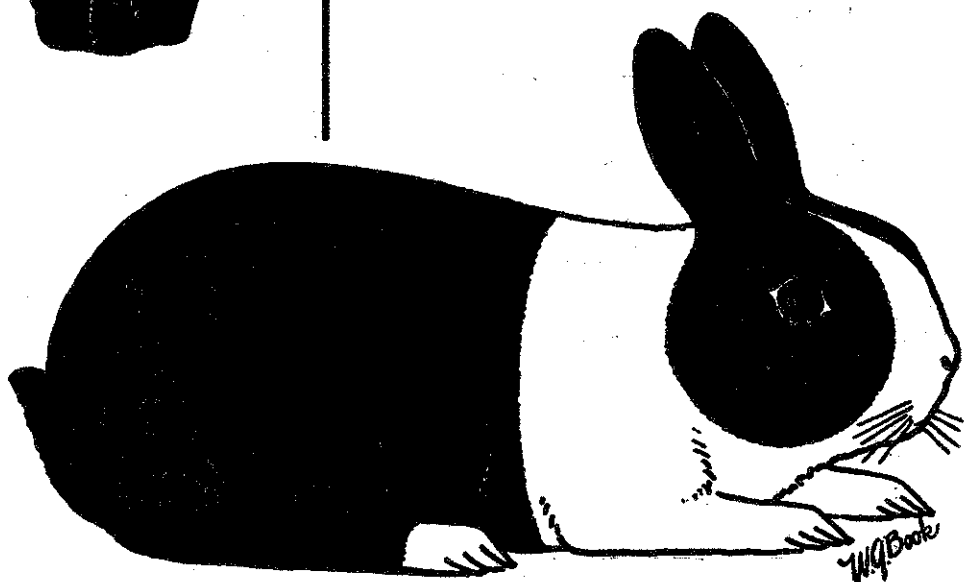

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Well, I must say the Postman really went the whole hog. Nearly went my door all out, if I had one to wear out. I want everyone to know how pleased I am to be able to sit down with a folder full of a number of things besides show reports. I hope this won't be a one shot job. Keep material such as appears on the following pages coming to me and you will have the happiest Secretary and Editor in the rabbit business.

First I have a note from Mr. H. F. Pedigo, who belonged to the ADRC for about five years a number of years back. Mr. Pedigo is the Superintendent of the Rabbit Department for the Colorado State Fair and he says, quite "Ours is one of the better paybacks in the Nation and we would like to see some of the Eastern breeders exhibit here. Competition is very keen, in classes of 25 to 40 in blacks and blues. We had 257 Dutch shown at our 1957 show: all varieties represented including Gold. Judges for 1958 will be D. F. Parker and Tommy Andrew." Check the list of coming shows for the dates of this fine Fair.

Also from Colorado, I have a letter under the heading "Colorado State Dutch Rabbit Club" from Patrick Norman (what a Dutch boaster that guy is) telling me about the fine show put on by the Colorado Rabbit Breeders Ass'n. last month, and also stating that he had obtained all of the old records of the Colorado State Dutch Club which has been dormant since the fall of 1954. They are planning on a reorganizational program out there and as soon as he sends me more information I will pass it along.

Another thing I received was a postal card from the AZ Research & Laboratory Inst., 2823-29 S. Quinn-Chicago St., Ill. as follows, "We are in the market for approximately 300 to 1000 Dutch rabbits, possibly more, both sexes, weighing 1 to 2 pounds, all colors. Because you are the secretary of the club, we thought you could refer us to those breeders who would be able to supply our needs. These animals are needed immediately, all must be clean, solid, healthy stock. We would appreciate hearing from you." This card was addressed to Merl Eary, Secretary of the Ohio State Dutch Club and forwarded to me. Any of you who are interested might contact these people.

It's the first week of April and shortly after you receive this Dutch Reporter it will be time for the National Dutch Show. You should have your catalog by now. I have mine and I must say that the boys down Ohio way have done a job to be proud of. If the catalog is a preview of the good work they have done, are doing and will accomplish towards giving us an outstanding show, I for one wouldn't miss it for the world!

WHERE ARE OUR NEW MEMBERS?

I read with interest the secretary's article in the March Reporter about why so many of the Dutch breeders are not members of the ADRC. I would like to ask my two cents worth, perhaps they will do some good.

It is all our own fault. We as an organization act just like we were a select bunch and that any one should petition us to join instead of being invited. You can scarcely ever pick up one of our National Magazines without seeing an ad from some Specialty Club wanting the breeders of their breed to join them. Do you ever see one from the ADRC?

I would like to tell my experience when I first joined. After I had raised Dutch rabbits for a while I felt the need of affiliating myself with those who were raising them. So, I wrote to the (then) secretary, asking for an application blank. I never got a reply to my letter. I then wrote to the Publicity Director, and no reply to that letter. I decided that it was an exclusive bunch and that they wanted me to prove myself before I could be accepted as one of them. Then one day Judge J. A. Brown was talking to me and asked me why I didn't join. I explained to him that I didn't suppose they wanted me, and told him of the efforts I had made in that direction. He said, "Give me your money and you are in." Which I did. That was about six years ago and if it hadn't been for that, I probably still wouldn't be a member, for I wasn't about to bet them to let me join.

I would like to suggest something that might help. If each member were furnished with a bunch of application blanks and asked to check each inquiry he gets about Dutch, with our membership list and if the writer wasn't already a member, to enclose an application blank with his reply. I answer at least a hundred such inquiries a year. By the law of averages I should surely get some of these.

