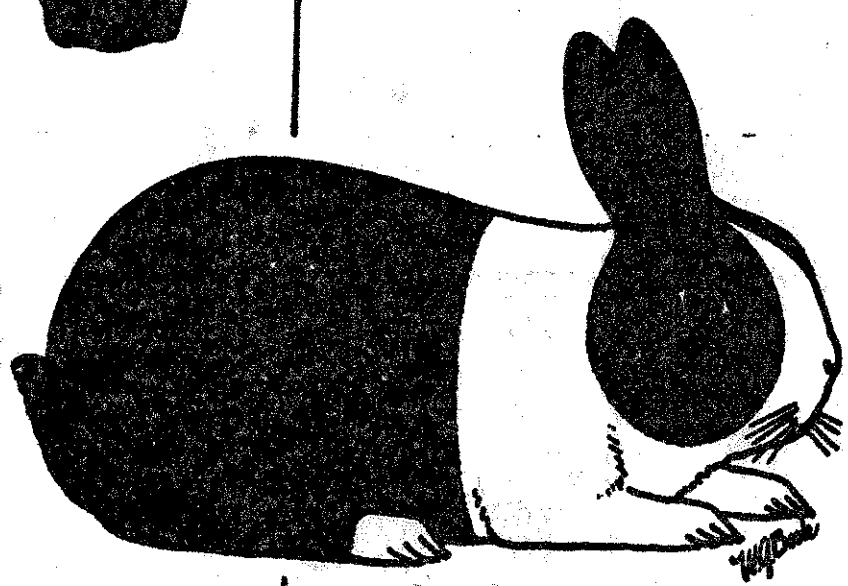

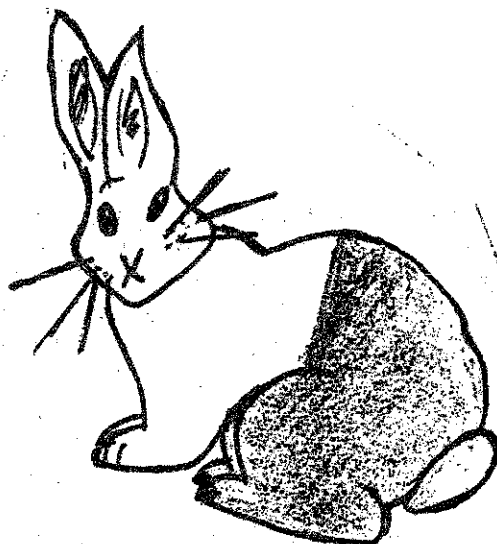

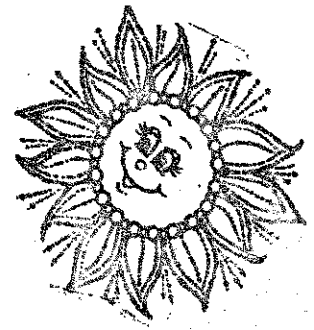

From the President

HEAT, HEAT and more HEAT!

Summer heat has hit us all - no area in the United States has been spared. While the subject of this issue of the DUTCH REPORTER is "HOW TO KEEP YOUR RABBITS COOL IN THE SUMMER HEAT", I'm sure that many of us have already learned just how difficult that is and the toll it takes on the survivors.

Does ready to kindle and those that are into the maximum period of lactation are the most vulnerable to heat stress. I often wonder how those families where everyone is absent from the home during the day are able to raise rabbits. Mid-day is obviously the hottest and most crucial time to be in the barn - checking for signs of heat stress. I have a real advantage being home during the day, being able to walk quietly through the rabbitry and observe the animals. We have saved a number of animals over the years, during kindling as well as from heat stress.

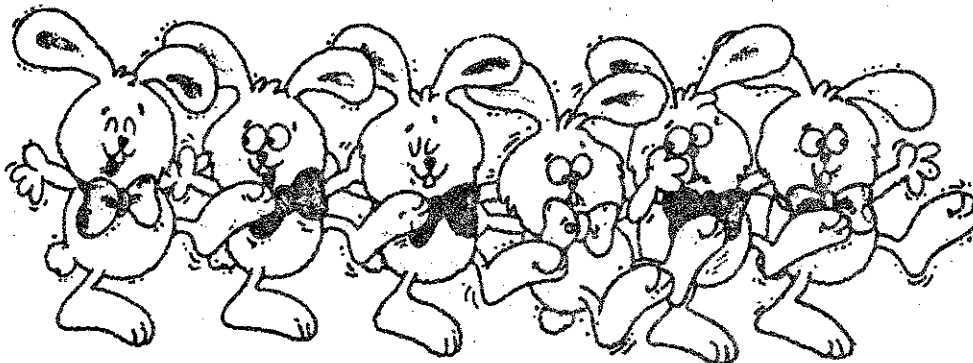
Some suggestions that I'll pass on - Buy a plant (spray) mist bottle and keep it filled with water. We used to wet the rabbits ears from a bucket, losing most of the water before reaching the ears. The spray gently dampens the ears and the fur over their back. Many, when extremely hot, won't offer to move from the coolest area they've located in the coop. The rabbits ears are their 'air conditioning' unit so moistening them provides for a quick cooling effect. During EXTREME hot weather we ALWAYS keep a bucket, at least 1/2 full of room temperature water. This is to submerge an animal into should they be suffering from severe heat stress. (Don't submerge the HEAD!)

