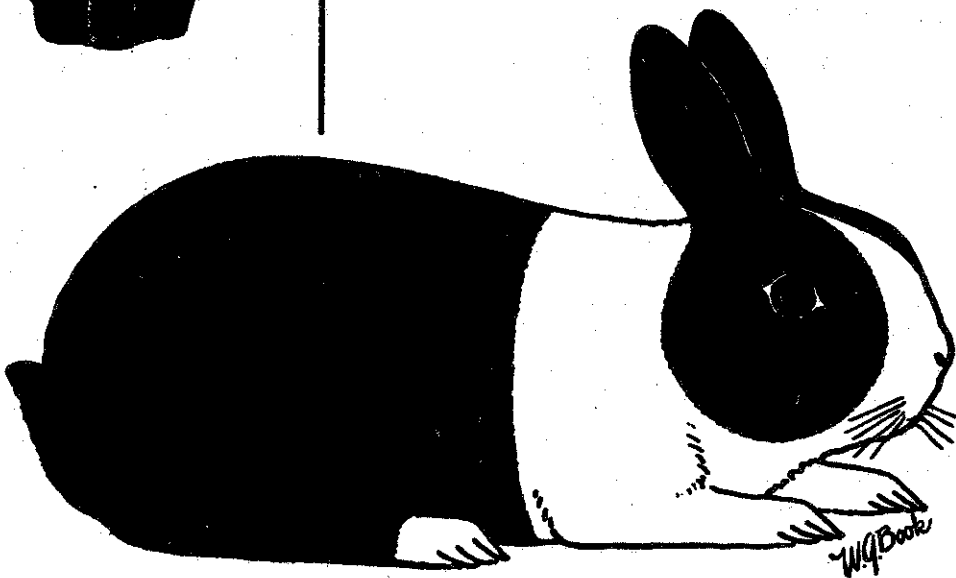

## DUTCH REPORTER EDITORIAL POLICY

Name: The official organ of the American Dutch Rabbit Club shall be known as the "Dutch Reporter"

Objective: The object of the Dutch Reporter shall be to assist the American Dutch Rabbit Club promote the Dutch Rabbit, encourage the breeding of better Dutch, serve as an entertaining and educational media for the membership of the American Dutch Rabbit Club and provide a necessary link between the executive body and the membership.

Content: The Dutch Reporter shall contain only those articles, reports, news items and advertising that can properly be considered pertinent to the American Dutch Rabbit Club, its members and the rabbit it sponsors. All material that appears in the Dutch Reporter shall be judged by whether it is educational, informative, constructive and/or newsworthy. It shall never be used for personal promotion, personal attacks, or articles that would tend to reflect unfavorably upon the American Dutch Rabbit Club and/or the Dutch rabbit.

The preceding paragraph shall not be construed to mean that articles of a controversial nature be rejected. To the contrary, controversy sparks interest, thought and participation. However all articles must reflect good taste, be constructive in intent and absolutely free from personalities

All articles used in the Dutch Reporter shall be correctly identified as to author.

Dutch Reporter Committee: The Dutch Reporter shall be the proper business of a committee of three.

The Chairman of the committee shall be the editor of the Dutch Reporter.

One committee member shall be the duly appointed publicity director.

One committee member shall be appointed from the board of directors by the president.

Dutch Reporter Committee Duties: The chairman shall receive all articles, news and reports. Any article or item that might be considered in conflict with the content objective of this publication shall be submitted by mail to the other committee members for ruling. It shall take a 2/3 vote of approval for it to be published.

The publicity director as committee member shall constantly and actively solicit advertising to help defray the expense of publishing a necessary and worthwhile Dutch Reporter.

The board members as committee member shall be responsible for at least one article in each issue of the Dutch Reporter. In addition he shall solicit one article from each elected official during each calendar year. The articles should be of an instructional nature.

Additional provisions: Should any committee member neglect the responsibilities of his office and fail to follow the intent of this editorial policy, he shall be asked by the president to resign his said office. In case of failure to do so, the board of directors by two-thirds vote shall declare the office vacant. It shall then be the duty of the president to make an appointment to fill the vacancy.

