

You will see in the Convention minutes that the Board had to make several important decisions. The dues were raised to \$5.00 for individual and \$7.00 combination (husband-wife), effective Jan. 1, 1972. This was to keep the club solvent. The Board also approved the new point system which will give one point for B.O.B. and 1/2 point for B.O.S. times the number shown in the breed. This will start with the new 1972-1973 series. Traveling trophies and plaques were discontinued by previous board action and were still being listed. The Secretary was instructed to give out all travelling trophies in her possession to the ones with the most wins as fairly as possible. No more traveling trophies will be accepted by the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

We are in the process of incorporating in the state of Minnesota. The object of this is to get a much cheaper mailing rate for the D.R. etc. The New Zealand and Champagen Speciality Clubs have done this and cut their mailing costs quite a bit. They are helping us with the details.



To be successful on the show table requires a number of factors. I will discuss my methods and procedures on one of these - breeding. I think this article will probably be different from anything I have ever read by other successful breeders. This does not necessarily mean they are wrong and I am right. These are my ideas and opinions, and if it will stir up some controversy among the membership and they will write agreeing or disagreeing on points, I believe it will be good for the readers of the Dutch Reporter.

First, I do not think it is necessary for one to begin with a closely bred strain. The reason being if one could get everything he needs from one strain, it would be fine. I think all will agree that there are no perfect Dutch. They have faults, and even the best I have ever seen had some faults.

I keep alot of Dutch in my herd that would never place high in show competition. The reason I keep them is that they have at least one outstanding quality. The think to work toward is to try to breed better young that the parent. One should look beyond the first generation. For instance, if I raise a doe with excellent fur and everything else only fiar, I might cross her with a buck with excellent type and fur, then breed this offspring to one with excellent color, trying for all three aualities. If I succeeded in this, I would go for better heads, etc. This cannot be done quickly. It takes years. If I do not have some necessary quality in my herd, I would go outside my bloodline to get it, but I would also breed brother and sister, if I thought the cross would produce the qualities for which I am looking. I don't think you can get it if it isn't in the genes. Hany don't agree with this because you can also pick up undesireable qualities as well. This is where you need to cull. Proper culling is a very important factor which I may cover in a future article.

I evaluate my young that I put into the herd for production on whether or not they have enough good qualitites to improve my future young. I pay less attention to markings than to type, color, fur, head and ears. I have bred good marked to good marked and produced practically the same percentage of good marked young as I have by using mismark to mismark or mismark to good marked.

Apparently, the gene pool for markings is much larger than it is for type, color, head, ears or fur which seems to be easier to narrow the range of differences. Even in close breeding, the young will all be slightly different. I also do not think one herd buck is the answer. If he has a type fault, this would be hard to breed out in the future generation. I am using today eight bucks for twenty-three brood does.

One could put Dutch markings on a Himalayan, but all you would have would be a snaky-looking Dutch-marked Himalayan. Apparently, from some of the stock I have seen at shows, it looks as if this is what some breeders have done. This comes from breeding for markings alone and placing little regard for anything else. These will place at a show because after all you have 50 points on markings, but they sure do lack that classy look you can have with a good head, ears and cobby type. Type to me is the most important quality. Very few Dutch stay long on my place with poor type. Also, type seems to be what breeders and judges have the most trouble with, and there are more differences of opinion regarding type than any other characteristic.

What is good type? The drawing in our standard is what I have always sought. One sees so many Dutch with low shoulders, combined with high rearends. This is mandolin type. I see very few judges even look at a Dutch from the side to see the profile. Some are good enough to feel their shape with their hands, but most

are looking for hard smooth flesh condition. Type is visual, flesh conditions, you feel. There are no points in our Dutch standard for flesh condition. I do think flesh condition is important because it fills out the rabbit so it looks its best. Conditioning rabbits for show is another topic that I may write on in the future.

In breeding to gain good qualities, watch to eliminate the faults as well. For example, I have one old buck with excellent type, head, ears, good color, but long, thin and slightly wirey coat. The does I breed to him must have a good coat. One must evaluate on what a rabbitproduces. It takes time to build a herd of producing does. Patience and persistence are the keywords. After I place a rabbit in production, it is evaluated on what it can "throw". Not all throw good young. If they cannot, after several litters with several different combinations, you are wasting your time and feed.
