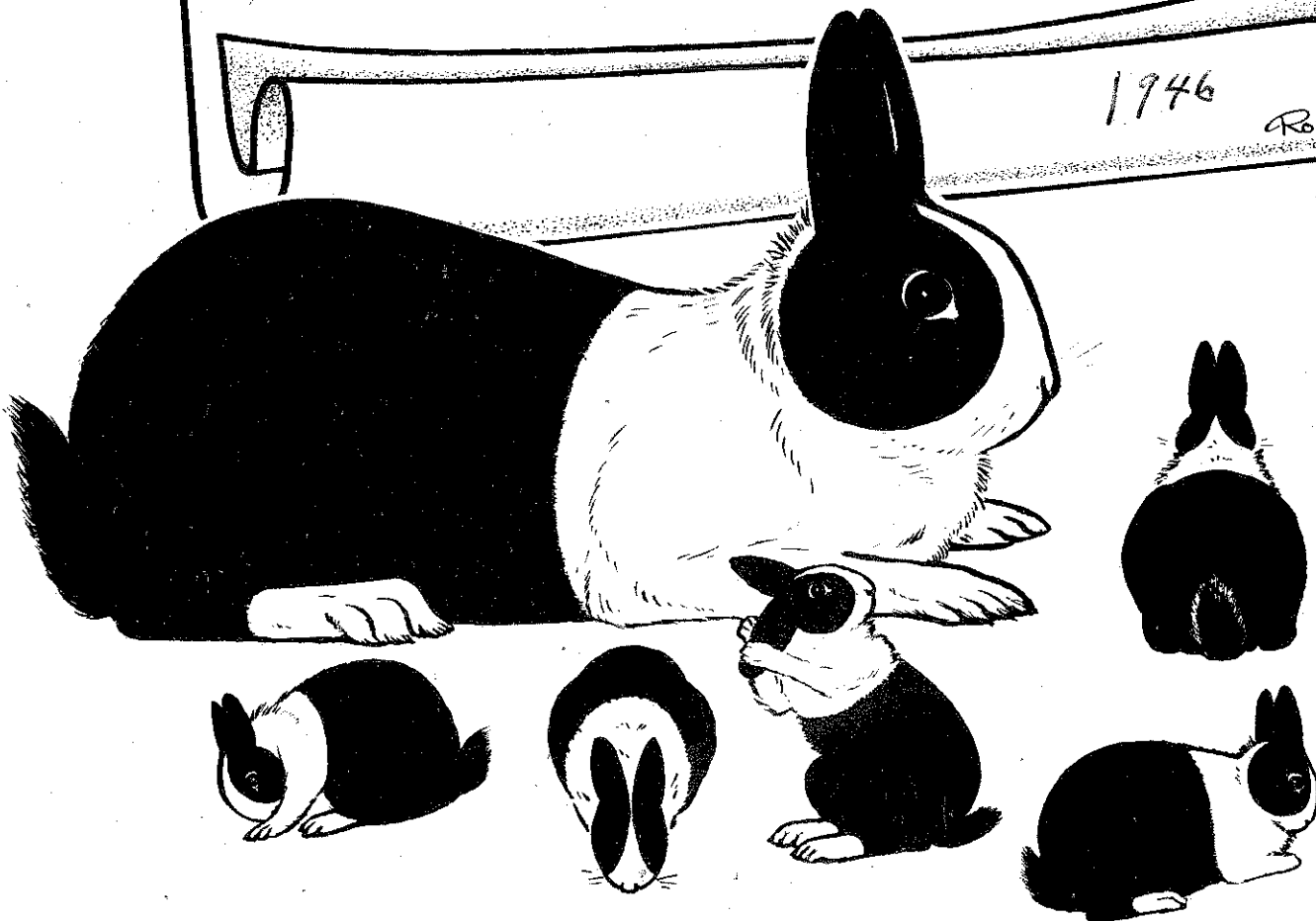

WHERE TO FOR THE NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW OF 1947 ?

Having just returned from the National Dutch Show at Dayton, Ohio, I am all agog with elation over the fine exhibition of Dutch Rabbits that were in the show. It was the finest array of Dutch that I have ever had the privilege of seeing. It was also quite stimulating to note the fine spirit that prevailed among the Dutch Breeders, and to make many valued new acquaintances. In fact so many real assets accrued from my first visit to a National Dutch Show that my evaluation of the worth of such events increased to almost inflationary proportions. I now await with keen anticipation the time of the next Dutch Show.

It is with the same keen interest that I concern myself also with the place of the next National Dutch Show. As much propoganda as has been distributed it seems highly improbable that any member of the ADRC should be unaware of the desire of the SOUTHWESTERN DUTCH FANCIERS ASS'N to bring the next National Show and Meet to Texas. But, just in case there are those who will not be informed, this article should leave no doubt in any person's mind.

