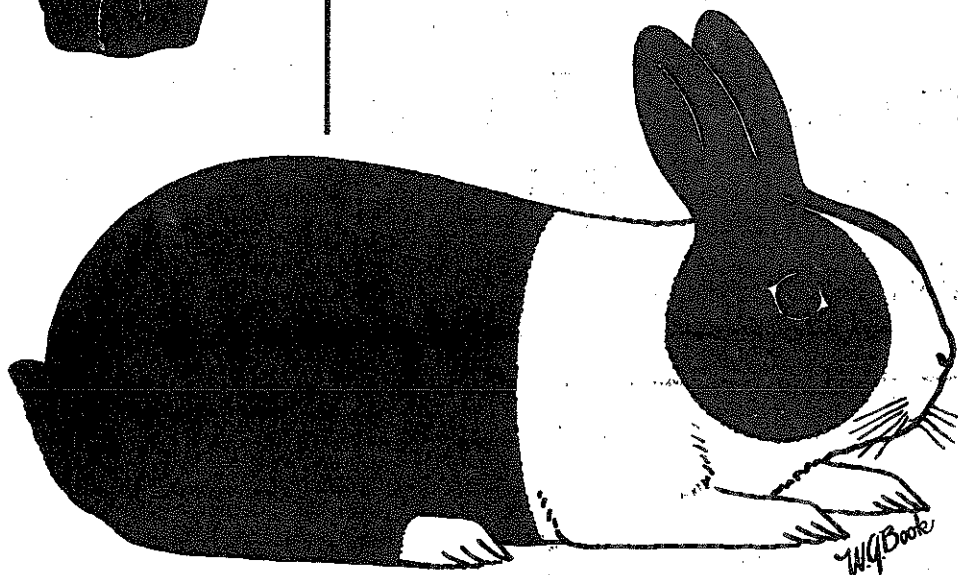

### DUTCH RUMBLING'S

Time marches on and once again we find ourselves at the beginning of a new year. The year 1956 was indeed another great year for the A.D.R.C., the members and for the rabbit we so proudly sponsor. We as a unit, the American Dutch Rabbit Club continued our steady progress in 1956 as we did in the preceeding year. The mounting number of Sweepstakes shows held annually throughout the United States continues to grow and the outlook for a continuance of this trend looks even greater for 1957 due to the constant increase in popularity of our breed and to the fine harmony that exists within the ranks of the Dutch breeders and the A.D.R.C., in looking back over the past year we again witnessed another very fine National Dutch Show sponsored by the Indiana State Dutch Club and at St. Paul we were very near the Top again. It is my belief that the Dutch Breeders throughout the country are most sincere in their efforts to improve our breed and I feel that much has been accomplished in the past few years in regards to improving the Dutch type and color however, we cannot rest upon our laurels for there still remains a great deal to be desired in both type and color and this can be done only by careful selective breeding and a rigid culling program. Color in our Blacks and Blues are definitely on the gp-grade but there still is much to be desired in the remaining four colors, particularly our grays and steels. As you may know at St. Paul the members present at the Dutch meeting voted their approval for the A.D.R.C. Standard Committee to write a new Standard for our present Gray Dutch that will conform nearer to the Grays that we see in our show rooms today and to apply for a (Working) Standard to replace our present Gray Standard that will give the breeders who approve the Gray Standard as it appears in our Guide Book an opportunity to develop a Gray color that will conform to it. At the conclusion of the Dutch meeting in St. Paul, President Bayliss instructed our Standard Committee to prepare a new standard that will be presented to the membership as a whole for their vote. It is my understanding that this new proposed Standard will very closely resemble the present English Standard for "Brown Gray" Dutch and if this Standard is adopted it will conform very closely to the majority of Gray Dutch in America today. For the benefit of those who may not be familiar with the Canadian Brown Gray

Standard I will present it below as it appears in the "Dominion Rabbit and Cavy Breeders Ass'n. Guide Book".

