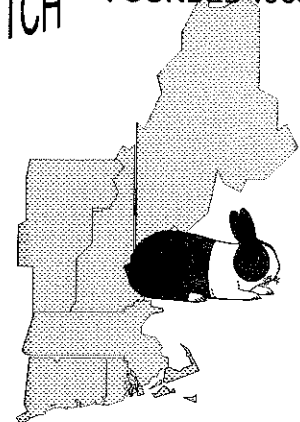

I would like to begin this message with a THANK YOU to the Ohio State Dutch Club for their fine demonstration of hospitality at the recent National Dutch Show. The facilities were excellent, and the show was enjoyed by all. Since we came from Minnesota, we still had our ice scraper in our car and so the frost on the windshield was easily taken care of.

As your secretary I need to apologize to the entire membership for the omission of the resolutions in the past Dutch Reporter. All the rules up to that point had been followed to the letter, and due to human error, the

missing resolutions were not discovered until the whole batch of Dutch Reporters had been mailed. I had hoped that the Board of Directors would approve the appearance of the resolutions in this issue, but their decision was no. I would ask each of you to please forgive my error and hope that you would continue to add the surcharge as you renew this year.

Our new Guidebook cost \$3007.27, the advertising came to \$1235. And the balance of \$1772.27 came from the contingency fund. 100 Guidebooks were passed out to members in attendance at the National Dutch Show and 491 were mailed from this office on May 14, 1996. If your dues were due before May, 1996, YOU WILL NOT receive a guidebook until you renew your membership. Please be aware that the mailing was bulk, cost 33 cents per book and will take in the neighborhood of three weeks to get to you. BULK MAIL CANNOT BE FORWARDED, so if you have changed your address, your guidebook will probably get shredded and recycled. The cost for each guidebook came to \$2., mailing came to 33 cents and the last four issues of the Dutch Reporter came to \$7.40 for a grand total of \$9.73. It is true that we can deduct the advertising in both the guidebook and the Dutch Reporter and that will cut the cost a little, but it does add up. When I took the Guidebook in for mailing I checked and was dismayed to learn that the cheapest rate for mailing the Guidebooks individually will be \$1.24. There is no discount for second or third class or book rate. This will make it VERY expensive to service new members. If anyone has an idea to be able to cut the cost, please let me know, because I have run out of ideas.

Since the Board meeting in Greenville, I have been spending much energy preparing to comply with our Constitution and By-Laws. I will try to make things as stable as I can, but the document is in need of much repair.

The first big change will be that the next Dutch Reporter must go into the mail in early August. The Constitution and By-Laws require that your ballots be

returned to me not later than September 15th.

The next Dutch Reporter will be the July-August issue in order to comply with our Constitution & By-Laws. We will be voting for a President, and a Director in each District as well as judges for the years 1998 and 1999. Thank you for supporting Dutch and the ADRC.

The 1996 National Dutch Show is now history. My sincere thanks go out to all who helped the show run smoothly: Rick and Julie Billups, Todd Uran, Shelly Thompson, Dan and Kelly Nixon, Charles and Joann Uran, Tammy and Janice Wise, Jack Wireman, Bob Hessick, Penn Peters, Roy McClung, Kevin and Vicki Bogan and all of those who helped write and carry - THANKS! We had 966 Dutch entered plus about 150 fur, and 13 AOV. The judges should be applauded for a job well done!

The biggest winner of the open show was Bob Worden with a nice Blue Sr Buck, while Ed McKinley from Michigan pulled down BOS with a Black Jr Doe. The big youth winners were Justine Caldwell and Jeremy Brown with BOB and Richie Cruz with BOS. Congratulations to all!

One of the biggest questions everyone had at the show was where will the NDS be next year? The board of Directors has received no bid for 1997 as of yet. I know the Dutch Breeders of Michigan are discussing the possibilities, Rich Billups and I have decided that we could host again at the same location next year if we do not receive a bid. We have not discussed this with the Ohio State Dutch Club at the time of this writing, but it would be much easier next time as our catalog and other vitals are already on computer. We will have a computer program towards our NDS for next year. We have talked to the creators of the program and they can make it fit our needs. We were unable to use the program to figure class money payback, specials payback, and variety points for best display. We could not do the keyboards at each table with the current program either, maybe in the future.

I was very impressed with the display of Torts at this year's NDS. The torts no longer have the long ears and narrow heads that was very common in the Torts just a few years ago. Not only have the heads and ears, improved, but the body style as well. Good job to the tort breeders!

