Friends: As your Secretary, I note an increasing amount of competition among our Dutch Raisers from all sections of these United States. This is a healthy sign and I want it understood that I personally favor no particular section of the country. Here in Minnesota we are in the Upper Midwest and on the fringe of the heavy show areas. Our shows are growing, but I am sure that due to the severe weather and driving conditions in the winter, we will really have to work in the summers to catch up with the more active showing areas. We do have fun and it isn't a matter of life and death. We are impatiently waiting for any sign of spring. As yet, it hasn't appeared.

Mail is particularly heavy about 25 pieces a day and I am finding myself thinking of Jimmy's (Blyth, that is) statement, quote, "I don't need pen pals." When I heard that I thought to myself, "gee whiz," but now I know.

I am aware that there are those that wonder why Point Count doesn't appear in every issue of the D.R. Well folks, just haven't been able to get it in. These monthly D.R.'s overlap and it seems as if there is always one laying on the table for completion. Also remember, if you attend a show on Sunday, those points aren't going to appear the next day. The show secretary has to send in the report, I have to figure points, check out the non members etc. type a full show report, then comes the posting and checking out the show report on the coming show cards. At the present moment points are posted up to November, not counting the stragglers. We do have stragglers, you know..... I am constantly on the alert for ways to streamline this operation and little by little it is falling into place.

There is an area of confusion in the YOUTH ACTIVITY. At the present time there is no provision made for a Youth Division in the American Dutch Rabbit Club. As I understand it, the only line of communication with the Dutch Club is your membership and only A.D.R.C. sanctioned shows will qualify for Dutch Club ribbons etc.... I know that we have a youth membership that has joined at the regular membership fee and they are showing in Open Shows and doing well in some areas. This will qualify these young folks for their ribbons which will arrive in due course.

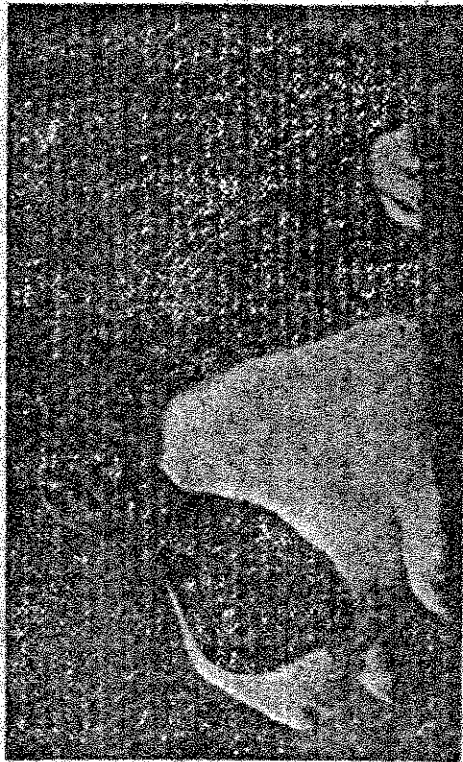

## CHAPTER VII THE DUTCH



ONE of the most popular varieties of fancy rabbit is the Dutch; in fact, it can be considered the most popular, there being hardly a town or village throughout the country in which a "Dutchman" of some sort or other cannot be found. It is quite a rare occasion to find a show without a class for Dutch.

The enormous popularity it enjoys does not necessarily follow that winners are easily bred; first-rate specimens are certainly not bred in every litter, but one great advantage is that those that are mismarked may be destroyed immediately after birth, thereby eliminating the necessity of keeping them on for a number of months before it can be seen what they really will be like. Another feature, too, is that they can be exhibited very early in life; in fact, some exhibitors put them in the show pen at about six weeks old, though this is a very early age.

In colours we have blacks, blues, tortoiseshells, greys, chocolates and yellows. These are the recognised varieties, though occasionally blue-greys and blue-fawns appear, but they are not recognised and are usually the result of mating indiscriminately and are certainly not colours which should be used in the breeding pen.

