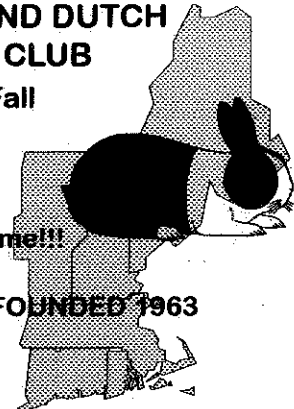

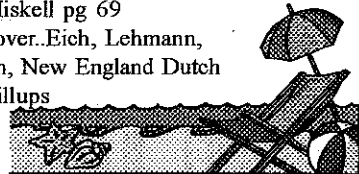

From your new (old) secretary.....

Good morning! It has been a long time since I have written to all of you. I prepared for this writing by spending some time with the last year of Dutch Reporters edited here in Minnesota. It brought back many memories, some of them good and some not so good. It was at the Illinois National Dutch Show that we (Larry & Doreen) announced that we probably would not be able to continue as occupiers of the secretary's chair in the ADRC. The job went to Norma Hart in January of 1982. At the time we retired the children (5) were just all going to school. Paul our youngest was seven, and we felt that they and the farm needed more attention.

I will spend just a few moments catching you up on the Bengtson family and then move on to other things.

First of all, our eldest daughter, Kirsten, is now a PHD candidate at the

University of Idaho in Moscow. Kirsten is a microbiologist and an excellent student. She began her career at the U of Idaho last fall after spending a couple of years at Mankato State U in Minnesota completing two masters degrees in Anthropology and Microbiology.

Then we have Erik who graduated from Winona State U in March of 1993 with a degree in finance. And then there is Paul. He is that cute little blond blue-eyed toddler some of you will remember from 13 years ago. Well, he is taller than any of the rest of us, and still blond and blue eyes. He is



a student at St. Cloud U and now completing his junior year. He became 20 in February, hardly our little baby anymore. Paul's special love is Chocolate and Tortoise Dutch.

With Paul's move away to school last August, our nest became empty.

Larry continues to work for the Department of the Army. He has retired from active reserves, but still works as a civilian for the 407th Civil Affairs. He did not retire quite early enough to miss Desert Storm. The entire 407th got a special Saudi Arabian vacation courtesy of the US government. With all the talk about government economy and military downsizing it is impossible to know how long his position will continue. Anyway, I think he would really like to retire and become a professional Dutch breeder. Larry has an especially good "eye" and can spot an exceptional Dutch a mile away.

When the ADRC left Lewiston, I became an active volunteer in Boy Scouting, Girl Scouting and 4-H. My Boy Scout involvement ended when the boys became full fledged Boy Scouts and they no longer needed a Den Mother. My involvement in Girl Scouting lasted several years through a trip to Wyoming and concluded with a National Wider Opportunity with six 14 year old Cadette Girl Scouts to the Girl Guide International Camp in Scotland. I was active on council committees as a member of the training committee and as chairperson of the older girl committee. I served several years as a council trainer of leaders. The 4-H involvement continued from my youth. I was an active participant in 4-H and continued that association through college and into my children's experiences. I left the positions when the pastor I was working with was transferred and the structure of the three parishes was changed and they no longer needed a parish worker. Since leaving the churches I have been working with a library organization. I spend my time with a bookmobile that serves the 5 counties in the southeastern part of Minnesota. We travel to 30 communities that do not have libraries on an every other week basis. We are a full service, automated library and maintain a library on the truck and another in storage. We carry a small portable computer called a trakker when we are on the road. At the end of each trip we dump the information from the trakker into the central computer system. It is an interesting job and I like being able to be out and about. I try to continue my gardening connection, but find that sometimes it has to take a back seat to other things.

Through all of this we have maintained our "Dutch" connection. Larry and I have both raised Dutch since the early 50's. I always tell him that he better behave, because I had Dutch before I had him and it is the last acquisition that goes and not the first.

So, now you are caught up on the Bengtson Bunch and we can move on

to other things.

FLASHBACK!!

In looking through the 1981 DR, I find new members listed, and they are: Mark Pecaric, Betty Hoagland, and Ricky Billups, and a whole bunch more that are long gone, those are the only names I recognize as still around.

The ADRC was preparing for the 1982 NDS in Hutchinson, Kansas. Conall and Barbara Addison were deeply involved in getting that one going.

The May/June issue of the DR contained the report from the Illinois NDS. Best of Breed was a Black Senior Buck shown by Louise and Les Johnson, Best Opposite Sex was a Tortoise Senior Doe shown by Myrl Milhahn. Judges were Glen Carr and Larry Bengtson.

The new guide book was in the works. The article stated that the 1969 ADRC Guidebook cost the club .38 per book after the monies from advertising had been subtracted from the total price. And that the 1976 guidebook had been larger and cost less (.23) because the advertising response had been so great. Can you believe that 1/5th of the membership had advertised? The closing of the article said "So, after 6 years of inflation and rising costs we were able to get our new book for less money because **YOU CARED ENOUGH TO SUPPORT YOUR CLUB**. See how easy it is to be successful when we all work together."

I wanted to save this for the end,

because I want to send my thanks to Norma Hart for her kind care of the ADRC. We are loosing much money. The board would have proposed a dues increase at the general membership meeting but our code of Regulations requires that we make a code change which will take 1 1/2 years. The figures we were considering were the following.

Single \$10

Youth \$ 8

H/W \$15

This would increase our dues revenue by about \$1600 a year. We will have a proposed code change in the next issue. We have not had a dues increase in 15 years. We need this if we are to continue serving the Dutch Breeders.

Also it was brought to our attention that several people are receiving more than one copy of the DR at one residence. Since each membership provides a Dutch Reporter, the only way that we can only send to each residence is if the member/parent requests this from the ADRC secretary. This would save the club a lot of money per year.

We also need more ads in our Dutch Reporter. We have the best breed publication but we must all do our part to support the magazine.

NEWS FROM RICHARD

With this writing, the 1995 National Dutch Show is history. For those in attendance, you are aware of what a great show it was. For those not able to attend, believe me you missed on of the best National Dutch Shows I have attended in over 20 years.

I was fortunate enough to judge Youth rabbits, and it was a very enjoyable day for me. The Youth were very responsible in getting the animals to the table for the classes to be judged, as well as returning them to their coops after being placed. The writers and table ramrods were excellent, and the show ran without a hitch.