Our raffle of Dutch from top breeders across the country was a great success. My thanks go out to Wayne MacKinnon, Tony Micallef, Jill Dobson, Lynn Shaw and Dan Nixon. The raffle brought in \$972.00. This enabled us to repay the American Dutch Rabbit Club the \$500 that was given to us as the hosts of the NDS.

We also had the privilege of having the first Dutch Hall of Fame members inducted at our banquet. The group as a whole were not only deserving, but showed very sincere appreciation as founding members of the Dutch Hall of Fame. Congratulations!

We will not be having a dues increase this year. The Const. & By-laws states that we must have the proposed changes to the C & B in the Jan/Feb issue of the Dutch Reporter. Since these were not printed, we will be working to overhaul the entire C & B and the vote on these will be in 1997. The changes, if approved will go in affect Jan 1, 1998. This means that your cooperation with the voluntary surcharge is needed. This will keep us running until a dues increase is adopted.

The reason that we are going to overhaul the C & B is because it is very out of date as to the way the club operates. Changes have been made over the years for the betterment of the club, but in many cases, these changes are in violation of our C & B. When our committee proposes changes at the ARBA Convention this fall, we will be looking to some changes that allow some flexibility. Many of our Articles are so specific, that it hinders many minor operational procedures.

The new guidebook is now out. I hope that you can use it to better your Dutch. The first attempt at color pictures was a partial success. The black, blue and gray worked well, but the reproduction of the tort was very distorted. Some ideas for the next guidebook; Have pictures contributed by breeders with the breeder paying a fee if his picture is selected. Ownership of the animal would be placed below the picture (idea from Linda Anderson). We also need articles from current breeders - who are successfully breeding Dutch. This would make our book more modern. Some of the articles in the guidebook are always going to be good. The genetics article by Joanne Parker was in the 1947 guidebook, but the information

is still current. It was discussed that we may try for another guidebook for the year 2000. Anyone interested in heading a committee to work on this? If we can begin collecting articles for it NOW, then we can work on ads the year prior to publication. I want to shoot a bunch of Dutch at the Convention this fall in Peoria. Anyone have a camera that can zoom in for a close-up?

NEWS FROM RICHARD

I will use my Director's column to explain a situation regarding the anticipated and desired American Dutch Rabbit Club dues increase.

For several years, the American Dutch Rabbit Club has been operating on a pretty tight budget. With the ever increasing costs of paper, postage, labor, etc., it is costing more to furnish the member with the same material than it did several years ago.

The American Dutch Rabbit Club has yet to raise its dues, as the club was surviving on the income we were receiving, and nobody wanted to tax the members by a dues increase if it was not necessary.

As times progress however, it has become necessary to create additional income to meet the rising operational expenses encountered by our organization. A dues increase seems like the most feasible manner to accommodate this necessity.

In Louisville, a surcharge on our membership was mandated by several of the Board members, with those present at the General Meeting endorsing this surcharge. However, in essence this was a change to the dues structure, thus a violation of the American Dutch Rabbit Club Constitution and By-Laws. I objected to this surcharge as a violation of the C & BL, and since that time it has been determined that the surcharge would no longer be enforced. There would be a resolution to change the C & BL submitted to be voted on this year, so the dues structure could be increased beginning in 1997.

Our C & BL states that all resolutions are to appear in the January/February issue of the Dutch Reporter, however no resolutions appeared. At the American Dutch Rabbit Club Board Meeting in Greenville, some Board members desired to just print the resolutions in the April/May/June issue, and proceed with voting on them, thus insuring the dues increase to be effective beginning in 1997.

Again, I objected due to a violation of the C & BL. As a Director that is supposed to uphold the C & BL, I could not support printing the resolutions in an issue other than is called for in the C & BL. Several of the other Board members were a bit upset,

as they feel the American Dutch Rabbit Club will go bankrupt and fold if the increase is not initiated immediately. Sounds a bit drastic, but that is what was implied to me in the meeting. I do not believe the American Dutch Rabbit Club will fold because the dues increase would take place beginning in 1998 instead of 1997. We have been surviving a long time on a limited income, and the club is in a much better financial situation now than it was several years ago.

My contention is that I am not opposed to a dues increase. I believe it is necessary (and long overdue) just as much as the other officers do. However, as a Director, I cannot support a known violation of the C & BL, even if nobody cares that it is a violation. That still doesn't make it right.


