots, package and send them to the club Secretary within three months. The ballots will be retained for a period of one (1) year, during which they may be accessible to any member in good standing, provided proper arrangements can be made for examination with the Secretary. After the one (1) year holding time, the ballots may be destroyed.

Section 3: Notification of Election Results: The Secretary shall inform the candidates and the Board of Directors of the election results as soon as they are received and each elected candidate is verified as being a member in good standing. The newly elected Officers/Directors shall assume offices on the following January 1st and serve their terms or until their successors have been elected or duly appointed. In the case of a tie for any Office or Director position, a majority vote of the Board of Directors remaining shall break the tie.

Section 4: Unopposed Candidates: Any candidate running unopposed for Office shall be declared elected by the Board of Directors. No ballot will be issued for an unopposed candidate for office.

Section 5: Filling Vacant Positions: A position that has no candidate for the vacancy shall be filled by appointment made by the President with a two-thirds (2/3) approval by the Board of Directors.

Bylaws

Articles I: Board of Directors:

Section 1: Role & Responsibility of Directors: The responsibility and authority for implementing, supporting, adhering to and enforcing the Constitution & Bylaws of the club, for establishing and implementing the policies, procedures, and practices of the club that relate to the day to day operation and administration of the ADRC, shall be vested in its Board of Directors. In addition,



the Directors shall have authority to; a) transact all business of the club; b) hear and determine matters of discipline involving members of the club; c) determine and award the location of the National Dutch Show; and d) hear and decide all matters of interpretation and application of the Constitution & Bylaws, club policies, procedures and practices, other than those that require action of the entire membership.

Section 2: Election & Size of Board of Directors: The Board of Directors shall consist of twelve (12) members, nine (9) of which will be elected based on their District of residence. The President and Vice President shall be elected from any of the three Districts. The Secretary shall be appointed regardless of his/her District of residence. Candidates for Directorship are only voted upon by eligible members residing in their respective District. Candidates for President or Vice President are voted upon by the entire eligible voting membership of the club, regardless of their District of residence. Directors may be from the same state as other Directors and Officers within their District

Section 3: Executive Committee of the Board of Directors: The Officers of the club comprised of the President, Vice President, and Secretary, shall constitute the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors. They may meet whenever the President, or any other member of the Executive Committee, feels that there is a need for a meeting. The meetings can occur in person, by phone, electronically, or by a combination of these means. The only action that may be taken by the Executive Committee is to make recommendations to the Board of Directors.

Section 4: Terms of Office: The President and one (1) Director representing each District will be elected for a three (3) year tenure. The Vice President and one (1) director from each District will be elected the following year for a three (3) year tenure. The Secretary will be appointed and one (1) Director from each District will be elected the third year to serve a three (3) year tenure. The President, Vice President and the Directors are eligible to run for more than one three (3) year tenure.

Section 5: Director Action: Any action taken by the majority of the Board of Directors, including the removal of any Director and approved appointment of his/her successor, shall constitute an action of the Board of Directors.

Section 6: Compensation of Directors: Directors shall not receive a salary. The Board shall have the authority to reimburse a Director for expenditures incurred by that Director in furtherance of the purposes and objectives of the club.

Section 7: Director Disciplinary Decisions: The Board of Directors may, upon showing of cause deemed sufficient by a two thirds (2/3) majority of the Board of Directors, suspend or expel any member from the ADRC.

Article II: Duties of the Officers:

Section 1: The President: It shall be the duty of the President to a) preside over all meetings of the club and Board of Directors; b) direct the daily business affairs of the club with the normal authority of an Executive Board member; c) to act on behalf of the club and legally obligate the club, subject to approval of the Board of Directors if required; d) appoint and assign tasks as are necessary to individuals or committees.

Section 2: The Vice President: The Vice President shall assist the President and shall perform the duties of the President in the event of his/her absence or inability to perform their duty. In the event of the permanent departure from office by the President, the Vice President shall automatically succeed him/her in office.

