

#### BREEDING CHOCOLATE DUTCH FOR COLOR

When I first purchased Chocolate Dutch in 1948 the oldtimers carefully explained that in order to maintain a good deep, dark, rich, chocolate color it was necessary to breed black into my chocolates every third generation. This advice was given with the best of intentions and in all good faith. It seemed to be generally believed at that time. My experience has shown that this is not true. To the contrary, repeated efforts have conclusively demonstrated that in the long run, there is no other color that you can mix with your chocolate to get better chocolate color.

The first Chocolate Dutch were obtained by crossing a Black Dutch buck on to several Standard Havana Does. The deep, rich, dark, Havana Color was obtained, and is being maintained today, by careful selection from straight Havana or chocolate breeding. Doesn't it seem reasonable that we can obtain the deep, rich, dark chocolate color we are looking for in our Dutch be careful selection and straight chocolate to chocolate breeding?

Occasionaly there is a very real need to bring in some other color in our chocolates to make inprovements in type, fur or production. This need, added to the belief that addition of Black to our Chocolates was necessary to improve the color has led to a situation where there are very few pure chocolate Dutch. The crossing of a pure Black to pure Chocolate would create no real problem. The offspring would be all Black and when bred together would produce both Black and Chocolate and these recessive chocolates would be pure. However Black is the most dominant color and there are even fewer pure blacks than pure chocolates.

When you start out to purify your strain of Chocolate Dutch you must expect that you will continue to get other colors for at least the first three generations of chocolate to chocolate breeding. You will get Chocolate Blue or Lilac. You may get any of the following: Chocolate Tortoise or Gold: Chocolate Gray or Cinnamon; Blue-Gray or Blue Fawn; Chocolate Blue-Gray or Lilac Fawn; and very rerely a beautiful Chocolate Tortoise Gray which I call a Golden Fawn. These non-standard colors will appear at the most inopportuen times. They will have their proportionate share of good fur, type, markings, etc., and will, in fact have all the necessary qaulification of a show winner except the required color. This tends to be discouraging, but you

will find that you will be compensated in other ways. You will find that when you have eliminated all these colors you will have overcome your problems with stray white hairs, off-colored eyes, spots in the eyes and with your careful selection you will have also eliminated most of your crooked legs, cow-hocks and buck teeth.

Shortly after I started raising Chocolate Dutch I read an article in the Dutch Reporter which stated that the quickest way to improve your chocolate color was to breed only animals which have deep, dark, rich eye color. This article went on to say that as between animals with equal eye color that the next most important item was the color of the undercoat as the color of the undercoat was more important than the surface color in selecting breeding specimens most likely to improve the color of your Cgocolate Dutch. I immediately began testing this in my own breeding program and I have found it to be true under all circumstances and with all the various strains of Chocolate Dutch that I have had the opportunity to work with during the past 15 years.

In conclusion three rules for breeding Chocolate Dutch for color. First, purify the strain so that all colors will be eliminated except Chocolate. Second, use only those individuals that show the best possible eye color. Third, when you have a choice between animals with equal eye color, give preference to the one with the best color of undercoat. These three rules will give you good color. Hard work, careful culling and a little luck will put this color on a Dutch rabbit that has the necessary type, markings and fur to make a winner at the shows.

"Another t ing we would like to see impressed on the committees of the shows is if they could try and get Grand Championship legs to the winners of the show. We are still waiting for two shows to send ours we won on a senior black doe. These two are to complete her winnings to make her a Grand Champion and are holding us up from sending in for our Grand Champion Certificate." I believe this point is well taken as I know of at least one show secretary who would never send a single certificate unless the exhibitor wrote and asked for it. It doesn't seem to me that it takes that long that it couldn't easily be done right along with the other reports.

We had a very fine rabbit school here in Michigan the first of the month. It was held under the sponsorship of the Poultry Department at Mich. State Uniw. Wayne Willmann was one of the fine list of speakers on the program and we all wished that the day had been longer as there was no time allowed for a discussion period as we have had in years past. Oh, well, if there wasn't someplace these things could be improved on there wouldn't be much incentive to formulate the next year's plans.