Like many other rabbit breeders, we keep frozen milk jugs in the freezer as well as frozen Zip-lok bags. Yes, the rabbits will chew on the containers but I'd rather have a live rabbit chewing on plastic than a dead one who can't. It's not unusual to see a doe either lying on or having her body wrapped around a frozen milk jug.

Lights are turned off during the heat of mid-day so the animals can rest. They are fed in the evening when it cools. Water is changed everyday and a vitamin supplement is included in the water. All activities such as barn cleaning, feeding and watering are done in the EARLY morning or LATE evening.

All of the above items will help your rabbits survive the EXTREME heat but, in my opinion, the most important item is to keep the air moving, even warm air. Our barn is 16' x 24' with rabbits three layers high. During the 100 degree plus temperatures, we have six "squirrel cages" running, during the winter months two operate in temperatures to zero. The "squirrel cages" are blowers from furnace units that can be purchased for \$20-30 and are much cheaper to run than large window fans. They are more durable and put out much more air.

Caring for your animals more than your own comfort is what makes the difference between those who have winners ready for the National Dutch Shows and ARBA Conventions and those whose animals are never finished in fur and flesh.

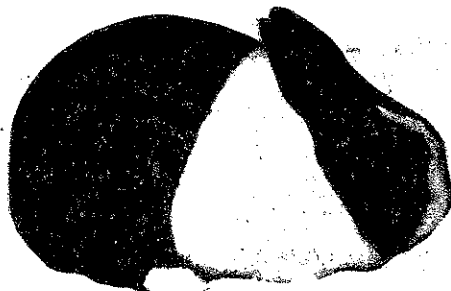
HELLO EVERYONE !

NOW THAT THE BIG SPRING SHOWS ARE HISTORY, ITS TIME TO LOOK AHEAD FOR THE FALL SHOWS AND THE NATIONAL IN MADISON. FIRST HOWEVER MANY OF US DO A FEW FAIRS AND IN SOME CASES SUMMER SHOWS. I HAVE BEEN ASKED TO WRITE A ARTICLE THIS MONTH ON DEALING WITH THE HEAT IN THE RABBITRY. SINCE I ALREADY ADDRESSED THAT IN THE LAST ISSUE I WOULD LIKE TO WRITE A LITTLE ABOUT SHOWING YOUR DUTCH AT THE FAIRS TO HELP SOME OF THE NEWER DUTCH EXHIBITORS.

IT IS EASY TO GET INTO HABITS WHEN SHOWING YOUR DUTCH, BUT YOU MUST REMEMBER IF YOU CHOOSE TO SHOW YOUR DUTCH THIS SUMMER AT THE FAIRS BE FORE WARNED.IF YOU HAVE BEEN TRANSPORTING YOUR DUTCH TO THE SHOWS IN WOODEN OR CARDBOARD BOXES WITH LITTLE VENTILATION YOU COULD BE IN FOR SERIOUS TROUBLE. PLEASE THINK, OF THE RABBITS FIRST, THINK, DO NOT PUT RABBITS IN TRUNKS OR CARS WITH THE WINDOWS UP. AIR CONDITIONING IS FINE BUT DO NOT TURN IT ALL THE WAY UP AND THEN TAKE THEM INTO OPPRESSIVEY HOT WEATHER. DO NOT PARK YOUR VEHICLE IN THE DIRECT SUNLIGHT WITH THE RABBITS INSIDE. LOOK FOR A COOL AREA UNDER TREES OR A TENT IN WHICH TO PUT YOUR CARRIERS. IF THE RIDE IS LONG OR IF YOU THINK THE SHOW WILL RUN LATE, BRING COOL ICE WATER FOR YOUR RABBITS. PLEASE THINK, AND TAKE CARE OF YOUR RABBITS FIRST WHEN TRANSPORTING AND SHOWING YOUR DUTCH THIS SUMMER.