Section 3: The Secretary: The Secretary position is a position combined with the Treasurer position, appointed by the President and subject to approval by the Board of Directors by a simple majority. He/she shall assume the role of club custodian of all written and financial records suitable to the Board of Directors. He/she shall also a) receive and process all membership applications, b) furnish an approved bond covering the assets of the club within three months of assuming office, c) furnish the club with quarterly reports showing the general financial health of the club, d) record the minutes at Board or Membership meetings, as well as any other special meeting that may



be called, e) perform any other duties assigned to him/her by the President, Vice President or the Board of Directors, f) assist with correspondences within and outside of the club as deemed necessary, g) provide financial reports to be submitted for review on an annual basis. In the event that the Secretary shall vacate the position or be replaced, he/she shall surrender all records and club materials retained in his/her capacity as Secretary to the successor at the time of the successor's appointment.

Article III: Committees:

Section 1: Types of Committees:

- A) Standing: Standing Committees are created and are assigned a task(s) to perform on an ongoing basis.
- B) Special: Special Committees are created and assigned a task(s) to perform with the understanding that upon completion of the assigned task(s) the committee will be disbanded.

Section 2: Committee Membership: All committees, both Standing and

Special, are created by decision of the Board of Directors. Membership on each committee is by appointment by the President, subject to approval by the majority of the Board of Directors. Only club members in good standing may serve.

Section 3: Committee Size and Leadership: All committees, whether Standing or Special, shall consist of an odd number of members, with the minimum size being three (3) unless specifically noted. There is no maximum number of members. The President shall appoint a committee Chairman for each working committee. The Chairman shall a) preside over the meetings of the committees, b) be responsible for maintaining records for any meetings held during the tenure of that Chairman, c) appoint another committee member as Chair in their absence during a scheduled meeting for that committee, and, d) shall provide a written or oral report to the President and/or membership when requested to do so. The President of the club is an ex officio member, meaning participating but non-voting member, of all club committees. As such, he/she shall receive notices of all meetings for each committee.

Section 4: Standing Committees: The Standing Committees are as follows:

A) Financial Review Committee: The Financial Review Committee shall consist of a Chairperson and two (2) other members. The members shall not reside in the same county as the Secretary. They shall perform a review of the financial records at a time and place designated when requested to do so. A written report of such review shall be signed by all members and submitted to the President and Secretary by a date to be determined prior to the review. The Board may retain the services of an Accountant or Accounting firm at any time to assist in an audit or review of the club's financial records.

B) Election Committee: The Election Committee is responsible for counting, tabulating and certifying the election results for all matters voted upon by the membership in good standing of the club.

- 1) The tabulation and certification of the election is to occur within the date specified on the ballot. Certification of the election results is accomplished by having all committee member signatures indicating the result of the election. The results will then be communicated to the President and Secretary.
- 2) If any of the Committee members are unable to meet to carry out their duties, the club President shall be promptly contacted and advised of which Committee member (s) are unable to carry out the duties. Different committee member(s) shall be appointed as needed, with Board Approval, prior to counting and tabulating of the ballots and certification of the election results.
- 3) No member of the Election Committee shall be eligible for election as a club Officer or Director while serving on the Election Committee.