I would comment that in the evaluation of the animals, I would like to see some work done on the Dutch type. As far as markings went, there were some very respectable rabbits, however, the type was, in my opinion, the worst fault in nearly every class. Naturally there were some very good typed animals, but I would have preferred to

see more marking faults and better consistency in the type. The Dutch appear to be too long and weak in the forequarters. The longer limbed (legged) animals will tend to lengthen out in body structure, so this is one way to determine at a younger age if there will be a length problem after the animal has time to grow. Watch the little kits as they start coming out of the nest box and move around. Those long legged ones will surely need to be watched. Those having the nice short legs with some substance are the ones to keep an eye on for the better type at a mature age.

I do not know if everyone is aware of how long Wayne MacKinnon has been raising Dutch rabbits, but believe me his winnings are well earned. Wayne has always been knocking at the door. rabbit conditioned and show ready, is water. It is quite simple, and yet so important. Keep a fresh supply of clean water available in clean dishes. Automatic watering systems if kept clean and in working order are the best plan yet. Unfortunately our family and many others do not have this. It certainly is a goal in our rabbitry. Meanwhile, we keep those crocks full with H2O in clean, slime free dishes. A few drops of bleach to a gallon of water seem to help to keep diseases down and the dishes cleaner. Nothing gets me more (my daughter Mandy will attest to this) than rabbits having to drink out of water dishes that have feces, feed or slime in them. When water dishes are emptied, feel with your hand on the bottom for slime. It only takes a few days to accumulate. We have a bucket of bleach and detergent water available at all times in our barn. That makes it easy to clean these dirty dishes.

Rabbits need clean drinkable water at all times, if possible. Then they eat what you want them to. If they cannot drink they will not eat. In Wisconsin winters can be very severe. Our rabbit barn is unheated, so the rabbits do not have water in front of them all the time. We water them four times a day. This certainly sustains them, but does nothing for their condition. The late winter and early spring shows are hard to get rabbits in good fur because they have not had all the water they wanted for a few months. When we start

having above freezing temps, it is such a treat not to have to dump water dishes. Moreover this means the start of better conditioning for the rabbits.

Warmer temps do however bring another set of problems in watering your rabbits. When the rabbit's water in their dish heats up, they will not drink either. That means dumping each dish twice a day and giving them cold water to drink. In addition make sure that pens with multiple rabbits have a large dish or two for water. When it is very hot and humid, rabbits often go off feed and only seem to want to drink. We need to make it as easy as possible for them to get what they want.

When rabbit shows are 5 hours on the road and then the show lasts for 8 hours, your bunny undoubtedly is going to get thirsty. Take along some water from home and do offer them a drink or two during the day. Exhibitors get to drink when they are thirsty, so please do not forget the rabbits in the carrier.

In summary, there are many hints, tricks and ideas that you will get from the experienced show person concerning rabbit conditioning. Remember it all starts with a clean dish of water for your rabbit to drink.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING

April 28, 1995 Oshkosh, WI.

The Board of Directors meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order at 8:20 PM by President Fred Mullinax.

ROLL CALL:

Those present were: President Fred Mullinax, Vice-President Wayne MacKinnon, Directors - Ken Emerson, Kevin Hooper, Richard Gehr, Floyd Dopler, Lynn Shaw, Fran Schettler, George Parmer. Secretary/Treasurer: Norma Hart.

Those Absent were: Directors - Charles Christ, Linda Anderson.

Director Parmer made a motion to dispense with the reading of the previous minutes. The motion was seconded by Director Dopler, MC.

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

DIRECTOR ANDERSON; sent a letter with President Mullinax with some comments on possible sending a current copy of the C & BL out with each new membership until a new guidebook is issued. It was also mentioned that it may be feasible to print the ballots that go in the DR on colored paper and place them near the front of that issue. She felt that it may assist in them being returned in a more timely fashion.

DIRECTOR PARMER; noted that many of the Dutch shown in the Pacific Northwest area belong to youth. He said that Dutch numbers being shown were down in his area.

DIRECTOR DOPLER; noted that allot of youth Dutch are being shown and there appears to be allot of potential. There have been a few 2 in 1 shows held that have sparked some interest.

DIRECTOR SCHETTLER; says that Dutch are strong in California and

there appears to be allot of interest.

They are planning a big Dutch extravaganza for two days so there is allot of excitement at this time.

** Secretary note - Director Schettler's report was inadvertently omitted when these minutes were read at the General Membership meeting. I would like to apologize to Fran for this unfortunate error on my part!*

VICE PRESIDENT MACKINNON; says that the demand for good Dutch in his area exceeds the supply. He stated that there are not allot of established breeders around. It's slow, but he hopes to experience a growth of Dutch in the future.

DIRECTOR EMERSON; stated that there is not much going on in his area and there aren't as many Dutch breeders as there used to be. He said that many were going out of the Dutch and getting into some of the smaller breeders like Netherland Dwarfs, Holland Lops and Mini Rex. He said since many judges don't consider the Dutch for best 4 class, some are starting to raise some six class animals. He feels that there is a lack of competent judges for marked animals.

DIRECTOR GEHR; echoed Director Emerson's remarks about some getting away from the marked breeds and going to those breeds that type and fur are the main concern. He stated that there are allot of youth showing Dutch in the area which is encouraging. He said he is saddened by the loss of some of our dedicated breeders like Carl Decker and Sue Stockmaster. He noted that he has had many calls for good quality Dutch stock and always tries to give the name of a reputable breeder in that area.

SECRETARY/TREASURER HART; stated that not having attended any shows this year, it was impossible to say whether Dutch were up or down in her area. She could only echo Director Gehr's remarks. Secretary Hart gave some statistics with regard to memberships, sanctions, and the Dutch Reporter. We have 782 members which

included 104 H/W, (208 mbrs), 283 youth, and 291 single adult paid members. She noted that there had been 472 sanctions issued from January 1, 1995 through April 25, 1995. Sweepstake ribbon cost from February '94 through April '95 was \$1907.75 and Dutch Reporter costs were given from previous years through the present time.

DIRECTOR HOOPER; is busy with the 1996 NDS. He says that the numbers are up and down in his area and the loss of the Billups' due to a move to Tennessee has hurt the Dutch numbers a bit. He says that he will continue working on the Blue-Steel Dutch.

DIRECTOR SHAW; noted that he really couldn't speak about the numbers but the competition appears to be tough, and that's good.

PRESIDENT MULLINAX; says that there's about 40 - 50 Dutch being shown in the open shows and 20 -30 in the youth. He says that the shows have been down but when they have the Carolinas Dutch Rabbit Show, they usually have about 100 - 110 Dutch shown.

