



I received a letter, back in November 1947, from "Bill" Hawthorne, our President at that time, giving me a list of expired members in the territory where I lived and asking me to contact them. This I did. Every one of them who were still raising Dutch were glad to renew. Most of them had just neglected to send their dues in, just putting it off 'til another day. I would like to take his idea and go a little further with it. I would like to appoint ten members as Representatives of the A.D.R.C. to work with me on this membership deal, also to help Mr. Wheelus get his publicity items before the public and to get ads for the REPORTER.

I will ask our Secretary to send me a list each month of the expired members who did not renew. Then, I will send them to the Representative: nearest them, the Representative to contact them personally if possible but at least contact them. Are you an exhibitor? If so, do you show your Dutch locally or Nationally? Do you show at your local club's show or in the neighboring towns and those are the big shows of the year, or do you ship them out away from home occasionally?

I would like to give you an urge to try your chances a little farther away if you exhibit only locally. More often than not, as I show my

Dutch away from home I find that the Judge favors another's rabbit instead of mine. I know that it must give you, as it does me, a thrill when you rabbit wins over someone who shows all around and has attained a Sweepstakes Standing by major winnings. Yet what happens when you win at your local show? Your bunnies go back in their hatch for another year or six months until the local puts on another show.

Along come the National Dutch or National Convention Shows. Your bunnies stay home. Mine go! Yes, the same ones you beat at your local show! Maybe they win or place well up there. Why? Because you kept yours home! Now, some of these locals put on real good shows but do you know it when you read it in the Reporter? Sometimes you say, "Why, Joe won that big buck class, I wonder where he got the good buck," -- chances are that Joe sent the same one that you had beaten.

But when you read about the National Shows what happens? You say, "Hope I have one good enough to send some day." Chances are the some day has already arrived. Did you know it? Don't do as I did in my first Convention Show... I entered three or four, then got cold feet and only shipped one. A few months later I was priviledged to see several of the winners of the classes that I had entered in and didn't ship them. That cured me -- almost.

Sometimes I still get "buck fever" when the big ones come up. What do I do then? Send two in the same class. Then when the Judge misses that real good one, he sometimes accidentally picks up the other one. What do you know! He picked them both! Of course, if you'd have had that nice one of yours there, it wouldn't have happened.

I'm going to use a real personal illustration. The boys from Calwifornia are real good fellows, and I know they won't mind, so I will use the Long Beach 1949 National AR&GBA Convention. They show lots of Dutch out there and are very active in everything they do. But they all kinda bogged down in the Long Beach show and didn't show as many as they might and it was right in their own backyard. They could have filled those classes up. Some classes didn't have an entry. Easy pickin's! You say, "I've never shipped that far!" What happened to our friend, Chas. O: Lewis. He shipped several from New York to Long Beach, about the longest sweep possible across our United States. You say, "But they wouldn't be in any shape to win after such a long trip." Again, look at that entry from New York which not only took several firsts and Bests of Color, but Best of all in the show.

Put some carrots in the crate when you ship. Carrots are not only food but they furnish moisture as well. Make friends with your local express agent. Find out which is your most direct route and quickest. Often a train one hour later will arrive first. I watched a florist get quick attention one day in a crowded express room. When someone complained who had waited longer, the agent said, "the flowers are perishable!" He didn't mention the two-bit tip that the florist gave him. Don't be afraid that your Dutch will die enroute. I have shipped hundreds yearly for several years now. I lost one at a show! Your Dutch are hardy - you know that. Mine are in an old barn, the weather boarding full of cracks. So they are used to drafts and don't take cold. It is better than being outside where the fur will discolor (rust) when exposed to the sun or excessive light.


I shipped eight Dutch to both Long Beach and Pueblo in shipping crates made from 1 x 2 welded wire, with 1/4" hardware cloth partition and 1/4" plywood bottoms and door. No covered top, back or sides. Light in weight, durable, beats the cost of a heavy shipping crate. No colds from exposure.

You're shipping to the National in March? What have I done? Should have kept my big mouth shut! Guess I'll have to settle for 31st in a -12-
