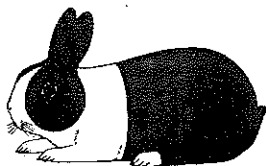

President's MESSAGE

The year in the mid-west started out with large shows and the NDS continued that trend. Not many people expected over 700 Dutch in the open and youth in central Kansas. The permanent caging was nice, even if the top row was a little high for a few of us. The weather was super. My Dutch acted as if they had never left home. Thanks to the Kansas Dutch Club for hosting the show. I know how much work goes into hosting the NDS, and your efforts are much appreciated. Congratulations to the winners!

We may be looking at limiting the number of animals that are allowed to sell in the seller's class. We have had a lot of animals in the class the last several shows, and we had nearly forty this time. That in combination with the fact that our shows have been large have made it difficult to get everything completed in one day. **Anyone ever consider having the seller's class on Friday evening?**

The Board had several items that were considered at Friday evening's meeting. We have decided to go forward in having a computer program developed for our sweepstakes contests. It will be an investment that will save much time and effort for our Sweepstake's Chairman, as well as increasing the contests that we may offer to our membership. This will be implemented beginning in 1999. **Rabbit of the Year, Variety sweepstakes, Quality points contests, and Breeder of the Year are being planned.** If you have other ideas, please forward those to your Director or myself.

Congratulations to the latest Hall of Fame inductees: Larry & Doreen Bengtson, Wenton Carlton, and Wayne MacKinnon. You have all served the club and the Dutch rabbit well over the years.

We have another new Dutch Club forming - **The Missouri Dutch Rabbit Club.** Welcome and let us know if you need any help.

We will be re-implementing our nomination procedure for the selection of judges for the NDS and the ARBA Convention. The process was used, then it somehow was lost in the shuffle of re-working the Constitution. It will work like this: When we send out our ballot (separate mailing this year). We will vote on the shows coming up two years ahead, and nominate for those shows three years ahead (think the number of years is correct.). The judges must receive five nominations to be on the final ballot the following year. The judges must also receive five votes to be selected for the NDS or the ARBA Convention. This was put in place several years ago to make sure that the judges that were selected had strong member support.

Speaking of judges, I have some more work to do, but I did pass my judges test. I now must work eight shows and receive the approval of six of the judges that I work under, before I'm officially licensed.

Keep your Dutch cool this summer.

I use metal nestboxes with finely shredded aspen or paper and remove any extra fur. The metal boxes are great because if you put a "refrigerator" next to them the box will cool down. I have been raising them this way for quite awhile and have never had any problems with summer ears even in 90-100 degree weather.

I will be embarking on a massive new project for the ADRC soon, one that will hopefully bring us into the modern computerized age by virtue of computerizing the ADRC sweepstakes calcs into a custom designed Access 97 program. This may even be extended to helping the club Secretary with the membership and sanction databases via linked databases, which would enable data downloads between the Secretary's office and the sweepstakes person, thus avoiding double data entry.

The sweepstakes program will be designed and programmed by an Access programmer and myself, and will enable the ADRC to initiate some of the proposed new sweepstakes contests. We are shooting for the program being ready to go by 1999.

This customizable new program may even be available for sale to other specialty clubs for their sweepstakes, but ADRC would not be involved in that aspect. Since no ADRC member has come forward to volunteer to do this programming, we are fortunate that this programmer has offered us a VERY discounted rate, based in part on the possibility of sales to other clubs.

That's all the news I have at this point. I hope that many of you are planning to come to Portland in October!

SUMMARY

Description & Name Choice of the "Gray" Dutch

by Eric Mixdorf

A questionnaire was mailed to 31 breeders/exhibitors of what is presently termed BROWN GRAY Dutch. Sixteen were completed and returned. Three were returned as "address unknown."

1) Please check your preference of variety name: Brown-Gray — Gray — Chestnut
Brown Gray 3 votes
Gray 8 votes
Chestnut 3 votes
Others receiving 1 vote each was Brown and Agouti

2) Give us two sentences that are very descriptive of the correct color of the "gray" variety to be included in the Standard of Perfection.