YOU WOULD THINK THAT AN ARTICLE SUCH AS THIS SHOULD NOT HAVE TO BE WRITTEN. UNFORTUNATELY I HAVE SEEN THE RESULTS OF RABBITS PUT IN SMALL HOT BOXES, WITH NO VENTILATION,AND KEPT IN HOT VEHICLES TOO LONG,WITHOUT BEING CHECKED ON. THESE PEOPLE HAD NO IDEA AT THE TIME THAT THEY WERE SETTING THEMSELVES UP FOR A TERRIBLE ACCIDENT.

FROM THE DESK OF YOUR SECRETARY.....

Our temperatures have soared to 100+ and there appears to be no relief coming. It isn't the heat so much as it is the humidity that accompanies it in our area. Knowing how hard it is for us to catch our breath, I can certainly realize what a tremendous stress it is on our bunnies. We've done our best with fans and alot of help from frozen plastic 'pop' bottles and milk jugs. The rabbits seem to enjoy the cool relief that these bring and snuggle right up to them. I would think that there has to be a better way (without air conditioning) but we can't seem to find it. We have an automatic watering system so the bunnies always have fresh cold water available. I wonder how an 'earth' rabbitry would work?!

In this issue of the D.R., you will find your final election ballot for the ADRC. Please take the time to vote. Remember that the youth have a separate ballot and may only vote on the 1990 youth National Dutch Show judge. Adult members will find a different ballot, - husband/wife memberships will use both adult ballots enclosed. Please remember that you may only vote for one (1) District Director, and that vote must be within YOUR DISTRICT. I don't feel that you should have any problem following the instructions provided on the ballot. However, if you are uncertain about an item, please feel free to contact this office for assistance. Ballots must be received by September 15, 1988 in order to be counted. Notice that this says received, not postmarked by. You should always allow at least five (5) days for mailing. I do believe that horse and rider could sometime beat the Postal Department delivery, but until such time as they are allowed on the interstates we'll have to do it their way. I received correspondence from the ARBA office approximately 70 miles away and it took five days to get here from the date of the postmark. So, if you want to make sure that your ballot is in on time, fill it out, put a stamp on it and send it back ASAP. We would like to see a little more participation from our youth members. Come on guys and girls and mark your ballot next to the candidate's name of your choice and mail it in. It only costs a stamp to have your choice counted. Do it today.

Remember to check your Dutch Reporter label for your expiration date. If you have expired or are about to expire, please renew promptly so that you don't lose your sweepstake points or even one issue of the D.R.. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Jeanine Powers for the fine job she did on the May/June issue of the Dutch Reporter. Let's all help her out and keep our material coming in to her already typed and stencil ready whenever possible. This really saves time and I'm sure it would be appreciated.

HOT WEATHER

My building for my Dutch is so that when it is 0° outside it's 0° inside. When it is 90° outside, it is 90° inside.

I have an exhaust fan on the east end close to the roof and it comes on at about 80°. Then I have a 20" fan on the floor, which comes on at about 86° and sends air down the middle. Air comes in between the rafters as I have screen across the ends of the rafters which are 2 x 4's. Also I have across the ridge of the roof a 30 foot roof vent. One small screen window on the east end and a small window about middle of the building, on the north side, which I can close. The other screen windows can also be closed.

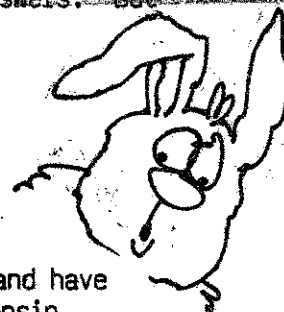
As long as the air is on the move, even hot air, (ask any politician), it gets the job done. When the warm or hot air just settles and lays still is what will give you trouble. Keep it moving and it sure makes a difference.

Yes if you walk in and it's 95° that's hot. But just stand real still and the moving air will give a cooling effect. This is not perfect but works for me.

KEEPING COOL?

Lets ask "How to keep the rabbits from getting too hot?"

My building is 18' x 32'. Running north & south. Shade trees at the south end. The south end has 10 windows that I took out and covered with shade screen. Two big openings at the north end. Two 12" exhaust fans (1 at each end in the peak. When it gets around 90° I have a squirrel cage fan at one end blowing along the ground. This keeps the air moving pretty good. Plenty of fresh water. Don't get the rabbits too fat before summer comes. Bred does go thru alot of stress. Maybe even put some cages in the basement. This is the first time after almost 30 years that I put some cages in the basement. Most of my rabbits are under 1 year of age. So it boils down to this, younger rabbits, not too fat, plenty of water, keep the air moving, don't get them excited and if you lose some, learn from it so that it won't happen again.

Here is another subject for you to think about. Another way to make our hobby more enjoyable for breeders and judges alike, a few words come to mind. PRIDE - RESPECT - ETHICS - SPORTSMANSHIP - REPUTABLE - CHEAT - DISHONEST.