Secretary-Treasurer Hart issued copies of the Treasurer's Report to those present. (A copy of that report will be found elsewhere in this issue).

PUBLICITY: Rick Billups came in and gave a report on the Publicity Dept. They are going to liquidate some of the old inventory and have some new embroidered items available. They are going to keep a complete inventory on computer so that they can keep a constant watch on what's selling and what needs to be discontinued. They don't want to tie up allot of funds on inventory. They have their booth space reserved for the 1995 ARBA Convention in Louisville, KY and ask that you stop by their booth here to look at what's available and what's on sale.

Vice-President MacKinnon stated that

the ADRC Hall of Fame is all set and ready to go. There will be an application form in the next Dutch Reporter and by the next NDS we should have some names to put in.

UNFINISHED OR OLD BUSINESS:

Director Hooper said that he mailed copies of the NDS rules guidelines to each officer to look over. He said that his committee set these up so that the show sponsors would know what was expected of them. They are not intended to be dictative, but rather to show our expectations. The Board would be flexible but would expect that show sponsors to abide by them if at all possible. There was some discussion held with regard to the rules. Director Parmer says that there is no reason that guidelines cannot be followed and Director Schettler suggested that a possible commitment letter with regard to the show sponsors and the NDS rules may be part of the bid pack. Director Hooper and his committee are putting together a final complete set of guidelines for the NDS and will submit it to the Board as soon as it is completed. It was noted that any inferior conditions should not have to be tolerated by the exhibitors or the animals.

There was a lengthy discussion with regard to membership fees and Dutch Reporter costs. Director Hooper did an excellent study on the dues from past years to the current time. The dues have not been increased for approximately 8 or more years. It is suggested that the fees be increased and a possible resolution to the C & BL be submitted to the membership for a vote in the near future. Director Hooper will give a brief detail of what the Board discussed and it's findings during the General Membership meeting.

Secretary Hart noted that our supply of guidebooks has been depleted. The new edition should be ready for

mailing to the entire membership in Feb. of '96. Until that time, new members will be issued a copy of the current C & BL and a letter telling about the Dutch Reporter and Dutch Sweepstakes. It will also note that they will receive a copy of the Dutch GB ASAP!

There being no further business, Director Parmer made a motion to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Director Gehr. MC

MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

April 29, 1995 Oshkosh, Wisconsin '95 NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW

The General Membership Meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order at 7:30 AM in the NDS Showroom by President Fred Mullinax.

ROLL CALL: Those present were: President Fred Mullinax, Vice-President Wayne MacKinnon, Directors: Ken Emerson, Kevin Hooper, Floyd Dopler, Lynn Shaw, Dick Gehr, Fran Schettler, George Parmer. Secretary-Treasurer: Norma Hart. Those absent were: Directors: Linda Anderson & Chuck Christ.

President Mullinax asked for a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the previous NDS. A motion was made by Larry Bengtson and seconded by Jack Wireman. MC

Secretary Hart read the minutes from the Board of Directors Meeting. President Mullinax asked the membership present if they were please with the last copy of the DR and the reply was yes.

Director Hooper then gave a report on the cost of the Dutch Reporter and it's recent large increase. He noted that the DR needs to be more self sufficient. He told the membership that as it now stands with the last issue mailed, the DR costing us \$1.00 more than we receive in the cost of a single membership. He reviewed all of the income and expenses and it is necessary that something be done to increase our revenue. It will take 1 1/2 to 2 years before we can have an increase in dues if a resolution for a membership increase was passed. We need some additional ads for the Dutch Reporter and they can be sent either to the Secretary of the DR Editor. There was discussion on the possibility of sending only one DR to an address to help defray costs. Some want their extra DR's as they are passed on to potential new members or to those who have purchased stock from them. Some state that they would prefer only one DR be sent. If you wish only one Dutch Reporter be sent to your household, please advise the ADRC Secretary so that your file can be noted as such.

Wenton Carlton spoke on how judges have been placing some of the Dutch. He said that he has seen a Dutch be placed last in a class of 7 to Best of Breed the following day. He said many of the judges are placing the animals down because of small faults that should have only minimal points deducted, like a neck marking. He suggested that a committee be appointed to approach the ARBA with regard to the judges not judging by the standard. He noted that it should be what breed fits their standard the best rather than personal preference.

Others spoke on this same situation saying that he is not alone in his feelings. Wenton noted that in his area, it seems if there is a Mini Rex at the show, it is definitely going to be the BIS winner.

Robert Woods asked if there were required specials for the Dutch with an ADRC sanction as many clubs were not adhering to it. He asked if this couldn't be printed somewhere so that clubs would take note. Secretary Hart advised that this information is printed on every sanction form that is issued the show sponsor. All they have to do is read it!

Jim Schettler gave some concern to the fact that many feel there is not enough communication with other members in the ADRC. He suggested that it was a possibility, since many now have computers, that some communication be done through them. He noted that way, anyone who wanted to contribute could and members could communicate with each other whenever. He suggested that a task force or committee be set up to look into this matter for feasibility. Jim Schettler recommended Fran Schettler look into this. President Mullinax appointed her this committee chair and asked that she get her own

committee members that she felt she could work with. President Mullinax also appointed Wenton Carlton as committee chair to look into the judges' matter with regard to the judging of Dutch by the standard and the problems being encountered. He is to appoint this own committee members and approach the ARBA Board with their findings at the '95 Convention in Louisville, Kentucky.

There was a questions asked with regard to the ADRC getting involved in mandating when State Clubs are to hold meetings. The ADRC has no jurisdiction with regard to state clubs.

The Hall of Fame was discussed and there was some clarification with regard to a misunderstanding of only deceased members being eligible. There will be certain categories in the Hall of Fame and it should be ready to have names included by the '96 National Dutch Show.

President Mullinax asked that we bow our heads in prayer for all those members who have passed away.

Director Hooper recognized Secretary Hart for the work she has done as Secretary/Treasurer for the ADRC for

the past 13 + years. He also wished to recognize Dick Gehr for his job as past DR editor. The new DR editor, Julia Anderson was introduced. She asked that the membership continue to contribute our thoughts and our ideas in order to provide a good publication.

Sue Strandwitz welcomed each of us to the '95 NDS. She said that they had worked hard with our help and support and thanked everyone for coming.

Doreen Bengtson spoke with regard to the exhibitors getting their complimentary T-Shirt from the '95 NDS and noted that she needed to be aware of all animals that had been scratched so that judging could begin.

With there being no further business, a motion to adjourn was entertained by Reggie Shull and seconded by All Miller. MC

IS THAT DUTCH SHOW READY?