These are some of the responses received.

** "able to see all 3 (band) colors when looking at the gray."

** "chestnut color does not fit. Some grays do not have any intermediate (tan) band. This is wrong. Too much emphasis is put on the width of intermediate ring color — no where is how wide it should be."

** "Nothing is sharper than a LIGHT colored, CREAMY bellied (not sooty white) with chestnut lap markings, medium width eye circles and very narrow coal black laced ears on a good typed Dutch rabbit."

** "Agouti hairshaft — slate blue base — 1/2 length; tan ring followed by narrow black ring tipped with medium chestnut. (Tan ring to be 1/4 length — rich color.)

Surface color medium chestnut, well interspersed with black guard hairs. Belly WHITE or LIGHT CREAM, slate undercolor."

** "A medium DARK shade of gray showing ring color when blown into. Ticking carried over entire body — belly color should be WHITE."

** "Surface color LIGHT BROWN with black ticking. A chestnut agouti coat with distinct bands of color."

** "LIGHT agouti color with distinct rings with blue base, then tan, brown and lighter at the top."

** "Uniformly ticked MEDIUM shade of gray evenly over cheeks, top of body, sides, down the outside of rear legs and ears. Agouti colored with distinct bands, color next to the skin, being slate blue."

** "An agouti coloration with distinct ring in the colored portion, especially over the middle of the back. Surface coloration should not be too DARK or BRASSY."

** "Surface color is CHARCOAL BROWN blending down to caramel tan color to base of slate blue. The overall appearance of the coat is highlighted evenly with DARK guard hairs and ticking."

** "Surface color of top and sides of the body is to be LIGHT brown, ticked with jet black and the intermediate band — a well defined orange over a dark slate blue undercolor. The nape of the neck is to be orange with black ear lacings."

** "Chestnut agouti with slate blue

undercolor. Ticking to be GRAY TIPPED and have distinct ring color of 5 bands when blown into. Color to be brownish with SILVER GRAY tips."

** "The gray has an agouti coat. The undercolor is to be slate blue, followed by a medium tan band of charcoal brown, finished with a lighter tan band. The entire body should be interspersed with a moderate amount of black guard hairs. The belly should have a white or cream surface color with slate blue under color extending from inside the rear legs, over the belly, to the undercut. When the belly surface color is white, the undercut is determined by blowing into the fur. Medium tan lap spots are permissible. The top side of the tail is black with tan ticking, while the bottom of the tail is white. Eyes dark brown."

3) When breeding for "grays", do you breed any other color(s) into your "grays"? If so, what color(s).

The overwhelming response was gray to gray only, however a few stated they use black and steel. A very interesting comment was "gray smuts steel — steel blackens gray!"

TO "D" OR NOT TO "D" ... that is the question.

Although rare, it does occur. And the next time it could happen to you. Here is the scenario. You have a Dutch rabbit that has excellent type, beautiful fur and color and a nice balance of markings. Then you hear from the judge those earth shattering words, "This rabbit will be DISQUALIFIED." What for? But how? You see there right behind the ears where the rabbit has a nearly full neck marking, lies a white spot right in the middle, plain as day.

To "D" or not to "D", that is the question.

On one side of the coin, the Dutch standard clearly states to disqualify from competition for distinct white spot(s) in colored sections. Thus the ruling.

On the other side of the coin, how do you penalize a rabbit for having white where it is suppose to have white in the first place? It is suppose to be penalized for having

too much color in that area isn't it? And what about the hairline? The standard states if the hairline is partly there, but does not join either the blaze or the neck, it should not be considered a spot, nor should the animal be disqualified from competition. How can it be allowed in one area and not the other? Wouldn't that be a "double standard"?

A verbal poll was recently taken by 8 A.R.B.A. judges including the secretary of the A.R.B.A. and the A.R.B.A. Standards Committee Chairman. The vote split 50/50 on who would pass the animal and who would disqualify it.

