"Taps" were blown for the American Dutch Rabbit Club at Tampa, Florida when they voted against the publishing of the full show reports in "The Dutch Reporter".

Dutch rabbits were the coming breed in Florida. They withstood the heat and preduced the size fryer most in demand in Florida. Then in Nov. of 1960 the "brass" of the A.R.B.A. ruled against mismarked Dutch in our meat rabbits. What Dutch breeder is going to send his well marked Dutch to the block (or guillotine) to win a meat pen class. None, as you and I well know.

The beginner in Dutch rabbits joins the American Dutch Rabbit Club in hopes to win a rosette for the Best Dutch or Best Opposite Dutch and special ribbons for the best

specimen in each colour.

The old-timer in Dutch has won many of thess ribbons and they are no longer and attraction. He renews his membership to get the "Dutch Reporter" and to see how his fellow Dutch breeder is doing through-out the country. Without these detailed show reports he will have no incentive to renew his membership. It doesn't take much to cause a breeder to lose his enthusiasm when he figures that all the breaks are going

As an example of my arguments in this matter, I refer to the "Dutch Reporter". The June 1961 issue showed the Gulf Coast area (Tampa Bay) with 19 members of the ADRC. The June 1962 issue listed only nine members in the same area. A loss of over 50%.

Having nearly 50 years experience in the rabbit business, hobby or industry, call it what you wish, I predict a loss of from 25% to 50% in the membership of the ADRC if this "brainstorm" of not printing the full show reports goes into effect.

Bet us write the Editor of the "Dutch Reporter" and state forth your views. This matter should be subject to the vote of the entire membership of the ADRC. Many of our efficers and directors have not been doing so well in the show circuit so then they hate to see the sad news printed. But what about the average member? Do you approve or not? Please write and act before the final "Taps" are blown. YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

Dutch Rabbits are "moving" all over the country. Many requests for a source of this or that type of breeding stock come into this office. With the high cost of express rates your secretary attempts to recommend some breeder within driving distance of the prospective purchaser whenever this is possible. Naturally I do not know what sort of Dutch each and every member has. My recommendations must be made either of my own knowledge from having seen a breeders stock in some show, or else it must be based on the record as shown by the show reports. Often all I can do is mail the prospect a copy of the last June edition of the "Dutch Reporter" with the complete membership list published and put him on his own to find the stock he wants. If one or more of the breeders in his area also have an ad in the Reporter he is going to receive first consideration as his ad, most likely will tell what varieties he raises and can thus save the person seeking stock from going off on a wild goose chase to visit a breeder who speciallizes in one or more varieties and may not have the particular variety that is wanted. You help yourself when you advertise, be it in the Dutch Reporter, The Guide Book or the National Dutch Show Catalog, all of which go to every member of the ADRC. Weigh the values and then spend your advertising dollar wisely. If you were to take an ad in each of these three publications, there is no doubt that it would be money well spent and for little as \$11.00 you CAN advertise in all three. Give it some careful thought. One or two breeders sold would pay the

(Editor's Note: The following article appeared in the 1946 Year Book of the United Kingdom Dutch Rabbit Club. A bundle of these old year books just came to me from our long time member, Chas. O. Lewis with the thought, that as we have so very many new members in our in our club, much of the knowledge gleaned from long years of experience by the members of the much older organization, the UKDRC, might prove not only interesting, but useful in getting off on the right foot. Those of us with more experience would be the first to admit that we never stop learning, and we too, may gain some benefit. Thank you, Charlie! JW)

When starting to keep Dutch don't rush to buy the first rabbit you see, but make a few inquiries as to who has reliable stock. Keep your ears open at shows or when talking to an old fancier, then visit a rabbitry where good stock is kept and don't be afraid to ask questions as to the breeding of any rabbit you may be thinking of

The surest way to success is in breeding to the best only.

Avoid does cut too far back, big and coarse for long barreled.

If you cannot afford the price of a Champion Buck I recommend buying a couple of does from a stud where you can get them mated to a good buck, then any does you may get from the litters should be sent back to the same bucks.

Don't give a big price for a rabbit because it has won a few prizes, unless you

know it won them at open shows and was up against some good ones.

Don't bny cld, worn-out does. For preference buy youngsters and commence breed-

ing at 5 or 6 months old if in good coat.