Texas is fast awakening to the attractiveness of the Dutch Rabbit and the fascination with which the breeding and exhibition of them grips its unwary victims. We have about 30 breeders in the State, as of this date, compared with one breeder two years ago. We feel that the National Dutch Show of 1947 would do more for the ADRC and the Dutch Rabbit in Texas than anywhere else in the United States. The past three shows have been held in the mid-west, two in Indiana and one in Ohio. During these three years the American Dutch Rabbit Club has grown by leaps and bounds, but its leaps have been confined largely to the bounds of the section in which the National Dutch Show has been held. If this is any criterion, then the way for the American Dutch Rabbit Club to expand is by holding its annual National Show in various sections of the country. Texas, by dent of its already good begining and by virtue of its most delightful Spring weather, affords an ideal opportunity.

I represent the wishes and hopes of the breeders of Texas when I say that we want the National Dutch Show of 1947, and we want it badly enough to do almost anything to get it. We feel that we deserve some consideration on the basis of the cooperation that we have tried to give every interest of the ADRC. We are the first State Club to be organized, indicating the zeal and enthusiasm of our local breeders. We have in all points tried by hard work and liberal generosity to win your support rather than by political maneuvering to force our point. We are still in that spirit. We want to so labor for the Dutch Rabbit and the National Specialty Club that the members will WANT to come to Texas for the 1947 National Dutch Show. We rest our case on that point. We hope you will vote to come to Texas next May.

In the event you do vote to come to Texas you may expect several things to the advantage of the breeders and the ADRC. In the first place, the show would be held in Houston, which is Texas largest city, where "eighteen railroads meet the sea". The show would be held in the "Sam Houston Coliseum", which is in downtown Houston and in walking distance of all the hotels. This coliseum is a well lighted brick and concrete building with adequate floor space to house thousands of rabbits without double decking. Comfortable quarters are available for holding the meeting of the Dutch Club. Real southern hospitality will be a feature of the occasion and it will be the high joy of the Texas breeders to make your stay enjoyable. Splended train connections and the best of modern facilities will be another feature. Ther will be more money put up on specials and regular prizes than has ever been up in any previous National Dutch Show. This expense will be born by the Texas breeders.

There will be another distinct advantage for the ADRC members in voting for the National Dutch Show to come to Texas. We have a world of potential fanciers of Dutch in the Southwest, but good Dutch breeding stock is woefully lacking. Breeders who have stock to sell will find their sales stimulated beyond their capacity to produce it if the Dutch Show comes to Texas and all these Texans see the fine exhibition of the Dutch that ADRC is capable of showing. Not only will many new breeders be developed in Texas, but also in the surrounding states of the Great Southwest.

Since the time of the next show was set for May of 1947, Texas and the Southwest will be in its finest season of the year. You can expect 50 to 60 degree

MINUTES OF THE MEETING AT DAYTON, OHIO.

Semi-Annual meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was held at Dayton, Ohio, Saturday November 16, 1946. Meeting called to order at 8.30 pm by President Beaver. On roll call of officers the following were present; President Beaver, Vice-President Snyder, Secretary-Treasurer Souers, Directors Bernhardt, Sautters, Shufflebotham and Hawthorne.

Motion by Mr. Moore, second by Mr. Zapp that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be dispense with, since these minutes were read and approved at the Allentown Convention. Motion carried. On the report of officers talks were made by Mr. Snyder, Mr. Bernhardt, Mr. Sautters, Mr. Shufflebotham, Mr. Hawthorne, Mr. Souers and Mr. Beaver.

Motion by Mr. Sears, second by Mr. Snyder that our next National Dutch Show be held in March 1947. After some discussion as to this being a feasible date, Mr. Sears with the consent of Mr. Snyder withdrew his motion. Motion by Mr. Snyder, second by Mr. DeAtley that our next National Dutch Show be held in the month of May 1947. An amendment to * this motion by Mr. Hawthorne second by Mr. Zapp, that future National Dutch Shows beginning in 1948 be held in the month of March. Amendment and motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Wells, second by Mr. Mundhenk, that members putting on the show shall have the authority to set the dates of the show within the month specified. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Shufflebotham, second by Mr. C. Moore that Rosette Ribbons be given on Sweepstake Series through 10th place. An amendment by Mr. Snyder, second by Mr. Thatcher that if the money received from Sweepstake Shows is not sufficient to pay for trophy and ribbons that the difference be taken from the club treasurer. Amendment and motion carried. A suggestion by Mr. Zapp that a collection be taken up at the meeting to help defray the cost of Trophy and Ribbons for the coming Sweepstake Series which ends with the National Dutch Show in May was accepted. President Beaver appointed Mr. Zapp to make the collection which resulted in \$14.26 being collected.

Motion by Mr. Sears, second by Mr. Thatcher that the Club Secretary be given the authority to purchase the Sweepstake Trophy and Ribbons of such design and cost as he deem advisable. Motion carried.

After the reading of the discription of color on the six varieties of Dutch as prepared by Mr. Bernhardt and Mr. Souers and concured in by Mr. Lewis with the suggestion of a few minor changes as to wording, a motion was made by Mr. Hawthorne, second by Mr. Zapp to accept Mr. Lewis' first two suggested changes. Motion carried.