This is another area we would like to clarify in the next upcoming standard and will be included in the voting process.

Think it over. What would you have done if you were in the judge's shoes? And is such an animal able to be registered?



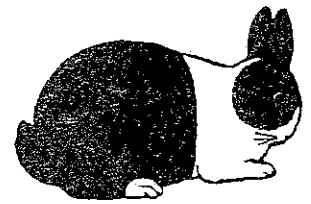

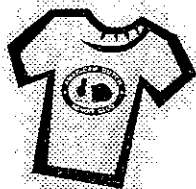

HOT WEATHER BREEDING

TIPS FROM AN OHIO BREEDER

First and foremost we must think of the animal's comfort and safety. For those who live in areas that experience severe heat you must consider how you are going to house the animals period, before you think about breeding. In Ohio we usually only have a few weeks of really severe heat. In both my rabbitry locations my first consideration is how I can make sure that the rabbitry will be properly ventilated. At my parents I have windows on every side of the barn and for most part these stay open most of the year. In the summer we close the east door in the morning and open it in the afternoon. We have one fan that we turn on when it is really hot that pulls the air in the west end and out the east. We only need this when it is getting around 90 or above. In Columbus I have a ventilation fan that kicks on when the temp in the barn hits 75-80 degrees. I again have windows on two sides, the fan on one end and a garage door on the other end.

All of this aside I do very little different with my summer breeding than any other time of the year. I do remove the majority of the nesting material from the box, especially for those does who over do it. I also check the litters more often. If a kit dies in the summer it decomposes very quickly and must be removed ASAP as it will draw insects.

Finally something that should be a given any rabbit in hot weather must be given fresh water several times a day. Other times of the year we give clean water in the morning and just top off the bowls in the evening. In the summer we give fresh water at least twice a day. Does should be checked several times to make sure they have fresh water and are not getting to warm. **Remember we can get water, food or shelter on our own but the rabbits that we raise depend on us for everything and we must provide it.** If you do not have the time to devote to properly care for the animals then you should not have them.

As far as bucks go I tend to use younger ones during the summer and I also do the actual breeding in the morning before it gets hot or in the evening once it has cooled down. There is no reason to cause un-needed stress during the heat of the day. This is not a great article about hot weather breeding it is just some thoughts I had.

I encourage other breeders to just put down some thoughts about the subject of the month or anything they think of. It is not hard and you never know when something you take for granted may be a great new piece of information for a new breeder or old timer.

SUMMER BREEDING IN IOWA

I used to wonder how could it be too hot to breed rabbits. We waited all winter for it to be warm enough so the babies would not freeze if they crawled out. This was when my rabbits were outside under the shade trees in Wisconsin. Now they are in a garage and it does get too hot to breed. We breed year round anyway. You don't know when you breed them how hot it will be a month later. We have never lost a rabbit from the heat since I have lived here. We have had to take them into the air conditioned house on a few occasions. We use frozen pop bottles for the does to lay against during the hottest part of the day. This also really helps when she has a whole litter running around the cage with her. During the really hot weather is a good time to save up some extra fur for the colder weather when you need some.

We have never switched to automatic waterers because the rabbits like to lay up against their water crocks to keep cooler. We dump and put in fresh cold water 2 or 3 times and day on the really hot days. This helps cool them down drinking the cold water.

Most of the breeding is done early morning or very late at night. We have fans plugged in all over moving the air and one window fan that is temperature controlled. Sometimes we take just the nest box full of babies into the house to keep cool. This allows more air movement and room in the cage for the mother to relax. Unfortunately you get a lot of "summer ears" if you raise litters through this kind of heat.

SUMMER BREEDING IN IOWA PART 2

Summertime can mean some very warm days with high humidity. Sometimes for weeks at a time. If you decide to breed during this time of year, here are a few tips we've found helpful.