BY FRAN SCHESSLER

You have to know which animals in your barn are show ready by the time you sit down to fill out your show entry form. It is a waste of your time and money to enter rabbits that are not ready to compete, and it causes unwarranted stress on the rabbit to take it to a show that it isn't ready for.

But how do you get that Dutch rabbit show ready? It is a combination of good genetics, good rabbit husbandry, good feed and water, lots of time and effort, and a pinch of luck thrown in for good measure.

Unless you are very lucky, don't expect to be able to ignore your rabbits until just before the show and still have them compete well. Here is what my husband Jim and I believe go into making a rabbit ready for a show:

- **Good feed and plentiful clean water.** This has to be one of the most important items. If a rabbit is being fed stale or poor quality feed or is not getting an adequate supply of clean, healthy water, there is no way that any of the other items listed here is going to make that rabbit ready for a show. A good show rabbit must have good condition, both in flesh and fur. A wasted, bony, moulting rabbit is not going to compete-- in fact, all the other breeders will think very poorly of you for

bringing that rabbit to the show.

We are fortunate here in Danville to be on healthy, tested, clean city water. However, I bet many of you reading this article are on well water, or on a water system that may not be up to city water quality. If you are having problems with your rabbits, give some thought to having your water tested! There are some surprising things found in water these days.

- **Good rabbit husbandry.** A dirty, stinky, dark and dank barn full of flies, mice and other undesirable will not help a rabbit get into show condition. Rabbits require lots of hard work to keep cages, feeders, waterers, carrying cages, nest boxes and surrounding rabbitry areas clean. Rodents and other pests must be eradicated before your feed and cages get contaminated. Good ventilation and a clean smelling barn go a long way towards keeping your rabbits healthy too!

Good husbandry also includes regular grooming of your rabbits, clipping toe nails, and helping the rabbit get rid of loose hair during moults.

Your upcoming babies that are still with their moms require some attention too. Keep the nest box clean so that the babies have a healthy environment to grow up

in. Don't leave them with mom or fellow brothers and sisters too long or you may find them looking like a cloud of moths got to their fur, or you may suddenly discover that the fur on their blaze has disappeared mysteriously.

- **Good genetics.** If you don't have good quality rabbits, the cleanest rabbitry, the best feed and water is not going to make your rabbit a winner. A poor quality rabbit takes as much time, effort and feed as a good quality one. Don't waste your time-- don't impulse buy-- do your research and buy the best you can get and afford.

- **Luck.** Most Dutch rabbits, given basic good care, will come into prime show condition and development somewhere between 5 and 7 months of age. With luck, this peak will be at the same time as the "big show". (Many people time their breeding to have prime age rabbits for the "big show"). If your rabbit loses this peak or goes into a moult right before the show, though, your chances of winning are lowered dramatically.

Moulting and having the rabbit peak at the right time have a big effect on your rabbit's success at the show--you can't really control these factors very well, but you can control your genetics, feed and water, and rabbit husbandry.

Getting to Know Floyd

At the request of the new Dutch Reporter editor, I have been asked to write a "rabbit history" of myself. I have to applaud Julia Anderson's efforts as she seems to trying many things to make the publication interesting and use it to it's full benefit. Many of her future ideas I have tried on a smaller scale and therefore I realize how difficult it can be to get the material an editor desires.

Sharon and I will be married 17 years in April of '95 and we have two daughters, Melissa, 16 and Laura 14 (I wanted to name our first daughter Shasta, but I guess Little House on the Prairie beat me out). We had been married less than a year when we met a youth cavy breeder who encouraged us the join the ARBA if we were interested in rabbits and cavy's. In 1979 the ARBA sent a note to a local club secretary about 40 miles from us who subsequently invited us to attend their meeting and picnic in July. We brought Melissa with us who was three months old. We were among strangers but that perception was short lived as the members were quick to meet the quests. We quickly discovered that some rabbit breeders have more than one interest, such as the person who raised birds. Some were hard working devoted individuals who were simply the spouse of a rabbit breeder. We joined the club that day and were members for a whole six days before we assisted in putting up the coops for the upcoming fair show. We also at that time owned only two rabbits, neither of which was showable.

We snowballed on from here and

attended more than a dozen shows over the next year. We learned at least one new thing from each one of them. I became one of those precious people that I feel has so much to offer our club today; a new breeder full of enthusiasm. People like this do not have a lot of experience, but are what make things come to life and pushes the older breeders along. They need to be given a chance of what they can do and yet watched over just enough to see that they do not make any horrendous mistakes.

After attending many shows where no one was available to register stock and finally having to beg a registrar in my own "local" club to register my rabbit if I would drive sixty miles to his house, I felt I could do everyone some good if I obtained my registrar's license. It was definitely a challenge and not a money maker, but obtaining my all breed license was a personal achievement.

While attending a show with Mike Avesing, who was thinking about getting a registrar's license (and now is a judge), we looked around the show floor and decided we could do better than what our host was doing. Long story short, we formed the Riverbend R.B.A. which is currently the largest club in Illinois or Iowa. Riverbend is located on the boarder of two states so we have many members from Iowa, although we are affiliated with the IL state association. I continue to be secretary/treasurer for this fifty member club along with being show secretary for their 1000 head fair and 2100 head annual fall show. Here again, the first time Sharon and I tackled this job we had no experience and no nearby help and had never seen a sanction. This first Riverbend show had 900 head! On top of the rabbits we have another other major interest: mineral collecting. I am president of the Black Hawk Gem & Mineral Club in Rock Island, which was formed the same year as I was born, 1955. I am also the bulletin editor which means I have ten pages of material to assemble, print and mail every month. I also have had the good fortune to met many other people in the field of geology through the internet system and America on Line, at our local college geology department and out in the field.

I am always hoping to hear from more dutch breeders. I am district 5 director for the Dwarf Hotot club and almost all the officers are on line. 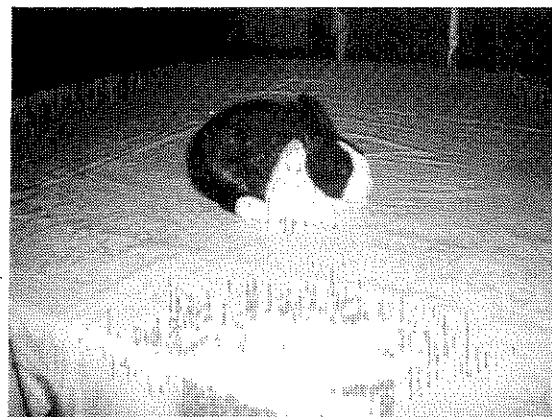

We, the UMDRC are proud of our effort and will celebrate with a wind-down fund show in the park on June 4, 1995.