To get a correct idea of the points and markings the ideal should be studied in connection with the standard of points allotted for the

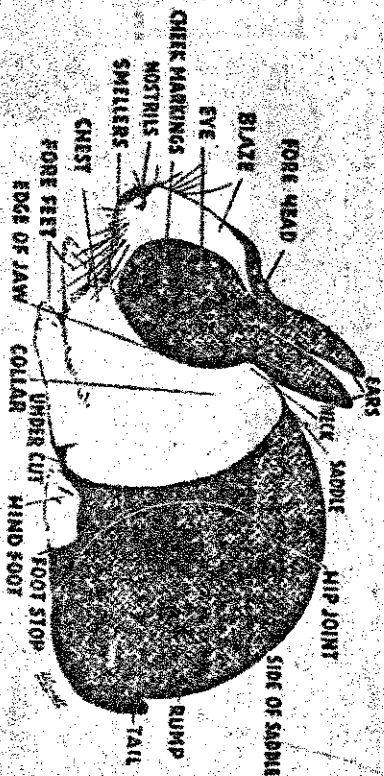
Before leaving this point I would like to mention the neck, by which is meant that portion immediately behind the ears. It is here that we often get what is referred to as a "full neck" or "run in the neck." This fault often coincides with faulty cheeks which run over the jaw bone and which, I might add, are often hidden on the under-side of the jaw. Another point, too, is that very often a rabbit which has a blaze which does not continue completely through between the ears is full in neck. This does not apply in every case, but it is so in many cases. Ten points are allowed for this clean neck, and to-day there are not nearly so many full-neck specimens in the show pen as there were a few years back.

Before leaving the head we have another very important point—the ears, which should be well covered and not too long and well carried in an erect position close together. If the ears are too long they detract from the otherwise smart appearance in addition to which they lose that alertness which is one of the principal features of a good Dutch. Ten points are allotted to these.

The only remaining features of the head which we have not dealt with are the eyes, and in these can be a multitude of faults, but, thanks to very drastic penalties, most of these faults have been greatly reduced. The standard allows five points for eyes, but it also penalises eye faults very severely, as will be seen by the following. Small specks on eyes, discoloured or wall eyes, to be disqualified. During recent years the penalty for these two faults has been drastically carried out, so much so that an animal exhibited with a specked eye, or a discoloured or a wall eye, is immediately passed, with the result that exhibits with these faults are extremely rare. This by the way, proves what can be done by severely penalising bad faults. The colour of the iris should match that of the body colour of the rabbit and have no specks or discoloration whatever.

It will now be seen that the head of the Dutch carries 40 out of the 100 points.

What is termed the collar is the white band between the back of the ears, from the neck to the saddle. The saddle commences where the white ends and the colour begins and is situated just behind the shoulders. This saddle should continue on a perfectly straight line across the back, down the sides and underneath, where it eventually becomes known as the undercut. The chief faults to be found in saddles are uneven lines in some cases and "V" saddles, i.e., where the centre of the saddle runs forward to a point. Some saddles do not run directly across the body but have a tendency to run obliquely. This fault is often termed skew saddle. An irregular line is often to be found on the flanks of the animal, but the greater fault is to be found in the undercut, in which many otherwise good animals fail, some being what is termed "stepped," whilst others "drag," i.e., the colour runs up towards the armpits or front legs. Another undercut fault is that of a "V" patch of white which runs



various features. Attention should be given, too, to the penalty points.

One of the chief features we meet as we review our specimen animal is the head, and this we will deal with first. Many of the faults here can be readily seen. Faults may be as numerous in other places but be hidden from the casual view. The cheeks play a very important part in the appearance of a Dutch as the blaze is formed by these. The blaze is the white wedge-shaped portion of the face that comes through between the ears and gradually widens as it passes down the face.