Breeding of the animals is best done in the early morning hours before the heat takes over or during the late evening hours when they are normally eating and active. This is a good time of year to try out your younger senior animals (6-8 months of age). Young bucks will be fertile at this time where as the older bucks will have a tendency to go sterile after a period of prolonged heat. Young does will usually still be more receptive than older does that may decide otherwise. (been there/done that syndrome). Plus with first time does who are not quite familiar with making a nest, the babies will not chill due to an inadequate amount of fur in the nest. Sometimes older more experienced does pull an abundance of fur no matter what. You will want to monitor this and pull out any excess to help prevent the litter from suffocating, as the kits will generate their own heat in the nest and the extra fur can be saved to be used in the cooler fall and winter months.

We also use nestboxes with wire mesh

bottoms during the hot months to help with ventilation through the nest.

Does go through a lot of stress through their pregnancy and while nursing. Keeping them cool and comfortable is essential. Constant air circulation is very important whether with fans, swamp coolers or whatever. Save your 2 liter soda bottles of 1/2 gallon milk jugs, and fill them with water and freeze them. These icepacks can then be placed in the animal's cage during the peak heat hours and they will lay against them to keep cool. As they thaw some animals may chew on them and put holes in them, so save plenty and recycle the leaky ones.

Keep a fresh supply of cool water for your rabbits to drink at all times. Supply plenty of shade from the sun. We have changed water as many as 3 times a day and even added ice cubes to their water in the hot afternoon hours. We also switch to a lower protein feed (15%) during the summer.

Rabbits are unable to sweat like you and me. They release their extra body heat through the thinnest parts of their body: their belly, nose and mouth area and ears. The animal will usually stretch out on its stomach and pant. If you notice a rabbit very wet around the nose and mouth, head tilted back, feverish hot ears and panting rapidly, it is probably overheating and needs quick attention. Take them into an air conditioned area or you can soak them down with cool (not cold) water. You can submerge them in a bucket of cool water up to their neck and then allow them to cool down on a wet towel placed in their cage. Too cold of water may put them into shock.

Remember ... plenty of water and shade, good air circulation, use younger aged animals, lower protein feed, and monitor your animals at peak heat times of the day for heat stress. With a little extra care, those summer litters will provide you with some nice juniors for the fall shows and conventions.

His question was "are the dark torts coming from the influence of blacks and blues or is it just the variance that we see in torts". Speaking as a 18 year veteran of breeding torts I say absolutely not. I, like Kevin, have bred my torts to blacks to get blacks not torts. I have never mixed the blues in at all. My torts have been straight torts for generations and I still get litters with dramatic color variations. I personally have a weakness for a really dark little 3 week old tort. I get to see these guys every once in a while as well as the little bright orange pumpkins.

I also agree with Kevin that every variety has significant variations in color but it is never an issue. Blues and Chocolates are all over the color chart and it is not generally an issue.

In closing thank heavens for the variances because there are no two judges or breeders who completely agree on good tort color or any color for that manner.

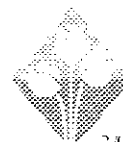

PRODUCING STEELS

The Steel color is somewhat of a challenge. A breeder commented to me that she was having a problem in that all of her blacks were producing nothing but steels. I asked, "So what's the problem?" She then wanted to know what to do to not produce steels? I told her to try to produce them. Steels are a color that is easy as long as you are not trying for them, you'll get them. If you want a lot of steels, you will get few.


To produce the best Steels, you can use any on the following; blacks, blacks with steel in the background, blues, Dark Steels, medium shade of steel, light steels, Grays with nice ring color, Blue Steels, and Blue-Grays.

The following combinations should be tried:

- blacks to medium or light steels
- blacks with steel in the background to any steel, Gray, Blue Steel, or BlueGray
- Blues to Steels that have no blue in their background
- Dark Steels to Grays or Blues
- Medium Steels to Blacks, Grays, Blue Steels, Blue Grays, or Blues
- Light Steels to Blacks, or Blues
- Grays to Blue Steels, or Dark Steels

My best combinations are still using Blue-Steels to a nicely colored Gray. You will get some Grays out of this, but Grays are a common side affect of raising steels. The offspring out of any blue, blue-steel, or blue gray will carry blue. These offspring should then be bred to an appropriate complementary color

which is not carrying blue. I only have three blue steels. I have produced none this year, because I'm trying for steels. I use the blues and blue steels to get that blue or gray tint to the steels. I do get some lighter, more brown shades, and some darker ones. But, I get quite a few nice looking steels.