"BROWN GRAY—Slate Blue at base followed by a band of yellow orange then a black line finishing by light or Nut Brown tips to the Fur. The whole interspersed by Black guard hairs. That is the impression gained when the fur of the BROWN GRAY is parted. The general impression is Light or Nut Brown on Ears, Cheeks, Body, Hind Feet and Top of Tail, the whole ticked with Black hairs. Belly color and Eye circles (small as possible) bright straw color. A lighter shade permissible under tail. Eyes Hazel the deeper the better. NOTE: Undercut on Brown Gray will be Straw Color." It is my hope that the membership will accept the new Standard when it is presented to them and if so I am sure the confusion that now exists in regards to our Grays will be cleared up for certainly today the majority of the Grays in the country do not conform to our Gray Standard that was adopted by the membership more than a year ago, which led to the disqualification of many Grays on the show tables in the past year. We do want a Gray Dutch but I feel sure that all who breed this variety possess an honest desire to breed them to conform to a Standard that the American Dutch Rabbit Club has adopted by vote of the membership and I feel certain that they will.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE DUTCH CLUB  
MEETINGS AT ST. PAUL

After leaving the second Dutch meeting, at the St. Paul Convention, it occurred to me, that I had just witnessed a tremendous contrast between the first Dutch meeting I ever attended in 1941, at Fort Wayne, and the meeting just completed. At the 1941 meeting great headway was made--in breaking up the Dutch Club, and in breaking up several friendships of many year's standing! In fact I will never forget the fact, that apparently no one's word was good enough to be accepted as proof that they were eligible to vote. In fact if you didn't have your Dutch Club membership card on you, you couldn't vote!

Now, to the Dutch Club meeting of 1956. More constructive progress was accomplished, in a well coordinated manner at St. Paul, than has ever been done. And in view of the fact that some of the subjects were highly touchy, and debatable, our President did a very fine job in conducting the meetings at St. Paul.

Early in the year, our President, George Bayliss appointed a ways and means committee to try and increase the Dutch Club Treasury. This job, is as most of you know, a thankless task; because it boils down to just one thing --by one way or another, to ask for more money! Our committee thought out many ways to raise money but most came right back to the same old routine, the old reliable factoring the bill as usual! In

any event, after presenting my ideas to the assembled members at the Convention meeting two methods were adopted. These methods will go a long way toward easing the financial situation in the Dutch Club.

One suggestion, which was unanimously adopted was to originate a "Seller's Class". This class to be shown at each National Dutch Club Show, and all rabbits entered in this class to be judged together, and placed accordingly. In other words, the various colors and sexes will be judged as one class in exactly the same manner as we judge the various colors of Dutch, picking best Doe, best Buck, etc., right down the line. We will try to have a trophy put up, for the best rabbit in the "Seller's Class". As I understand it, entry fees will be PAID BY THE EXHIBITOR, and PREMIUMS WILL BE PAID BY THE SHOW, same as in regular classes. When the judging is finished, all rabbits entered in this special "Seller's Class" will be auctioned off to the highest bidder. Half of the proceeds will go to the owner of the rabbit, the other half to the Dutch Club. All entries in this special class must be accompanied by their pedigrees, so that the auctioneer can get the best possible prices in-so-much as he will have information of bloodlines, background, winnings, etc.

To my way of thinking, this Class would materially help the Dutch Club financially, through publicity, they would receive. This would serve as a stimulation of the sale of good breeding stock in the show room, and carry over to the individual rabbitries, after the show. Publicity such as this, would be worth money to any breeder!

I may be out of line in my thinking, but I can envision this Class being held in other shows, other than the National Dutch Club show! Why couldn't this same "Seller's Class" be put on by Dutch breeders, at shows through out the country, for the benefit of National Dutch Club, and themselves?

The other plan that was adopted at the Dutch Club meeting at the St. Paul Convention was to raise the dues in the Dutch Club. I think the reason this plan was so wholeheartedly approved, is because Dutch breeders are fanciers at heart, and they realize that anything done by the membership at the National Convention, is for the benefit of the Dutch breeders, as a whole.

Next month, I will give you more details on this increase in dues as approved by the National Dutch Club, at the ARRA Convention at St. Paul.