This editorial policy shall not be considered restrictive or censorship in any form. Rather it provides and outline for the editor and committee members to properly provide the type of official organ that will aid the growth of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, the promotion of the Dutch rabbit and the usefulness of the Dutch Reporter.....

The 1970 National Dutch Show at Mason City, Iowa is now a thing of the past. We, the show management, would like to thank all those who helped make the show a success. Things seemed to have run smoothly with a few minor exceptions. Again, a large thank you to all who helped make this possible.

Aside from the problems associated with having to replace our General Manager and Show Secretary in mid-stream, when they were selected as fill-in judges, we were proud to have a chance to show off our two fine local judges. Both Doris Leibel and Darrell Bramhall have previously judged at National Conventions and have fine reputations as Dutch judges in the surrounding area. From the comments that I heard after the judging was over, I think that everyone was impressed with their fine job and that you will be hearing more from these two. Congratulations to Senior Judge, Doris Leibel and Junior Judge, Darrell Bramhall for a job well done and our thanks.

For those of you who were unable to attend, I think you missed a good show. The showroom facilities were outstanding. The showroom was large, well lighted, clean and nicely decorated. There was a coffee shop with fresh home made donuts and other foods and drinks at one end of the showroom and an area of tables and chairs to sit and relax at when eating or just talking. Because of the distances involved between most of our show committee and Mason City, the majority of the arrangements and most of the work was done by Darrell Bramhall, ably assisted by his nephew Steve Haxton. They certainly expended a lot of effort and time on this project.

The entry was smaller than we had anticipated, about 200 but the quality was high. I heard several comments from breeders who attended Dutch Shows regularly to the effect of the high overall quality. We were able to send the rabbits along with another breeder from the same area and I understand the rabbits were home that night.. Breeders straggled out all morning. I saw evidence of the celebrations in many eyes, but I did notice that Pres. Reid and his son Tom (Shufflebotham) were bright and chipper, yet. There were some tired but happy breeders on their way home that morning.

AN EXPERIENCE by Doris Leibel

Something happened recently that I would like to share with you. Joe T. Powers, a friend, had invited me to participate in his shipment from England of Netherland Dwarfs. I agreed and ordered a pair of Chinchilla dwarfs. In due time they arrived Joe picked them up in the late evening and called the next A.M. to tell me to get cages ready and put a nest box in one as the doe looked as if she would kindle soon. I drove to Joe's in the afternoon to pick them up, took a little time to look his collection of Dwarfs and Dutch over along with his fancy fowl, real nice birds and rabbits. Started home and upon arrival found that the doe had kindled three young in the carrying case, lifted her gently into her nest box with her young, where she had one more. I sat and watched her for about an hour, she seemed calm, but didn't trust the situation. Left her for a bit to start supper and when I returned found that she had damaged the last born and knew that she needed something to satisfy the need to clean up after herself. Noticed two placenta in the carrying case which I gave to her. I then plucked fur from her and nested the young. I destroyed the damaged baby and watched her during the evening. She was a bit uneasy, but ate and drank. I sprinkled her pellets with Esbilac, a milk producer that I use with the cats and dogs and their young. She licked that up. At bedtime I left her with a silent prayer for the night. Next A.M. checked her and found, to my delight, she had pulled more fur, fluffed up her nest and fed her young. After all was in order, wondered what the heck kind of rabbit raiser would ship a doe so close up....

After over 22 years of observing the habits of our domestic rabbit I have noted that with a few exceptions there is a pattern to the kindling process. If undisturbed the doe will make a hole in her nesting material and put a few wisps of fur in it. Then kindle and clean up after herself, then she may jump out of the box, drink and rest a bit, the babies will dry off during this time. Then to work, pulling fur and covering the young. Each step seems to take just so much time. If you work closely with your animals on a daily basis, when there is trouble they are familiar with you and you are in a position to help them if needed.

