

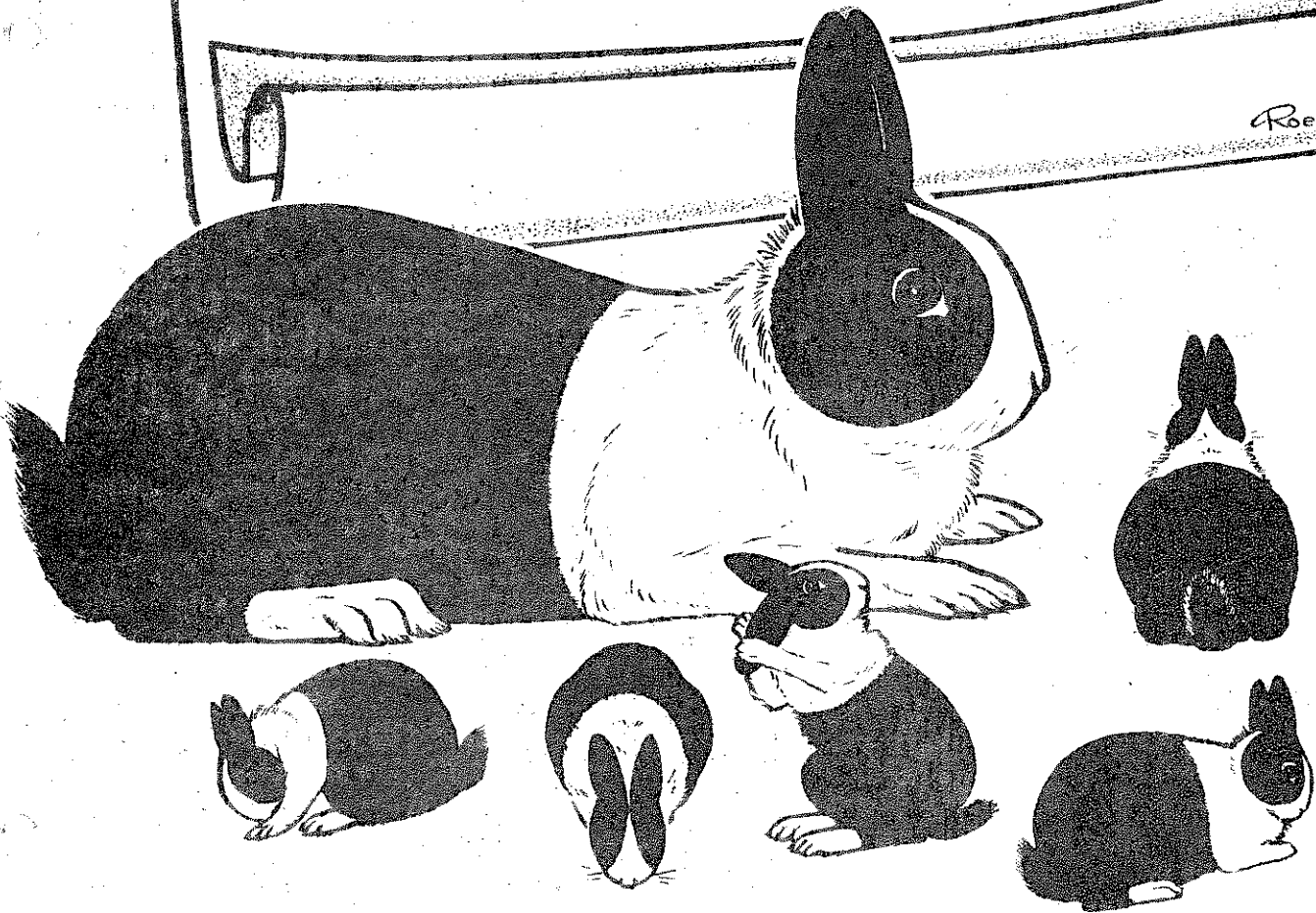

the results of this balloting be placed in the hands of the Club's Executive Committee for final decision on all details. The idea was advanced by Mr. Charles Pine and here is the story in his own words:

A NEW SHOW PLAN

Charley Pine

For some time I have been of the opinion that the majority of our Dutch breeders get very little out of our present show system. When this benefit is removed there is not much left because Dutch are primarily show animals and that being the case our Club has a great deal of interest in shows. Looking back over our Sweepstakes participants one finds that nearly all of those who run up the big totals to finish in the top five are quantity breeders who can and do show as many as 20 to 50 head in some shows and in addition send stock to a good many distant shows. I believe that the majority of our Dutch Club members deal in fewer numbers and are restricted in their scope of showing. This scope has become even more confined since the express rates continue to spiral upwards. To reach the small breeder and afford him a chance for recognition I believe we have to take in the one day table shows that are becoming so popular. My proposal covers these cases.

