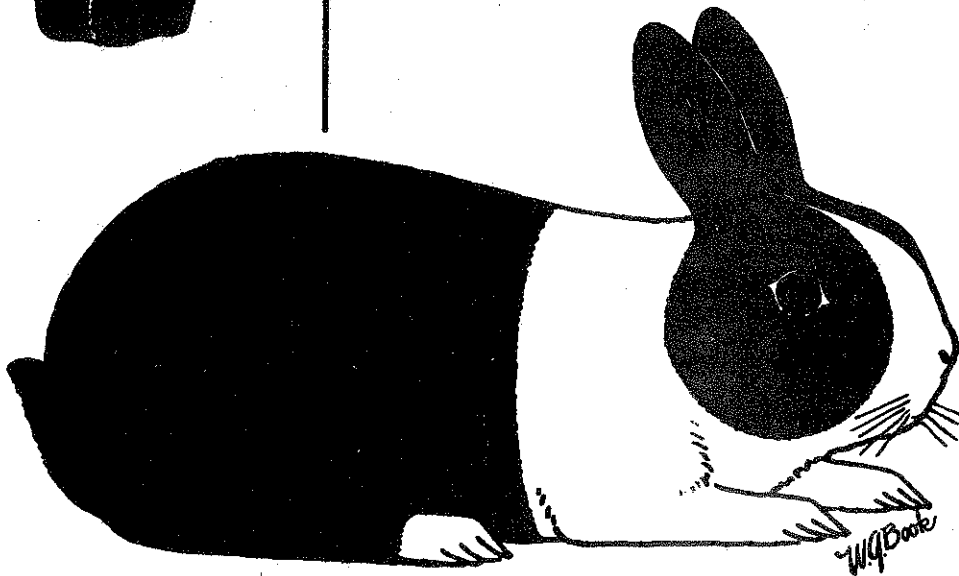

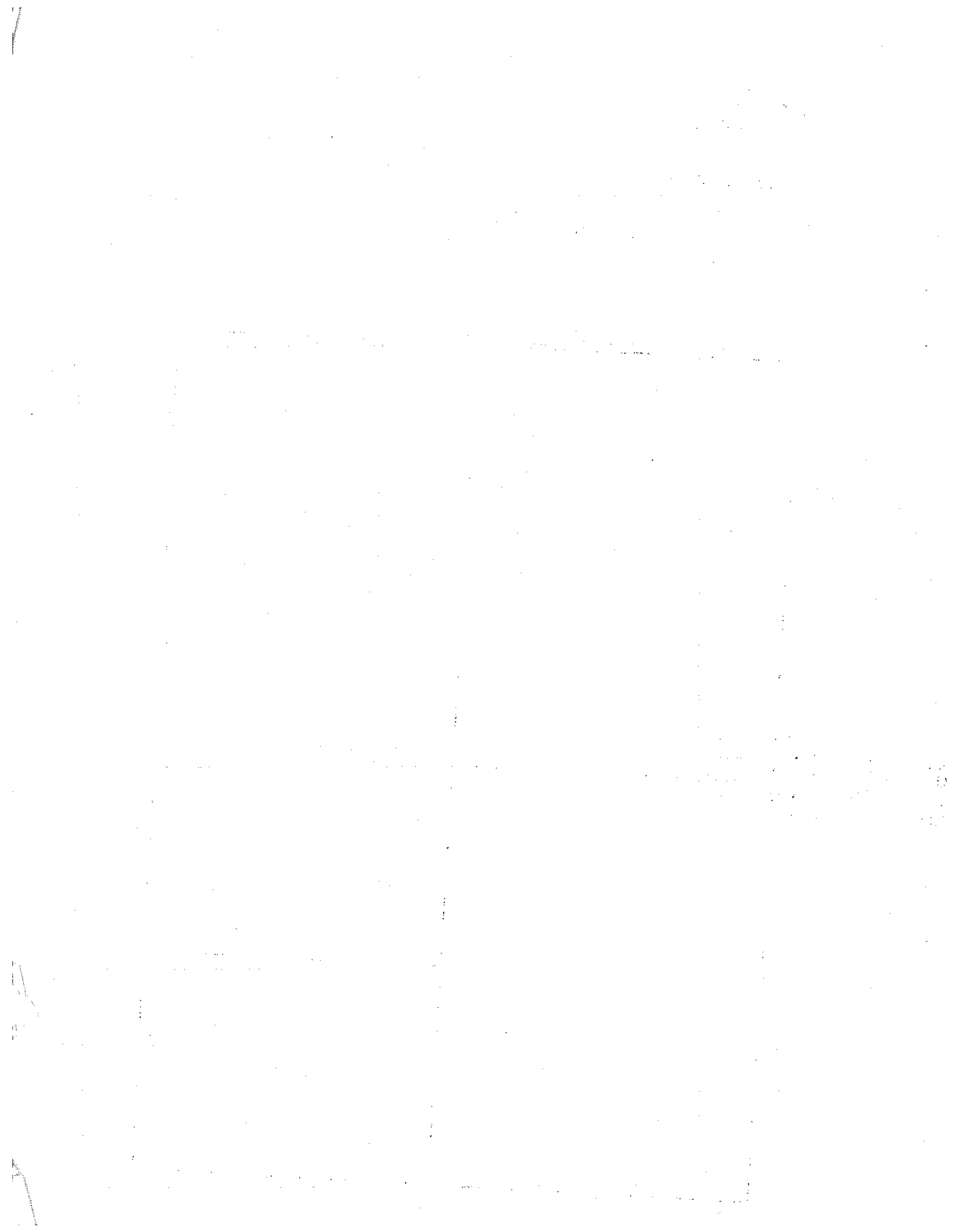

recent Springfield Convention. Mr. Chips, Dutcheng Homecoming Queen, Paradise's Best Dutch and other great champions of the past would be hard pressed by today's top winners.

Two areas that still leave much to be desired in too many Tortoise are type and color. Our standard says type should be cobby, compact in form and limb. Head should be rounded and full with very short neck. Too many Tortoise are long in body and have narrow pear shaped heads. A more critical selection for type in our breeders will pay off in more Best of Breed winners from this variety.

Color seems to be misunderstood by many. The standard says to be a bright clean orange blending into smokey blue shadings over the rump. Remember, bright clean orange. Heavily shaded Tortoise are usually smutty over the back. Heavily shaded haunches are all too often black instead of blue.

The true Tortoise color as described in our standard is a thing of real beauty and worthy of the efforts required to obtain it. Many breeders use light to heavily shaded animals in an effort to blend the correct color. I, personally have had best results by using breeders nearest the correct color.

Regardless of variety the Dutch isn't much without good type, color and fur to show their markings to best advantage. The slogan "You can't beat the Dutch" was made true by the combined efforts of many great breeders working to bring them to their present quality and beauty. It is up to you and I to maintain, improve and enhance it.

