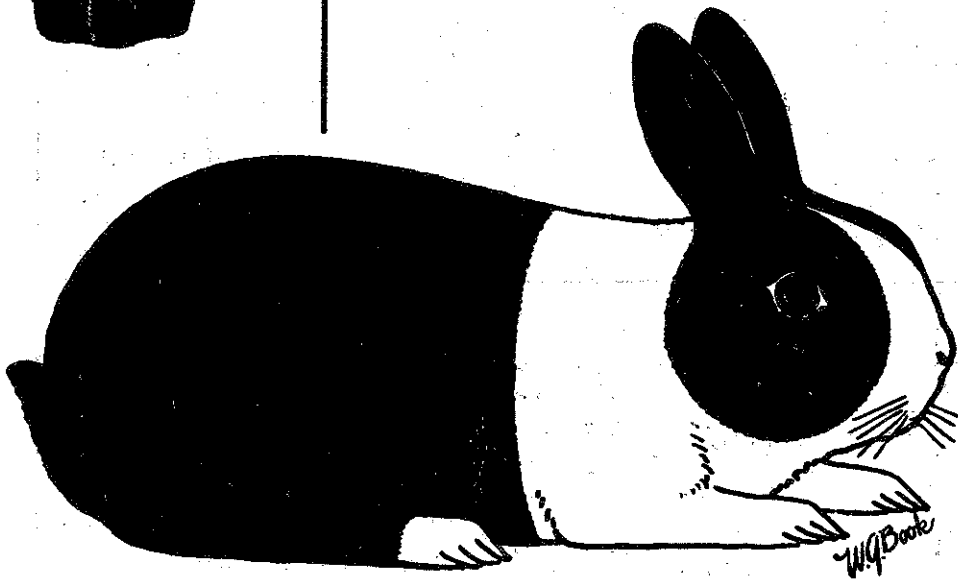

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

REPORT OF WAYS & MEANS COMMITTEE OF AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

When I was appointed Chairman of the Ways & Means Committee, our president asked me to work with my fellow committee members in a sincere effort to do something about the severe financial plight of our beloved ADRC. To try to come up with some new ways of raising money and to try, if possible to figure out some way to reduce our operating costs. At the outset I asked for suggestions from others including the President and our Secretary Treasurer, we came up with these suggestions. 1. Raise the sweepstake sanction fee. 2. Raise our membership dues. 3. Raise the advertising rate in the Dutch Reporter. 4. To print up decals of the ideal dutch for sale to the membership. 5. To print stamps with our official cut on them for sale to our membership. Suggestions 4 and 5 were approved by the W & M Committee and adopted at the ADRC meeting at Harper, Iowa. The suggestion 3 was somewhat modified but the W & M Committee recommended that we raise our advertising rate from \$2.00 for a single breeder card to \$3.00 and from \$4.00 for a double breeder card to \$5.00, this was adopted by the meeting at Harper, Iowa. Suggestion 3 was fully explored, we now charge \$5.00 for a sweepstake sanction and I am informed by the Secretary that figuring all expense as carefully as she can that we are now making about 15¢ on each sweepstake, maybe a little more depending on the amount of postage necessary. We are now charging the top rate for Sweepstake Sanction and we are breaking even or a little better on the service so we felt that we could not afford to charge more. The same was true with the raise in dues, we voted only a few years ago to raise our dues from \$2.00 a year to \$3.00 with a joint husband and wife membership of \$5.00. This again is the top figure in so far as national specialty clubs are concerned. We felt that we are charging all that the traffic will bear. I might also point out that it has been repeatedly suggested that we cut back on the printing of complete reports of sweepstake shows, in the DR, in order to save money this has been rejected each time and no one on our committee felt that this coverage should be cut.