The additional expenses will still be there, regardless of whether what we do is right or wrong, and they must be met. However, rather than violate the C & BL, I would prefer encouraging and asking that when you send your membership dues, please send a few extra dollars if you are able to. This will have the same effect as the dues increase, will keep us operating within the boundaries of our C & BL, and will show just how much the American Dutch Rabbit Club member cares about their club.

The resolution to increase the dues WILL appear in the January/February/March

1997 issue of the Dutch Reporter, voted on in the Fall of 1997, and go into effect in January of 1998 (if passed). Until that time, it would be most appreciated if you could send in a few dollars extra to Doreen in order to help the American Dutch Rabbit Club through these times. In order to keep the quality of the Dutch Reporter, the sweepstakes ribbons and trophies, etc. at the quality and caliber that they presently are, the donations would be a great asset.

If you are able to spare a few extra dollars, just drop them to Doreen and state they are a DONATION to help the club with the additional expenses.

Thank you for your anticipated support, and if anyone cares to discuss the above please feel free to contact me at any time.

All aboard (Ben, Taylor and Katrina) were injured in varying degrees, with shoulder, ankle and neck injuries. Their Dutch rabbits survived relatively well as most of the cages were tied down in back, but one

cage still went flying through the Bronco. Fortunately, it did not hit any of the human occupants. It sounds as though they were very fortunate to have escaped alive, and very smart to have tied their cages down (something for all of us to think about). Hopefully they are all feeling better now.

Here in California the show trail for the last few months has been hot and heavy, with shows now being every weekend. Most shows now being held are double shows, either an all breed show with a Dutch specialty, or a double all breed show. Interestingly, this double show venue seems to be working very well as long as a basic strategy is followed, and the shows are over at about the same time as a single show! The clubs holding these shows have twice as many entries to defray their building costs over, and the exhibitor gets the benefit of showing twice,

making the trip more worth while. As you may have guessed, building costs here in California are very high, and many fairgrounds have simply priced themselves out of the rabbit show circuit.

Dutch here continue to show in good numbers and with excellent quality. Quality certainly has come a long way in the last several years. Enthusiasm in the breed stays high in both the youth and open divisions, although poor judging is a constant frustration.

I am convinced that the activities of the California Dutch Rabbit Club has done a lot to generate this high level of interest. If you need to generate interest in Dutch in your area, get an active Dutch specialty club going, and I am sure that you will see similar results after a couple of years.

I was honored recently by our ARBA District Director, Shannon Byrom, who invited me to present Dutch at the judge's conference at the recent California State Convention show. The attendees were split up into several small groups, who then rotated around the room every 20 minutes to each different presentation. This allowed each presenter to permit "hands on" teaching, although this meant we had to present the same information several times. This was an interesting experience, and was certainly worthwhile, but I couldn't help but notice that some of the judges who could have used the information the most weren't there! One interesting fact did come up continually from those who did attend — the judges and registrars don't like our new term "brown gray!" They seem to feel that the term "chestnut agouti" would be more in conformity with the standard ARBA terminology for colors.

It certainly has been a challenge to remember to use the new term and to change the judging order of the varietes! (Unlike some areas of the country, we judge the varieties in the order listed in the ARBA Standard)

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING OF THE ADRC 4/26/96

The American Dutch Rabbit Club Board of Directors meeting was called to order on April 26, 1996 by President Mullinax at 8:15 PM in the Little Turtle Room of the Greenville Inn in Greenville, Ohio.



Answering roll call were: President Mullinax, Vice President MacKinnon, Secretary Treasurer Bengtson, Directors Peters, Hooper, Gehr, Mixdorf, Schettler, and Carlton. Also attending, Publicity Director Billups, Dutch Reporter Editor Julia Anderson and Youth Representative Mandy Anderson. President Mullinax entertained a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last board meeting because they had been printed in the Dutch Reporter. Director Schettler made a motion that the minutes be corrected as follows: The motion about raising the ADRC Dues should read "After much discussion, a motion was made by Kevin Hooper and seconded by Lynn Shaw that the American Dutch Rabbit Club will raise annual dues to \$10 for a single adult member, \$15 for a husband/wife,

and \$8 for a youth membership effective January 1, 1996. Six board members were in agreement with the motion, one opposed. Motion carried." An omitted motion" A Motion made by Kevin Hooper, seconded by Wayne MacKinnon that we change the Constitution and By-Laws of the American Dutch Rabbit Club byresolution in accordance with article VII of the By-Laws. Motion carried.

