In Convention at Little Rock, Ark. - Oct. 19, 1957  
The meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order by President George Bayliss at 9:00 A. M., Oct. 19, 1957, with the following Officers and Board Members being present: Pres. Bayliss, Secretary-Treas., Jessie Weinhardt, and Members Tom Shufflebotham, J. Cyril Lewis, E. C. Bickley and Wm. Stedman.

The minutes of the Oklahoma City meeting were read and approved, the Treas. report was read and approved on a motion by E. C. Bickley, seconded by Al Emery.

Committees reporting: J. C. Levitt reporting as Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee, that the Seller's Class was in effect for this Convention Show, and that any entries would be accepted for this show whether entered in open classes or not. There was an explanation of the working of this class - that entries were to be made to the club secretary, and also any sealed bids were to be placed with the club secretary, these to be opened and announced at the beginning of the auction, the highest sealed bid to be the starting point for open auction. It was felt that the rules were a composite of ideas from many persons and they were still open to suggestions from the general membership. It was agreed that while the rules are probably not perfect, we have an excellent and workable idea that would certainly benefit the club and probably would soon be copied by other specialty clubs.

E. C. Bickley, reporting as Chairman of the Standards Committee, stated that he had still had no suggestions from the membership, aside from one letter from Don Guthrie, on the Gray Standard. President Payliss made a special plea that ideas be sent to this committee. It was suggested by Al Meier that we look into the British Standard and perhaps take a little guidance from their long experience. This idea was discussed at some length and the idea was brought out by L. W. VanHorne as to whether we needed three Gray Color Standards as the British have, or just call the Gray we have a Brown-Gray and let it go at that. It was emphasized that we must take care not to bring this Brown-Gray in as a new color, but rewrite our present standard. Any ideas on the subject will be welcomed by Mr. Bickley and his committee.

Mr. Shufflebotham reported as chairman of the Educational Committee, saying that so far there was not too much to report, but some questions were beginning to come in and were being answered for publication in the Dutch Reporter. It was the feeling by those present that a good start was being made, and that this sort of thing would make the Dutch Reporter of greater interest to the new breeder.

Under unfinished business the question as to where the 1958 National Dutch Show was to be held was raised by Merle Emery. The Secretary explained that inasmuch as the By-Laws state that this announcement is to be made at the ARMA Convention, that here and now was the time and place to do so. The announcement was made as follows: The 1958 National Dutch Show has been awarded to the Ohio State Dutch Club and will be held April 25-26-27, 1958 in Wellington, Ohio, honoring A. E. "Pop" Sautters, one of the oldest members, in point of membership, and probably the oldest, in point of age, of the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

Under New Business, the results of the election of officers for the year 1958 were read.

President Payliss took this opportunity to thank all of the members of the American Dutch Rabbit Club for their confidence, evidenced by his re-election and also for the wonderful co-operation that he had received both from the membership at large, and the Board of Directors.

Al Meier brought up the question of exchange memberships with the British Dutch Club that had been voted on at St. Paul and after a brief explanation of the working of this plan (by which an ADRC member would pay the dues of an interested Briton, and in turn have his dues paid in the British Club, each receiving the other Club's Guide Book and any publications.) Mr. Payliss promised to get the necessary information into the hands of the Secretary as soon as possible so that we could get started with this plan. Considerable interest was shown.

There was some discussion of the "Four Best Dutch Pot" for the ARMA Conventions. It was felt by some that this money should be spread around a bit rather than all going to one winner. The question was raised as to whether we wanted to continue this plan after this year. It was decided that it was a good idea and should be continued. A motion was made by L. W. VanHorne, seconded by Walter Cox that the Dutch Pot should, in the future be awarded to "The most points secured by any Eur Dutch exhibited by some breeder - 60% to go to first place; 25% to go to second place; 15% to go to third place, at an ARMA Convention Show." Carried.

It was announced that a Board of Directors meeting was called for 5:00 P. M. in

room 638 of the Marion Hotel.

President Rayliss complimented Clinton Dennis for his very capable handling of the job of Dutch Breed Chairman for the present Convention Show.

There was a discussion of the present plan of sanctioning both One and Two Day Sweepstake Shows. This matter was tabled until after the Board meeting.

Motion to adjourn at 10:55 A. M.

MINUTES

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING - AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

Oct. 19, 1957

After an abortive attempt to hold a meeting before the ARBA meeting, the meeting of the Board of Directors of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was finally called to order at approximately ten P. M., in room 638 of the Marion Hotel with the following members present: President George Rayliss, Sec'y-Treas. Jessie Weinhardt, Board members, Wm. Stelman, E. C. Dickley, Tom Shufflebotham. Absent were Vice-Pres. G. C. Leisenring, and Board members, James Elyth and L. E. Settle.

