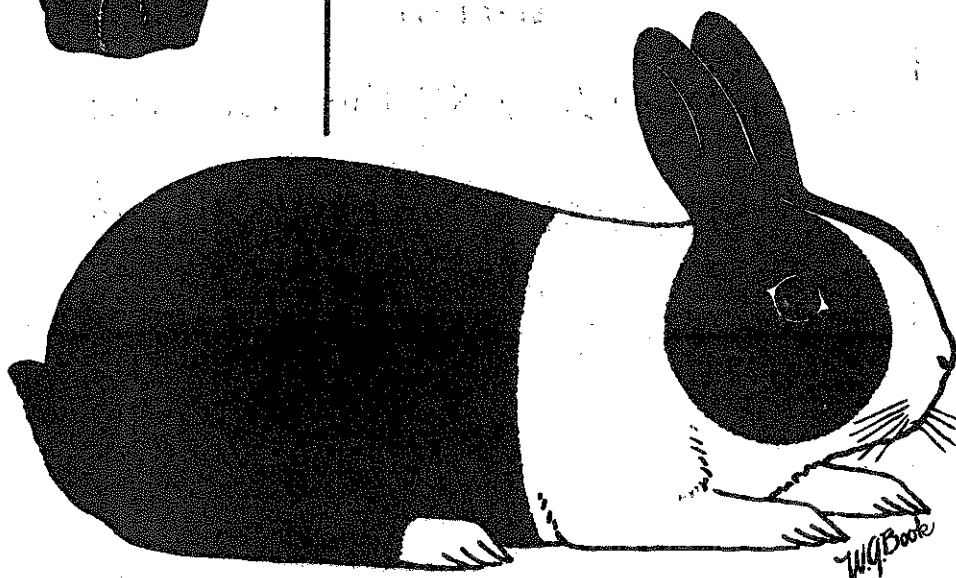

St., Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, the Dutch Specialty Club of Oklahoma will offer a rosette for Best Dutch; \$2.00 for Best Dutch in show; \$1.00 for Best Opposite Dutch in show; a Special Ribbon and \$1.00 for the Best of each variety; providing the sponsoring club will pay the cost of the Sweepstake sanction with the American Dutch Rabbit Club and comply with the rules of the American Dutch Rabbit Club concerning sweepstake shows. This offer is made only to All-Breed Clubs chartered with the American Rabbit Breeders Ass'n., Inc., and holding shows within the State of Oklahoma.

This offer has been in effect for the past year, and only two clubs availed themselves of this offer last year. We hope that this announcement through the Dutch Reporter will arouse interest, and that we will have several Dutch Sweepstake sanctioned shows in Oklahoma this year.

The Club will also continue our TABLE SHOW SERIES which has become an institution with our Club. FROM YOUR SECRETARY'S DESK

I thank each and everyone of you who thought of me and my family at Christmas time. The front part of our house was a shambles due to the remodeling going on here - but our dining room, which is my present office was decorated with the most beautiful cards we have ever received.

Right now, I feel like crying a bit on the big, broad, gorgeous shoulder of every Dutch Club member. So, brace yourself, I am leaning. Besides having our share of illnesses here, I lost my father in January and had to make a trip out of the state - leaving behind a pile of work, your letters, dues, sweepstake sanction requests, and all the other items that go with our office. Since there are only twenty-four hours in the day, I was right behind that eight-ball for a while, but I am happy to report I am beginning to see a little light over the top of the pile in front of me. I believe all items of business have been taken care of with the exception of being a bit late with our Dutch Reporter. Our Publisher, Mrs. Weinhardt, has been very kind in helping me out, again, and I know that each of you appreciate her services to our Club. We are making a brave attempt to get back on schedule here with the Dutch Reporter. We like for your copy to reach you by the 5th. of the month, and to do this the copy must be mailed out before the end of the month, preceding issue.

May I call your attention to the new breeder-card ads we now have? My thanks to each of you who advertise in our Dutch Reporter. These ads do help support your bulletin. It is good advertising and very modestly priced. I do not understand why more of you members do not avail yourselves of this service. At the same time, you will be helping to bring the Dutch Reporter to our members. If you have just neglected to send in that ad you have been contemplating for some time, why not sit down right now and make the copy and mail it to this office? Advertisers wishing to renew their ads, and hold their present position on the same page SHOULD renew before the present ad expires, if possible. In this way you will be advertising in the spot you wish. We aim to please you. Let us know your needs.

Several have written to inquire about certain show reports not yet published. I shamefully inform you that about three out of five show reports have to be returned to show secretaries for correction, and for more information. Unbelievable, isn't it? At the present time there are thirty, yes 30 - show reports out that have been returned to secretaries for corrections. This holds up this office on sending out rosettes and ribbons to the winners, as we cannot send a rosette for Best Dutch, etc., if we do not know who won it. At the same time, points for these incorrect reports cannot be accredited to winners. The report MUST be correct before we can award ribbons, or credit sweepstake points. If you have won a ribbon or rosette not yet received, just note if the report has not been published in the Dutch Reporter. If the report was not published, you can bet that report was incorrect. However, if the report was published, and you did not receive your ribbons, then please let me know at once. All ribbons and rosettes are mailed to winners BEFORE the show report is published in the Dutch Reporter. If you note any inaccuracies in these reports, I would appreciate it very much, if you will let me know about it. I have had only one such correction here - and one of our members was credited with another member's winnings. The nice thing about this information sent to me was: the member who was not deserving of the points WAS the one who gave me this information. Sportsmanship par excellence!!!

