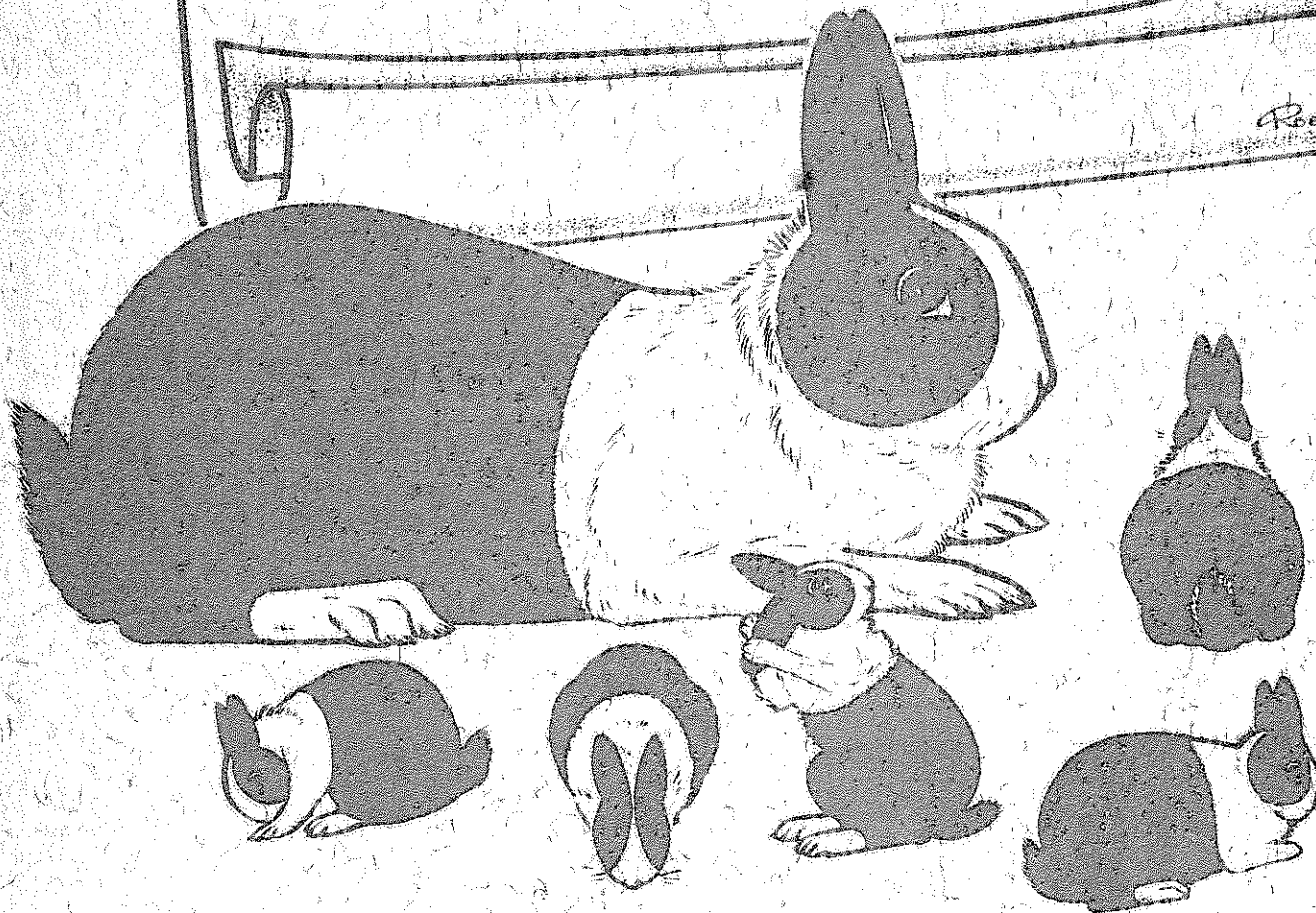

First of all, I would like to introduce myself to so many of you fine Dutch Breeders and Fanciers throughout the country. My name is Lee VanNess; 13 Park Street; West Caldwell, New Jersey, proprietor of Park Rabbitry (as many may know me), member of the A. R. B. A.; A. D. R. C., and various local clubs and associations. I am not a veteran rabbit breeder having only been raising rabbits six or seven years, and Dutch the past four years.