If the cheek marking is not carried high enough over the eye this gives us too much white and the blaze becomes much too wide, which detracts from the neatness and balance of the face. Continuing down the face, the cheek markings should just clear the whisker beds with a nicely rounded sweep along the edge and at the base of the ears. The cheek markings always should be curved with no sign of a straight line. The whisker beds should be clear also, as should the underside of the jaw, whilst on the other hand the cheek markings should be sufficiently low to ensure that no white is seen on the side of the jaw bone.

Many cheeks to-day are too small, giving what is termed high cheeks, these being much more prevalent than the low ones which run into the whisker beds and are not common to-day. On the other hand, we have a large number of animals with apparently good cheeks which, if carefully examined, are found to run well under the jaw, this being termed a drag. This is one of the chief failings in the cheek markings. Another fault which seemed more prevalent ten years ago than it is to-day was a dip or "apron strings" on the bottom edge of the cheeks. Squariness of the cheeks at the lower edge is another failing, but one that is not so prominent as at one period. Many faults in Dutch seem to run in areas, or strains, which outstanding faults. Ragged cheeks are not nearly so prevalent as they were. The total points allotted for blaze and cheeks is 15.

back into the other colour. The points allotted for saddle and undercut are 20.

These undercuts are very rarely sound, and many of our Dutch to-day are cut under in some degree or another, some only slightly and others to a greater extent.

Next we come to the stops or markings on the hind feet, which are one of the most important markings, and for which the standard allows 15 points. Considering the size of these stops or markings it seems a large number for the small area controlled. On the other hand, however, when it is realised how difficult it is to get these stops correct, it will certainly be appreciated that none too many points are allotted.

In length the standard allows for the stops a latitude of from one inch to one-and-a-half inches, but quite a good guide is a one shilling piece, which approximately covers a stop of the correct length and size.

The faults in stops are many. The chief is the irregularity of the line of demarcation. It should continue in a straight line completely round the foot. Many are ragged and irregular, particularly on the outside edge where the white runs back into the other colour in the shape again of the letter V. Many are ragged on the underside of the foot, which, by the way, is not so conspicuous, but is nevertheless a fault. In cases the line will run diagonally across the top of the foot, this being termed a "cross stop." Some specimens will have one good stop and one cross stop, or one good and one ragged one, but the greatest tendency to-day is for both stops to be good or both to fail in some point.

Another fault is in the length of the stops. Very seldom are stops too short; usually they are the reverse; in other words, they go too far back towards the hock. In this case one sometimes finds that they are not balanced in length, one being longer than the other, and in many cases where long stops are to be found they are also ragged on the edges.

From the above it will be seen quite easily that correct stops are not at all easy to obtain and that the allotment of 15 points for these is not too many by any means.

Ten points are given for colour, a feature to which too little attention is often given. The theory which seems to appertain is that providing a Dutch is well marked, nothing else matters, and no matter what the colour is, so long as it is well marked it is all right. First we will take blacks, which when in good colour and coat are a picture to behold, especially if our black is sound in colour and well or reasonably well marked. I would venture to say that though many thousands are exhibited to-day the percentage of really sound coloured blacks is very small. Many may appear to be black, but on a closer scrutiny they will be found to be of a dingy rusty colour. This, of course, will often be the case with adult rabbits when the coat is dead and on the verge of moult, but it can be found in many

I felt that the article had a certain amount of historical value and background material. Many times one has to understand what has gone before in order to understand what we have to-day. You will note that this was a 1946 edition. This was about the time when Ancel Beaver came along with a shorter, smaller Dutch. We proceeded on and the smaller Dutch were "cute" first thing we knew advertising read "toy Dutch"

Wouldn't it be a wonderful thing if we could take the best from history and start from there. Why do we need to go from one extreme to another. Our Standard now calls for an ideal weight of  $4\frac{1}{2}$ # with  $3\frac{1}{2}$  to  $5\frac{1}{2}$  spread.