We are guilding on to this building now and are making our Club House and Rabbitry combined. We are building all new wire hutches and have created quite an interest amongst all the town people. Dear Mrs. Weinhardt:

Although I have raised rabbits on a limited scale in my back yard for 56 years (about 16 years with Dutch) I have not taken Small Stock Magazine continuously, which results in my not possessing all four "Special Dutch Issues" of Small Stock. I do not have t ose for 1937 or 1948. Do you know of any place where I could secure these two issues? Sometimes I can't help thinking that almost every ADRC member would be willing to buy these two rare copies and that if the club contracted to buy 200 or so copies (reprints) of these issues, perhaps they could be sold to members at a profit. Is this a wild idea?

I am wondering if you have noticed, Mrs. Weinhardt, that we have two distinct types of Dutch today, in the show room?

We have the nicely-marked Dutch with fair to poor type and the beautiful cobby little fellows with (sometimes) not as good markings.

Actually we are in the same spot as the N.Z. breeders were a few years ago. Now

they are getting a more uniform type.

As far as Dutch go, I'm a sucker for short heads and bodies. I don't always produce them, but I try. I'd rather go out of Dutch than raise the long-eared, long-bodied ones.

I have read and re-read our Standard and studied it and I don't know the answer. Markings total to 50 points if you include the neck's 5 points, governing the white of neck and the black at the base of the ears (the overlapping of the 2 colors, as I see it).

So, if a judge really "goes by the book" a poor typed, nicely-marked Dutch often wins.

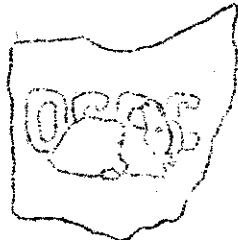
