

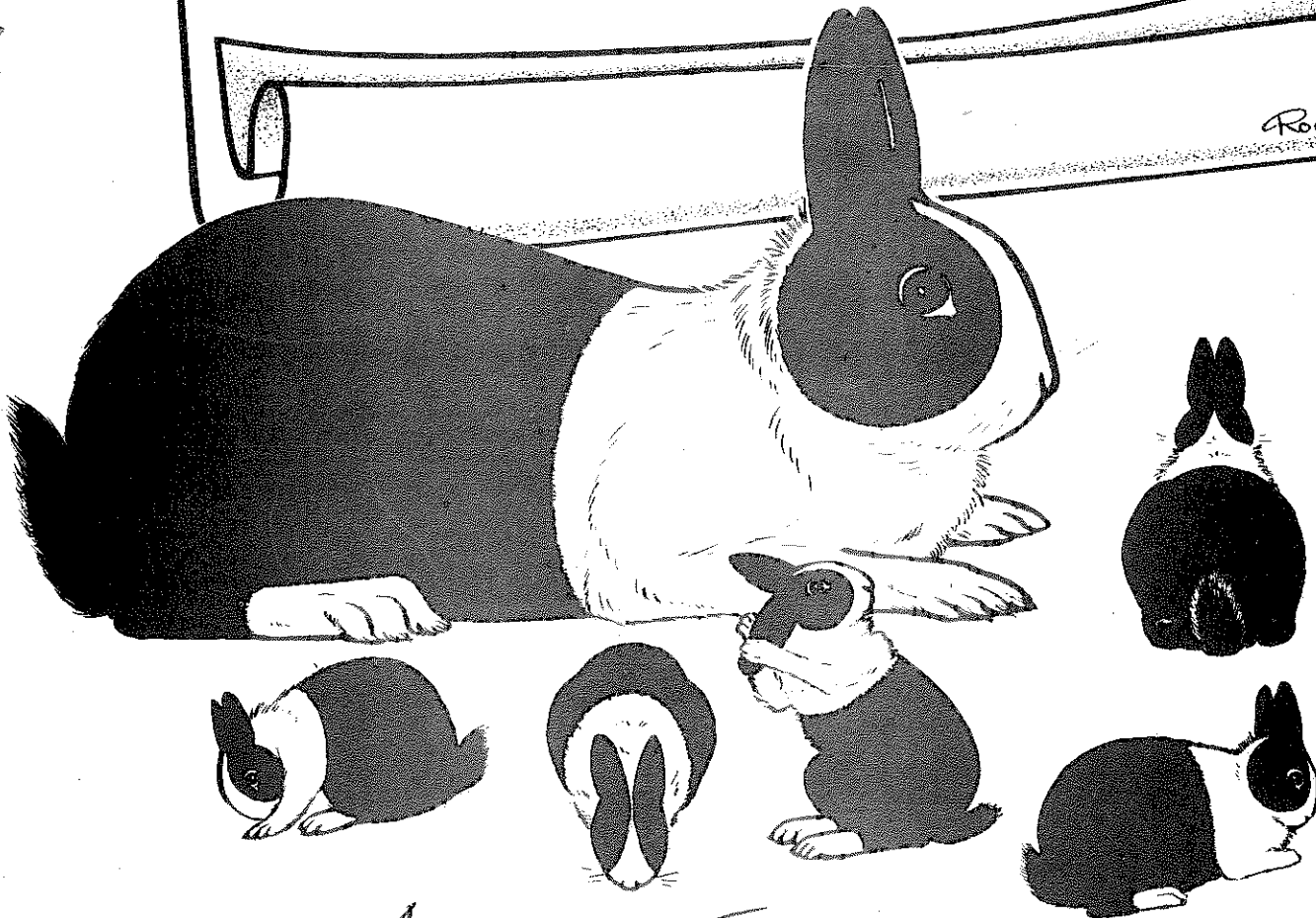

Now that summer is here and the show business is at its lowest ebb doesn't necessarily mean that the promotion business is also at a standstill. With all this bright sunshine it is surely possible to take some real good Dutch pictures for the new AR&CBA Book of Standards. We have had some response as Lou Slavens (Jerry-Lou) and E. E. Brumfiel have submitted some pictures but WE STILL NEED MORE.

In taking these pictures please be sure that your rabbit has the proper background to distinguish his body lines, ears, etc. For example one can't always see the ear outline or the back line on a black or chocolate when posed against a dark background. Would also like to have the rabbit occupy as much of the picture as possible with it posed to show type and markings. To encourage this I will award a Dutch car tag to the best Dutch picture submitted to me by October 1. For the next two best ones I will give a Dutch shoulder patch. Submit your photographs to me and after October 1 I will take the whole bunch of pictures and get two prominent Dutch judges to help me select the winners. Will that help get me any pictures?