Resolution 1- Be it resolved that we change the first sentence of Article of the American Dutch Rabbit Club By-Laws:

from: "The membership dues shall be seven dollars (\$7.00) per year payable in advance, with a combination membership being provided for husband/wife at nine dollars (\$9.00) per year, expiring with the same date."

to: "The membership dues will be determined by the American Dutch Rabbit Club Board of Directors and reviewed annually at the ARBA Convention meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club Board of Directors. Changes in dues will be approved by a simple majority of the members in attendance at the annual meeting."

Resolution 2- Be it resolved that we change the third and fourth sentences of Article I of the ADRC By-Laws:

from: "A single paid life membership may be purchased for the sum of one hundred forty dollars (\$140.00), payable in advance. A husband/wife life membership may be purchased for the sum of one hundred eighty dollars (\$180.00), payable in advance."

to: "A single paid life membership or husband/wife life membership may be purchased for twenty (20) times the yearly rate, payable in advance."

Resolution 3 - Be it resolved that we change the first sentence of Article VII of the ADRC By-Laws:

from: "Any alteration of, or amendment to the by-laws shall be made by way of a resolution, unless provided for in section 2 of article VII." (subsequent parts of this article to remain.)

to: "Any alteration of, or amendment to the by-laws shall be made by way of a resolution, unless provided for in section 2 of article VII." (subsequent parts of this article to remain.)

add: "Section 2. The Board of Directors, when deemed immediately necessary may make a temporary change to the by-laws. This may be done only by a 2/3 majority vote of the entire board of directors at one of the semi-annual meetings. The change must then be approved by a simple majority of the members present at the general membership meeting. This change in by-laws may then be effective immediately. This change may be made permanent by following the procedure outlined in Section 1 of Article VII." Director Schettler made a motion that the minutes be accepted as corrected, seconded by Director Carlton, motion carried.

Report of Officers:

Director Schettler reports that interest in Dutch in California is high. The Reno group indicates an interest in a future National Dutch Show.

Director Hooper finds sponsoring a National Dutch Show a busy time. He reports the illness of long time Dutch Breeder Stqn Goeglein of Indiana. Youth exhibitors in Ohio seem to be on

the up swing.

Secretary/Treasurer Bengtson reports that the membership stands at 647 with 279 youth members, 257 single adult members and 111 husband/wife members. The treasury stands at \$5191.59 in the general fund and \$6921.63 in the contingency fund.

Youth Representative Mandy Anderson indicated a desire to resign as youth rep to the ADRC board. Mandy recommended that Megan Gottschalk be approached to replace her.

Director Carlton reports a lull in Arizona activity. Only two regular exhibitors are currently showing. Things seem to also be pretty quiet in Utah. He reports 89 Dutch being shown in January in his area.

Director Gehr finds some new breeders in his district, some are adults, but the youth seem to be the strongest. All the "old die hards" are still there, but very selective about where they show.

Vice President MacKinnon sees enough Dutch to supply the demand in his area, but Vice President MacKinnon sees enough Dutch to supply the demand in his area, butthey lack the people. He feels that Dutch on the National level are really blossoming with all the record shows we have been having.

Director Mixdorf sees the numbers holding in her district with many of the youth exhibitors becoming adults.

Director Peters has only been to two shows recently in her district and finds the numbers pretty good in both. She reports several new breeders and concernabout judges that don't know how to pose a Dutch.

President Mullinax says things are about the same in his area. Some shows are offering large purses to the winners in hope of drawing larger numbers.

Committee Reports:

Standard Committee: There was discussion concerning the point structure of the Dutch. Expecially in the head area. Some discussion followed about working on the written description of Tortoise color in that the present description does not match what we want or are getting. Also, some of the usual discussion of Gray color, with at least one director indicating displeasure with the term "Brown Gray".

Publicity Committee: Reported the purchase of new banners for use at future National Dutch Shows and ARBA Conventions. In view of the conflicting parts of the Constitution and By-Laws on the publicity committee it was agreed that the ADRC needs to re-define the Publicity Department. Director Billups reports \$395.00 in the bank. The Board requested that Publicity Director Billups prepare a Job Description for his position.