Another interesting point is what is happening to our Blacks? Why all of these white hairs and poor undercolor. General ARBA disqualifications call for disqualification for Foreign colored spots in solid or self varieties or in marked varieties etc. when specifically noted in breed standard. Then we go to the Dutch Standard, current and it lists "faults white hairs, mealiness, frostiness etc. So when does white hairs constitute a spot? almost as bad as white toe nails. I can remember some excellent Blacks for color, but they are getting few and far between now. Much emphasis has been placed on Blues (color) and I have seen some good blue color. Neither too light or too dark. Tom S. can tell us about this.....What do you think of our Blacks now, Tom????

whilst there are also 20 penalty points if the rabbit is over-weight. Many adult Dutch are far too large. Over-weight alone does not necessarily mean that a rabbit fails in type. Often a rabbit not over standard weight has a long, shapeless body and bad carriage of ears, heavy limbs, and so on. Shortness, neatness and cobiness are the features of a "typical" Dutch. Neither long limbs nor long bodies should be encouraged.

The coat should be short and tight, with natural sleekness and brightness, which is a sure sign of health. Condition in Dutch is keen. "condition" often becomes the deciding factor.

To summarise the position, blacks are probably the greatest offenders in regard to type, a number of them being far too big; perhaps the next failing in sequence of seriousness in blacks is that of bad colour, i.e., the black very often is very dingy and brown. In blues, which, by the way, are not so numerous as blacks, we often find that the "light tipped" colour makes them appear somewhat neatly instead of a nice medium blue. Tortoiseshells perhaps are not quite so nice in type and appearance as the blacks, often being longer in the barrel of the body. The greatest fault in the steel greys is that they are often too dark upon the spine and ears, whilst that of light greys is that the stops are too long, and these and the undercut too undefined.

Generally speaking, Dutch have made great progress in regard to type and markings, especially the former, but we still have to-day some of the serious faults that were prevalent thirty years ago, particularly in regard to colour. Since the last war chocolates have made great strides, but yellows have made very little improvement at all. There should be a good opportunity in this colour for those who are of an ambitious turn of mind.

In conclusion, I should mention a serious fault that was at one time very prevalent, but which (thanks again to drastic penalisation) has been very much reduced—"flesh markings." These are white spots mixed among the main or body colour. Often these were found on the belly and on the ears, but to-day they are rarely seen. This proves how serious faults can be eradicated by adhering strictly to these penalties, and one wonders if some of the faults that are now still prominent, which have been so for the past thirty years, could not be obliterated by the same means. In any case, an improvement could be made even if the faults were not entirely mended.

youngsters. This fault will undoubtedly have been brought about by indiscriminate breeding, i.e., the crossing of various colours indiscriminately. One often meets young blacks carrying a decided trace of steel grey about them, giving definitely their line of ancestry. We may be told that the black on the under-side of the animal becomes rusty through contact with the hutch floor, but this does not excuse rusty backs and cheeks! Also in blacks to-day we find too many white hairs intermingled with the black, particularly on the ears, a fault that needs attention.

Blues do not usually show the same tendency to rustiness, but are apt to show lightness at the tips of the fur, giving the animal a somewhat mottled appearance. Dark blues are also to be found in addition to these, but that which should be aimed for as the ideal should be the medium blue. One of the colour faults with blues to-day, especially in adults, is that of light ear-tips. This tendency runs round the edge of the ears. Many breeders very successfully breed blacks and blues together.

In greys we have the two colours, steels and light or brown-greys. The former are by far the more popular, and a well-bred steel-grey will last for several years. The ground colour in steels should be of a dark grey with steel ticking, but to-day we have far too many with the dark ground colour but lacking in the steel ticking, many failing in this respect on the saddle and ears, which deprives the coat of that brightness and sparkle. Quite a number of steels, too, carry far too much of a brownish cast, which should be absent in this colour. To such an extent is this brownish tinge shown in some specimens that it is difficult to determine whether they are browns or steels. The light or brown-greys are quite a different proposition; they lack the steel mixture in the coat and are of the colour their name implies. The great failing in this colour is the cut, which is often hardly discernible, whilst there is a large percentage of long stops among them. Quite a number of these light greys are very light in colour on the cheeks.