Another thing that might help is for each member who sells a rabbit to a non-member, notify the Sec'y and have her send him or her a copy of the Dutch Reporter, along with some advertising telling the advantages of joining the ADRC. Then there would be nothing wrong with offering a prize of some kind to the member securing the most new members in a year's time. Let's prove that "You can't beat the Dutch."

There is a bill now before the Agricultural Appropriations Sub-Committee now and will be acted on March 27th. or 28th. We must flood this Senate Committee with letters asking for an open hearing on the bill so we rabbit breeders might present our side and save the Stateion. (The above dates were "proposed dates" so it still may not be too late.)

Write these Senators Air Mail, each of you asking for an open hearing. Those of you residing in the following States make your letters go to the following Senators:

Carl Hayden; Arizona, Lister Hill, Alabama, Willis Robertson, Virginia, Spessard Holland, Florida, John Stennis, Mississippi, Carl E. Mundt; South Dakota, Irvin M. Ives; New York, Everett Dirksen, Illinois, Henry C. Dworshek, Idaho and Hilton Young, North Dakota.

These Senators are from your own State and thus will pay more attention to letters from their own State. If you reside in one of the above States be sure to write.

Remember, the American is like a General without an Army in cases like this unless we have you members' full support and action. We MUST have your help. Phone and contact all your friends, have them write too. Let's spread this like wildfire. Tell everyone. Let us act at once. This is a real crisis and the American membership must nobe be found waiting. With your help we can stop this in Committee. Let us act as we never did before!

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

WITH THE JUNIOR MEMBERS

My girl-friend, Ann Lee, and I are both rabbit lovers and fanciers. We both raise Dutch. This is her first year with them, and my fourth. Since we both like Dutch we made a detailed study of them for our school Science Fair. We called our project, "The Dutch Rabbit in Detail." Included in our project was an assembled skeleton, two posters, and a 30 page notebook on Dutch, their origin, etc. Also on display, we had a Plack Dutch doe, which I may add, drew quite a large crowd.

How we assembled the skeleton may interest you. I didn't have any extra Dutch at the time. Neither did Ann, and as there aren't any other Dutch in thown (that I know of) we used an 11 lb. New Zealand doe which was donated by Mr. W. W. Price of Albuquerque. After the rabbit was killed and skinned, we boiled her for about 5 hours in water. Then it was boiled two or three times in a clorox-water solution. After that most of the meat was off the bones, but after two days of soaking in pure clorox they were completely clean. We wrote off to the Rabbit Research Station at Fontana, Calif. and they were kind enough to lend us a book (about the skeleton of a rabbit) from their library. From this Ann and I were able to assemble the skeleton and name the bones.

We also made a poster showing a Dutch, (its conformation and markings) and another poster on the internal parts of a rabbit. We were confident in the Dutch, and it didn't let us down. We won 1st. prize in the Medical Division, along with \$25.00. We also finished 5th. in the whole school, which consisted of over 100 projects.

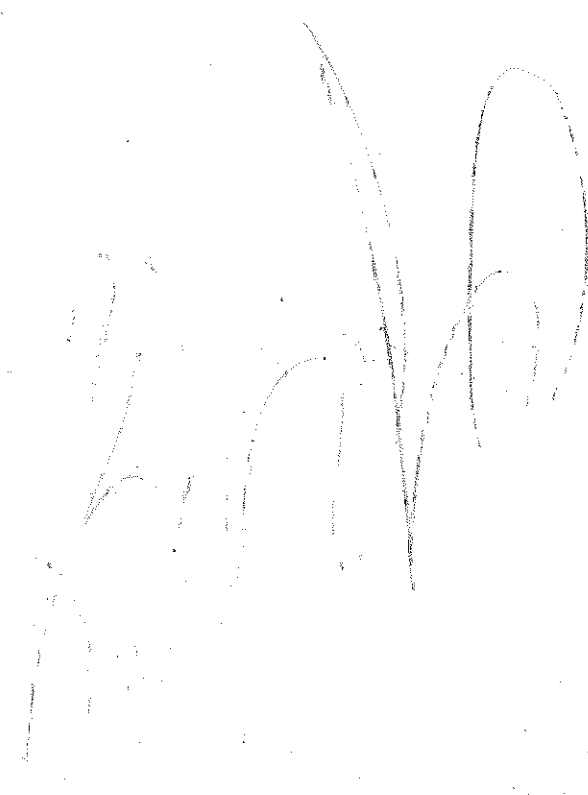

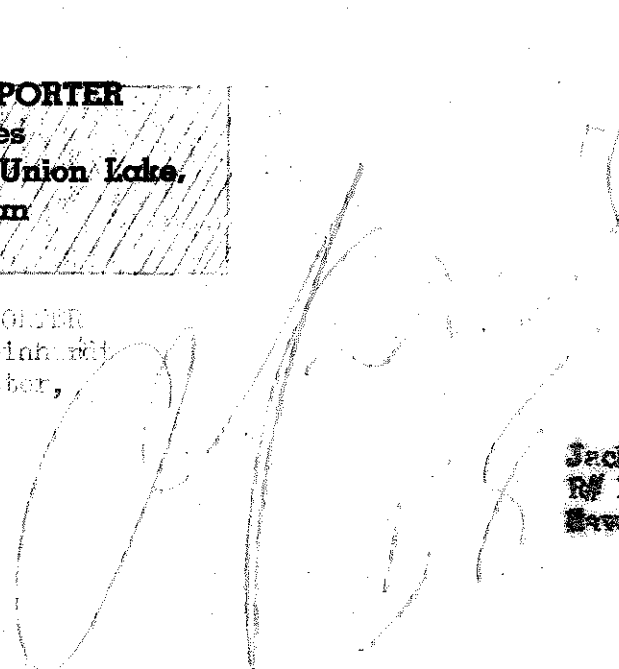