Dutch Reporter Editor expressed thanks for the cooperation of the Board of Directors and all of the members of the ADRC. Julia indicated a need for pictures and articles for the upcoming issues of the Dutch Reporter.

Constitution & By-Laws Committee: reported that they are at work on the documents, and have found that the 1988 version of the Constitution & By-Laws seems to be the official version, It does however need much updating and revision to make everything mesh with the day to day running of the club.

Hall of Fame Committee: presented its report to the Board. They presented their recommendations for the recipients of the first Hall of Fame class. Nine members were then selected and they are: (in alphabetical order) Al Butler, Barbara Butler, Bill Geitzenauer, Stan Goegelein, Norma Hart, Anthony Micallef, George Parmer, Jack Pugh, and Jack Wireman.

Unfinished Business:

The secretary apologized for missing the absence of the previously mentioned resolutions in the January/February/March issue of the Dutch Reporter and requested that the board allow the resolutions to be printed in the April/May/June Dutch Reporter. Director Carlton made a motion to allow the printing of the above resolutions in the next issue of the Dutch Reporter. The motion was seconded by Director Hooper. The motion failed with 4 directors voting no and 4 directors abstaining.

The secretary requested direction from the Board regarding selecting judges for future National Dutch Shows and ARBA Conventions. The next ballot will contain space for members to vote for judges for the years 1998 and 1999.

The Guidebook was presented to the Board of Directors with a discussion of its production and the recommendation that Julia Anderson be given a modest amount of money to express our appreciation for her long hours of work on the new edition. Director Gehr made a motion that we give Julia Anderson \$150.00 and our thanks, the motion was seconded by Director Hooper and passed unanimously.

New Business:

A Breeder of the Year or rabbit of the year committee was discussed. Then President appointed Director Mixdorf to head that committee and report at the next Board meeting.

Director Hooper and Publicity Director Billups then presented their proposal to "farm out" a future National Dutch Show. It was noted that we still lack a bid for the 1997 NDS and that if a site could be found, the Ohio contingent would perform some of the duties.

A motion to adjourn made by Director Hooper, seconded by Director Gehr was passed. The meeting was adjourned.

NDS JUDGES REPORTS

...from Senior Open Judge Glen C. Carr

I wish to thank the Ohio State Dutch Rabbit Club for allowing me to be one of the panel of judges to work the national show this past month in Greenville, Ohio.

This was my eighth time to judge a NDS over the years and my excitement and enthusiasm has not diminished. I truly enjoyed judging this show.

The building was ideal in that there were high windows allowing for a lot of natural light. There were numerous holding pens to accommodate the large classes, lots of space, lots of help from table ramrods and carriers. All of these factors really made my job easier.

The quality of the Dutch was quite good. The deepest class as to quality I judged was the black junior does. I believe there were 48 or so and the top 25 were all above average animals that I would be proud to have in my barn. The selection of all of the specials was very exciting to me. I felt there were many excellent class winners. The best of breed winner, a blue senior buck, was a unanimous choice of our three judge panel. He was of ideal weight, very well marked, especially the stops, beautiful even dark blue color, and in fine condition. He was not perfect but darn near it.

There were several winning does that were worthy of best opposite sex and the black junior doe prevailed. She was lovely.

Judges are trained to be critical and demanding of perfection so even after handling so many nice Dutch I pondered what aspect of the Dutch breed may need improvement toward perfection. I determined after judging over 200 Dutch that day, that I was most critical about the shape of the heads. An ideal Dutch head is to be rounded and full, not to be pear shaped or narrow. The head type is valued at only five points in the standard, but animals not possessing a nicely rounded, full head really lose the "Dutch Look," especially bucks.

It was an excellent show, and I was honored that I had a part in it. Thanks again.