- 4) No member of the Election Committee may serve on the committee if a family member, or household member (meaning a Candidate and a Committee member share the same household as their primary Residence) is a candidate for office for which the committee is responsible for counting, tabulating, and certifying the results of that election.
- C) Hall of Fame Committee: The Hall of Fame Committee shall be responsible for collecting nominations for a member from the general membership who is to be considered for induction into the ADRC Hall of Fame in accordance to the criteria set forth by the Committee and approved by the Board of Directors
- D) Historian Committee: The Historian Committee shall be responsible for storing and preserving ADRC organizational publications in a format acceptable to the Board of Directors. The Committee shall submit at least two (2) informational reports to be published in the Dutch Reporter annually.
- E) Publicity & Promotions Committee: The committee shall consist of one or more persons and shall be in charge of all publicity and promotional work necessary to advance the interests of the club, except for the editing of The Dutch Reporter. The committee shall provide the Editor of The Dutch Reporter with information of a promotional and publicity nature for the possible inclusion in The Dutch Reporter. The committee shall oversee the convention raffles should one take place.
 - 1) A quarterly financial report from the Publicity Chairman is to be submitted for inclusion in The Dutch Reporter in a format acceptable by the Board of Directors.
 - 2) An annual inventory report is to be submitted to the Secretary within forty five (45) days following the ARBA convention.
- F) Standards Committee: The Standards Committee shall be responsible for maintaining a continuous study of the Dutch Standard and communicating any proposed revisions or additions to the club Board of Directors. If any of the revisions or changes are approved by a simple majority vote of the ballots cast, then the Committee must submit them to the ARBA Standards Committee, along with a copy of the ballot count, including the names and signatures of the Committee appointed to tally the ballots, with the recommendation that such revisions or additions be adopted.
 - 1) The committee shall follow the progress of any new varieties of Dutch that an exhibitor has been granted a Certificate of Development for, hereafter referred to as COD. If at all possible, the holder of the COD shall annually present an animal to the Committee to examine at either the National Dutch Show or ARBA Convention.
- G) Scholarship Committee: The Scholarship Committee shall work to raise funds for a Youth Scholarship Fund, which shall be maintained by the club Secretary. The Committee will be responsible for fundraising activities, and developing and determining Scholarship Applications and criteria for awarding scholarships with the approval of the Board of Directors. They shall determine which candidates meet the criteria and will receive the Youth Scholarships to be awarded at National Dutch Show Banquet.
- I) Additional Standing Committees: The Board of Directors may create additional Standing Committees as deemed necessary to efficiently and effectively pursue the purposes and objectives of the club.



Section 5: Special Committees: The Board of Directors may create a Special Committee whenever it is deemed advisable to do so for the purpose of accomplishing a specific task that is not ongoing in nature, and upon the completion of that task, the committee is disbanded.

Article IV: Compensated Positions within the Club:

Section 1: Compensated Positions & Level of Compensations: The club will compensate the occupants of the following positions:

- A) President: The President is to receive a compensation set forth by the Board of Directors.
- B) Club Secretary: The club Secretary shall receive Twenty-Five (25%) percent of all new, renewal and Life membership dues received, and ten (10%) percent of the Sanction fees as compensation for his/her services. No compensation will be paid from any Life Memberships awarded to a member.
- C) Sweepstakes Chairperson: The Sweepstakes Chairperson shall receive compensation in the amount to be determined by the Board of Directors. The Sweepstakes Chairperson shall provide the Dutch Reporter Editor with a typed, quarterly report of standings for both Open and Youth contests, and will include the top Twenty (20) Open and Youth exhibitors. The Chairperson will also provide a report of standings to the Chairperson of the ADRC Web site on a quarterly basis.
- D) Dutch Reporter Editor: The Editor of The Dutch Reporter shall be responsible for the editing and publication of The Dutch Reporter on a quarterly basis. Two or more members will be named to assist in the editing of the final version of The Dutch Reporter prior to publication.
- E) Sanctions Chairperson: The Sanctions Chairperson shall be responsible for granting Sanction requests to clubs wishing to host Dutch Sanctioned shows, and shall receive compensation in the amount of Fifteen (15%) Percent from each paid sanction.
- F) Publicity & Promotion Chairperson: The Chairperson of the Publicity & Promotion Committee shall be paid an amount to be determined by the Board of Directors, not to exceed One Hundred and Fifty dollars (\$150.00) for each convention that he/she transports ADRC publicity items to be offered for sale at the club booth. Said funds will be paid from the General Fund.

Article V – Apportionment of Funds:

Section 1: Membership Dues: The Membership dues are to be apportioned as follows:

- A) Secretary/Treasurer: The club Secretary/Treasurer is to receive Twenty-five percent (25%) of the membership dues.
- B) Publicity & Promotion Committee: The Publicity & Promotion Committee is to receive Twelve and one-half percent (12.5%) as the operating budget.
- C) General Fund: The remaining Sixty-two and one half (62.5%) of the Membership dues collected will be placed in the General Fund, with one dollar (\$1) from this amount to be placed in the Guidebook/Contingency Fund. The General Fund will be used to pay for expenditures incurred in furtherance of the club's purposes and objectives that are not specifically budgeted for elsewhere. Specific allocations to be made from the General Fund include the following, in the following amounts, both of which are subject to review and revision by the Board of Directors.
 - 1). National Dutch Show Sponsors: The sponsors of the National Dutch show are to receive an amount no less than Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars, with the stipulation that the ADRC receive recognition for the allocation. Said allocation will be sent to the show sponsors when all National Dutch Show judges are secured.