I am pleased with the reaction of our members toward my recent attempt at an article on Gray Dutch. These thoughts have been brewing in my mind for a long time. Out of all the letters I received praising the contents of this article, only one writer had an objection to one part of the article. This breeder, whom I know is a good breeder, and a very good Club member, does not understand "why we have to have white surface color on the bellies of our Gray Dutch". He cannot understand just why the Grays should not have a colored belly, the same as the other varieties. This same thought has been in the minds of a few of our Gray breeders for a period of (my guess) three or four years now. Anyone who has bred Gray Dutch for a NUMBER of years knows that a true Gray Dutch has ALWAYS had a white surface color over a blue undercolor on the belly. My word of advice, IF you want it. Don't be a victim of folly. Breed for and KEEP that white surface color on the bellies of your Grays.

May I refer you to the Standards and Guide Book of the Flemish Giant Breeders Specialty Club. If you do not have a copy available, try to contact a Flemish breeder and have him allow you to read one article in this book. This article is entitled "25 - YEAR REPORT GIVEN AT THE GRAND RAPIDS 1940 CONVENTION", and was written by the late Lev Griffen, a former Secretary of the National Federation of Flemish Giant Breeders. If my deductions are correct, this dates the beginning of this article back to 1915. The part of this article to which I refer is on the subject of "Steel" color breeding, and begins on page 69. (What applies to Steel color breeding, applies to Gray color breeding, due to the fact that both colors are of an agouti (ring) fur composition.) The late Mr. Griffen lamented the fact that the "light stomach color in Steel breeding had been disregarded, and thus resulted in the Steel Flemish having slate bellies." He quoted the present standard which states "Belly and under tail shall be light in color as possible" and further stated he still liked the old standard that said "belly to be as white as possible" - "however, this was a compromise with some who wanted slate bellies, and I personally feel we made a mistake and a backward step." (end of reference.) Now, the only way we can improve and hold our color is through actual breeding experience. This experience DOES NOT necessarily have to be done by our own self. We must learn to take and heed the advice of those who have "been through the mill" so to speak - unless we, as individuals, want to learn the "hard way", with bitter and costly experiences. Costly - not only to the breeder himself, but more times than not, costly to the breed. Many of you remember the late Gus Siegmund of Detroit. Judge Siegmund had a world of experience in color breeding. To my knowledge, his experience was within the Rex rabbit. I am grateful to Mr. Siegmund for his having imparted some of his knowledge and related experience to me on "color breeding". I remember well that Mr. Siegmund stated that "it is very, very difficult to breed an agouti furred animal (of any kind, not necessarily rabbits) true to variety IF that animal possessed a colored belly". We definitely can use recorded information from authorities on genetics who have or may be conducting experiments along the lines of "color" breeding. Until we have these facts down in black and white and to the point they cannot be disputed, the only alternative we have as safe and sane color breeders is to pay attention to the old-timers who have been with us, and who have already learned long ago. It occurs to me that likely as not, IF we had white bellies on our Steel Dutch we would have a true-breeding Steel -----but now, this does not entitle you nor me to go out into our rabbitries and start coating the bellies of our Steels white; this is just a thought, and let it remain a thought; a thought that will remind you, and me, if we want our Grays to breed true, keep the belly color white with a blue undercolor ON GRAYS.

If you have not yet been able to send a contribution to Mrs. Staneart, Sec'y. of the 1956 National Dutch Show, rush it into the mails right away. She is working very hard to get this show together in a manner which will do the Indiana State Dutch Club, and the ADRC proud of her. She cannot do it alone; she must have our help. Every little bit helps a lot. Send what you can to her at once, and include something for the Junior Department. Specials received too late for the catalog will be posted in the show room, and published in the Dutch Reporter.

Members whose dues expire soon, be sure to renew - no points - no show ribbons. Also winners must be in good standing to win specials, and legs on Club trophies at the National Dutch Show. While on the subject of dues, one youngster wrote to me and inquired if "he is allowed to pay his dues before they expire, or a few weeks early".....bless him. It would be a lot less work in this office if members would renew early. Also, as I have stated in the past, you will be sure to receive your Dutch Reporter, without missing a single issue. We print only enough copies for our members, plus ten copies. If more than ten new members or renewals come in, someone is out of luck for an issue. So, yes, it would please me very much if you will renew early.

Note the show dates of the A.R.B.A. Convention, and names of our Dutch Breed Chairmen for that show. Some money has already come in - honor going to Art and Helen Owan, of Chicago, winners of Best Dutch at 1955 Convention at Columbus, for having sent in the first specials for the 1956 AREA Convention. Incidentally, I

believe J. Cyril Lowit should have had more publicity for his fine work in getting the "Dutch Pot money" for Best Display, or displays, (depending how large this "Pot" becomes) of Dutch at the 1956 ARBA Convention. This \$80.00 pot was built in less than four hours time. Cy just put that "eagle-eye" of his on the paper, had his pen ready, and said "Write". And boy, did they. Kidding, of course, but this was nice work, and the Club members appreciate this kind of gesture. Anyone else who cares to contribute to Cy's "Dutch Pot" may do so by mailing said contribution, with name and address of donor, to this office. Again, all donations - small or large - will be gratefully accepted. (By the way, remember seeing in the 1955 Convention catalog whereby Cy Lowit, same Cy, contributed \$200.00 for the \$26.00 Dutch Pot for that show???????) It was printed plain as daylight, and was a boo-boo, according to those concerned. We forgive; but we did try to collect this "extra money" - No luck!

I appreciate the letters accompanying dues, etc. I do not always have time to reply, but keep your letters coming. You are doing a great service here by keeping me informed.

Plan to attend and exhibit at the 1956 National Dutch Show.
