

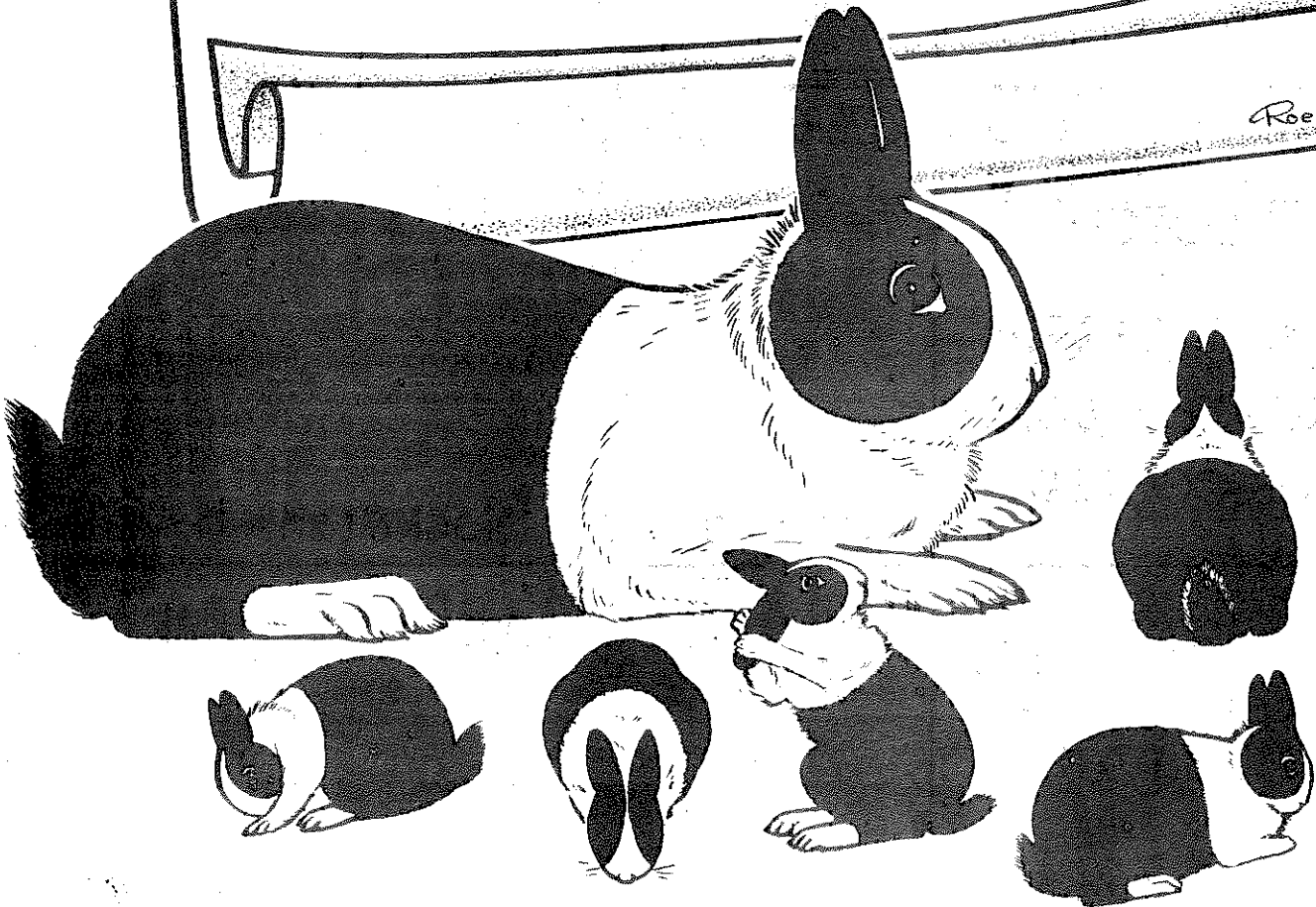

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

BREEDING STEEL GREY DUTCH RABBITS

I have also been requested by our good secretary to write an article for the Dutch Reporter on Breeding Steel Dutch. I understand this will be the third article published on this subject. I have read our good friend Tom Shufflebotham's write-up in the February issue and I understand Mr. Raymond Smith of Toledo, Ohio, sent one in for March.