2) ARBA allotment: An annual allotment, in an amount no less than Three Hundred (\$300) Dollars shall be paid towards the ARBA Convention, with the stipulation that this be equally divided between the Open and Youth Dutch specials. The above specials are to be advertised as having been donated by the ADRC.

Article XI – Discipline of Members:

Section 1: Discipline Imposed by Board of Directors: The Board of Directors may impose a discipline upon a member or members, upon receiving and investigating the complaint, and finding the complaint to be valid.

Section 2: Complaint Filing Process: A complaint may be filed by any member, or by the Board of Directors, naming the member and describing the nature of the complaint. The complaint is to be filed with a member of the Executive Committee, and will be filed within the club records.

Section 3: Disciplinary Process: The President may choose to form a Special Committee to further discuss the nature of the complaint. The committee will then report any suggestions for discipline to the Board of Directors. The final decision as to what discipline will be imposed shall be at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Article VII – Amendments to the Constitution & Bylaws:

Section 1: Initiation of Proposed Amendment: The Constitution & Bylaws of the ADRC may be amended in the following manner:

- A) Proposed amendment(s) may be made by the Board of Directors, or
- B) Proposed amendment(s) may be made by the submission of fifteen (15)

voting age non-Board member names in good standing.

In both instances, the specific language of the proposed amendment(s) must be submitted to the club Secretary thirty (30) days prior to the NDS, ARBA Convention, or Special Meeting of the Membership.

Section 2: Procedure to Notify Members of a Proposed Amendment(s): Any resolution(s) or changes for amendment to the current Constitution & Bylaws shall be signed by twenty (20) ADRC members in good standing with voting privileges, and submitted to the Constitution & Bylaws Committee by March 1st. After review, the Chairperson will submit the resolution (s) to the President and Secretary by April 1st. The resolution(s) will be made available to the membership to review at the NDS and the shall be printed in the April-May-June edition of the Dutch Reporter, and will be sent out in the form of a ballot to the general membership by August 1st. The Constitution & Bylaws will be amended if passed with a two-thirds (2/3) majority of all eligible votes cast. All amendments shall take effect on January 1st of the following year.

Section 3: Method to Vote on Proposed Amendment(s): Voting will be by ballot on watermarked paper to be sent out by the club Secretary to all voting age members in good standing. The ballot shall include the specific language of the proposed amendment(s) of the Constitution & Bylaws with reference to the existing Constitution & Bylaws section that is to be considered for modification, or the specific section to be deleted, or the specific location where the new section is to be inserted. Ballots shall be marked and placed in pre-addressed envelopes, and received by the Election Chairman by the date specified on the ballot. The Special Committee appointed by the Board shall then tabulate, package and send the final ballots to the club Secretary by the date specified. The ballots will be retained for a period of one (1) year, during which they may be accessible to any member in good standing, provided proper arrangements can be made for examination with the Secretary. After the one (1) year holding time, the ballots may be destroyed. All ballots received after the deadline date shall be void and such ballot will not be counted.

Section 4: Requirement to Amend the Constitution & Bylaws: A two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the membership casting a vote will be required to pass a motion to amend the Constitution & Bylaws.

Section 5: Notification of Results: The appointed Committee to tabulate the ballots shall communicate the results to the President and Secretary as soon as the results are known. The



membership shall be informed of the results of the vote in any combination of the following manner:

- A) Printing of the results in the next Dutch Reporter.
- B) Displaying of results on the Dutch Web Site.
- C) Announcement of results at the following the Membership ARBA or NDS meetings.