When a person is dishonest and cheats, you lose all the others, and most everybody knows it.

Let us enjoy and have fun.

There is no doubt that it is SUMMER !! So far here in the Mid-West, I am aware of several breeders that are losing many babies. The heat is tremendous.

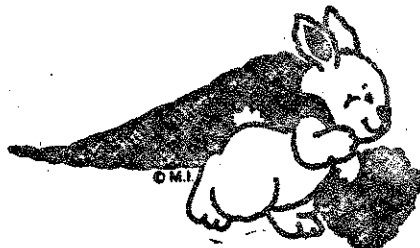

For the does that are littering, or have litters, a one-gallon milk jug is used instead of the 12 ounce Coke bottles. I wish I had more to offer in the way of suggestions, but I don't.

There are many shows approaching in the next few months, with Madison being the big one. Please don't beat your rabbits to death by running them to all of the fairs in the hot weather. Winning a few dollars at these fairs will not be enough money to replace the stock you chance losing. Use some common sense when it comes to transporting and leaving your rabbits at these summer shows.

It appears there were not many petitions filed for the offices of the ADRC. My feelings are that there have been so many changes to the Constitution and By-Laws that many people have lost interest in the happenings of our organization. Agreed, you have to have set guidelines to operate within, but you CAN become too organized and too technical for the average rabbit breeder and showman. That's going to be it from me this time. If I can be of any assistance to anyone regarding the Dutch, or any other aspect of the rabbit industry, please feel free to contact me.



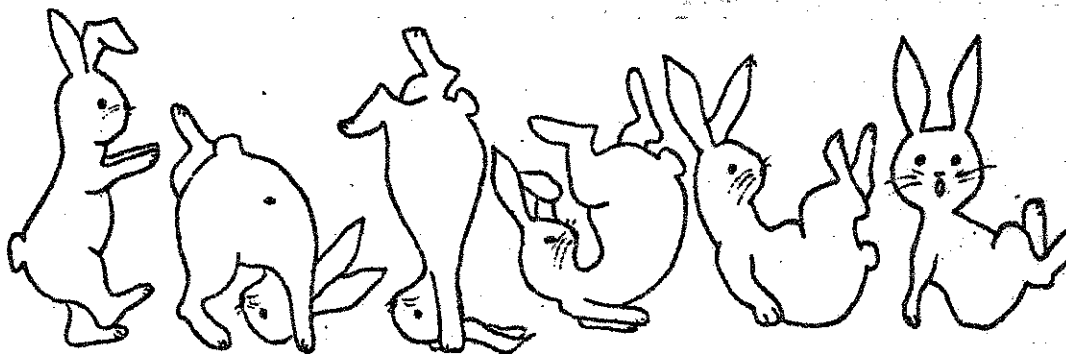
A word from your Director

Summer is so extremely hot in Texas that the rabbit breeders are forced to spend their spare time keeping their rabbits cool and day dreaming about upcoming fall shows. Some breeders with outdoor hutches can't even breed during the summer months. We all have our own methods of cooling our rabbits such as; frozen plastic jugs, hanging damp burlap bags over the cages, evaporative coolers, etc. Shade is an absolute must. Luckily we have a barn that is totally shaded and cooled with a large evaporative cooler. Therefore, we can breed year round. On the hottest day of summer our rabbitry will be 85 degrees inside.

Due to the lack of rabbit activity in the south during the summer, I have no news or events to write about. I hope everyone is planning their trip to Madison and hope to see many of you at the Texas State Dutch Show on September 17. This will be a double show. If you need any information, drop me a line.

Until next time, take care and keep cool.

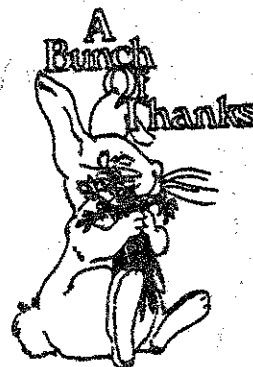

DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE:

George L. PARMER - District #3

July is here, don't quite know where the rest of the year has slipped to, but then they tell me that I am beginning to show my age when I talk that way. Could be they are right.

The local shows are beginning to slow down in this part of the Country, the Fair Shows are about to start. (In fact Maxine & I have our first two day 4-H Show to judge starting tomorrow.) We did attend the Washington State Convention Show in Everett, Wa. the middle of June. It was a two day show, I visited with a good portion of the Dutch Breeders, saw some VERY NICE Dutch recruited some new members for the Northwest Dutch Club and had fun. I do believe the Dutch are on the up once again in the Pacific Northwest. As for our own herd - our old does are all tired, and we are anxiously awaiting for some of our younger does to start producing. (Anyone else ever been in this boat?)