Of all the breeds I have raised and am raising the littel Dutch doe is still the best mother. If you haven't gotten her to small and short coupled she'll raise 6-8 young with no problem and you need a bit of volume when you are dealing with markings. My Dutch does have raised young from larger breeds for me and it is strange to see ~~3-5#~~ fryers nursing on a 5# Dutch doe.

For the benefit of our "new to the fancy" breeders, take time to just sit and observe the habits of your rabbits. Ask yourself, Is their cage clean or are they living in manure and rusty wire. Are their feed and water crocks clean or are they scummy and green with algae. Are they plump and thrifty feeders, or are they thin and poorly from poor feeding practices. Are they kept in a building where when the door is opened the pungent air about knocks you over and you can't understand why their eyes water. Correct these conditions, if they exist, and you are on your way....

Another friend, Mrs. Eleonore Lins of Cologne, Mn. also imported some rabbits from Germany, I tagged along on her coat tails and brought in a trio of ruby eyed dwarfs. It's interesting to see the differences in the stock, Joe's type from England is better, these would make good Polish, but they are small and with dwarf characteristics and look to be at least two years old.

Mrs. Lins also received what she calls Hermelins, six month old rabbits that weigh 1# and 2grams each, with a reddish surface color to their coats and a definite blue undercolor. Never saw anything like it. They are a true miniature rabbit and just as friendly as can be. She also received 4 English Lops that will need a little work, but they are true lops.....

Dear Mr. Paquette:

On the 20th of Feb. I rec'd copies of letters from you and Don Reid regarding a problem with our 1968-69 Sweepstakes Series. It is ten days since I received the letters and it has taken me approximately half of that time, spent in research into the problem to try to learn just what happened. These are my findings: It was announced at Ft. Wayne National Dutch Show in April 1968 that Presidnet Summers had created a new office, that of Sweepstake Chairman, the duties of which should be to receive from the Sec'y. all show reports, comp'le all points and post same, reporting back to Sec'y. all results and standings, for permanent record and publication in the Dutch Reporter. The purpose for the creation of this office was to lighten the work load of the Secretary's office. It would have defeated the purpose had I taken the time to check each report for corrections and also would have expressed a lack of faith in the appointed officer. This chairman carried on, after the National Dutch Show, until Sept. 1968 at which time he wrote stating that the work involved consumed more time than he had to give to the job, but he would continue to mail out ribbons and rosettes if I would send him the cards. He is still doing this job.

My research furthur showed that there were six shows, Santa Cruz, Ca. 6-9-68, Coshocton, Co. Oh. 6-9-68. Mad River Valley, Oh. 6-15-68. San Diego, Co. Ca. 5-21-68 Orange Co. Fair, Ca. 7-16-68 and Ventura Co. RBA, Ca. 8-1-68 which had never been posted. After adding points for these shows to the exhibitors other points I have come up with these results:

Clipfort Rbtry, Ca. (22).....14,106	Chas. Eberle, Oh. (21).....4,839
Sweet Success Rbtry. Co. (7)....11,865	C & D Jones, Tx. (10).....4,497
Leonard Weir, Ca. (20).....11,865	E.D. Smith, Va. (10).....4,380
Robert Berry, Tx. (15)..... 5,612	R.O. Ellett, Ca. (12).....4,293
Ron Gilbertson, Ca. (14)..... 5,242	Mike's Rbtry, Oh. (20).....4,055

There were no significant changes in the second ten of the top twenty as affecting the top ten.

I also have found that all but two of the reports for the May, 1968 shows have disappeared, they were published and the reports are available in three issues of the Dutch Reporter. I do not know what become of the original reports (lost in the mails) but since the material is available in the Dutch Reporter this loss is not significant.

As to an audit--there is no machinery set up in our By-laws for such a proceedire. We do not have funds for a commercial audit and since it took me, who after all of these years am well acquainted with the system nearly five days to check out the points of twenty members, where would we find a disinterested party to devote time to complete such a project.

What the Board will want to do about the mis-delivery or error in engraving of some of the trophies, I do not know. This will have to be acertaind in the near future. In the meantime all of the necessary reports will be held in readiness for any investigation the Board might decide to authorize,