I have been appointed Breed Chairman for the Dutch rabbit for the coming National Convention Show (October 23-27) which will be held at York, Pa.

York, Pa. is located on the Lincoln Highway, U.S. 30, which is the Main Street of America. It is 50 miles north of Baltimore, Maryland, 25 miles south of Harrisburg, Pa. (Pennsylvania's state capitol); 90 miles west of Philadelphia, Pa. (the City of Brotherly Love) and 200 miles east of Pittsburgh, the home of the A. R. B. A. This places York in Southeastern Pennsylvania within a few miles of the very heart of the Pennsylvania Dutch country.

Now, to get down to serious business—who supports the Dutch Rabbit at National Convention time? Do you? Can you truthfully say, "Yes"? Just think back and then ask yourself, did I support the National in '53? '52? '51? We have approximately 400 members in the American Dutch Rabbit Club. Did we receive a Special or entry from each one? You bet we didn't, because if every one did his or her part, we would have had the largest entry.

Let's make 1954 something to remember. Let's all pitch in with cash, trophies, ribbons, rosettes, or what have you, and really make the Dutch rabbit the talk of the Convention, and Conventions to come.

Think it over NOW. Get that Special off to the Breed Chairman now. NOT tomorrow. Tomorrow never comes. There's an old saying, he who hesitates is lost, and we don't want the Dutch Rabbit to get lost, ever. We have the BEST little rabbit, and you know it, for you have said so yourself many times. So let's do something about it now.

We do not like to see the same breeders and Fanciers filling the Convention pot every year, but believe me, where would we be if these people did not help so generously every year. We need everyone's help. Help with Specials and an entry, and attendance.

Let's look back at the National Convention at Springfield, Illinois. The Dutch entry beat 21 other breeds of rabbits to be the fifth largest entry. In 1953 at Amarillo, Texas, the Dutch entry bested 25 other breeds to be the second largest entry. Are we going to take a back seat at York, Pa. in 1954???? You bet we're not, but it is going to depend on you to put the Dutch in first place. I will go out on a limb in saying it will take 450 Dutch at York, to get the largest entry of all breeds, and co-operation of all you Dutch Breeders, along with your Specials and your entries will do it. Don't let me down, and above all - don't let the little FELLA down. You all know our slogan "You Can't Beat The Dutch". Let's keep it that way.

The only reason a breed other than Dutch is on top, is because the breeders of that breed work and plan for it. Let's show them we can work harder and plan better, by putting the best rabbit in the world on top. Remember only you can help to make this possible by sending your Specials in NOW, and an entry to the show in October. We CAN put the Dutch on Top, and with your help it WILL BE DONE. HURRY YOUR SPECIAL TO ME TODAY.

C. Bickley, is awaiting any suggestions or remarks on Standards. The Junior Department Committee has not been completed. As you already know, Mrs. Lyle Neubauer of Pueblo, Colorado, has again consented to serving as Chairman of the Election Committee. Bear in mind, THIS IS YOUR CLUB. The Club members who have so generously accepted these positions cannot function at their best without knowing the needs and desires of at least the majority of the Club members. Even our Election Chairman, and her Committee will have no work unless you send your ballots to them. To be sure, the results of some of our Committees' work will be voted upon by the membership before becoming a "part" in the machinery of our Club; however, your letters with suggestions are an incentive for them to work. They have joined our Club with the expectation of receiving some first-hand information on Dutch breeding, and to help promote Dutch by exhibiting at the shows, etc. It is always quite a thrill to "breed that good one yourself" - and I am sure these new breeders will appreciate your effort in helping them do just that through your tips, hints, and suggestions that will be published in the Dutch Reporter. Kindly send your articles to the Secretary's office. I shall continue to do all editing of articles. Send them in as soon as possible. Our publisher says "bring on the work", and your article is needed.

I would like to call attention to some new addresses of our advertisers. One member in particular, Mrs. Barbara Overley, informed me that she "looked around considerably before finding a location where she could take her Dutch".