KEEPING YOUR RABBITS COOL

Well here in the Pacific Northwest we don't usually have too much trouble. Here in the Parmer rabbitry we have two large reverseable fans which run 24 hours a day at this time of year. The fans are placed in such a way that we have a good air flow through the rabbitry at all times, not only for the cooling effect, but also to facilitate the ample supply of clean fresh air.

We do keep a half dozen bleach jugs full of frozen water in the freezer -- just in case of an unexpected heat wave about the time some poor old doe is due to kindle. The jugs are also good if you have a large litter of young and they need to be cooled. In this area we have a nice breeze a good percent of the time in the afternoon and early evening this does us a world of good.

We do not frown on the old sprinkler on the top of the house either, it can save a lot of animals. My experience has been however -- this works better on a metal or shingle roof, what I have found is if you try to use it on a tar & rock built up roof you drive the heat in. When nothing else - the old bath towel soaked in water and wrung out either laid in the cage, hung on the cage or if the rabbit is in distress -- just wrap the rabbit in the WET towel.

From your Director - District 3

In the Southwest the temperatures in the summers can be in the range of 115° - 116° at times. Many of us use Evap coolers. They work well only if the humidity stays down.

Even in the summers; I will continue to breed my working does. I have found that if I don't keep them working I have trouble rebreeding them in the fall. The summer bunnies tend to be long in type and long in the ears.

The nest box I use are hand made using 1 x 12 wood with holes drilled into the sides to improve ventilation. You can also build a cooling basket made of wood strips and cloth wire. Just place the bunnies (2-10 Days old) in the basket and hage in the does cage. Make sure mom can see and smell them.

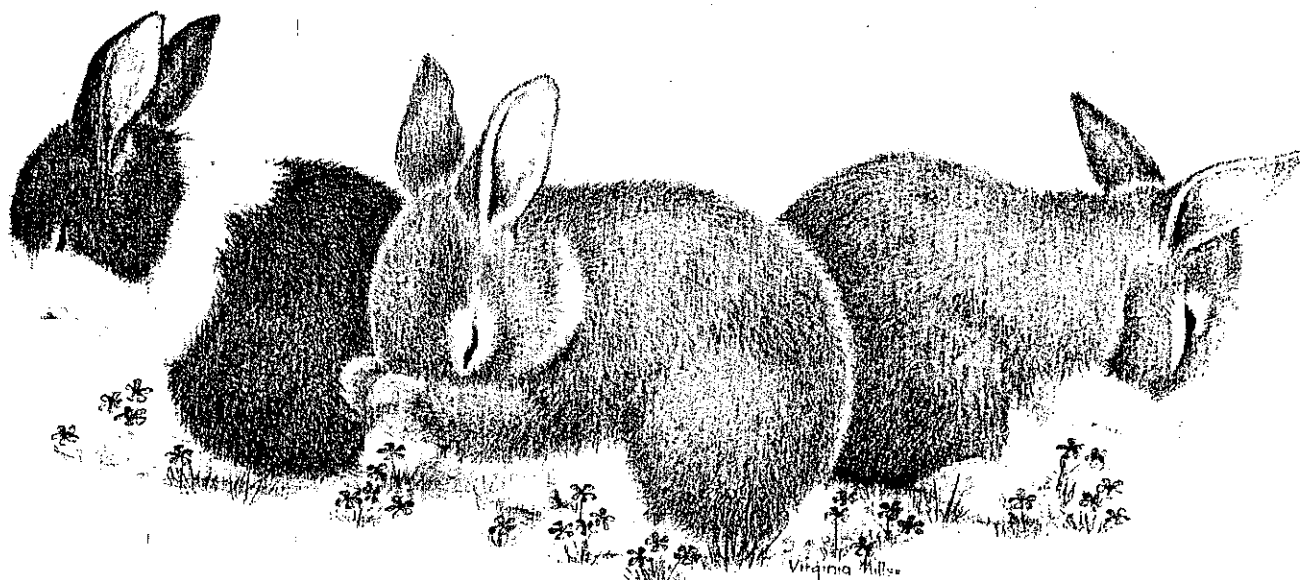
I keep my stud bucks in the coolest part of my barn so they remain sterile.

You can also use a 3lbs. empty coffee can - open at both ends. Place a piece of old carpet around the can - held in place with wire. Soak the carpet/can in water and put it in with your rabbit. Your Dutch then can lay inside the can. The can works as a Evap Cooler.

I try to provide plenty of water using ceramic bowls. The rabbits will lay against the bowl. This will also help them stay cool. There are many ways too keep your Dutch cool and Healthy. The best two are plenty of fresh water and good air circulation.

