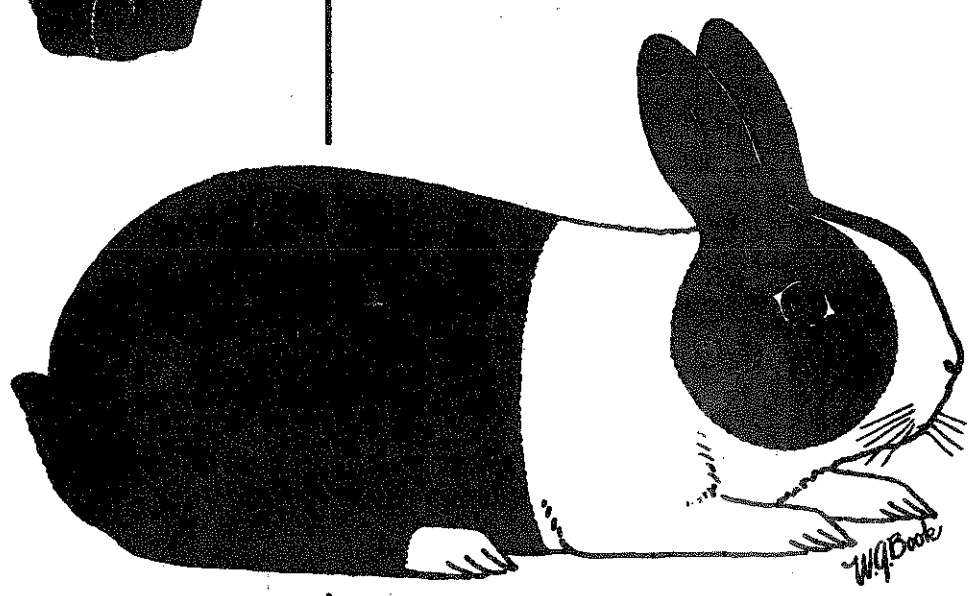

AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

Minutes - General Meeting - Springfield, Illinois - Oct. 27, 1964

The regular meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order by President Summers at 11:15 a.m. with the following officers present: President Bill Summers; Secretary-Treasurer, Jessie Weinhardt; Directors: Tom Shufflebotham, William C. Stedman, and Don Reid. Absent were: Vice-President, Jack Boughton; Directors, Clinton Dennis, Don Guthrie and E. R. Parks.

The minutes of the previous meeting held at the National Dutch Show at Ann Arbor, Michigan were read and after some discussion regarding action taken at that meeting pertaining to proposed changes of the Standard, it was explained that this had been taken care of at the Board of Directors meeting on the previous evening and would appear in those minutes. A motion by Wm. Stedman, seconded by Bill Hobin that the minutes be approved as read was carried.

The minutes of the Board of Directors meeting were read and approved.

Report of the Publicity Committee was read by Bill Hobin and accepted.

Don Reid went into some detail to explain the proposed changes in the Standard which are to be submitted to the general membership for acceptance or rejection. A ballot is to be mailed in the near future.

The Election Committee report was read by Committee member, E. P. Shilliday.

Bill Hobin reported that the fine oil painting on display in the Dutch Club booth is to be the prize to go to the winner of the membership drive now going on under the heading "One for One Club".

There was no unfinished business.

A motion by Frank Miller that the report of sweepstake standings published in the Dutch Reporter should include the home state of each member. Seconded by Tom Shufflebotham. Carried.

There was some discussion as to the present system of apportioning funds for the National Dutch Show. The question as to why so much went to this show fund with none being apportioned for the Convention Show. Bill Stedman explained that the reasoning behind the present set-up was that the National Dutch Show, being our own show, the need for greater club backing to make for a bigger and better show was apparent. The Convention show, being wider in scope could better be supported by individual contributions. It was pointed out that the weakness in the list of specials at the last few Conventions was to a great extent due to the late appointment of a Breed Chairman

by the sponsoring club, and the suggestion was made that the time and place to raise these funds was at the present convention. President Summers appointed Don Lovejoy to do this job and he immediately went to work to raise funds for specials for the Dutch for the 1965 ARBA Convention show to be held at Pomona in his home state of California.