Section 6: Certification of Voting: Certification of the voting shall be accomplished by obtaining all committee member signatures indicating the result of the voting. The appointed Committee Chairperson shall send all ballots, including those deemed void from tabulation, and the certification of voting, to the club Secretary by the date specified for ballot submission.

Section 7: Effective Date of Amendment: The amendment shall take effect the first day of the month following the date of certification, unless the amendment included within the proposal specifies a date for it to become effective.

Article VIII – Parliamentary Authority:

The meetings of the club shall follow the parliamentary procedure set forth in Roberts Rules of Order

Amendments to the ADRC Constitution and Bylaws:

October, 2010

Financial Review Committee: The Financial Review Committee shall consist of a Chairperson and two (2) other members. The members shall not reside in the same county as the Secretary. They shall perform a review of the financial records at a time and place designated when requested to do so. A written report of such review shall be signed by all members and submitted to the President and Secretary by a date to be determined prior to the review. The Board may retain the services of an Accountant or Accounting firm at any time to assist in an audit or review of the club's financial records.

Amendments to the Constitution: Any resolution(s) or changes for amendment to the current Constitution & Bylaws shall be signed by twenty (20) ADRC members in good standing with voting privileges, and submitted to the Constitution & Bylaws Committee by March 1st. After review, the Chairperson will submit the resolution (s) to the President and Secretary by April 1st. The resolution(s) will be made available to the membership to review at the NDS and the shall be printed in the April-May-June edition of the Dutch Reporter, and will be sent out in the form of a ballot to the general membership by August 1st. The Constitution & Bylaws will be amended if passed with a two-thirds (2/3) majority of all eligible votes cast. All amendments shall take effect on January 1st of the following year.



Ask the Breeder

This will be the last column for "Ask the Breeder". There has been a lack of participation, both in receiving questions and answers for the questions. A new feature will be presented on the American Dutch Rabbit Club website called "What do you think?" Look for information on this feature on the website soon...

ASK THE BREEDER

How exactly do you ship your rabbits, for shows and to new homes? What do you charge for additional expenses, like carriers, bedding, and travel time? Where do you get these supplies and how is payment received from buyers? Walk me through your process!

(I did not receive any replies, but this is an excerpt from an article Lisa Wittrock submitted for the Guidebook.)

From Lisa Wittrock:

Flying to national shows with rabbits is a whole different game! First you have to deal with airlines that usually don't want to talk to you, however, to reserve a spot in the baggage compartment for your animals you must talk to a reservationist. All the airlines have different interpretations of how or if this is allowed. Delta/NW and Alaska/Horizon have worked for me, others swear by Frontier. I check convenient flights/times online first. I want a flight that is as direct as possible with layovers to be 1-2 hours as you want the airline to have time to make sure your animals get on the right flight and not left out on the tarmac! Yes, that can happen! If there are too many stops along the way, the rabbits can be injured by the multiple pressure changes they experience. Don't press your luck, try for the most direct flight! Once you're found a flight that looks good, call the airline and tell them you are traveling with rabbits. I find it works best to be a bit assertive at this point because they don't usually understand what you're trying to accomplish, which is, you want to be in the cabin and the rabbits will be in the baggage compartment on the same plane, arriving at the same time! I put my Dutch in two four hole

carriers that fit in a 400 series (large) dog kennel. All the airlines need to do is handle the kennel as if a dog was inside. That's too easy. Some airlines have restrictions on how many animals can be in a kennel, and, although the rabbits are safely in individual compartments, they can limit the number of animals allowed! You've got to do your homework and communicate (that can be difficult if they aren't native English speakers). Be patient, it will eventually work out!

Next, the plane needs to be big enough to have dog kennels in the cargo hold. With the economy, they are using smaller planes that might have limited space. You should make sure the reservations include guaranteed space for your kennel(s). The airlines will charge you at the airport for your kennel and cage cart (which I highly recommend). Prices are subject to change!