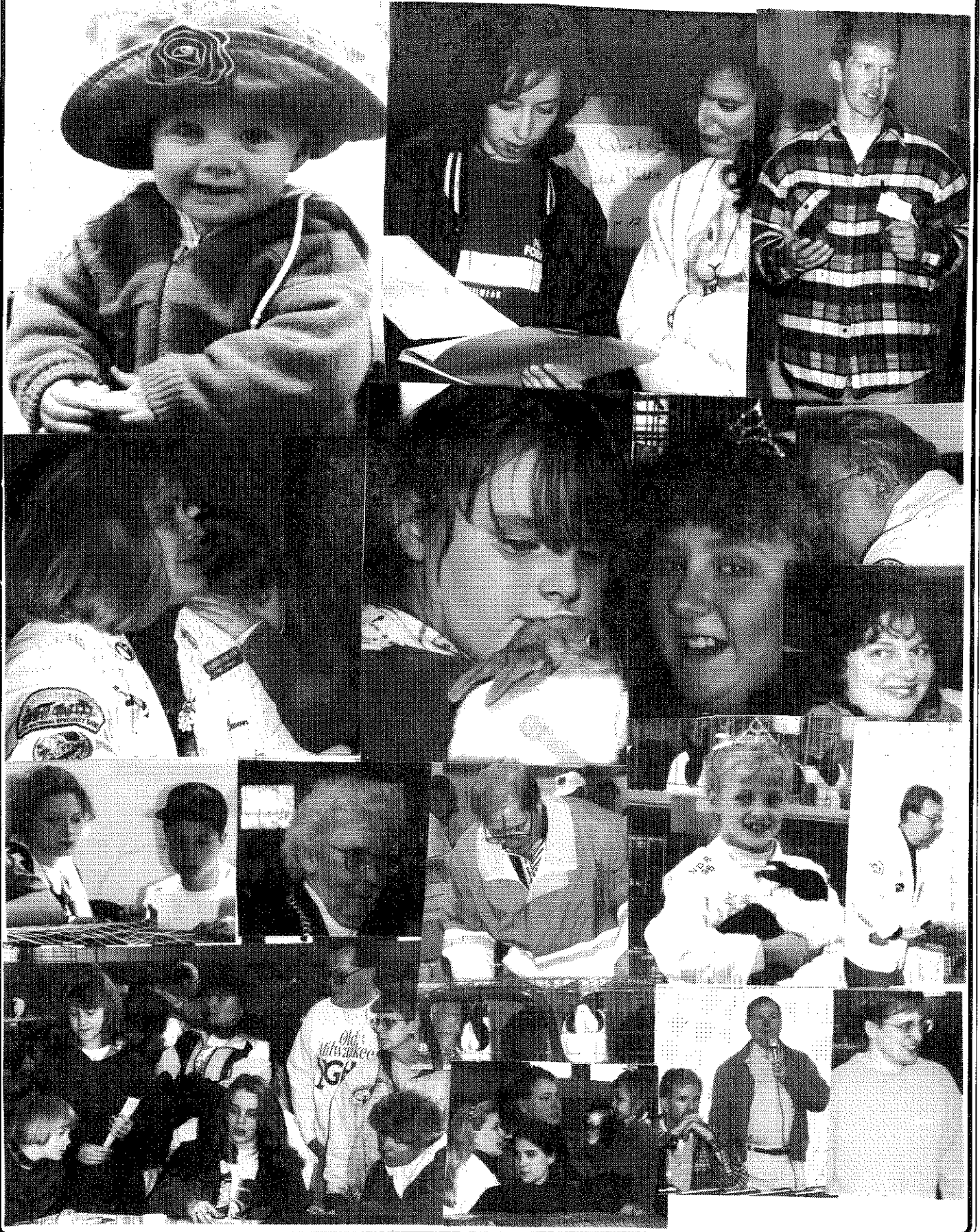

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF A
YOUTH REGISTRAR

Most of you have had the experience of getting your rabbits registered. Meeting new people, handling, and observing the different breeds are my favorite parts of being a registrar. I have found that, when asked, most people are eager to share their interpretation of their breed's standard. My advice to registrars is to go beyond the standard, and access the information in the breeders. When I need information about a breed, I try asking a few breeders what they look for. By showing me their own rabbits, the breeders help me visualize what is written in the standard.

People are also the hardest part of being a registrar. For example, every registrar is required to put comments on the paperwork. Is it fair to only put "Good doe" or "Good buck" on every registration? Personally, I record the good traits and some of the faults on every registration blank. Many people will help me by pointing out the good and the bad on their own animals; however, some people won't even take their "perfect" animals to me, because they know I will comment on faults. Other concerns are: how long to stay at a show and when to turn a breeder away. I recently worked a show in Pamona, Ca. About half way through the show, a woman asked me to register her rabbits. At the moment, I was busy with other rabbits, so I told her I'd tell her when I was free. I couldn't get back to her until the ending stretch of the show. Unfortunately, her rabbits had just started to go up for judging. By the time she was able to bring her 1000 big fluffy animals to me, I had to start packing up. This made the woman very unhappy. In fact, she didn't hesitate to tell me how displeased she was. Little did she know she was talking to a hockey

referee who was used to taking criticism from grown men that are twice her size. Never the less, when someone asks you to register their animals after half of the show is over, it might be a good idea to warn them that you might have to leave before you get to their animals. This will hopefully help clear up any misunderstandings.