I am now trying to house break a rabbit. My dog (Dutch) and the rabbit get along fine. I am having trouble getting the rabbit to use a kitty litter box. If you have any ideas, Please write me.

I hope to see you in Madison, if my checkbook says I can go. I hope so. Keep breeding and showing, but most importantly keep having fun with your Dutch.

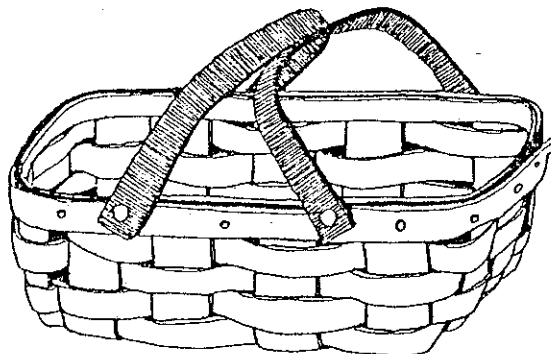

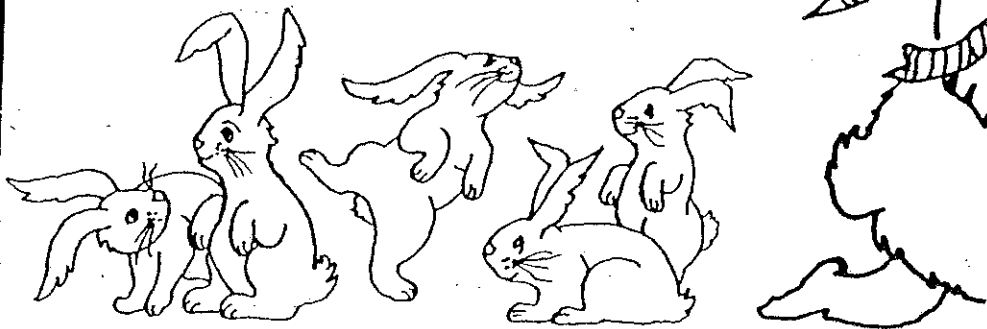
HELPFUL HINTS

Recently, we had a first time doe kindle her young on the wire on a cool morning, all lay dead. I cleaned the cage and removed the nestbox, laying it off on the work table nearby. That same day, a doe who had raised five or six excellent litters choose to ignore her litter of five days. They were becoming shriveled-looking. I took the remaining three and placed them in the nestbox that our first time mother had made. I also added two off-colored (blue fawn) kits from a third litter.

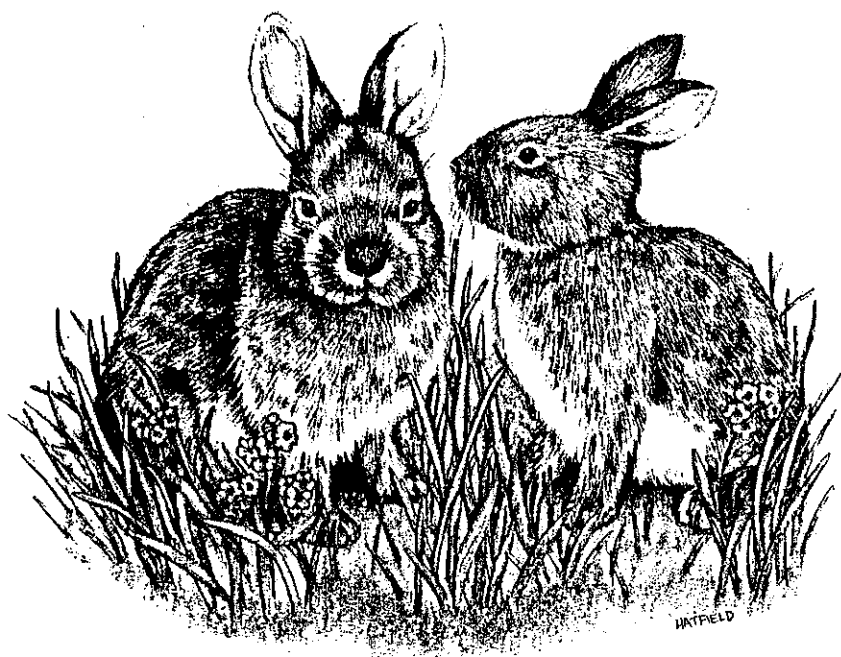
Later in the evening when I checked, all five of the kits were warm and wiggling. We did lose one of the kits but this first time doe saved four bunnies that we would have lost or destroyed if we hadn't tried fostering.