The day of the flight, arrive with plenty of time. Airline personnel will check you in. They may ask for a health certificate for the rabbits. The front desk will have TSA come and inspect the animals. I try to make this as easy for them as possible. The kennel has it's top section removed and stacked under the bottom, so the TSA guys can see what's going on the plane. I put a puppy training pad in the carrier's tray so the guys don't have to sift through shavings. I have empty crocks in the holes in case there is a delay, airline personnel can give the rabbits food and water. With TSA watching, I take out the carriers, get the top section of the kennel unstacked and set aside as I put the two fourcarriers back in the bottom section and pack any feed, grooming equipment, risers, etc around in the kennel. Then I set the top section on the bottom section, connect the two halves with ziplocks, and TSA rolls the kennel away on the cart! I do have wire cutters for the ziplocks. Ask TSA if you need to put them with your checked bags. And, if you ask the flight attendant before the plane takes off she will make sure your bunnies are on board.

Blast from the Past

A True Store of a New Dutch Fancier and How it Started.....

We have shown rabbits since 1963 and always admired the little Dutch as we called them.

It all started at the Lowry City, Missouri Judges Conference and Rabbit Show, March 1968.

We were ready to leave and Mr. Eabert (Fibber) McGehee from Tulsa, OK says "John have you got an empty carrying case?" I said "yes". He handed me a little black Dutch buck and says, take this home to your little boy, Lane. Lane was 5 years old then, and was home with his Mother as there was serious illness in the family. I arrived home with the little buck, tattooed G1 and gave him to Lane, who promptly named him Fibber G1. It was cold and snowing so a box about 20" wide and 2' long was brought into the house and placed in one corner of the kitchen for Fibber's house.

Within a week he was house broke and Lane carried him around like a doll. It was just a few weeks until all the neighbors knew that Brown's rabbitry had a Dutch rabbit.

Fibber was quite a rabbit. We first let him run around the house and he became a music fan, stereo, no doubt. When he was loose and the stereo was turned on Fibber promptly would go to where one of the speakers was sitting on the floor, park his back side against it and stayed there until the music stopped. He performed for one and all.

Every day the sun was shining and ground clear, Lane would take Fibber outside in the yard and turn him loose to run around. The neighbors thought that was something because Lane could catch Fibber anywhere. He would just sit there and let Lane walk up and pick him up. Lane started to Head Start School in June and talked about Fibber to the teacher until she asked him to bring him to school. A number of kids had never touched a rabbit and Lane and

Fibber were great hits with the class. Fibber is quite a show-off. Lane told the teacher he liked music so she turned on a record player and sat one of the speakers on the floor. Lane turned Fibber loose, he promptly hunted up the speaker and stood with his front feet on it, then turning around he sat down beside it. Lane was the proudest Dutch owner alive.

When we visited Mr. & Mrs. R.J. Pearson, our close neighbors and long time Dutch Fanciers, Lane promptly told them about Fibber. Mr. Pearson said, "We have some young in the nest box and as soon as they are old enough to wean I will give you a little black doe". A few weeks later the doe arrived and Lane named her Molly which is tattooed in her ear. We tried to get him to tattoo her L1, but true to rabbit breeders he had his own ideas and nothing would do but Molly. He stood there to see that his Mother put MOLLY in her ear. With a pair now, he could hardly wait for Molly to get old enough to breed.

Lane had owned Californians since he was six months old and for two years was the youngest member of the Specialty Club. Now owning Californians and Dutch, his first love is the Dutch. Every show that we attended, Lane wanted Fibber to go. He has one blue and several second and third place ribbons to his credit. Finally Molly was old enough to breed on Dec. 20, 1968. Then on the 21st of Jan 1969, Molly had seven babies, she raised them all. Lane was the happiest Dutch breeder in Missouri. Every time someone came to look at the rabbits he had to show them the Dutch and her babies. Molly let Lane play with her and the babies; he had to go see them to make sure that they were all there. With the help of Mr. Pearson, who told us what to look for in Dutch, we decided two of the little does were good enough to keep. The other five were sold to kids around the neighborhood for pets. Every kid who saw them wanted one. One little boy came to see them and wanted one but didn't have the money and asked if we would keep it until the weekend and he could sell enough pop bottles for the money.