I must confess that I have not raised Steel Dutch too long and have a lot to learn.

First I would like to give you the Canadian version of the Standard as used by the Dominion Rabbit and Cavy Breeders' Association, the main rabbit club in Canada, for Steel Grey Dutch - "Dark steel grey merging to paler slate blue in the undercolor. The whole interspersed with black guard hairs. The medium bright and evenly ticked shade is the one to aim for and the extreme tips of the fur will be tipped with steel blue or grey. The mixture to carry well down sides, flanks, hind feet. Belly colour

will be a lighter shade carrying with the top colour; underside to tone with the belly colour. Ears to match body. Eyes hazel."

I believe the steel grey is one of the prettiest colours we have in Dutch and is the best waring colour. It is the most difficult colour to breed, but when one has a good one he is mighty proud of it. It is a composition or blending of various colours. Many breeders are disappointed because so few steels appear in their litters. You may get blacks, blues, blue greys, light grey and brown greys together with a percentage of the colour you desire until the experience of the character of the strain you have has taught you to eliminate those animals which give you the least desirable results.

I started out with a steel buck that I secured from Thos. Wragg of Oshawa, Ontario, our senior rabbit and cavy judge and the best authority on Dutch rabbits in Canada.

I mated the steel buck to a blue doe and have only saved the steel and the best brown grey young ones. I have tried mating brown grey does to a steel buck but so far this has not worked out so good for me. My best results have been from mating steel to steel. My steel have been a good colour so far. I hope to try some of the other colour combinations in the near future.

STANDARD COMMITTEE'S Report: Chmn. E. C. Bickley reported, and read the Revised color Standard on Grey Dutch. Mr. Bickley reported that this revision had been accepted by the A.R.B.A. Standards Committee. Some discussion followed, and Mr. Shufflebotham brought out that there was no difference in this revised color standard and the Gray color standard now being used. Paul Miller moved to accept the report; support by Wm. Book. Carried.

ELECTION REPORT: Report read by Sec'y Grables, as Chmn. Neubauer was not present. In the discussion following, the question was raised as to seating the incoming Directors, since Chas. Pine had passed away, and was one of the Elected Directors, and since two candidates were tied in number of votes. Some members felt that there would be an obligation to the voters to seat the three highest in number of votes for this office. Sec'y Grables reminded the members that this was a new kind of circumstance, one that to her knowledge had never occurred in the history of the Club before, and that regardless of the feeling of "duty" this matter should be, and would be taken care of with regard to our Constitution and By-Laws which provided for the President to appoint members to office in any vacancy, and that the tie between Nominees for office should be broken by the vote of the entire membership. SECOND SESSION was called to order by Chmn. Stedman at 5:10 P. M. October 24, 1954

Officers present: Sec'y-Treas. Grables; Directors Stedman and Shufflebotham; and Pub. Dir. Leisenring.

REPORTS, Cont.:

DIRECTORS MEETING: This meeting was held at the Yorktowne Hotel, on October 22, 1954. Present were: Sec'y-Treas. Grables; Directors Shufflebotham and Stedman, and Pub. Director Leisenring. The meeting was called to order at 12 midnight by

Sec'y-Treas Grables. The meeting was spent in discussing general affairs, mainly the revised Grey Standard, and revisions for the Constitution and By-Laws. Meeting adjourned at 1:30 A. M.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS COMMITTEE'S Report; This report was read by and put into discussion by Committeemen Guthrie and Stedman due to the absence of Chmn. Nitzsche. This Committee asked special consideration from the assembly, and asked that refrain from reprinting in the Dutch Reporter be granted, as this work so far by this Committee was still in the rough, being mainly suggested revisions passed from one committee member to the other, and suggestions received from the members. The purpose of this discussion in the meeting on these suggested revisions was for the benefit of the Committee. Concensus was that any revision of the Constitution and By-Laws should be voted upon by mail ballott furnished to each member. Suggestions from assembled members were noted and passed on to this Committee.