After considerable discussion, to the effect that inasmuch as the line of demarcation between our present system of holding shows passed under the guise of Two Day Shows, but to all practical purposes being - quite "in the morning, out at night" - one-day shows, the following recommendation is made by a unanimous vote of the Board - "It is recommended that we, after January 1st., 1958 combine the points of the so-called One and Two Day Sweepstake Series and hold only one DUTCH SWEEPSTAKE SERIES for the year 1958. This series will include the National Dutch Show to be held at Wellington, Ohio. The rules for the two types of shows having been held in the past will be combined and the rules be changed to read as regards cooping, 'Rabbits MAY be cooped'."

It is further recommended by the Board, that due to the late lamentable delay, in getting the results of the Finals of the Sweepstake Series to the membership, that the Secretary be instructed to purchase a rubber stamp reading, "NEW RULE - POINTS ON THIS REPORT WILL NOT BE COUNTED IN THIS SWEEPSTAKE SERIES UNLESS THIS REPORT IS REC'D BY THE ADRC SECRETARY WITHIN FORTY-FIVE DAYS OF THE CLOSE OF THIS SHOW." Said stamp to be used with bright red ink on each and every show report blank to be sent out to Official Sweepstake Shows.

SECOND MEETING OF THE AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

October 21, 1957

The second meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order by President George Rayliss at 10:00 A. M. with the following Officers and Board Members present: President Rayliss, Vice-President Leisenring, Secretary-Treas., Jessie Weinhardt, Board Members, E. C. Dickley, Wm. Stelman, L. E. Settle. Board Members absent were; J. C. Lewitt and James Elyth.

Notes of the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved, minutes of the Board meeting were read and approved by the Board.

There was a discussion of the idea of combining the present two separate Sweepstakes Series into a "Dutch Sweepstake Series" without regard to length of show - recommendation of the board was read and after a few questions had been answered, there was a motion by Homer O'Haver, seconded by Clinton Dennis that recommendation number One be accepted - carried.

The second recommendation of the board was read, and after some discussion as to the "Why" of the 45 day limitation there was a motion by Kirk Moore, seconded by Homer O'Haver that recommendation Number Two be accepted with the amendment that a delinquent club be sent a notice to that effect and be allowed an extra 15 days to fulfill the requirements. Carried.

The question arose as to the awarding of Grand Champion Leg Certificates to Best

Opposite of Variety - we were informed that this matter was due for consideration at the Judges Conference of the ARFA later in the day, and inasmuch as this had been passed on at a former Convention of the ARFA, and our Dutch Club rules had never been rewritten to cover it, this should be taken care of at once.

The Gray Standard was brought up for further discussion - Don Guthrie raised the point that at St. Paul the American Dutch Rabbit Club had requested that all ARFA Judges be lenient with the Grays until further action could be taken by the Standard Committee and he want to know "just how long are we to go on being lenient?" A supplement to the Standard had been promised but to date had not been furnished and he felt that we were being unfair to the judges by not taking some definite action. Much discussion followed. Among the questions asked were, "Do we want a light belly or a dark belly? Do we wish our Standard Committee to re-word the present standard?" The Chairman of the Standard Committee was instructed to go home and write a Gray Standard to fit the wishes of the Gray Breeders.

Under New Business, Mr. Bickley announced that inasmuch as Ohio had received the National Dutch Show for 1958, Mr. Merle Emery is waiting with open hands for any and all contributions.

Meeting adjourned at 11:15 A. M.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

ARE THE BEST AND BEST OPPOSITE SEX DUTCH ALWAYS BLACK?

How many times have you heard those very words? Or, "Why do the Judges always pick a Black Dutch Best or Best Opposite?" You have probably said, or thought the same thing yourself. I think I may have believed it myself at times, but then you think, "No, it just can't be.", and you know it really isn't true at all. I did some research on just that to prove to myself whether it were true or not, and after viewing the facts, I would like to pass them along.

First of all I chose at random, 150 shows, east coast to west coast, north and south. I took the number of Dutch entered in these shows, broke them down to the six varieties. These 150 shows were judged by 50 different judges. This represented 10,093 Dutch, or an average of 68 Dutch per show. This points out, among other things, the wide popularity of our little Dutchman, as there are many sections of the country that they are just beginning to become popular.

If you will study the averages in the table below, I think a great many of you will be surprised to learn that it isn't always the Black Dutch that wins just because it is Black. I also think, a great many of you will agree that the Judges are doing a good job in picking the Best Dutch because it is THE BEST DUTCH and not because of the variety.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

ARE OUR SWEEPSTAKES FAIR?