I believe that we should start a new series for these one day table shows which are at present excluded from our Sweepstakes series but at the same time does reach every small breeder. For a new name for this competition and to get away from the Sweepstakes idea I suggest that we call this "DUTCH, LIMITED" - this is to suggest that they are limited to the short shows and also are for the breeder with a limited showing area. In order to finance the awards we could charge a \$1.00 sanction fee and give rosettes to the winner of the first fifteen places in the year's time. The rosettes need not be the grandiose, fringed affairs but just an attractive, trim-looking three streamer, looped center bezel that can be bought for about \$1.50 to \$2.00 each. For the rules I suggest:

1. That any one day show be eligible if it is AR&CBA sanctioned and complies with all AR&CBA rules. A fee of \$1.00 to be paid at the time of application for sanction by the Dutch Club. (See Page 12).

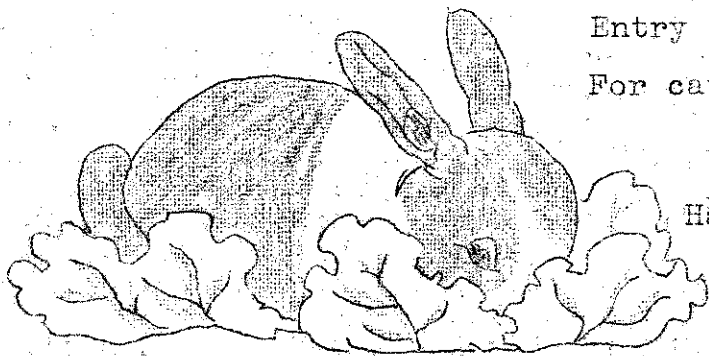

A NEW SHOW PLAN by Charley Pine - Con'd.

2. No one who has a current standing at the time of the show of fifth or better in the regular Sweepstakes shall be eligible to count points. (This is to prevent the quantity breeder from "swamping" the fellow with fewer head to exhibit - besides the "Quantity Breeder" has the regular Sweepstakes and if he is in the first five he should be satisfied.)

3. The points shall be counted in the same manner as the points in the Sweepstakes series with the exception that the winner of best four (4) head exhibited shall receive an extra 25 points.

4. Regular reports shall be compiled and published in The Dutch Reporter on the basis of reports received from the Show Secretaries.

5. The regular Dutch Club ribbons shall be awarded with the exception that another one shall be added for "Best Four Head."

6. The series shall run on a calendar year basis with awards being made as soon after the end of the year as the results are in.

7. To be eligible an exhibitor must be a member of the Dutch Club at the time of each show when points are counted.

The idea for Best Four Head was originally suggested by Charley Lewis some two or three years ago and I believe it deserves a trial as it opens up an award to recognize the breeder who may not sweep the show but at the same time has some real good ones. The best four should be determined by the four head of Dutch in that show, owned by one breeder, which earn the most display points. I believe such a plan will also encourage breeders to try to develop quality and a strain of their own - both of which we need badly.

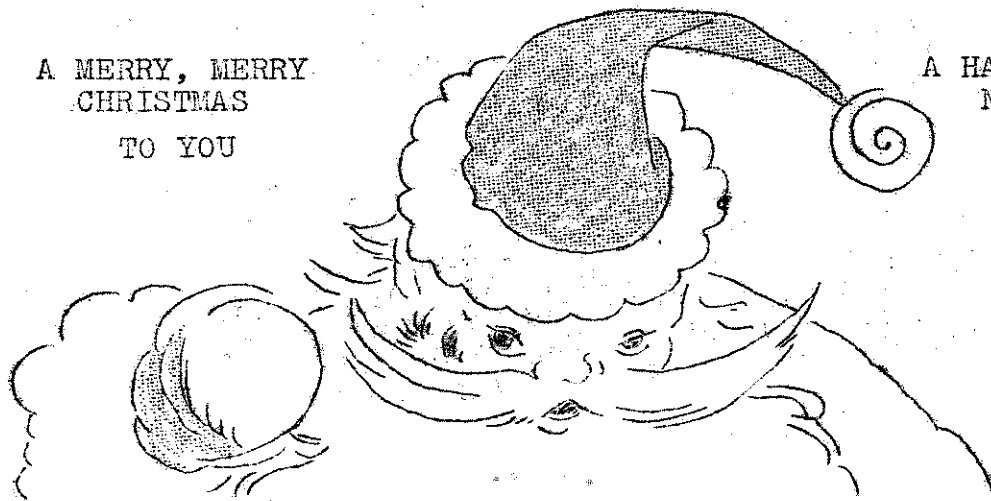
I know that the above will mean some added work -- all new ideas always do otherwise they wouldn't be worthwhile -- but I also believe we need something to revive interest, to recognize the backyard breeder and make an award that will be within his reach. I also feel that it will give some encouragement to continued interest by the majority - another thing we need.

I have no doubt but that this idea can be improved upon and new details added or even better named but we have to start somewhere -- this is my suggestion of a start. Where shall we go from here?
