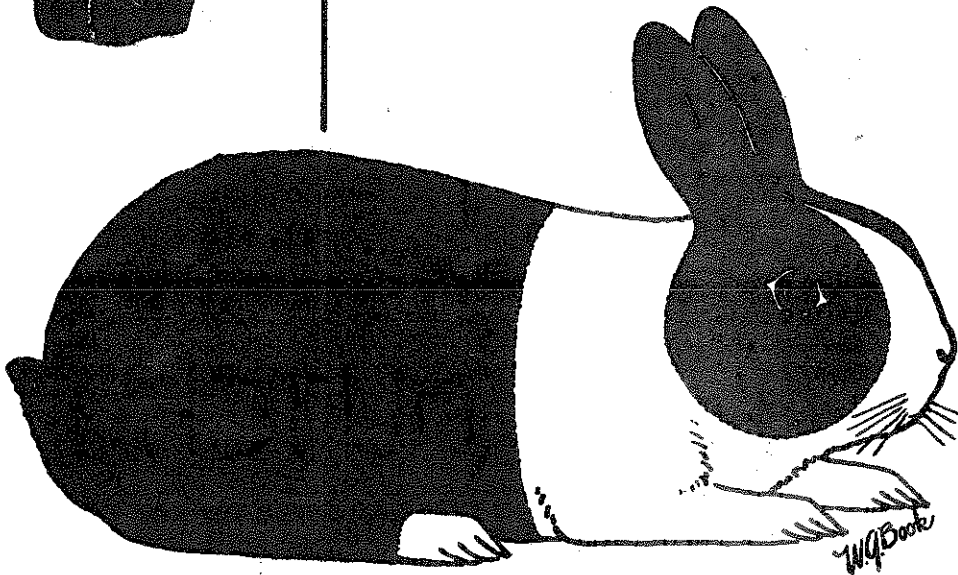
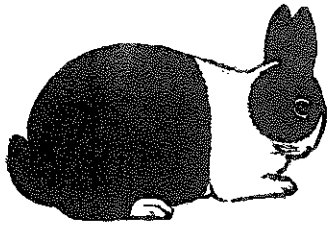
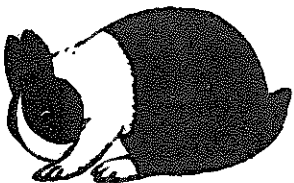

YOUTH WANTS TO KNOW

Over the year just passed, I served this club as Publicity Director. As director, I received a great many letters from old and young alike. But most of my letters (I would say about 70 per cent of them) came from our younger members.

It seems to me that most of them asked the same questions: "What's the best way to raise Dutch?"

There is only one way to answer these youngsters and that is by telling them that there are several different ways of going about it. Everybody has their certain way of feeding, breeding and grooming those young ones for the show table.

Now I know for instance that Bill Summers, Jess Weinhardt, Al McKeeman, Stan Goeglein, Don Lovejoy and G. C. Sturgis, just to name a few, don't raise their dutch as we do here in Rhode Island. They can't. They have that certain way I was telling you before, and we have ours. I don't know their secret formula, but to our younger members, I am willing to reveal ours.

When I refer to "ours" I mean my partner and I, who show under the name of Hobin and Baker.

First of all, get good stock. Poor type dutch eat just as much as good type pedigreed stock.

Second, keep food and water in front of your young rabbits at all times.

Third, keep your dutch clean. A clean rabbit means a healthy rabbit and a healthy rabbit means profit for you in the long run.

Next, start your does to breed at an early age (3½ to 4 months.) If they don't breed this early they will after they get themselves used to your stud bucks hutch. Continue taking your young does every other day or so until they do breed. Take them only to a proven stud. Don't take them to a young buck.

On our young bucks, we don't serve them until they are at least 6 months of age. This we feel, gives them a good chance to fill out, especially in the shoulders.

On feeding, I could tell you not to feed greens, but I won't. We could feed greens very easily because we have access to all the greens we want, but we don't. We believe that everything a rabbit needs to grow strong and healthy is in the rabbit pellet. If your budget will allow, may I suggest once in a while a bale of alfalfa. This is especially good for your younger dutch or your future grandchampions. As far as keeping your dutch indoors or out, it really doesn't matter. We have done both, but

presently conditions are available for us to house them indoors.

The next step I would say is most important to the new breeder. When he or she is buying dutch, stick to one color until you are certain you can handle another. When you can get a first in that color that you have reaised from the nest box, and there were at least five in that class under three different exhibitors, then I would say that you are ready for another color.

Another tip that I think will help you out, expecially those who witness a lot of cold winter nights like we have here in New England, is when your doe comes in, have extra fur for her. This can be done by saving her own fur from the breeding before. You can do this two ways. One, by having her own next box with either her name or ear number on it; or if space will not allow you to have all these nest boxes around, you can save her fur in a jar with her ear number on it. Then, when you have a doe coming in on a cold day, put the fur in her nest box and she won't have to pull so much. By doing this you could save her and the litter from freezing.