Having enjoyed phenomenal success in three big shows the past year, after feeling a brief degree of false joy, my conscience bade me sit down and look at the situation objectively. Was it really fair for, say people like us, who are presently blessed with many, many good Dutch, to go into a show like we just did and pick up, in one show, in the vicinity of sixteen hundred points: What about the other exhibitors,

with smaller herds, many of them outstanding animals, who placed below fifth place in those classes of eleven to nineteen? Did they get a fair shake? After considerable thought I began to wonder if our system wasn't a farce. One thing you must admit to is that a rabbit placing first in a class of one, and it is a good rabbit, gets only six points. A rabbit placing second in a class of two gets eight points, even though it may be only a fair specimen. Likewise if a poor animal in a class of three places a last third, he gets NINE points, a worse rabbit placing a fourth in a class of four can still get eight points. Likewise an animal that gives ground to four others within its class can still get five points, regardless of how faulty it is, just so long as it can escape disqualification. Now comes the other side of the fence too. Say in a class of thirty-five that has contained within it no less than ten exceptional animals - at least five must be discriminated against, for only five of the ten good bunnies can gain points. It is my personal belief that this draw-back can be conquered thusly:

1. A judge could, at his own discretion, award any number of points, up to six on an animal. For example, if fourth place animal is almost equal to the first place bunny, he could give it credit for a full six points just as the first place animal would get, i.e. if all four are real outstanding, likewise he could give an eighth place animal in a class of thirty say, three or four sweepstakes credits, if its quality warranted it.

2. Best of Breed or Best Opposite Sex, under present set-up are restricted to their own class for gaining points which actually can amount to this, such as at our show, just completed, Black Senior Doe, in its class of eleven gained only sixty-six points, yet in the same show there were no less than eleven other animals that gained as many or MORE points. For example the second place Senior Buck was credited with ninety-four points. This second place Senior Buck won over nineteen rabbits while the Senior Doe won over a hundred and sixty-eight rabbits for only sixty-six points!

In plain words, if a rabbit competing as an individual within its class and gains only six sweepstake points can be the Champion of a show in which it is mathematically possible to have a hundred and fifteen rabbits within the same show, it should gain more sweepstake points. It is my belief that any rabbit, regardless of the number of animals competing within its own class is deservant of the maximum number of sweepstake points. I feel that the taste of victory is darkened by lack of an even playing field.

I would like to see it made mandatory that exhibitors nominate, prior to showing at a desired Sweepstake Show, the animals they wish to be eligible to participate for Sweepstake points. The number of animals eligible to nominate should be limited to, say twenty-five for each show and the number of shows in which rabbits could be nominated should be limited to five for each Dutch Club year (annual meet to annual meet) with a maximum of one hundred nominations within a year. Believe me, this would really make the Sweepstake Contest contestable. Under present rules it isn't possible for Mr. Average fancier to even make the Elite Ten for lack of a balanced playing field. I know that the enthusiasm is removed from Mr. Average Dutch Breeder to compete for Sweepstake honors under the present set-up. If Mr. X can go to only two or three shows and load the show with numbers exceeding normalcy or Mr. Y has time and money to exhibit at a Sweepstake Show every week, the sport ceases to be a contest. This as I say, is my personal opinion and hope that it will result in making adequate changes, so that more can participate. Seems silly, that I should cry, when presently I am one of the select ten, but my conscience dictates that my achievements haven't been with equal opportunity for all. I dream of the day when we of the Dutch Club can adjust this.

True, so true that the ADRC is presently perched on its all time highest pedestal, but that it is permissible for us to loaf upon our laurels is folly. May the Club always find room for both progress and expansion.

IN APPRECIATION OF LOCAL SHOWS AND SHOW OFFICIALS

I would like to express through the Reporter my appreciation to the rabbit clubs that promote local shows. First let me state my position. I am a member of the ARDA and ADRG but not a member of any local club. There are not enough breeders in my community for a club and it is 80 miles to the nearest town where there is an active club to which I might belong. But the clubs within a radius of 80 to 150 miles of me have put on some good shows at which I have been privileged to show my rabbits and bring home some of their premium money and other awards. I know that the members of the clubs promoting these shows put in some long hours and hard work, both before and after the show. I am sure that the entry fees do not much more than cover the actual expenses of the show. They pay back is not the only expense they have. There is printing, Publicity, Mailing expense, the expense of having the show sweepstaked for several breeds, Judges fees and many other costs. We will assume that they get the building where the show is held rent-free and that the handlers, care takers, secretaries and carriers work for nothing.

I have always felt that I was well repaid for my entry fee and expense to these shows by being able to visit and associate with other breeders and just talk rabbits, especially Dutch rabbits, with them for a day or two.

There are all kinds of animal shows. There are dog shows, cat shows, cattle shows, horse shows and a show for almost any kind of animal or bird in the world. I doubt if the pay-back on any of them would show the exhibitor a profit on his entry fee and expenses of attending the show. Exhibiting at shows has many other rewards besides the pay-back. The publicity and advertizing that a breeder receives by showing his rabbits and having his winnings published in the papers and magazines is worth more than the cost of the entry fee. The association and fellowship and friendly competition at the shows is something that to me, you cannot put a price on.

I feel sure that if a club was lucky enough to come through a show with a profit on the entry fees that this profit would be plowed back into the rabbit business in some way by promoting the industry where it would benefit all of us to some extent.

I have no complaint to make at the entry fees or the pay-back from any show that I have attended. To the contrary, I want to express my appreciation to the officials and members of the local clubs for promoting the shows and hope you have many more of them.