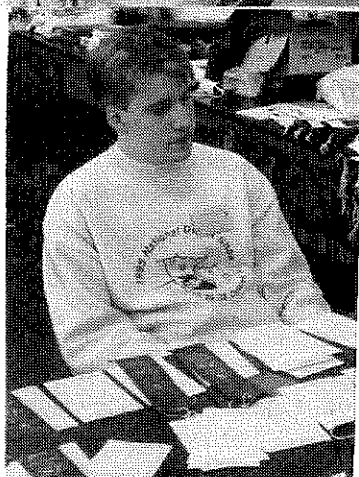
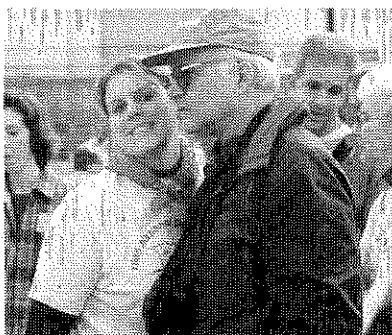

'94 OPEN SWEEP-STAKES WINNER

Ricky Wood is thirty-three years old and has had rabbits since the mid 70s when he had pet "mongrel" rabbits. He raised and cared for them for fun until the mid 80s. In 1984 Ricky saw a tort Dutch in a pet shop. He was intrigued and interested enough to purchase it and track down the breeder, Gary Pace. It was Gary that got Ricky interested in breeding and showing rabbits. He sold Ricky some of his initial stock and accompanied him to many shows. The original tort did go on to win a BOB and other wins, which shows Ricky's eye for perfection was established right from the start.



Ricky continued to add colors until he had all six in his barn. He has no favorites- "whatever is winning." The four main colors, black, blue, chocolate and tort seem to rise and fall in numbers and strength. He has had BOBs with all colors and BOVs and BOSVs at national shows. To amend this, I must tell you that W9, an old black buck will soon be nine years old. T13, a tort buck, is probably four or five. Ricky is not usually sentimental but he has a few exceptions.

As for numbers of rabbits, he has 125. I can tell you that he has a fairly large enclosed barn with seventy-one holes for most brood does with some bucks and young stock. The lower building is almost totally enclosed and is used exclusively for Rick's show stock. It has thirty-two holes. There are also forty-eight wood and metal outside hutches. These are used for just about everything — show, breed stock, does with litters, etc. A fair bit of it is consigned to my daughter, Jennifer and

her woollies. This keeps the fur out of the buildings.

Ricky is a meticulous person with a drive for perfection — aren't many Dutch breeders? I believe much of his success comes from knowing the standards of his breed and developing and knowing his line of rabbits. He can tell quite early what a rabbit will probably look like as an adult and which markings need to be stressed. Ricky is also ruthless in culling bad teeth and poor type as well as any other major problems. I know he had to destroy a multiple grand champion black buck, several does and quite a number of babies several years ago when bad teeth cropped up and the common factor was the black buck. His blacks are still recovering from that blow.

Ricky is a superb competitor. His entries are on time, in correct order for show sheets and legible. When Ricky arrives at a show, his main concern are his rabbits. He gets them set-up and ready, then he chats or does business. He is a very quiet man. He will talk rabbits with you and just drop tidbits of information about himself. Ricky is extremely honest and tends to under price his rabbits as compared to many top rabbit breeders. His average price is probably \$20 to \$40. Kids can often buy them for less. I know Ricky gets calls from all over asking for his rabbits or just to talk and ask his advice. He is very knowledgeable and keeps running records of breeding, sales and feed purchases. His theory is not to turn anyone away. If you need a certain color, he will turn himself inside out to find something for you — even if it means letting some breed or potential show stock go.

Ricky's method of preparing for the next show is one of always looking ahead. Right now, he is looking in nest boxes and seeing Louisville entries. In Tulsa he was preparing for Oshkosh.

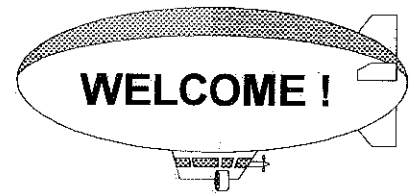
Unfortunately, his heavy show schedule last fall took its toll on his stock and were not ready for Oshkosh so he didn't attend. Ricky feels that if he does not have at least a few good contenders for BOB, then he might as well not show. In a concession to the many miles his rabbits travel, just recently Ricky bought several larger carriers with small feed cups and water bottles. This should help the rabbits on longer trips and minimize the stress.

Also, as far as barn maintenance, Ricky is a stickler for keeping it shoveled out. He says the ammonia smell will kill babies faster than anything else, especially in the summer. We seem to be shoveling and torching constantly! In addition, besides being an electrician by trade (he presently is contracted and working at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville). Ricky is an able carpenter. He built all his rabbit buildings and outside cages and even acted as contractor when building his own home.

His rabbit barns have electricity and running water. The barns also have an automatic watering system. We run several large window fans in the warm months for additional ventilation.

As you can probably tell, I have immense respect for Ricky and his animals speak for him. His presence can always be felt at a show. He is the kind of breeder that you love and hate to see coming. You know his stock is superb so he wins many classes, colors, and BOBs, but if you do beat him, you can feel like you've got a super rabbit. Ricky always has everyone's respect and liking. I believe he has helped improve the Dutch breed in the years he has been raising them due to his consistency, high standards, and dedication to the breed. I wish I was more like him.

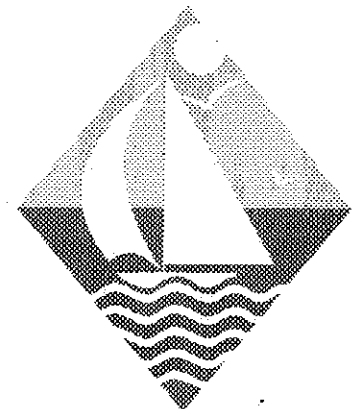

INTRODUCTION OF THE BLUE-STEEL DUTCH

By Kevin Hooper

Most of you should have seen the results of the balloting on my introduction of the Blue Steel Dutch in the last Dutch Reporter. It is my intention to introduce the variety again at the ARBA Convention in Louisville, KY. My purpose with this article is to initiate the discussion on the merits of the blue steel in the Dutch breed. I have received many favorable comments on these animals and I have heard many saying "Why does he want to bring that color back?"