Everett Shilliday reported as chairman of the Auditing Committee, stating that without any reflection on the accuracy of the treasurer, the present set-up of bookkeeping made it next to impossible to do a thorough audit in the time allowed at these meetings. President Summers requested that Mr. Shilliday review the situation and set up a new bookkeeping system that would make the Auditing Committee's job simpler. This he agreed to do.

Under Good of the Order, a motion was made by Don Lovejoy that the Secretary be instructed to write a letter to Art and Helen Osmon, expressing the American Dutch Rabbit Club's thanks for the wonderful job that they had done as Chairmen for Dutch at this Convention. It was pointed out that they had been drafted for this job on their arrival at the show room late Sunday night, without any previous warning that such might be the case. The motion was seconded by C. Jay Miller and carried.

There was a motion by Bill Hobin, seconded by Don Lovejoy that the members present participate in one minutes silent prayer in memory of our good friend and director, Bob Scott who was killed in an automobile accident shortly after the last National Dutch Show. Motion carried and complied with.

A motion by Stan Goeglein, seconded by Herb Baker that the American Dutch Rabbit Club discontinue to sanction any shows on the same dates as the National Dutch Show was withdrawn and this item was turned over to the Board of Directors whose duty it is to alter these rules and a special meeting of those Board members present was called for immediately after this meeting to take action.

V. L. Casper was given the floor in order to extend an invitation from the Decatur, Georgia Rabbit Breeders Ass'n. to all members to attend the 1965 National Dutch Show to be held in Atlanta, Georgia on April 23-25, 1965. (These dates being tentative.)

There was a motion by B. H. Cauthorn, seconded by A. C. McKeeman that the meeting be adjourned. Carried. Meeting adjourned at 12:25 p.m.

SECRETARY'S CHIT CHAT

I have just been reminded that I had forgotten to order the trophies for the 1963-64 Sweepstake Series. I just don't know how I could have forgotten such an important item and I assure you that I am taking care of it immediately. Would the winners PLEASE take the time and trouble to let me know when they have received their awards? Almost nobody ever does bother to let me know when these are received so perhaps that is one reason I didn't realize I had never ordered them.

I have had a request from one of our Canadian members for an article on the subject of moulting, with the principal question being is there any way to control such moult occurring at show time. Anyone have any ideas? I'm sure I do not.

I have been notified by President Summers that he has made some appointments for 1965. These include the appointment of Director-elect, Don Love to the Dutch Reporter Editorial Committee. Joseph A. Penksa has been appointed to fill the vacancy on the Election Committee created by the death of Bill Karlinsky. A new appointment to the Publicity Committee is C. W. Stinson for Virginia.

A couple of errors in the November Dutch Reporter have been pointed out to me and I wish to correct them at this time. In the Minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting on page 4, Don Reid's name should have been included in the list of those Directors voting for awarding the National Dutch Show for 1965 to the Decatur, Georgia club. In the show report for the ARBA Convention Show on page 14, I listed the black junior doe as being Best Jr. All Colors -- inasmuch as Best Dutch was the black jr. buck, this just could not be. Best Junior All Colors goes to Bill Summer's Black Junior Buck. I hope that is all of them.

There being an almost absolute absence of material for this issue (other than a knee-high pile of show reports) I am taking an article from the May, 1937 Special Dutch Issue of Small Stock to try to fill some of the requests for answers from some of our newer breeders. Any of us can benefit from reviewing some of this material from time to time, too. Let's start 1965 out with such a rush of new material that it will carry us way over into the summer issues:

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

COLOR AND COLOR TONING OF DUTCH RABBITS

Dutch are bred in the following colors: Black, Blue, Tortoiseshell, Steel-Gray, BrownGray, Light Gray, Yellow and Chocolate. (Ed's Note: I believe Judge Parker to be referring to the UKDRC Standards here.) I am going to try and illustrate to the breeders to the best of my ability the way color is transmitted from one generation to another. This is done through the life spores of the ovaries. It is generally conceded by authorities on the subject that the ovaries of a rabbit possess in the vicinity of 2,000 spores. These spores carry the color pigment factors that are to control the color of your future stock, but are not all fertile at one time, and when you make a mating such spores that are fertile and active on the male and female side take and bring about the life and color of the future generations. Let us take the Black and Blue Dutch, most breeders prefer a black buck to head their stud, but some fanciers have used Blue bucks with equal success, so it seems this choice lies entirely with the breeder as to which he prefers. I prefer a good black and also a blue as both are essential. My experience is that you cannot breed straight black or blue without a cross. For instance, let us take a black doe. This mating should give us results that are very good but take the progeny from that mating and keep on mating them from generation to generation for about four or five times and you will find a weakness in the color of your black, peppery ears, and on examining this stock at the base of the fur at the skin you will find that the color is starting to fade. This weakness gradually creeps up the fur until your top color is a very poor black, and by no means a beautiful lustrous black as envied by all breeders. Color is not usually lost in one generation, it generally weakens over a period of generations.

Having satisfied yourself that it is time that you toned up your Black this is where a Blue buck comes in for your next cross. He will put new life and color in your Black. A system that has been used by many successful breeders is three generations Black bred then a cross from a Black buck Blue bred. In the event that you are breeding alone, after the third generation use a dark blue, black bred if possible. If you do not possess a buck bred this way I would advise using a straight black bred buck.

We have three shades of Blue: The dark, medium and the light. The light we have found from experience to cause us breeders a great deal of trouble. Personally, I brand them responsible for the mealy washed out appearance that we often see in blues, and they are certainly a source of eye trouble, such as light blue, specked and wall-eyed Dutch. I think most experienced breeders are very careful about using this color from which to breed. If you take the very dark blue and mate them together you will get a percentage of medium or exhibition Blues. Mr. Fearn of England, mentioned

in his very able article on Dutch, that he likes the dark Blues best. From my experience what he would term a Dark Blue in England, we on this side would term a medium Blue. These are the most preferred in the show pen, and show to better advantage when put down in A-1 condition. If you keep mating these medium shades together it will not be long before you notice the tips of the ears getting light, the color at the bottom of the cheeks will begin to fade and the tail will be almost white underneath. Before you get to this point it is time to tone your color up by using a very Dark Blue into your matings, and these Blues, let them be bucks or does, should be Black bred. We must remember exhibition colors continually bred together will not give us exhibition colors. You must use a cross to keep your color up to par.

Let us take Steel Gray next. We have had some beautiful Steels from time to time. I have in mind "Champion Steel Princess", I think this was one of the best colored Steels the Dutch fancy has ever had, and those who have ever seen her I think will linger long in their memories as the ideal Steel Dutch rabbit. This doe was the property of Mr. J. W. Hanford, and I doubt if Jimmy has ever bred another such steel. Going back to our color, let us take Steel Grays. We have had some beautiful Steel Grays. Continually mating these together for generations we will soon have Brown Grays. It is at this point where your difficulty begins, and before you begin to produce too great a percentage of the brown and light gray I would advise you to put a cross in to tone up your color. I would advise if possible, using a good Dark Steel buck, that is Black bred to one of your best does. If such a buck is not procurable use a straight Black bred buck as far removed as possible from Blue or Tortoiseshell, as these colors do not mix well with the Steel Gray. The Black is a color that is almost indispensable in the Dutch stud for they can be used to so great an advantage in establishing or toning up almost all of the other colors.

If for any reason you may have to introduce an alien color into your stock, I would suggest that you do it from the doe side and not from that of the buck, as the defect you may develop in your stock can more earlier be eliminated from the doe's side than that of the buck. There is a great deal more that can be written on this subject but in conclusion I would advise all breeders to keep a faithful record of their color line breeding, as the Dutch variety possess the greatest pitfalls in color of any variety of rabbit.