Just where do we stand in so far as finances are concerned? Well, according to the last quarterly report from our Treasurer we have \$150.00 in our general fund. Last year when it was necessary to purchase a new mimeograph machine, we did not have the money and it was necessary to solicit the membership for donations to purchase the machine. I am informed by the Treasurer that there was not sufficient funds to purchase certain special aids necessary for the publishing of the DR and that these were purchased out of her own personal funds. I am informed by the Secretary Treasurer that our club does not own a typewriter but that she owns one and that she uses it for the work of printing the DR and other official duties. I am informed by what I believe to be reliable sources that most of our other equip-

ment has been purchased by way of donations from individual members of the club. We have solicited advertising in the Dutch reporter and only recently raised the rates, we have raised our sweepstake sanction fee to the highest in the fancy, we have raised our membership dues to the highest in the fancy, and yet, we are showing a decline in funds with each succeeding quarter which is kept from going into the red simply by asking our members to dig deeper into their pockets for outright donations. We have a good line of specialty promotion items, shoulder patches, decals, stamps, grand champion tags, ties, etc., and I feel that they could be pushed a little but not in a way to raise the kind of money we need. Just how much do we need? Well the big drain is our excellent DR. I am informed by the Secretary that as close as she can figure we are paying out approximately \$35.00 to \$40.00 a month on the DR, more than we are taking in in advertising. What does this mean? Well, we would have to raise, net, approximately \$350 to \$500.00 a year from some source to make up the deficit, well, it would except for one thing. According to our by-laws, Article III, Section 1. "The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ % of all membership dues including renewals and 50% of all other incomes as full compensation for his or her services", this applies to the ads for the Dutch Reporter, so instead of having to raise \$350.00 to \$500.00 a year in order to cover this deficit we would just have to double the same. I think that you can see that this is not possible under present circumstances with a mimeographed bulletin. I might point out here that this 50% of all other income means just that. Ads in DR, Dutch Seller's Class proceeds, sweepstake sanction fee, commission to club from registrations and joint memberships in ARBA, commissions to the club on sale of Rabbit magazines, money turned to the Secretary-Treasurer by the publicity director which is profit on sale of specialty items, etc. It might be pointed out here that I am informed that the secretary is not taking a commission on the income from the Sellers Class, but the By-Laws are very explicit, that she is entitled to. Also that any other items which have not been subject to this ruling only point up the dire straits that our treasury is in at this time. Well, you might ask, don't you think that we should pay our secretary something? Yes, definitely, based on what we can afford and on what the job is worth. According to the reports from the Secretary's office during the 12 months, from July 1, 1959 to June 31, 1960, our secretary received in commissions \$166.73 for the first quarter, \$170.37 for the second quarter, \$232.00 for the third quarter and \$224.00 for the fourth quarter or a total for 12 months of \$793.00 or \$66.00 per month, and it is impossible for us to raise more money without increasing our secretary's salary by 50% of the gross increase.

This figure comes primarily from 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ % of the membership dues and 50% of the sweepstake sanction fee. I am informed by our secretary that we are sweepstaking about 200 shows a year, at \$5.00 each this would amount to \$1,000.00 from which the Secretary receives as her commission \$500.00, this \$500.00 a year is I believe, more than any other secretary of a National Specialty Club receives for his or her services for an entire year. Of course this is based on the popularity of the rabbit we are sponsoring and the commission given for the work. Surely we want to in some small monetary way, compensate our secretary for the immense load that by force of circumstances they must carry if our club is to be successful, but, can we afford to pay what we are paying, obviously not, because we are running further and further behind each year.

My own personal suggestion was that we should simply propose a change in the Constitution and by-laws, cutting the secretary-treasurer commission to something we could afford to pay. Perhaps by either cutting out all commission except on the memberships and sweepstake sanctions or by giving the secretary treasurer 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ % of the membership fees and 25% of all other income. Other members of my committee thought that since the secretary-treasurer has such a great load of work that it was not fair to cut her compensation without thereby proposing a corresponding reduction in the work load. It was suggested that this could be accomplished by simply separating the DR from the secretary's office and giving this to someone else. Since the DR is a publicity item it was suggested that we should strengthen our publicity program by appointing a publicity committee, the chairman of which shall

be the publicity director and give the publicity committee the responsibility for publishing the DR. Which would give us additional people to work for our club, would give us a member of the publicity committee at all of our major shows, equipped to publicize our breed.

