OPEN LETTER TO ALL DUTCH CLUB MEMBERS L

Very shortly you will receive your ballot relative to the proposed new Constitution and By-Laws for our Dutch Club. I urge you all to study it very, very carefully -- ask yourself "do we need these changes at this time"? Note that under the new Laws the Secretary's salary is decreased but her work-load remains the same -- is this fair? Are you dissatisfied with your present Secretary and her efforts to date? Remember her present term of office is only half completed, she accepted the nomination and election predicated on the basis of certain duties and monies for same -- what has she done or failed to do to deserve a "cut in pay"?

Note also that under the new proposal the Dutch Reporter will no loger be edited and printed by your Dutch Club Secretary, but will become the responsibility of the Publicity Chairman who is a Presidential appointee. Why? Hasn't the Dutch Reporter proved itself to be a lively and interesting monthly visitor to our homes under each and every one of our duly elected Secretaries since its inception? Where else but in the Secretary's office do you find all the latest, accurate and interesting information relative to our Club that finds its way into the Reporter? Let's leave it as it is in the hands of our very capable Secretary whose policies, promptness and integrity certainly are above reproach.

I can assure you members that this proposed new Constitution and By-Laws does not have the support of the entire executive Board of your Club -- far from it. Certainly we could not have grown to be one of the largest Specialty Clubs, and by far the most active with the best monthly paper, if our Constitution and By-Laws were not good and workable and well founded. Why the sudden furor for a change? Who tends to profit by it either in prestige, power or monies?

Personally I intend to vote "NO" on the entire matter and am urging all by friends to help me defeat it.

I see by the January issue of the Dutch Reporter that within sixty days the member-ship will be called upon to vote on the revised Constitution and By-Laws. As an officer of the Dutch Club I feel it is my duty to express my views, and give the member-

ship a little background on some of these proposed changes.

The most controversial perhaps, is the proposal to separate the Dutch Reporter from the Secretary's office. These changes were originally proposed by the Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee at the Ft. Worth Convention. These changes were prompted by the feeling that our club was not on a sound financial basis. I would like to quote a letter by Clinton Dennis, and read before the general meeting at the National Dutch Show in Colorado Springs. "They (the changes) were based on the fact that I had found by careful investigation that we were not on a sound financial basis." At the meeting in Colorado Springs our President asked the membership present to act as a sounding board in a final draft of the Constitution and By-Laws that would be most to the liking of the membership in general. In line with the President's request the following motions were made and approved by the membership in attendance, and I quote the minutes of the meeting as printed in the Dutch Reporter. "A motion was presented by Bill Summers that the Secretary's duties be left as they are but the financial set-up be revised to leave the treasury in the black. This was seconded by Jess Williams. An amendment by Don Guthrie would set the Secretary's fees at 25% of all dues and 25% of all show sanctions as full payment for services. The amendment was accepted by Mr. Summers and Mr. Williams and the motion carried." I heartily recommend that the membership vote "YES" on this section as I feel it will solve all of our financial problems.

Now then, to the matter of separating the Dutch Reporter from the Secretary's office, I would like to bring to your attention the following facts. Again I would like to quote from the minutes of the general meeting at Colorado Springs. "Al Meier raised the question as to whether she had ever expressed a desire for a lessening of her work-load, and if she had not expressed such a desire, was there some other reason for the proposed change. An explanation of the background for the action at Ft. Worth followed in which it was stated that the Dutch Reporter was running approximately \$400.00 in the red. Al Meier expressed displeasure at it being expressed 'in the red'. He raised the question as to whether the Secretary would be willing to continue with her present work-load for less money and her reply was an unequivocal 'yes'."

In the President's message in the January issue of the Dutch Reporter, he has this to say and I quote, "Much study pro and con has been given to the revision: some of the parts of the present Constitution and By-Laws are out-dated rulings; some of our members have been hurt or embarassed. I hope that each and every member will read and give earnest unselfish thought to the revisions, and then vote to support the recommendation of the Committee that has worked hard in submitting this revision----"
The reason that I quote the preceeding is that I feel the President is trying to create the illusion that the whole committee is agreed that the revisions as presented are what they want -- this is not the case. In my conversations and correspondence with several members of the Committee I find they are adamant in opposition in particular to separating the Dutch Reporter from the secretary's office. I, for one feel this way. Jessie has brought the Dutch Reporter to us for almost six years in a satisfactory manner. We now have the best publication of its kind, so why should we change a system which has worked so well in the past?

Most of the changes you will vote on concerns the separating of the Dutch Reporter from the Secretary's office, so be sure you understand each section before you vote on it -- in short, THINK BEFORE YOU VOTE!

Started losing young and missing litters so now I have a pair of Californians. The first litter looks real goos, so I will try them for a while as some buyers around here claim the Dutch fryers are too small.

The achievements of this fine club this year was the largest Specialty Club, ene breed show ever held in America with 473 of the nation's finest Dutch. Breeders and exhibitors came from various parts of the nation to enjoy this fine show and meet friends and become acquainted with persons they had had correspondence with but had never met. The club was also well represented, both in exhibits and personal attendance at the May show of South Colorado Rabbit Breeders Ass'n, All Breed show in May in Pueblo.

Some of you will be interested to know that our dewdrop water system did not freeze, even during our three day 25 degree below zero temperature. We turned the pressure up some as it did freeze during the previous cold spell due to insufficient pressure. There is a plastic hose attached to the outside water faucet on the east side of the house. The faucet is about two feet high and also gets the cold air from the north. It is buried four feet under ground until the hose rises about three feet to enter the wooden east side of the rabbitry. Our rabbitry is all welded wire hutches built in a white frame double garage. The pipes inside are regulation lead pipes with the outlet the same height as the inlet. We ran a pipe from the outlet to the ground, outside, where it drains on the grass.
