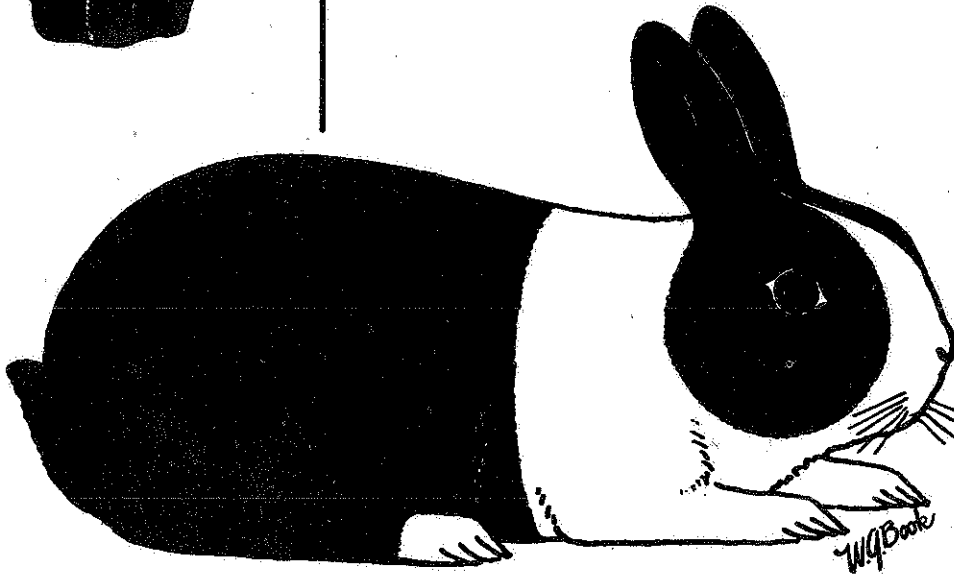

DUTCH JUNIORS

I'm writing this as I'm mixed up. I'm just a wee breeder with a few holes. I don't show much and I don't win much and I don't win much. When I do it can be accredited to the good people that have helped me.

You said in the Reporter that it was brought up as to what a Dutch junior is -- the way I read my Guide Book, this is an animal under six months old. A senior is over six months old. I cannot see where a weight limit would help as the main trouble is that we seem to have seniors that will not make 3½ lbs. That way our honest juniors are competing against senior fur, harder flesh and general condition.

Most of my Dutch are of the large size as meat pays a lot of my feed bill. As a result my juniors are too large to show. They usually taper off at about five pounds. As a result I usually wait till they are close to a year old or are very young when I show. The only thing the cheaters can't really lick is the toenails. They seem to be about equal to a horses teeth.

Of course there may be another way to look at it. For years some of the other breeds have gone by weight as Jur., 6/8, Sr. These breeders are used to squeezing a month or two. Now that the Dutch is in the top for competition we are going to have a few breeders that feel their rabbit is small so why not show as a junior. They real don't think anything is wrong with this. I know that you have been beaten with a senior shown as a junior because I had one of mine nosed out at the same show. The winner had toenails clipped at least once. I can't see where this can bring the fancy up at all, can you?