I want to have this color recognized because they are very useful in the breeding program for Steels and Grays as well as for their own color. The AOV (all other varieties) category was done away with (around 1960?) and I feel that many of these colors are useful and even missed. I have no intentions of introducing any other color, even if I think some of them, such as the gold, would help in breeding programs.

I didn't have any steel juniors at the Nationals, but I am getting extremely nice colored steels using Blue Steels. I have been breeding Blue Steels to my Steels which have no blue in them and am, getting entire litters of Steels and Grays (with good ring color).

I have talked with several breeders, who do not have Steels or Grays, who have expressed interest in raising this color if it becomes recognized. This will not only lead to more Blue Steels, but as they are bred to blacks, you will get more steels. As we all know, we often don't plan on raising a color until

it shows up and we decide we like it. I believe that the Blue Steel will increase the interest in the breeding of Steels and Grays and the raising of Dutch Rabbits.

To answer a couple of comments on my Blue Steels:

1. They will have a variance in color like the steels have. The amount of steel coloration and the shade of blue the animal has will determine this. Some will have a lighter belly than other due to these same factors. We will have an ideal to shoot for, as we do in steels. One drawback that I have had is that my blues have been of a lighter shade of blue that I would like. This has shown up in my Blue Steels as well.

2. They are not Blue Grays! Scott Williamson concurred with me on this at the Tulsa Convention. A Blue Gray will have features like that of a Gray. Light eye circles, a white belly color, white bottom to the tail, and white lacing to the ears. The Blue Steel has none of these. They are very similar in the color over the back, with the Blue Gray showing more ring pattern. Keep in mind, it will be more difficult to see any ring in a blue gray due to the colors we are looking at on the hair shaft.

3. They will breed true, depending on the genetic background of the animal. Grays, Torts, Chocolates, and Steels will also breed true depending on their genetic background. Most of the time, your Blue Steels will still have some colors in the background that will give you Blue Steels and Blues. Blue is the Dominate color in Dutch as it will dilute the black to blue. Therefor, a Blue Steel to Blue Steel breeding will give you 75% Blue Steels and 25% Blues.

In closing, let's discuss the issue now, before we get to the time to vote. (By the way everyone says our Torts lack the bright orange color - we used to have Golds to breed them to get that color - now we don't.) I believe we will increase the interest in the Steel and Grays as well as the Dutch Breed. Look at the number of ballots that were turned in on the first vote. At least maybe we woke some people up.

Husbandry of the RABBIT

Part 2

GENERAL CARE

Rabbits may be housed inside or outside. Adult rabbits should be individually housed in hutches or suspended wire cages that are structurally sound, provide protection from predators and adverse environments, are of adequate size, are easily sanitized, and are equipped with hopper feeders and sipper tube water bottles. The size of the pet rabbit determines the housing needs. Large rabbits should have a minimum of five square feet of space. Medium rabbits should have four square feet, and small rabbits should have three square feet. Cages should be at least 14 inches high. Wire mesh is generally recommended because it can be easily sanitized. Wire mesh openings should be 1 inch x 2 inches on the sides and 1/2 inch x 1 inches on the floor.

Rabbits that are indoor pets can be litter trained, and a litter box can be kept inside the cage or in an appropriate location in the house. Indoor rabbits should be caged when left unattended. The material used in the box should contain a substance that is both absorbent and, if eaten,

digestible. A paper organocellulose product is available as well as compressed wheat grass product that is superior to other materials often used. Cedar and pine shavings are often used but are not recommended. Cedar can cause respiratory problems. pine is not absorbent and can lead to urine scalding. Cat litter can stick to the perineal area or feet and cause dermatologic problems for pet rabbits. Regardless of the bedding substrate used, it needs to be changed frequently to prevent urine scald or ammonia inhalation.

The most common behavioral problem in pet rabbits is chewing. Provision of digestible litter material, high fiber diet, and safe chew toys may be helpful. Rabbit proofing a house in which a rabbit is allowed to roam freely is essential to prevent injury from electrical cords and possible toxins in the environment. Unsupervised exercise is not recommended.

Another important consideration when housing a rabbit is ambient temperature. Ambient indoor temperature should remain between 40 degrees F and 80 degrees F, ideally; rabbits should not be housed outdoors if temperatures are above 85 degrees F. Rabbits can tolerate cool temperatures better than warm temperatures. Excessively warm temperatures can result in heat prostration; decreased fertility may result if shade or a cooler environment is not provided. Incubators are rarely used for sick rabbits because of the heat intolerance of the species. The ideal temperature for rabbits to be housed is 60 degrees F. If outdoor

housing is chosen, the enclosure must have a shaded area that allows the rabbit to avoid direct sunlight if the temperature is too warm as well as an enclosure where the animal can shelter itself from the elements. Most breeders and pet enthusiasts have a separate housing area that is attached to the hutch. This facilitates easier cleaning and allows the rabbit to spend time on a floor with a smooth surface instead of the wire mesh. Time spent off the wire mesh helps alleviate sore hocks in rabbits. In cool weather, grass hay should be added to the housing area to provide insulation for the rabbit. Daily changing of this hay is optimum for good sanitation.

Although rabbits are lively and affectionate pets, they are also delicate and may require special care. Owners should be well informed about specific emergencies and signs of illness that affect rabbits to ensure proper care, treatment, and prevention of such episodes in the future.

Caution should be used whenever a rabbit is restrained. If the animal struggles, the lumbar portion of the spine can fracture or luxate. Gloves should not be used when handling rabbits because they do not allow for adequate control and may frighten rabbits. Rabbits should never be grabbed by the ears. The environment in which the rabbit is restrained should be made as calm and comfortable as possible. Rabbits are very sensitive to loud noises and odors and do not like slippery surfaces. A towel or mat should be used. This may make the rabbit feel more secure, allow for solid footing, and prevent

scrambling. The amount of restraint depends on the procedure. Physical examinations require minimum restraint whereas oral examinations require maximum restraint.

Rabbits that are carried a short distance can be scruffed by the neck and supported with the other hand on the rear quarters (football hold). Rabbits can also be cradled in the arms when scruffed by the neck and supported by the rear legs with the free hand. The head of the rabbit should face the crook of the arm. Allowing a rabbit to hide its face tends to relax some animals. The best and safest way to move a rabbit a long distance is to use a carrier or a box. Rabbits are great chewers and should not be left unattended in carriers for long periods of time.