CAR TAGS

Last months mention in the Reporter sold me out of tags but have a new batch ready for you so maybe you had better send in your \$1.25 to be sure to get yours out of this bunch.

SHOULDER PATCHES

Several responses were received to the suggestion that was submitted by Bill Robinson so as a result we have some shoulder patches on order that should please you very much. They will be available about September 1- just in time for the new show season. Prices and availability will be announced in next months Reporter.

PUBLICITY FUND

It was noted with some pride that you fellows voted in favor of the raise in dues to provide some money in part for the Publicity Fund. In fact the results from this vote has already been felt as our Secretary has already started forwarding the publicity portion of the new dues received. Since you voted to continue to finance the program you are sure entitled to let me know what you want. I'm perfectly willing to try any feasible suggestion so will welcome any views that you may have.

DUTCH BOOTH

Now that several fall shows are being planned we want to again remind our Sweepstake show officials that the Dutch booth is available to any Sweepstake show- the only requirement is that you pay return postage which generally does not exceed one dollar. The booth must be scheduled so if you want it for your fall show please let me know.

NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW TROPHIES

In last months Reporter we mentioned our trophies for the National Dutch Show and suggested that we should have a nice trophy for each color of Dutch, we received a few letters on this and as the results we are happy to announce that the Blue and A.O.C. will have a three time trophy at the next show. How about you Steel and Gray Dutch breeders? If you think that the expence is to great for one to handle why not get together with some other breeders of the same color and put up a trophy? The trophies that we now have are 17 inch cups of Gold or Silver plating and cost here in St. Louis \$18.50 plus engraving which is 7 cents per letter. Our annual Sweepstake Trophy is of the same size and design. These are beautiful cups and I am sure you would be proud to be the donor of one. If you are unable to get trophies where you live of suitable size and comparable price I will be glad to handle it here for you.

(Editor's note) We have just received a letter from our good friend Tom Shufflebotham which we believe will interest many of you Dutch breeders and here it is.

Valparaiso, Indiana

July 27, 1948

Dear Lou;

I have received several letters from Dutch breeders regarding the importation of some Dutch. I don't have to tell you what a risk they are taking. So here is what I will do for the Dutch Club. I will put up a Blue buck 100% imported Foord bloodlines, to the first breeder that sends you \$50.00 the proceeds to go to purchase a trophy to be named after the first President of the A.D.R.C. John Furrer.

Here is the discription of the buck; 8 weeks old, cheeks very good, even and well rounded, neck exceptionally clean, blaze excellent. I beleive he will score the full quota of points on his head. Saddle excellent, off a little on undercut, stops just a shade long and the left one has a run. This buck will show and he shows every sign of having very good color and type. Now here is his breeding; His dam is Dutcheng Winsome Lady, (black) one of the best blacks ever exhibited in this country as the following record bears out. 2nd Jr. Illinois State Fair (Wengert) 1st Jr. Wisconsin State Fair (Blyth) 1st Jr. Ottawa, Illinois (Phillips) 1st, best Jr, Best Dutch, Brookfield, Illinois, (Read) 1st Jr. best Jr. all colors, Shelbyville, Indiana (Souers) 1st Jr. best Dutch, South Bend, Indiana (Walcott) 1st Jr. best Jr. all colors, best Opposite Sex, National Convention, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, (Sautters) 1st Sr. best opposite Sex, North Manchester, Indiana, (Forebush) 1st Sr. best Black, St.Louis, Missouri, (Furrer) 1st Sr. best Dutch, Little Rock, Arkansas, (Rice) 1st Sr. best Dutch, Kankakee, Illinois, (Holmes) 2nd Sr. Colorado Springs, Colorado, (Davis) 1st Sr. Best Dutch, Hartford, Michigan, (Milliken) 2nd last month Tibbar, Illinois, (Wengert) when suckling this litter I refused \$300.00 for this doe, her sire was Dutcheng Blue Renown (Blue) 100% Foord Brothers, Grandsire, International Champion Lucky Boy Blue III only Dutch to ever win a Championship on both sides of the ocean (imported in 1946) Great Grand Sire, was Champion Lucky Boy III, (Blk.) The sire of the buck is Dutcheng Lucky Pilgrim II a son of Lucky Pilgrim (black) now owned by Vinton Heaton of Oakland, California and a grandson of International Champion Lucky Boy Blue III. Also appearing in his pedigree is Champion Lucky Boy II, (black) this buck was 1st and best rabbit in the National Championship show, Bradford England with 7,000 entries. I think this buck would be worth a fortune in any stud, as the importation cost alone is more than I am asking for him. I think that this is a good chance for those that are thinking of doing any importing to get some of the best imported bloodlines for only what the freight would cost them if they do their own importing, and they would also be helping to provide a trophy for the club.