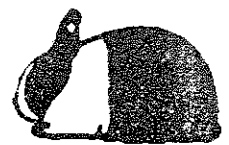

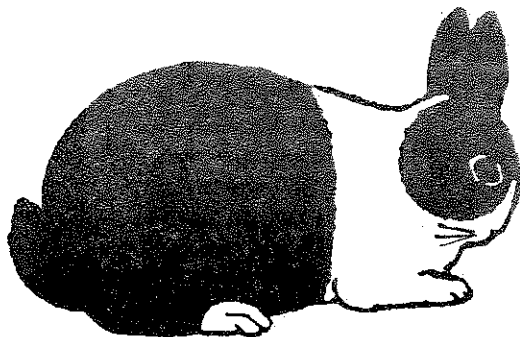



1998 BEST OF BREED YOUTH WINNER

Hello! My name is Fritz Trybus, and I was the winner of best of breed/best in show at the National Dutch Show '98. I am 15 years old and live in Illinois. I have had Dutch since I was 5 years old, and currently have all varieties of Dutch except blacks. Winning best of breed at the National

Dutch Show this year, was the greatest honor I have ever won in my ten years of raising Dutch rabbits. It was a thrilling feeling when Dr. Hayhow announced my rabbit as best of breed. I nearly fainted, and couldn't believe it. This is my first national best of breed win. I won with my Brown Gray Sr. Doe. I bred and raised this doe myself, which makes the honor even greater. Thanks to Kevin Hooper for starting me in Brown Grays a year or so ago. They are a wonderful, challenging variety of Dutch. My Gray doe was born in my summer "batch" of babies. I knew I liked her from the time of weaning. To make things even better, she was in prime condition for NDS. She also took the honors of winning best fur all colors in youth.

We all strive for winning the great honor of BOB at a national show. I can't offer any secrets to getting there. It's all in the breeding and how you cull. I personally don't use any feed conditioners. I only feed Purina Show Formula pellets and hay once a week. Keep breeding, cull hard, and keep a clean rabbitry. Those are the keys. In addition to BOB, I was also honored with winning the title of ADRC Duke and placing 1st in the showmanship and judging contests for my age group. Out of the 14 Dutch I showed at NDS I also was lucky enough to come home with other wins including some 1st places, BOSV Steel, and fur class winnings.

Visiting were: Jill Dobson, Julie Billups, and Penn Peters. Absent were: Wenton Carlton, Fran Schettler and Doreen Bengtson. There was no treasurers report due to the absence of the treasurer. A motion to accept the secretary's report as printed in the Dutch Reporter, seconded by Briony Barnes was carried.

Area Reports: Todd Uran says shows are up in his area, and the youth are especially active. Briony Barnes finds open numbers are up and youth numbers are down. Chocolates and Tort's are winning more frequently. Sharon Mixdorf indicates that Iowa is not as active as usual, that Missouri seems to be becoming more alive. Several new members and breeders in that state. Sue Peters reports good numbers at shows, and the loss of Eva Henry who was a friend that raised chocolates. Troy Ihrke sees new members coming on, but the old members aren't coming out as usual. Briony Barnes made a motion and Todd Uran seconded it that the ADRC increase the stipend paid to the Dutch Reporter editor from \$100. to \$200. per issue. Motion passed. Voting for judges was discussed and it was clarified as to future procedures.

New Business:

Rick discussed some of the Publicity departments future plans. They are working on a new poster and a genetics article. Todd Uran is working on the new Guide Book (2000) is the year and he is calling for articles and pictures. A motion to adjourn was seconded and passed. The meeting was adjourned.