Placing rabbits on their backs may be helpful for trimming nails and cleaning ears. The animal can be placed on its back and held firmly between the legs of a person that is sitting. The rabbit is positioned with the back legs closest to you. Stroking the abdomen may help to calm the rabbit. Hypnosis of rabbits has also been used for minor procedures, such as toenail clipping, injections, and radiography. The rabbit is restrained on its back (eyes covered or uncovered) in a V-shaped rack or in the crook of the arm. The belly is gently stroked until the rabbit relaxes. Breathing will slow from approximately 51 to 21 breaths per minute.

RABBIT EMERGENCIES

- Persistent choking or wheezing
- Difficulty in breathing
- Sudden weakness or lethargy
- Not eating for 24 hours (especially if weak or depressed)
- Watery diarrhea
- Persistent or bloody diarrhea
- Loss of use of any limb
- Fractures in which blood is present or bones are protruding
- Uncontrolled bleeding
- Large lacerations
- Coma
- Seizures
- Head trauma that accompanies lethargy or depression
- Animal bites
- Eye injuries

SIGNS OF ILLNESS

- Hair loss (possibly caused by mutilation or infection)
- Chronic intermittent diarrhea
- Anorexia (see in 24 hours if appetite does not return)
- Fractures
- Periodic weakness (may indicate systemic disease)
- Periodic salivation or pawing at the mouth (teeth should be checked)
- Lumps or bumps on the skin
- Chronic coughing
- Unusually aggressive behavior
- Small lacerations or signs of injury
- Persistent scratching
- Ear infections and head tilt
- Lethargy, depressions, changed attitude
- Pus or thick crusts around the eyes or nose

NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW GUIDELINES

Ken Emerson and myself were given the task of updating our National Dutch Show Rules. We each made suggestions and then presented these to the Board last fall. The input from the board was utilized and the rules were revised further. The board then discussed and decided that we should call these guidelines, not rules. The items below are to be used as guidelines for the sponsoring club. As noted below, a sponsoring club can have an alternative to one of the guidelines, but the ADRC board must approve the alternative.

NOTE: (The following National Dutch Show Guidelines, including who we mail catalogs to, can be amended if the sponsoring club has an alternative. The board can alter any of these if it is their desire.)

NDS GUIDELINES

Each sponsoring club shall agree to abide by the following guidelines when their bid to host the National Dutch show is accepted. If a club cannot meet all of the guidelines, it should not submit a bid.

Rule 1 - National Dutch Show

A National Dutch Rabbit Show, which shall be sponsored by a group of Dutch Rabbit Breeders who are members of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, or by a State Dutch Rabbit Club, shall be held once a year. This show is to be held during the month of April, unless decreed otherwise by the Executive Board of the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

Rule 2 - Bid timing

Bids for the next year's National Dutch Show must be presented to the Board of Directors of the American Dutch Rabbit Club prior to the meeting at the current year's show. **Bids may be submitted up to two years in advance.**

Rule 3 - Bid Selection

When two or more groups or clubs are bidding for the show, the decision as to the winning bidder shall be vested in the Board of Directors of the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

Rule 4 - Responsibilities

The sponsors of the National Dutch Show shall be responsible for all obligations connected with the show, and under no circumstances shall the American Dutch Rabbit Club be responsible for any obligations.

Rule 5 - Sweepstakes show

The National Dutch Show shall be a Dutch Rabbit Sweepstakes Show, and the sponsors shall comply with the Sweepstakes Show Rules, as well as these rules.

Rule 6 - Points

The National Dutch Show (as well as the ARBA convention) shall be a "Double Points" show. All sweepstakes points earned at these shows shall be doubled.

Rule 7 - Show Catalog

The Secretary of each National Dutch Show shall mail a copy of the National Dutch Show Catalog to each exhibitor of the previous National Dutch Show and to those members requesting a catalog, **at least 60 days prior to the show.**

Rule 8 - Cooping

Rabbits shall be cooped in wire cages that have double wire dividers, small mesh wire dividers, (1/2 x 1/2 max.) or solid dividers. No dividers made only of cardboard are permitted. Coops should have ample room for the animal to move about. No coops designed for dwarf breeds, shall be permitted. Coops shall be arranged in such a manner to protect the animals from injury at all times.

Rule 9 - Care of the Dutch

Provisions for food, water and proper care shall be made. **Cups for feeding and watering shall be clean and if possible, fastened in the coops by the sponsoring club. Breeders wishing to use their own feeders shall be permitted.**

Rule 10 - Judging Tables

The judging tables shall have ample space around them for breeders to observe the judging. The show tables should be placed far enough apart that so that comments from one judging table will not interfere with comments at another table. The judging tables shall have a minimum of fifteen holders on the table. There shall be enough holding coops behind the table to hold the remainder of the largest class. The holding coops at the judging table shall be high enough that the judge is not required to bend over to pick up the rabbits.

Rule 11 - Personnel

The sponsoring Club shall have enough members committed to carry the rabbits to and from the judging table from the first class until the show is completed.

Rule 12 - Awards

The sponsoring club shall provide placement stickers for first through tenth place. These stickers shall be placed on the rabbits coop as soon as it completes its' class.

Rule 13 - Financial Report

Sponsors of the National Dutch Show shall make a financial report of the show to the Executive Board of the American Dutch Rabbit Club within 30 days of the date of the show.

Rule 14 - NDS Allotment

An annual allotment, as set forth by the American Dutch Rabbit Club and included in the Constitution and By-Laws of the organization, shall be turned over to the show sponsors of the National Dutch Show by the Secretary-Treasurer, on or as near to January 1 preceding the National Dutch Show for that year.

Rule 15 - Profits

If the sponsoring club has a Net Income of More than \$300, then the sponsoring club shall return to the ADRC, the difference, up to the \$500, that they received from the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

Amount returned to be used in the allotment for the next National Dutch Show.

Rule 16 - Judges

The sponsoring club shall be required to pay a minimum fee, as set forth by the American Dutch Rabbit Club Board of Directors, to each National Dutch Show Judge.

There shall be a minimum of two judges for each National Dutch Show. The senior judge will be chosen by the membership of the ADRC in a mail ballot of judges who are ADRC members. The judge receiving the most votes shall be secured as the senior judge. If the judge receiving the most votes is unable to judge, then the sponsoring club shall contact the judge with the next highest number of votes. The other judge (s) will be selected by the sponsoring club with consideration given to those judges receiving the most votes. The senior judge must be a member in good standing of the ADRC, while the junior judge(s) are not required to be ADRC members.

No judge shall be allowed to judge two (2) consecutive National Dutch shows and it shall be the duty of the ADRC Secretary in inform the membership of those judges who are not eligible to judge due to this ruling.