This matter was thrashed out in our committee with all members expressing a desire to see something done about this problem. One member, Director Bill Stedman, expressed an opinion that although something had to be done he did not have the answer and didn't feel that anything should be done at this time. At Fort Worth, this problem was discussed with members present and it was agreed that something should be done so it was decided to present our findings to the meeting along with the following recommendations. That we direct the president to immediately appoint a committee to draft proposed changes in the constitution and by-laws, that would accomplish three things; first to separate the publishing of the DR from the Secretary-Treasurer; Second, to create a publicity committee the chairman of which would be publicity director chargeable with all the present duties of the publicity director and giving the duty of publishing the DR to the publicity committee; Third, to provide for a new schedule of paying our Secretary-Treasurer, in accordance with our ability to pay and the reduced duties of the office, and when the proposed changes were ready to submit to the membership in accordance with the constitution and by-laws. This was not anything done behind anyone's back, no Star Chamber session, but a frank open meeting attended by several of our good dutch members. We realize that this must be presented to the membership by mail ballot and that it will work some expense to the club, simply calling the election. We realize that if we separate the DR and the secretary's office that it will entail additional sums for moving the mimeograph machine, changing the mailing permit, purchasing another addressograph machine, etc. We know that we don't have this money laying around, but we do feel that by cutting down on our expenses that we can soon meet our bills with other income.

It has been suggested by our Secretary that it costs us 15¢ a member to have our ballots printed and mailed first class as required by our constitution and by-laws. What do you say, members, is this service worth what it is costing us, or can we save considerable money by simply sending out a ballot in the DR and then having the member furnish his own envelope and stamp? You realize that this also would have to be done by a change of the constitution and by-laws.

Friends, this is serious business, proposed for the good of the ADRC in the future, certainly it is easier to go along saying that everything is fine but going steadily down financially. We have to take some action. Our secretary feels, rightly so, that we always approve the spending of money but never the raising of money, then expect that she should amke do with what we get. It has been said by some that all of this is a slam on the work of our fine secretary-treasurer and in some sinister way an effort to make her look bad. This is certainly not true in any respect, we all acknowledge that she has been a cracker-jack secretary and publisher of the DR. We all hope that she will continue to serve the ADRC in her very capable manner as Secretary-Treasurer and/or publisher of the DR. It has also been said that this was done behind the backs of some. My committee was appointed by the President in accordance with the constitution, we conducted our business as any committee should, we reported our findings, first to the Board of Directors present at Fort Worth, and after the members present unanimously agreed that it should be presented to the meeting, we did that. I realize that a majority of the Board of Directors was not present at Fort Worth, I also know that Colorado Springs, the site of our next meeting is not as close to the absent members as Fort Worth and have no guarantee that they will be present there.

DUTCH FUROR.

The "Show-me" state is heard from this month, in the person of Judge L. W. VanHorne. He lives in Independence, Missouri, and is employd as Procurement and

Sales Manager for the Alderson Construction Company.

Dutch rabbits have been in his hutches since 1950 or before, and the first ones were Gray and A.O.C. Having raised and shown "commercial" rabbits up to this time, Mr. VanHorne was impressed by the Dutch type. He still is very particular about type and that is a "must" for the Dutch that he raises. He states, "to me if the animal doesn't have type, he just isn't a Dutch". Those who have seen his Dutch at the shows are aware of that. VanHorne's Dutch have been in the winning columns of most of the A.R.B.A Conventions since 1951. His Dutch have won Best Dutch, (1), Best Opposite Dutch (1), Best Sr.(1), Best Jr. (2), Best Black (2), and Best Steel two years in a row. Every spring it seems that his work has him all tied up which prevents attendance at the National Dutch Show, but he hopes to "get in the swim" in the next few years.

The rabbitry has 32 holes with 17 working does, consisting mostly of blacks, grays and steels. The blacks and a trio of chocolates are kept free of any Gray or Steel blood, however the steel does occasionally are mated with a black buck to keep down the brass in the steels but no resulting blacks are kept for black breeding.

Mr. VanHorne thinks there is nothing like Dutch to offer a challenge to the breeder, and to give that wonderful satisfaction due when a good one is produced. He says, "Let's keep raising good ones; and READ THE STANDARD and GO BY IT. Remember there is only ONE type of Dutch, and he is truly the Fancier's rabbit."