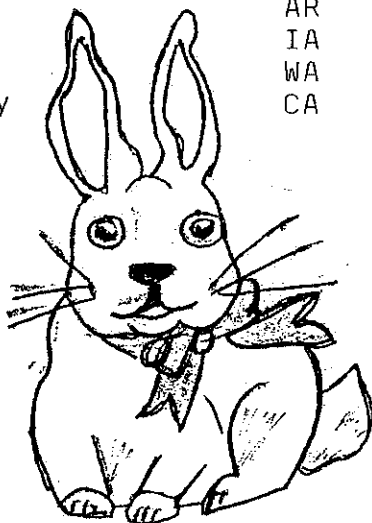

KEEPING YOUR RABBITS COOL IN THE SUMMER HEAT

Much has been written about this problem and I'll try to touch up some of the ideas.

1) The ole frozen water in the bottle method - although it does provide some comfort if the rabbit leans against it, it doesn't last very long, especially in 90° heat. I often find myself replacing and refreezing them 3 to 5 times a day. Wet washclothes work better, in my opinion.

2) Fans/air conditioners - For the small backyard rabbitry, air conditioners are very expensive and there usually no where to install them without getting rid of some cages. I prefer to use two fans (1) 20 x 28, and (1) 8 x 8 rotating fan. I place the 20 x 28 in the doorway and the 8 x 8 in the rear, hanging upside down from the ceiling. It keeps it nice and cool without too much of a single wind in one direction.

3) Misting - I like this method the best. Simply go to your local florist and buy a plant sprayer bottle. These bottles give a nice light mist of water to spray on your rabbits. A wet washcloth works good, as a rub down too! As your mother always said "wash behind their ears"!

4) Proper ventilation - as always you have to keep air in your barn moving by leaving the door or windows open especially if you don't have a fan, etc. It also helps to have your rabbits housed in the shade, be it a tarp over your cages or a tree that looms over your barn.

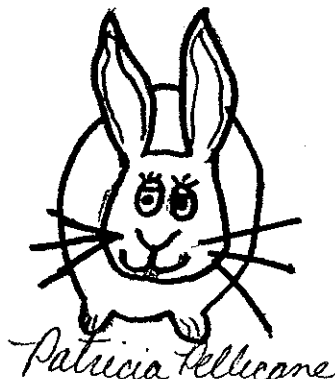
5) Grooming/clipping - In the hot weather I groom my rabbits more and more each day. This helps prevent fur balls, hair block, etc. as well as getting rid of the excess fur to help cool them. Some breeders recommend trimming the fur around a bucks testicles will help keep him sterile.

6) Proper placement of bucks - In the hot weather most breeders will tell you to keep your bucks in the lowest cages in your rabbitry as the ground level is usually coolest.

I almost forgot to mention that misting and using a wet towel on a bunnies ears will really help to discourage those dreaded summer ear!

3. CLEANLINESS

A COUPLE OF OTHER THINGS YOU MAY WANT TO CONSIDER AS YOU DEVELOP YOUR PLAN IS A SIMPLE RECORD KEEPING SYSTEM AND AN INFORMATION NOTEBOOK.

RECORDS ARE IMPORTANT BECAUSE THEY KEEP YOU FROM FOOLING YOURSELF. THEY ALSO HELP YOU REMEMBER AND EVALUATE.

YOU MAY THINK THAT A CERTAIN RABBIT IS A GOOD PRODUCER, BUT IF YOU CAN TURN TO A SHEET, YOU COULD FIND OUT DIFFERENTLY. LAST YEAR I DISCOVERED A DOE THAT HAD BEEN BRED FIVE TIMES, AND HAD ONLY LITTERED ONCE. I RAN INTO THIS INFORMATION ONE EVENING WHEN I WAS READING AND LOOKING AT SOME OF MY RECORDS. THAT DOE WAS CUT RATHER QUICKLY! IF YOU USE TWO FORMS YOU CAN KEEP THINGS NICE AND SIMPLE. THE FIRST FORM SHOULD BE A "BREEDING SHEET". THE ONE I USE CONTAINS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION.

THERE IS A PLACE FOR THE NAME OF THE DOE, BUCK THAT SERVICED THE DOE, THE DATE OF THE SERVICE, PROJECTED LITTER DATE, ACTUAL LITTER DATE, AND A PLACE FOR NOTES. IN THE AREA FOR NOTES I RECORD THE NUMBER OF BABIES, COLOR, AND ANY INFORMATION THAT MIGHT HELP ME IN THE FUTURE.

THE OTHER SHEET THAT I USE IS A "TATOO LOG". ON THIS FORM I AM ABLE TO RECORD THE NEW EAR NUMBER THAT I PLACE IN THE ANIMAL, IT'S SIRE AND DAM, DATE OF BIRTH, SEX, COLOR AND THE BREED. SINCE I ONLY RAISE DUTCH I NEVER HAVE TO RECORD THE BREED. THESE TWO FORMS IF YOU KEEP THEM CURRENT, ALONG WITH A COMPLETE PEDIGREE, CAN GIVE YOU A WEALTH OF INFORMATION. YOU CAN STOP GUESSING, AND ESTABLISH AN EDUCATED PLAN.