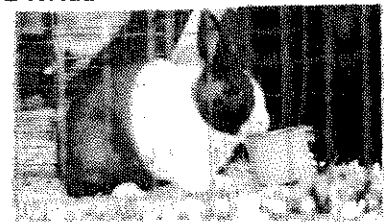

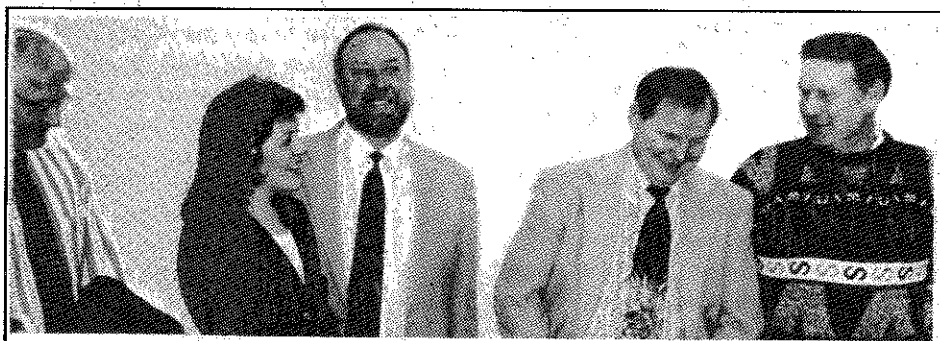

SOLD OUT AGAIN

Every year it is the same thing. We can't make enough of them -RABBIT NUGGETS for our county fair. The LaPorte Co. 4-H Rabbit Concession stand has completed 12 years of providing fair goers in this area with a different menu from the normal of hot dogs, corn dogs and polish sausage. It is rabbit served in many different ways. The idea has been accepted and people look forward to trying something new for a change.

I want to thank Elkhart Co. Indiana for giving us the idea and all the good 4-H rabbit people in our county that have worked hard all these years to make it a success, especially Diane Preston. There are other small businesses that have given us encouragement. We are going to expand our menu from previous years. New items this year will be rabbit tacos, rabbit chili, rabbit finger steaks, plain rabbit BBQ pieces, hot wings and rabbit jerky. Previous years we served the popular rabbit nuggets, rabbit sausage biscuit and gravy, rabbit tasties and rabbit BBQ sandwiches (like sloppy joes) along with the usual drinks and side dishes. The past two years we have added home made bread to our menu which the customers loved.

As I previously reported several years ago the purpose of this idea was to provide a place for the 4-H kids to get rid of their culled rabbits at a fair market price, provide an income for the 4-H rabbit project, introduce the public to the low fat, low calorie, low cholesterol all white rabbit meat at a reasonable cost. And it also shows the kids that people working together can overcome problems and make improvements each year.

From our experience over the past 12 years, there is a market for rabbit meat. People that are not supposed to eat red meat or high fat meat, appreciate a change from chicken or fish. The U.S.D.A. helps our cause with their chart that gives rabbit a good rating. We do display these facts in our Rabbit Science and Rabbit Consumer projects at our county fair. The high nutritional quality of rabbit meat should be encouraged my making it available wherever possible. For instance, at several Indiana state meetings I asked if they ever served rabbit chili at their shows. No one gave a positive answer. Why not? I have included a good rabbit chili recipe.

We think that LaPorte Co. 4-H rabbit project is about as complete a program as possible. Other than the regular rabbit exhibits, following the ARBA rules, we have the following: Rabbit Science, Rabbit Consumer, Rabbit Judging, Rabbit Showmanship, Pee Wee Rabbit Show, Rabbit Costume Contest and the Rabbit Concession Stand. There are several ideas we don't have for lack of qualified trainers and judges in our immediate areas. If you have a better rabbit program or ideas to improve ours please write to **Wilbur Williamson, PO Box 515, LaPorte, IN 46352**. Or if you want to ask questions regarding the food stand I'll be glad to respond. I would also like to know if anyone else has tried this food stand idea and what were your results and comments.

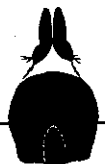