On the question as to whether a dewlap on a Dutch was a disqualification, a motion by Mr. Hawthorne, second by Mr. Zapp that an excessive dewlap shall disqualify. An amendment by Mr. Bernhardt, second by Mr. Snyder that the wording be changed to read; cut for a slight dewlap, disqualify for prominent dewlap. Amendment and motion carried.

After some discussion on the question as to whether a missing toe nail should be a disqualification a motion was made by Mr. Sautters, second by Mr. Moore that a missing toe nail shall disqualify, broken toe nail not to be considered a disqualification if a portion remains, it is then to be a cut. Motion carried.

After a talk by Secretary Souers on the new guide book, a motion was made by Mr. Bernhardt second by Mr. Hawthorne that the handling of the guide book be left to the Secretary in what ever manner he deemed most suitable. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Mr. Hawthorne that we extend a standing vote of thanks to the Dayton Dutch breeders for their effort in putting on one of the best Dutch shows ever held.

A talk was made by Mr. Hawthorne asking the membership to support their bid for the next National Dutch Show, this show to be held in Houston, Texas, in May 1947.

Mr. Earl Moore made a talk in support of their bid for the next National Dutch Show, to be held in Fort Wayne, Indiana in May 1947. Both of these gentlemen were ask to submit their bids in writing to the club secretary and that the membership will vote on them.

Motion by Mr. Snyder, second by Mr. Thatcher to adjourn. Motion carried.

A PLUG FOR TEXAS
(And I don't mean a horse.)

Not being able to attend the meeting at Dayton, much to my regret, I was unable to take part in the discussion relative to the location of the 1947 National Dutch Show to be held next May.

I understand that two requests have been made for the show and I feel that both should be carefully considered before being voted upon. For years our shows have been held in the mid-west, Michigan, Indiana or Ohio and no one can deny that these states are more accessible to the average breeder than Texas; but, should we always confine our shows to a given territory to the decided advantage of breeders living within a short range of travel? Our membership in these states has grown by leaps and bounds during the past few years, due no doubt to our National Shows, so why not try out a new section for expansion next year? The activity and growth of Dutch Club members in the Southwest as evidenced by the formation of the Southwestern Dutch Fanciers Association and their recent show of 260 Dutch entries out of a show total of less than 400, would indicate that here is a fertile field and a strong possibility of a new high being reached in entries at a National Dutch Show. True it is a long way from many of our homes and hutches, but it is no further from Indiana or Ohio to Texas than from Texas to Indiana or Ohio, BUT when it comes to the distance from Long Island to Texas. Boy you really have something. And speaking of long distance shipments, at the Dutch Sweepstake show held Sept. 28-29 at Brattleboro Vermont there was a Dutch from Colorado and THREE from Texas and they all were in fine condition after their long trip. If the proper size shipping crate is used and provided with feed and water containers, Dutch will travel well no matter what the distance. And did you know that they travel with the messenger on the trip?

At the National AR&CBA Convention in Allentown Pa. it was my pleasure and privilege to meet our new national director from Texas, "Boots" Schutze and if he is a specimen of the breeders and fanciers we have in Texas, I would have no hesitation in shipping my stock to our National Show if held in Texas next May. True, we might not be able to enter as many as we would, if the show were in our own back yard, where we could drive to it with a carfull of Dutch, but we could send our best and leave the large entries to the boys from Texas who have already demonstrated their ability and willingness along that line, and with big classes just think of the points a lucky winner could accumulate towards that coveted DUTCH CLUB TROPHY. I strongly feel that a show in the Southwest would go a long way in building up not only the membership of our Dutch Club, but in popularizing our breed more than ever in that section just as it has worked in the mid-west.

So I say, "LET'S GO TO TEXAS IN 1947."

weather, warm sunshine and an abundance of floral beauty. We have a long Spring season in Texas. Our cold is over by the 15th of March but Summer heat never begins before June. If held in Texas the show will probably be set for the first or second week-end in May. This will be just right to insure a great display of juniors, and the Texas climate will be ideal for them at that time.

Since we have been planning for this show for a year already, the short six months that we have for preparation will be no handicap for us, whereas it might be quite an imposition for another club. The breeders of the East will certainly feel that bringing the show to Texas will make it an almost prohibitive distance from them, and we do not argue that point. However, holding the National Convention in Allentown and in Milwaukee is also quite a distance from Texas. Certainly good sportsmanship will make objection on these grounds an almost untenable position. We believe that the fairmindedness and sportsmanship characteristic of the average breeder of Dutch will outweigh any selfish motives that might tempt you to refuse us this request to be your host in 1947. We cherish the opportunity, and promise the ADRC that we will go just as far in supporting any feasible plan to further the interest of the club in other sections of the country as we are asking you to go in this instance. We only ask for an opportunity to serve you.

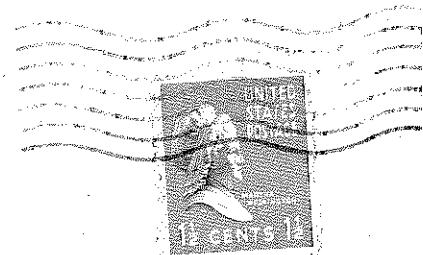