"ONE MAN'S OBSERVATIONS"

S. T. Wheelus, Sr.,

I have often heard or read this statement, "Why is it so many rabbit breeders quit breeding Dutch"? First I would like to impress on you the fact that the following is my personal opinion and I have no desire to knock anyone. As a breeder of Dutch exclusively I'm only interested in promoting the Dutch as much as possible.

Being somewhat of a new Dutch breeder, as I have only bred them for the past four years, I feel that by putting some of the difficulties that I encountered at the beginning before you fellow Dutch breeders it might be of some help. During the war I as so many others bought a few rabbits (just rabbits) to help out the meat situation and by so doing really became interested in them. The latter part of 1943 I heard of a man who raised rabbits on a large scale this led to my going head over heels into raising rabbits. He had some Dutch and they were the first I had ever seen. Before I had left the man's rabbitry I purchased a Black and White Dutch doe and litter of three. This man gave me a few points on Dutch and told me to call on him at any time for information. This I did and sometimes I felt that maybe he was getting tired of being pestered by me, but such was not the case. To this man, Judge Douglas Bass I give credit for most of the success I have enjoyed in the past two years with my Dutch.

Up until now my story sounds as if all you have to do to raise good Dutch is to buy one and you will be successful. This is not true by any means and I know for I had my troubles, such as buying additional stock. I, joined the Dutch Club in 1943 and received my guide book and from this book obtained addresses of the oldest Dutch breeders. I wrote these fellows asking for prices on good quality stock and for breeding information. In writing to these fellows I stated I was a beginner with Dutch and that I was very anxious to get the right start. From one of the few that did answer I almost became disgusted with the Dutch breeders, this man told me in no uncertain terms that he did not like to do business with an amateur and quoted me prices on stock that had not been weaned from \$35.00 to \$50.00 each. I also was told by some that I should buy only unrelated stock for if they were to closely related the young would be no good. Well thank God at least one of these I wrote did give me a break, Mr. A. S. Gibbons sent me a buck for \$10.00 that has produced more show winners than any other buck in the southeast. I'm not trying to boost or knock any one person, just stating facts.

Now to get to the point of this article, why is there such a big turn over of the membership of the Dutch Club? I believe that the answer lies within those breeders who have been successful with their Dutch. This may not be true with all but, we are all guilty of not doing our utmost for the beginner. If every Dutch breeder would pledge not to sell to anyone especially a beginner any stock for breeders that he would not keep himself, and give good sound information as to proper breeding it would go a long way towards eliminating this big turnover. Also if you old time Dutch breeders would write articles on the breeding methods you use and above all do not tell them to buy unrelated stock, as I am fully convinced that the closer you breed Dutch the better Dutch you will raise. To start you must have good stock as near the standard of perfection as possible and above all use good common horse sense.

In a letter to our secretary some few months ago I gave my opinion to why the new Dutch breeders in the southeast lost interest in the Dutch, he published part of it in the Dutch Reporter and ask you fellows to give him your opinion on it. As this is along the same lines as the above I'm going to say a little more about it. Here in the southeast are some of the finest rabbit breeders to be found any where and I dare say that if a little more consideration were shown the Dutch in the southeast by you fellows in the middlewest that we would gain a lot of new members for our club. As most of you know we do not have as many rabbit shows here as are held in the middlewest nor do we have as many breeders. Therefore we don't have enough competition in our shows. For us to get any big competition we have to ship to the shows held in the middlewest, because you fellows do not support our shows in the south. Here in Atlanta we have the largest entry of rabbits to our fall show of any show held in this section and we pay as much or more in premiums as any show in other sections. In the past three years at our show

there has been no more than 25 Dutch shown from outside the southeast. What does the beginner gather from this? He says why raise Dutch when I can't compete with the fellows in the middlewest for sweepstake points. After all the Dutch are primarily for show purpose. When shows are held within one hundred miles of a breeder he can afford to enter a good number of rabbits but, if he has to ship from Atlanta to St. Louis for example the cost of the express is so high that a small breeder can not afford to ship more than six. In 1947 I was seventh high in sweepstake points and to get those I had to ship to many distant shows and consistently place among the winners in good competition and this was rather an expensive proceeding. Therefore I believe that if the sweepstake points were awarded according to the distance the rabbits were shipped it would create a little more interest in the breeding of the Dutch.

I am not asking for any concession for myself but would like to see something done to help make the new members in our club become permanent members. Lets all work together like the sportsmen we are supposed to be and support the sweepstake shows in the southeast as well as the middlewest. And remember to do every thing possible for the new Dutch breeder, for if they can have a little success raising Dutch we will all be a big success with the Dutch.

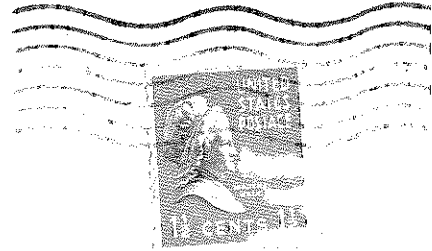