THE OTHER TOOL THAT I MENTIONED IS AN "INFORMATION NOTEBOOK". I HAVE A BIG BLUE ON THAT IS MORE VALUABLE TO ME THAN ALL OF MY OTHER RABBIT BOOKS PUT TOGETHER. I RECORD REMARKS AND VISITS THAT I HAVE WITH JUDGES AND RESPECTED BREEDERS. A FEW MONTHS AGO I HAD THE HONOR OF VISITING THE HOME OF "FIBBER" MCGEEHEE IN TULSA, OK. HE IS A HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL BREEDER OF FLORIDA WHITES AND NEW ZEALANDS. AS WE WALKED TO HIS BARN I PULLED MY NOTEBOOK OUT AND STARTED JOTTING NOTES DOWN LIKE I WAS A STUDENT IN BIOLOGY. WHY NOT? I WAS IN THE HOME COURT OF ONE OF THE BEST TEACHERS IN THE SUBJECT OF....RABBITS! I WAS ABLE TO CASH IN ON HIS OVER 50 YEARS OF EXPERIENCE. THOSE NOTES BECAME A BIG PART OF MY PLAN FOR SUCCESS!

MAYBE THESE IDEAS CAN BE OF SOME HELP. ONE THING IS FOR SURE....IF YOU NEVER AIM AT A TARGET, THE ONLY WAY YOU'LL EVER HIT IT IS LUCK!

OVER THE PAST COUPLE OF MONTHS I HAVE RECEIVED A FEW NOTES CONCERNING MISTAKES IN THE SHOW REPORTS THAT ARE PUBLISHED IN THE DUTCH REPORTER. AFTER ALL OF YOUR HARD WORK, TIME, AND MONEY SPENT I KNOW IT'S FRUSTRATING TO NOT GET THE RECOGNITION THAT YOU HAVE EARNED. THE COLD, HARD FACTS ARE THAT PEOPLE MAKE MISTAKES! NO PERSON LIKES IT....ESPECIALLY THE ONE THAT MADE IT. IN ORDER TO CORRECT THESE PROBLEMS IN THE FUTURE, I WOULD ENCOURAGE YOU TO CONTACT THE ONLY PERSON THAT CAN CORRECT IT. THAT PERSON IS THE SHOW SEC. OF THAT SHOW. I WOULD LOVE TO HELP ALONG WITH OUR EDITOR AND NORMA HART...BUT WE ARE NOT ABLE.

The greatest teachers in the arena of a child's life are undoubtedly their parents and adult figureheads.

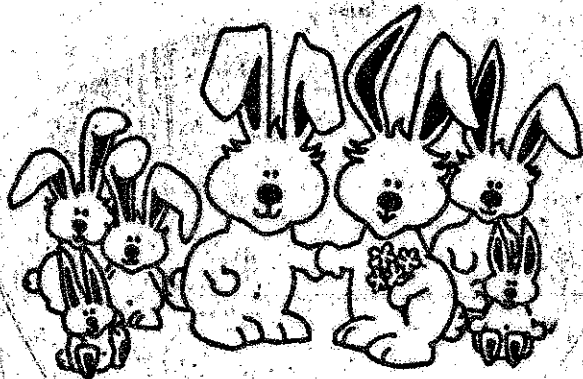

Rabbit Stir Fry

Cut boneless rabbit meat into 3/8 to 1/2" cubes.

Use in any stir fry recipe substituting rabbit for pork or chicken.

Nigerian Baked Rabbit

1 whole broiler-fryer rabbit
1 tsp. salt divided
1/4 tsp. pepper divided
1 tsp. cinnamon divided
1/4 tsp. dried leaf thyme divided
1/4 cup chopped onion

Sprinkle one half salt, pepper, cinnamon, thyme and onion inside cavity of rabbit; place rabbit in roasting pan, sprinkle balance of all seasoning over rabbit; cover and bake at 375 for 1 hour or until tender.

Sweet n Sour Rabbit

3 Tb. Butter 1/4 cup green peppers
1/4 cup onions cut in strips
 coarsely chopped 1/4 cup pimento
1 Tb. Cornstarch 2 Tb. vinegar
1 cup canned 1 Tb. soy sauce
 crushed pineapple
 undrained
2 cups bite-sized cooked rabbit

Saute pepper, onion and pimentos five minutes. Stir in cornstarch, then add pineapple. Heat and stir until thick. Add vinegar, soy sauce and rabbit.

Simmer until ready to serve.
Service over rice. Serves four.
