YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

SHOWING DUTCH by John T. Brown of Brown's Rabbitry

Just recovering from an attack of the flu and nothing better to do I decided to write a few lines for the Dutch Reporter.

As we have been showing Dutch for only 1 and $\frac{1}{2}$ years I study the Guide Book often and at a show I pay close attention to the judge, when the Dutch are being judged, as to the remarks he or she makes about other breeders Dutch as well as our own. That is our way to learn. The main thing that I have found out and so many people gripe about when the judge sets his or her rabbit off the table for being cow-hocked or underweight There is nothing in my book that looks worse than a rabbit hopping down the table and his feet stick straight out. Looks as if they were braces to keep the rabbit from tipping over. I have been unfortunate enough to have people sell bucks that were cow-hocked and believe me they sure pass that on to their off spring. According to genetic it sure is inherited, not only Dutch, but other breeds as well.

We have attended several shows this past year and I have heard several known breeders "gripe" because their senior bucks were set off the show table because they were underweight, That is one of the rules set up by the Dutch Club, Seniors, weight, $3\frac{1}{2}$ to $5\frac{1}{2}$ lbs.

I think a senior should be weighed (if there is doubt) that is what scales are for. If breeders don't want their Sr. bucks set off the table for being underweight, the best thing to do is leave them home. It is hard for someone starting new to figure all this out. If they are not going to go by the book and allow underweight animals then there isn't any use having weight standards or any other standards for that matter.

FROM BILL SUMMERS.....

A prominent rabbit breeder, judge and good friend once said, "Bill, in your opinion what is the one most important factor in raising Dutch Rabbits"? Without hesitation my reply was to obtain the best stock available for soundation stock. It is a fallacy of most rabbit breeders who think they can take stock from any strain and by selection arrive at a given goal. This is simply not so! This statement is not intended to convey the impression that you can't improve your stock by selection, if this were so we could all quit trying. Every characteristic in the make-up of a Dutch Rabbit such as color, shape, fur, etc. are genetic factors. If the genetic factors that add up to the ideal Dutch are not present in the gene pool of your stock then you can't create them by selection! This statement will probably come as quite a shock to those who believe they can breed for a given goal simply by selection. I know of one strain of Blue Dutch of a washed out Blue color. Over the years I have never seen a dark blue color from this strain. In my opinion the genetic factor producing dark blue color is not present in the pool. If this assumption is correct then selection will never produce dark color. The only way would be to introduce this genetic factor from an animal that possessed the factor in its genetic make-up.

stock

Obtaining good foundation/doesn't guarantee success unfortunately. In any of the more popular breeds of rabbits you can count the really top breeders on one hand. Have you ever wondered what sets these men apart from others? It's true they have superior stock, but many people buy stock from them and never measure up, so it can't be the stock. I would assume that many would attribute success to some superior and secret breeding system too good to share with others, I would challenge that thinking to be completely false. I would credit these fortunate few to two things: First they head in the same direction long enough to realize the fruits of their labor. How many breeders introduce new blood or obtain new foundation stock regularly without success, many, I can assure you. Every time you introduce new blood or obtain a different strain, it will take you a year or two to find out what is in the gene pool to select from. Second, all top breeders work harder to produce results. There is a direct relationship between the amount of time you are willing to contribute and the results accomplished. There are many other variables to consider in livestock husbandry, these few are indispensible. There is no short cut to success.

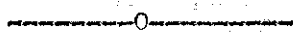