The tortoiseshell is quite a pleasing colour and one that needs to be "bred for." Continuous breeding on haphazard lines soon leaves the breeder with a stud of animals that lack shadings altogether.

The ground work of the tortoiseshell should be a fawn, with the haunches, cheeks and ears shaded to a bluish black, giving the rabbit a very smart appearance. No evidence of a smudgy character should be allowed to creep in. One of the faults at present in this colour is that the markings are smudgy and not bright enough. In chocolates the colour is not too bad, especially when one takes into consideration that this is quite new in comparison with the other colours, though it is now some years since it was first established. Yellows are a colour which do not seem to become as popular as they should. The markings, generally speaking, are a long way behind those on the four leading colours.

In the standard, shape, size and condition are allotted 15 points.

## ANIMAL WELFARE ACT of 1970

The regulations which implement the Animal Welfare Act of 1970 were published by the Department of Agriculture on December 24, 1971. These regulations, as they apply to breeders and dealers of rabbits and cavyes, require the licensing of those persons who for compensation or profit deliver for transportation, or transport, or buy or sell rabbits or cavyes, whether dead or alive, for research or teaching purposes. These regulations do not apply to those breeders or dealers who are involved in the production of rabbits for meat; nor do they apply to State and County Fairs, to rabbit and cavy shows or to the persons who exhibit at rabbit shows and fairs.

Breeders who consign rabbits and cavyes to commission merchants or to auction sales are not required to be licensed. However, those breeders who sell to a dealer in research animals must procure a license. There is no distinction between intrastate or interstate movement of laboratory animals; accordingly, breeders and dealers who do business entirely within a single state must still be licensed.

The A.R.B.A. Committee in Washington appeared at hearings in April 1971 at which the proposed regulations were discussed. Every attempt was made to make the proposed regulations as simple as possible. Arguments were presented to reduce the number of persons who would require licenses, to simply record keeping and to make regulations as reasonable as possible.

After the proposed regulations were published in October 1971, our A.R.B.A. Committee in Washington took exception to some portions and was able to convince the Department of Agriculture to reduce the cost of license fees and to greatly reduce the record keeping required when rabbits and cavyes are being transported.

I have mailed a copy of these Rules and Regulations to the editor of "Rabbit World" and National Rabbitman Magazine. Since they are rather lengthy, I have lined through the parts that do not necessarily pertain to rabbits and cavyes in order that they might be willing to print the balance of them in an early issue of their magazine. In this way, breeders who supply even a few rabbits for use in research can read them and apply for their license.

Copies of the Regulations and information concerning them may be obtained by writing to the Deputy Administrator, Veterinary Services, Animal and Plant Health Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture, Hyattsville, Maryland 20782.

Mr. Hord is also including in this Bulletin a release which our committee recently received from the U.S. Department of Agriculture on this Law and the Regulations covering it.

From the editor....

I have a copy of the Rules and regulations of this act before me as I type this and feel that calling your attention to several points may help. Page 24919 section "s" defines Dealer; means any person who for profit, compensation delivers for transportation or transports, except as a common carrier, buys or sells any animals whether alive or dead, affecting commerce, for research or teaching purposes, or for exhibition purposes or for use as pets, but such term excludes any retail pet store except such store which sells any animals to a research facility, an exhibitor, or dealer. Exhibition refers to circus animal acts etc.

To repeat, the upshot of this is that all breeders supplying rabbits for laboratory must apply for their licenses as soon as possible. All breeders raising rabbits for show and meat use are still excluded from licensing and thus only those supplying rabbits for laboratory use must be licensed. License fee is based on gross sales with a minimum of \$5.00 for those with sales to \$500.00

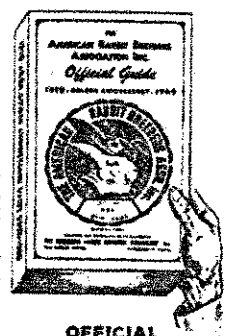
