

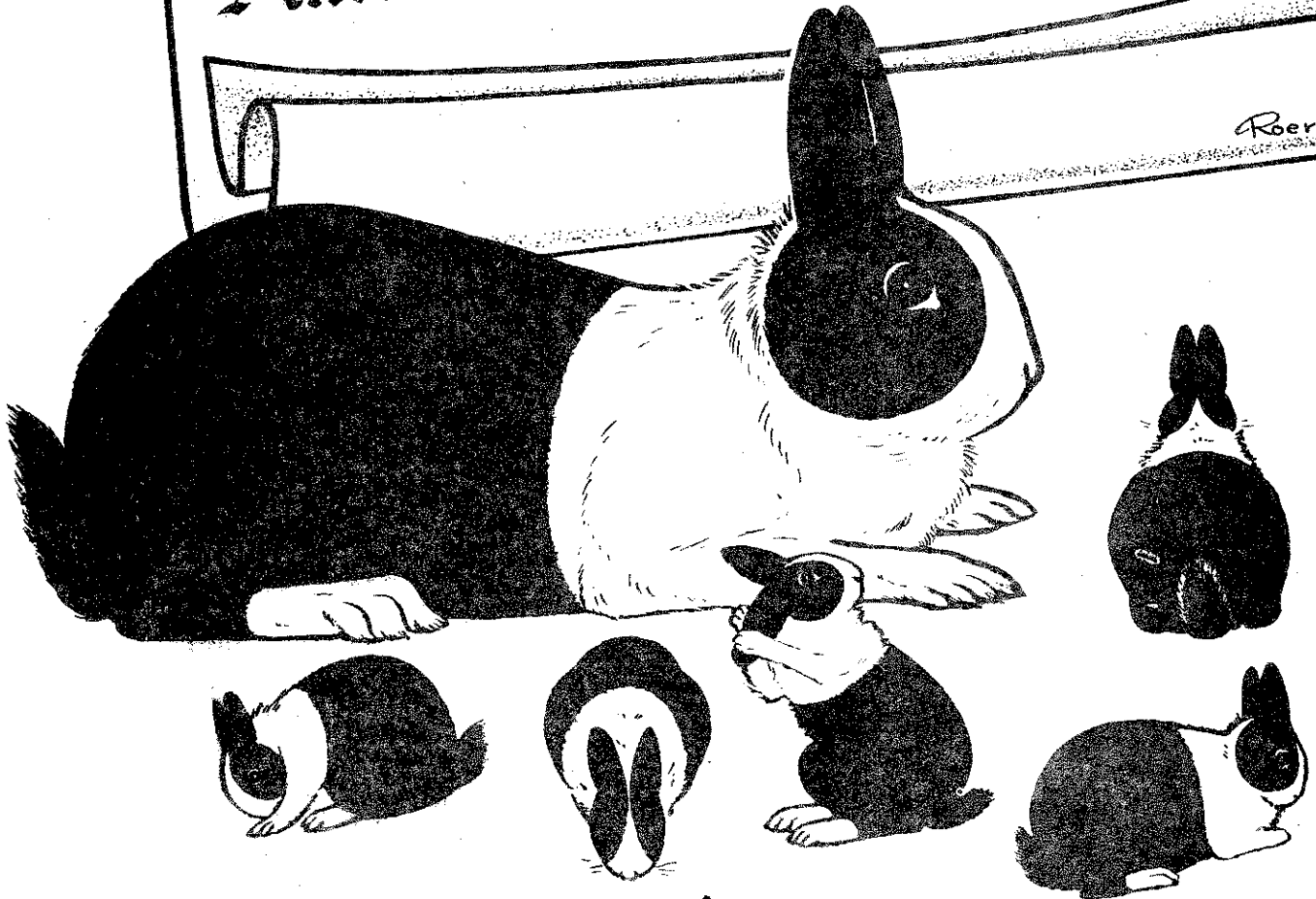

The Lilac Dutch working standard was accepted, to be presented to the AR&CBA Standard Committee, more about this next month.

The Dutch Sweepstake fee which has been one dollar since we started sweepstake shows was increased to two dollars.

"MY TWO CENTS WORTH"

The Standard for the little Dutchman has been for the past few months the most discussed topic in the Reporter, therefore I feel that I want to get in my two cents worth. I consider myself a novice as a Dutch breeder having bred them only for about four years, however I have grounds for what I'm going to try and get over to you fellow Dutch breeders.

I think that our Standard as it is now written except for one thing calls for a much better Dutch than you or I have produced up to now. This I think most of you will agree on, so why try and change our standard to fit what we are producing. Before any radical changes are made I would like to see Dutch that are as good as the standard calls for, produced in great numbers.

The part I feel should be changed at this time is not a radical change as I see it. The Standard as now written calls for an ideal weight of $4\frac{1}{2}$ pounds., and Seniors under 3 pounds or over $5\frac{1}{2}$ pounds to be disqualified (giving a spread of $2\frac{1}{2}$ pounds) With the above weight range we are allowed $1\frac{1}{2}$ pounds under ideal weight and only 1 pound over ideal. Now I feel that the bottom weight should be raised to $3\frac{1}{2}$ instead of 3 pounds, giving the same range above and below ideal.

I mentioned above that I have grounds for this change and I believe you have had the same happen to you. I have entered Dutch as juniors that were only 5 months old, weighed $3\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 pounds, and have the judge make the remark "over developed for class." I have found if you are to produce an ideal weight Dutch, that at 5 months they will weigh $3\frac{1}{2}$ pounds and over. Some will say all you have to do is enter them as seniors instead of juniors. Neither you nor I would do this, because a 5 month old buck will not have developed enough to be shown in classes with bucks over 6 months of age, which our standard gives as the senior age.

With that off my chest I have one other thing I have written about before that I feel would help increase Dutch entries in sweepstake shows. In the past year the Dutch have been shown in far greater numbers than I have seen in my four years of exhibiting Dutch, There is no doubt in my mind that this can be traced to sweepstake shows.

The present way of awarding sweepstake points, to me seems just a little unfair to small breeders like myself who happen to live some distance from the majority of the larger shows. I am of the opinion that if something could be worked out along the idea I have in mind we would have helped boost the Dutch entries even more. The idea I have in mind is to divide the United States into zones, using the latitude and longitude lines as they appear on the map. This would give us approximately 40 zones. By dividing the country into zones rather than a milage basis it would not increase the work of the secretary too much or make it complicated. After this has been set up, award an additional $\frac{1}{2}$ point for each zone shipped through, zones shipped from and into not to count. For example, if I were shipping to Indianapolis, Ind., I would ship through one other zone, then instead of six points for first place I would get $6\frac{1}{2}$ points times number in the class.

I have said my two cents worth and won't take up any more space in the Reporter, however I would like to have your viewpoint on the above.

Polish rabbits, I have had five in the nest, Hamsters, I have had sixteen in the nest, white mice as many as eighteen in the nest. Does this prove the smaller the animal, the fewer the young?

Lets stick to facts and figures as proven by the fanciers. In closing, are you trying to commercialise your Dutch or keep it in the show pen? wher it was originated for.
