

#### THE STEEL DUTCH

(This article is a reprint from the 1953 Edition of the United Kingdom Dutch Rabbit Club yearbook. This is sent to the Dutch Reporter by Earl D. Hord of Colorado.)

I have been asked by our Secretary to write a few lines on the Steel Dutch, and give my readers a few memories of the past which I hope will be of interest.

To the question, "Have we lost the correct colour of Steels?" my reply is "Yes!"
The name "Steel" was given to this variety from its resemblance in undercolour to the
metal. Today this resemblance has gone and the undercolour is nearer to brown than
blue. The brown shade is much more pronounced on hind feet, the ears and body are much
too dark and lacking ticking, and any suggestion of blue has been outbred. You cannot
get this blue undercolour without your breeding pair contains a "cross" of blue in
either Sire or Dam. To do this was much easier in the dim past than it is today. We
then had two acknowledged colours of Dutch, now nearly extinct: the Blue-gray and the
Blue-fawn were the colours, and the former the one we used — the mating was black Buck
and Blue-Gray doe, and we usually had a Steel or two in the resulting litter.

This is the method I adopted, and so did many of my contemporaries. I started on Steels well over fifty years ago and bred several well-marked exhibits equally ticked all over, including ears and hind feet with a distinct steel undercolor. My stud of bucks had a dash of blue in its make-ro -- the blue-grays were produced by mating two pale tortoiseshells, or tortoise and pale gray. In those days both of these off colours were recognized by the Club, and about 1903 the Young Dutch Cup was won by a Blue-Gray exhibited by Mr. Plant, of Hanley. A few years later the Club by-rule cut out both these rather unpopular colours. This action in my opinion, is the reason for the decline in Steels, and to anyone interested I suggest that if they ever see a Blue-gray doe, to purchase it, and if they breed one by accident they will be lucky and save themselves years of hard work and deep thinking.

The really correct steel is a beautiful rabbit and lasts better than every other colour. This colour is not easy to describe on paper -- if, however, you break a rod of steel, the color at the break is the correct one.

Personally, I should like to see the blue-gray reinstated as an exhibition colour, if only to bring us back to the true Steel. This manner of producing Steels as described was the one used, amongst others, by Ephraham Blakelock of Clockheaton, who produced a string of winning steels and won the Young Steel Cup in 1924 and 1931 -- rabbits that remain in my mind's eye until the present.

Another old friend, and he is still hard at it, is F. G. Perks -- once known as the "Steel King." I do not know, however, how he kept the correct Steel colour in his stock.

My subject is a very interesting game indeed, and trying to breed a typical steel is by no means easy going. I know I enjoyed my struggle to achieve fame with this lovely rabbit. It would be interesting to have my old friend, Mr. E. C. Richardson on the best way to regain the make-up of the ideal Steel -- it must put us on to a scientific method of accomplishing our object.

One of the strangest happenings in Steel breeding I know of is that I was shown,

by a Leicester fancier -- I forget his name -- a young steel that had won a few firsts. After its adult moult it was a very good coloured BLACK and won several futher prizes. The reverse, however, is quite common or was in my day.

As a conclusion, don't forget that you have a better chance of breeding a winner if you use a really well-marked buck to a rather heavily marked doe: that was my experience and is, I know the experience of several of the older hands. Don't forget that the saddle was once a "collar" and so called. The saddle has been slipping further and further back for years. The Dutch is a coloured rabbit with white markings and should certainly not be a half-and-harfer.

The Dutch Rabbit has figured "large" in my long life -- I still have my first prizecard -- a Third only, however. It is dated 1865. I little thought in those schoolboy days that I should be President of the Club one day and make real friends all over the Country, all interested in the humble bunny, as I was. My life has been made richer by mixing amongst men of all shades of thought and position.

Old men live in the past, and my memories of friends made through the fancy cheer me in the winter of my life.

(Editor's Note: For the benefit of our newer members, Mr. Townsend was a well-known judge over a period of 50 years, often travelling over 7,000 miles to shows in a single year. He was president of the U.K.D.R.C. from 1920 to 1935, and judged every premier show in England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales at different times in his career as a fancier and judge.)
