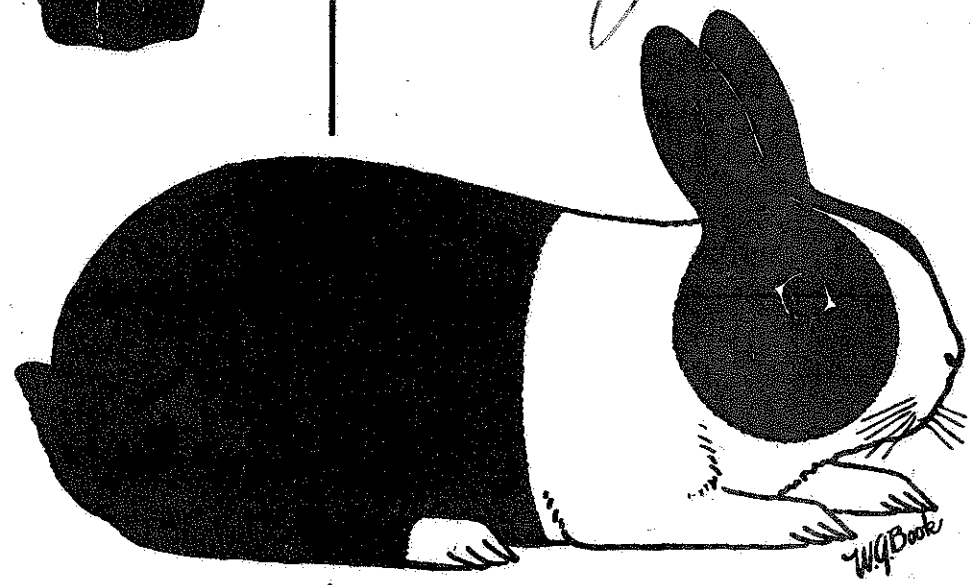

WHAT IS A STRAIN?

(Editor's Note: This small article has appeared in many publications as most editors being experienced rabbit breeders realize that the information it contains cannot be repeated too often. The misconceptions on this subject are myriad, so maybe this will help to clear it up. JW)

It is the possession of a family of animals possessing certain characteristics and having the power to transmit the same to their offspring. A Strain can only be called a strain after it has been built up over a period of time by the owner or breeder of the herd.

Some Strains will excel in type, some in color and others in markings, and these characteristics are so definitely developed and stamped upon all members of the herd that they in turn show them in some degree. No matter how good or how capable of winning prizes a herd may be, there is no basis for calling it a strain unless the herd virtues are transmitted from father to son and mother to daughter with a great degree

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

LET'S NOT BE COLOR-BLIND

This article is not directed toward the new breeder, in particular, but toward all interested Dutch hobbyists. What I mean by Color-blind is this:

I think so many of our Dutch breeders become very interested in one or two colors and lose all sight and interest of the fellow colors. Don't misunderstand me -- I feel, personally, the Dutch color specialist who puts all his time and effort in one or two colors does more good for the Dutch fancy than the breeder with all six colors and no particular goals to reach with any of them.

However, I feel there are a great many of our breeders who do not understand nor appreciate the true beauty or the time and planning that go into our less popular colors

I agree with you who say there is no greater or more striking contrast than black and white well-placed on a little Dutch buck, for example. However, in my own mind, a Steel Dutch with that right color or a Tortoise with the correct shading is a beauty to behold, and yet just a handful of breeders realize this. A good, rich, deep Chocolate color on a Dutch that has real type doesn't come easy, or a Gray without any brassiness are things that show the work of the breeders exhibiting these animals.

I will be the first to admit that the quantity of the colors other than Black and Blue aren't quite as great, however, every now and then a true jewel shines among them. When I say, "Let's not be color-blind", I mean let's be able to find a beautiful Tort, a really nice Chocolate, or a Steel or Gray that really has type and color when you attend the shows this fall. Maybe what you are looking for will only be in the Blacks or Blues and then stop. However, maybe that jewel is on further down the aisle in another color. I see by following the show reports in the Dutch Reporter that quite often an outstanding Dutch in one of the lesser colors comes up as Best of Breed or Best Opposite. Before you disagree with the judge for his placement of one of these colors over a Black or Blue, look at the animal who won, and not just its markings. Look at all of its points, type, color, condition, etc. I am definitely not an anti-Black or Blue breeder, for I raise both colors and love them both. I merely want to stir up a little more interest in the other four beautiful colors. If, in the future you are planning to add another breed of rabbit to your rabbitry, why not consider adding another one of the beautiful colors of Dutch instead?

I am going to close this article with a request. We have in this country and in our club some of the finest specialist breeders anywhere. I would personally like to read a good article on any of our six beautiful colors by the breeders around the country who are winning and doing real well with their particular color. We all look forward to the Dutch Reporter each month, but do we ever contribute to it????

FROM THE EDITOR'S MAIL BAG

Dear Mrs. Weinhardt:

Just a few comments on the June Dutch Reporter and on Dutch in general. The judges remarks are not consistent all the time, as you mentioned, and I would like to add that I wish judges would review the Dutch standards from time to time. Many do not know how the points should be distributed, especially so far as markings go, or at least they don't always judge as if they do. I would like to see more points on type. If a Dutch does not have type, I don't care how perfect the markings are and yet, type is apportioned 15 points while markings take 50.

Regarding the lack of entries at the National Dutch Show I would like to cite one reason why we will never send a Dutch to a far-away show. The following happened to a friend of ours when he sent a Dutch, his best Blue, to the A.R.E.A. Convention a few years back. When the animal was brought back, he discovered she had a broken hip which never healed and he was never able to show or breed this doe. Right now we have two grand champions that I think a lot of, but I would never take the risk of sending

either to a distant show. If there is the additional hazard of heat, which may have been the case at the Atlanta show, that is all the more reason for not sending entries.

What do you, and other members feel about the cheating that goes on in the showing of Dutch? Until recently I was naive enough to believe that everyone played the game according to the rules; but, it seems to me that some exhibitors think the junior classes are for any animal under a year of age. Our four and five month old Dutch can't compete with an animal twice its age, could yours? Since our Dutch mature at 4 to 4½ lbs. they don't make senior weight at 6 months of age, but I certainly would never think of showing them as juniors when they aren't! What kind of example are our young breeders being shown when they see cheating such as this -- and I can't have much respect for a person who does this. Does a breeder need ribbons, trophy, money, or points so badly that they will stoop to this? And what about the Dutch which has a bit of white on the ear, which was blackened with a felt marker -- you see the marker "slipped" when the coop number was being put in the car -- the rabbit doesn't have a disqualification! This cheating makes me sick -- how about you?

Would like to comment on how we prepare our Dutch for show. No, we don't make them eat eggs or any other foreign food. Just T.L.C. (tender loving care) - clean water in clean crocks, rabbit pellets with a little hay and oats occasionally, handle them a lot, spotless cages - and when a show comes along, we're off!

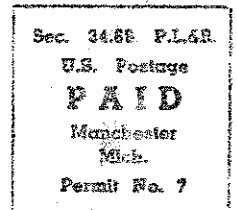