If you breed from does of good type you need have no fear of getting them too big. wheter bred in summer or winter. You must breed for type, it is the first thing a Judge looks for a transfer of the control of the first first first section of the control of the

See that your does are clean. The vent should be examined regularly and a little vaseline applied. Does must be in season before mating and a few soaked grey peas or a little wheat will help to bring them in season.

With regard to markings, don't encourage a fault by mating two together with the

same failing or you will stamp it into your stud.

Don't exhibit a youngster under 8 weeks old. Always see that your exhibit is in good fettle or you will fail in the show pen and a far-sighted fancier may purchase it from you for a few shillings. You will regret this later on.

Don't pull out long hairs where one color runs into the other as the Judge is then justified in passing your exhibit for "not shown as born". For this reason I have passed many that would have been easy winners if untouched.

Keep all your best rabbits until your stud is established. Don't be tempted with

a few pennies for your best or you will be all the longer getting to the top. ... the miles

Don't over show a rabbit. See that it has plenty of room in the exhibition box and that it is given a chance of a drink on its return from the show. Never starve a rabbit, you have to feed well for a good coat. A little linseed will help you in A STATE OF THE STATE OF THE STATE OF

Don't keep your rabbit from a show because a certain man is judging. The best

will always win under a decent judge.

Don't grumble if you don't score at a show before you know what has won. Any old vancier will tell you where you have failed.

You are sure to get to the top if you have the guts and are not always thinking

Being an unskilled writer, I will try to convey some facts and experiences pertinent to the "King of the Show Table", in Rabbit Circles. Would also mention that the following views are mine alone and, by my own standards, consider myself as being far from an expert at Dutch Fancy.

Dutch comes in six colors, Black, Blue, Tortoise, Chocolate, Steel and Steel Gray. Weight standard is $3\frac{1}{2}$ to $5\frac{1}{2}$ pounds, with $4\frac{1}{2}$ being the ideal weight to strive for.

Show classes are: under 6 months of age, a junior, over 6 months of age, a senior To properly breed and actually know this Premier of fancy Show type Rabbit one prerequisite is to belong to the American Dutch Rabbit Specialty Club. The Guide Book is worth the membership fee. In this book are pictures and illustrations of properly typed and marked Dutch. Also, the distribution of points for the Judge to utilize in the shows.

There is also a monthly publication "The Dutch Reporter" which supplies dates and places of coming shows throughout the U.S.A., and results of past shows. It is not

known exactly how the "King of Shows" derived its name. It is one of the oldest breeds in existance and seems to have been originated in England.

The Dutch Reporter also contains articles each month written by Old Timers, some of whom have been breeding Dutch for over 40 years. Dutch, for the last few years in this area have been gaining in popularity in the shows. They were the leading breed at the Southeastern F ir, Atlanta, Ga. in 1959. During the 1961 National Dutch Show held at Colorado Springs, Colorado on May 27-28, over 460 passed through two ARBA Judge's hands. These judges were voted on by the membership to judge their National Convention.

A properly marked, well typed Dutch with small, short ears and a rounded head is an thing of beauty. The Dutch with the well-balanced type, bearing perfect markings has not been kindled yet. That is why the Dutch is such a challenge to breed. The "Old Timer" that speaks from experience will tell a beginner to start out breeding with first, type, regardless of markings. Second, fur and color, then attempt from type, fur and color to produce the properly marked Dutch. With the proper type and fur this writer can go along, however, this proceedure is quite time consuming and while you are attempting -- the "Old Timers" will be winning all the shows. My own experience disclosed that good type and short ears, also good colored fur is a must to breed from, then by selective breeding try to produce the good Dutch.according to the Standard, meaning never mate two animals with the same fault. Always use one sex that offsets the fault of the opposite sex. This can mean type, head, ears and color. One reason for the increasing popularity of the Dutch is its dual purpose status. Florida breeders of Dutch have proven that the cost of Dutch meat per pound of production was far superior to that of the so-called commercial breeds. These breeders have also discovered that only the Dutch will breed consistently and conceive in very hot climates.

By the above ramblings one would think that this writer considers there is only one breed of Rabbits. This is not true, my hutches also conatin Californians and New Zealands, but YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH!