It shall be the duty of the ADRC Secretary to furnish a list of ARBA judges who are also ADRC members at the time the ballot is sent out. This ballot is to be furnished in conjunction with the final ballot for Officers, by September 10 of each year preceding the show.

Rule 17 - Judging Order

The senior judge shall start with black senior bucks then black junior does. The junior judge will judge the black senior does then black junior bucks (if only two judges.) The junior judge will then begin with the blue senior bucks and they will then alternate classes through the colors or varieties as listed in the Dutch rabbit standard.

If three judges, the senior judge begins with the black senior bucks, the first junior judge will judge the black senior does, and the

second junior judge will begin with the black junior bucks. The three judges will then alternate classes through the breed.

The judge who judges the senior buck class shall place all specials in that color, e.g.: Best Black, Best Opposite Sex Black, Best Black Senior, and Best Black Junior. It shall be the duty of all of the judges of the NDS to collaborate to pick the Best Dutch, Best Opposite Sex Dutch, Best Senior Dutch, Best Junior Dutch, or any other placement that takes into consideration of colors. In placing the Best Dutch, Best Opposite Dutch, Best Senior Dutch, and Best Junior Dutch, all colors, should the decision be close, the decision of the senior judge shall rule.

Rule 18 - Judging

Judging shall start on Saturday and be completed on one day, and the judges shall be notified to this effect at the time of securing their services. No judging shall be done at night.

Rule 19 - General Membership Meeting

The General membership meeting shall be held during the show, preferable in the morning prior to the show.

Rule 20 - Rules

These rules may be amended by a majority vote of the Board of Directors.

Don Reid of Remer, Minnesota died in the Hospice section of the Itasco Medical Center, in Grand Rapids, March 19, 1995. Don joined the ARBA in 1932, received his registrar's license in 1935 and his judge's license in 1938.

At the time he received his judge's license, he was the youngest judge ever licensed. His first love was Flemish Giants, followed by New Zealand Whites, and Dutch. His first big win was at the AR&CBA Convention in Chicago in 1933. He showed and judged throughout the US, and was also well known for his interest in Cavies.

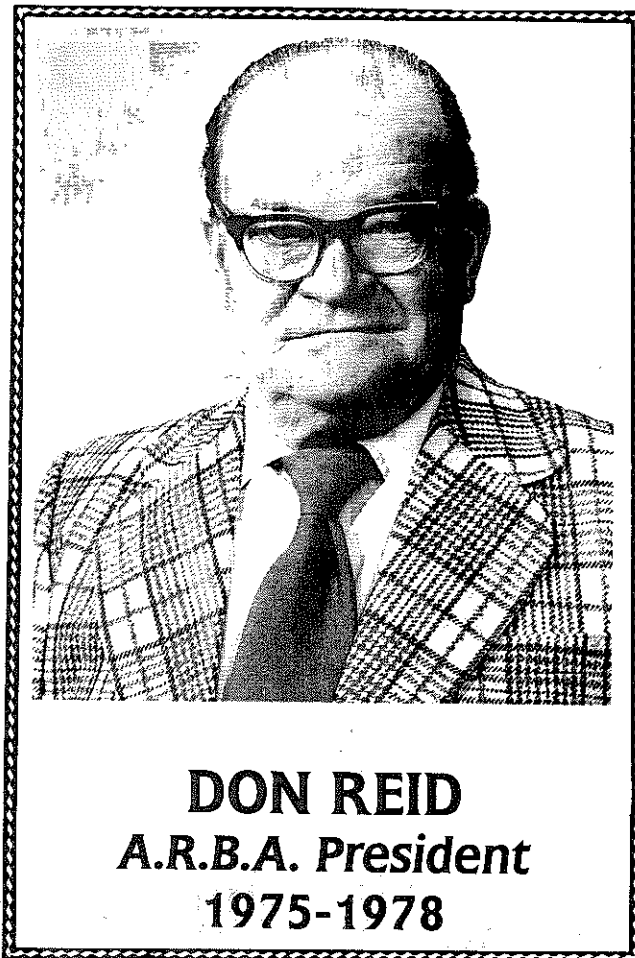
He and his lovely wife Muriel were mainly responsible for the reorganization and development of the Cavy Club in the 1950's. This led to further interest in the Cavy Club and new life.

He was a life member in many clubs, including the ARBA, Illinois State, Minnesota State, Tibbar Club of Illinois and Itasca Club of Minnesota.

Don served the ARBA as Vice President 1971-74, and was elected President and served 1975-78. During his term as the President, the concept of ARBA Districts was initiated along with several other major changes in the organization.

I believe he was the oldest active judge in the ARBA. Not in years of age, but years for holding a license.

Don was respected as a judge, well liked by all who knew him; and to his family and many friends, we offer out sincere sympathy.



In 1938 Don became the youngest judge - and received the AR&CBA Badge #60, which he was very proud of. He judged for over 57 years, and had attended 49 consecutive conventions, prior to becoming ill, and unable to attend the Oklahoma convention in 1994. Don was born January 12, 1917, and died March 19, 1995.

Don & Muriel had three children, Kenneth, Gary and Steven. They were an active rabbit family - with the boys participating actively. Gary had the opportunity of starting the first youth show - which went over very well. The Reid's spent a lot of time working with youth members.

During World War II Don was a pilot, flying bombers. He made many flights, and fortunately he made it home safely to Muriel and the rest of the family.

Being as active as he was, he participated in many clubs and associations. Don was quite often an officer in the clubs and attended many meetings. He was especially involved in the Illinois rabbit and cavy activities, which meant that he was, at different times, officer, director, V.P., & President. His ARBA tenure as V.P., and President lasted thru eight years, and continued to serve the ARBA for many years.

Don & Muriel were always friendly; they would always have visitors coming around. At shows they would invite you in, and would talk, tell stories, and discuss almost anything. Don especially liked fishing at their lake at Remer, MN. During the summer regular stream of people would show up, and fishing was often one of their many activities.

Don was a great person, and a great friend to all, and we will miss him very much.

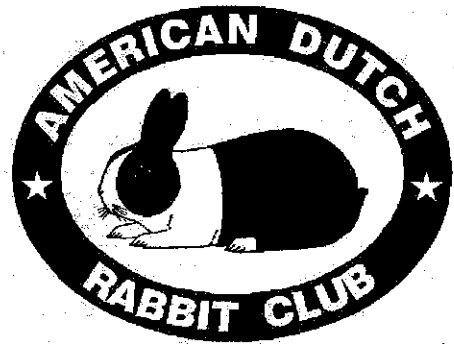