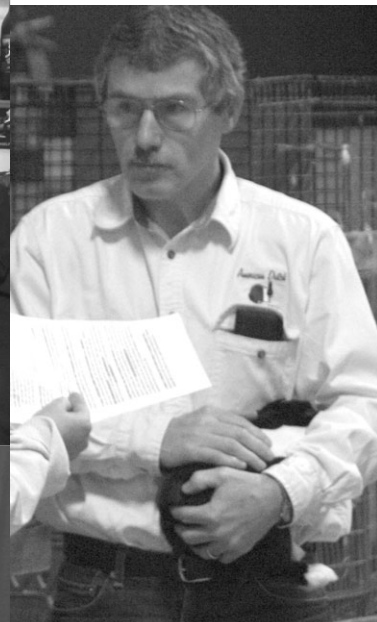

PROCEDURES FOR YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANTS

1. All applications must be submitted on forms obtained from Scholarship Committee member. *Computer forms will not be accepted unless in original format.*
2. Applicants must have held continuous ADRC membership for at least three (3) years preceding application for scholarship.
3. Applicants are eligible to apply only if they are a high school graduate under the age of 21 and currently have at least 12 credit hours of college education.
4. Applicants must have completed high school with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.00 (unweighted) on a grade scale of 4.00, and have been in the top 50% of graduating class.
5. Home schooled applicants are eligible, but must submit SAT or ACT scores, and a letter of recommendation from a person outside the immediate family.
6. All applications must include a complete High School and College transcript.
7. Scholarship proceeds may be used to further education at any accredited four (4) year college, two (2) year college, vocational, or technical school.
8. Scholarships will be paid to the member and school upon receipt of confirmation of college enrollment.
9. All applications must be postmarked by **March 15th of application year** and returned to the ADRC Youth Scholarship Foundation.
10. Applicants are only eligible to win scholarship one time.

We are looking for pictures to use in the ADRC Standard & Guidebook. We intend on replacing the line drawings of the markings with actual pictures. We need pictures of the following:

Saddle (looking down over the top of the rabbit)

Good saddle, saddle too far back, bias saddle, offset saddle, wavy saddle, dips in saddle, saddle too far forward

Undercut (looking at the underside of the rabbit)

Good undercut, dip in undercut, bias undercut, hook on elbow, wavy undercut, undercut with a drag back (either into white or color)

Blaze (looking at the head straight on)

Good blaze, blunt blaze, wavy blaze, hourglass blaze, narrow blaze, wide blaze

Cheeks (looking at one side of the head & also from the front)

Good cheek, low cheek, high cheek, square cheek, wavy cheek, hook to mouth (side view & also underneath the chin), drag onto neck, uneven cheeks (front view)

Neck (looking at the back of the head)

Good neck, full neck, dirty neck, drag onto shoulder, drag into collar, drag on ear

Stops (can be viewed from the underside of the stop or the top of the stop)

Good stops, bias stops, long stops, split stops, short stops, split stop, run into stop

Overall Type (viewed from the side of the rabbit)

Good type

Type on shoulders (viewed from the side of the rabbit)

Good shoulders, low shoulders, long shoulders

Height/Depth (viewed from the side of the rabbit)

Good height/depth, too flat, peak too soon, peak too far back

Width at the table (viewed from the backside of the rabbit)

Good width, pinched, hollow at the hip

Appearance over the top of the rabbit

Good, weak front & poor shoulder, Long & narrow, weak back, pinched

Leg structure (viewed from the underside of the rabbit)

Good width, narrow width, cow hocked

Head

Good, pointed nose, narrow, snippy

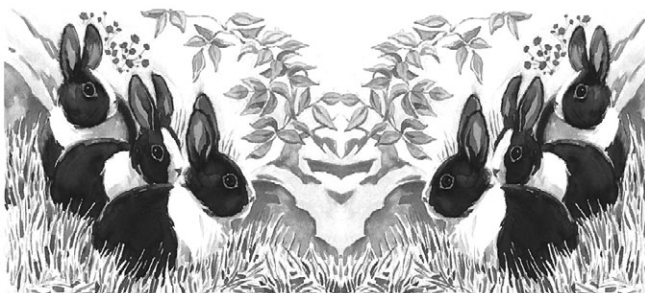