When your young are old enough to sell, but you have decided to keep a few good marked ones for breeding, don't take the young ones out of the hutch where they were born, but take the doe out and place her in another hutch. In this way you won't throw the bunnies off their feed and they will continue to eat and grow strong. A new surrounding will probably stop them from eating for a few days.

Well, now that you have some good show bunnies coming along, you will probably want to show them. In order to get them into tip top condition, I am going to reveal one of the biggest secrets that we have.

Getting ready for a show can be just as important as all the rest that I have already explained. For two weeks before a big show, we feed our show stock a raw egg covered with salt. We buy eggs that have a blood spot in them from of friend of ours who has hens. We break the egg right on top of the rabbit pellets. Then we sprinkle a good amount of salt on the egg.

Your rabbits won't at first eat this, but after a day or so they get pretty hungry and before you know it they have finished the chow. This we have found gives a beautiful shine to the fur, makes their eyes sparkle and appear much brighter. Using the salt on the eggs will make the rabbit thirsty and force him to drink. This in turn will flush out the rabbit and you'll have a healthy, well conditioned, and a good sheen color on your rabbits fur. And if you have the type and markings, you can tell your other dutch breeders in your neighborhood to watch out.

Now we are ready to go to a show. It may be to you, the younger members, your first. What should you put your dutch in?

Whatever you decide to do, make sure that there is plenty of air. And I do mean plenty. I would like to have a dollar for every rabbit that I have seen at shows and conventions that had suffocated because of lack of air. Nor do I mean when I say plenty, that when you are driving to and from the show that you have the rabbits head hanging out the window. Don't give the show rabbit too much room either. If you have to stop short, you could hurt the rabbit by having him thrown up against the inside of your carrying case or box. But most of all get to the shows. Even if you only have one or two to show. Or even if you don't show at all you'll fill your old noodle with plenty of dutch knowledge and that's for sure.

Who knows, you may grow up to be one of the best dutch breeders the club has ever produced. Well kids, good luck to you. This generation of youth today will be our leaders of tomorrow. And to some of you old timers who are reading this article, remember this: at the next show you go to, look around, and if you see a small freckled faced kid with a blank expression on his face, go over and talke to him and explain to him just what's going on at the show table. Be like a big brother to him. And at the same time let me remind you of the big brothers slogan that says, "No man ever stood so tall, as when he stoops to help a child."

And the non-dutch breeders at different shows who will undoubtedly see you help a youth will unquestionably say, "Boy, not only can't you beat the dutch, but you can't beat their members either!"

SECRETARY'S CHIT CHAT

It was a great disappointment for me to miss the National Dutch Show at Atlanta. I had been looking forward to that with real pleasure, but what is to be must be. I have some reports back from it and will merely give you the main statistics here. There was a total of 150 Dutch shown with Best Black, Best Dutch going to the junior doe owned by Stohrer & Quinton. Best Opposite Black, Best Opposite Dutch was won by the senior buck belonging to Tom Shufflebotham. Best Blue went to Bill Summers junior buck and his junior doe was Best Opposite Blue. Best Chocolate was won by Jodie Crocker with a senior buck and Best Opposite Chocolate went to her junior doe. Both Tortoise wins and Best Senior All Colors went to Alvileed (Bob Harris). His senior doe being Best Tortoise and his junior buck being Best Opposite Tortoise. Best and Best Opposite Steel went to the senior doe and the senior buck both owned by Johnny's Ideal Rabbitry. Best and Best Opposite Gray were won by the senior doe and senior buck also owned by Johnny's Ideal Rabbitry.

A very small Seller's Class was held, there being only two rabbits entered. First place was won by a Tortoise senior buck entered by Tom Shufflebotham which was bought by C. F. Simpkins for \$50.00. Second place went to a Black junior buck entered by V. L. Casper and purchased by Willard Morris for \$7.50. Complete reports should be in the June issue.

I have a letter from Elmer Paquette, Show Superintendent for the 42nd. ARBA Convention to be held in Pomona, Calif. in Oct. and he writes as follows: "This is to advise of the appointments made for Dutch at the Convention to be held at Pomona, Calif. on Oct. 25-28, 1965. Your first choice of Don Lovejoy we had to reject as we are going to have Don as one of our judges on some other Breeds. However we will list him in the Catalog as Specials Chairman for Dutch and Don has assured me that he will continue to work on this part of the job. We have appointed Leonard Weir as Breed Chairman and Ron Gilbertson as Breed Secretary. Leonard hasn't replied to my letter but I feel sure he will accept. Ron is a new Breeder of Dutch and has worked as secretary of our Calif. All Dutch Show and our Local Club Show and he has demonstrated that he will be very capable in handling the Paper work part of the job."

To date we have one bid for the 1966 National Dutch Show and any of you who might be interested in placing such a bid should be reminded that you only have a short time in which to do so. The deadline is June 1st.

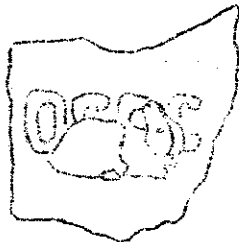

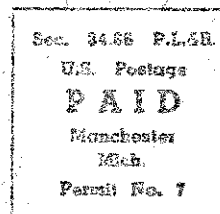
