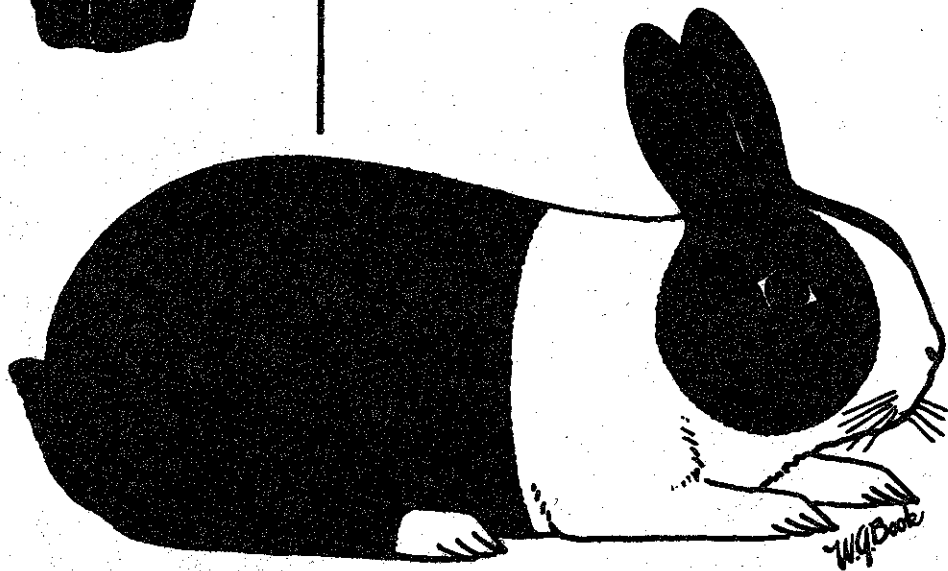

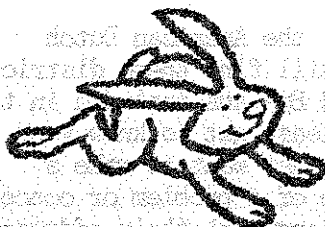
The new up-dated membership list will appear in the March/April issue of the Dutch Reporter. Please be certain that your membership is current so that you are not excluded from this list. If we do not have you listed as a judge, please drop this office a postcard and notify us so that we may include this in our files. You may also want to make note of the list of expired and expiring memberships. You receive one copy of the Dutch Reporter after your membership has expired. If you expired in November or December of '87, you will only receive the January/February '88 issue of the D.R. unless you renew. Membership expiration date can be found on your membership card and on each Dutch Reporter label. A list of expired or expiring memberships is listed in each issue of the D.R. If you want your Dutch Reporter mailed to you via FIRST CLASS, please submit a \$5.00 mailing fee to this office.

There is one other item that I would like to touch on before I close. As of January 1, 1989, the American Rabbit Breeders Association will no longer accept combination memberships from the specialty clubs. You must submit your specialty club dues to this office and send a separate check to the ARBA office to cover their dues. I personally feel that this is an excellent idea! You only save a quarter by paying for the two together, and it does make additional bookwork for both the ARBA and the specialty club. We have to first process your ADRC membership. Since your check is made out payable to the ADRC for the combination fee (\$21.75; \$16.75 or \$9.75), we must log your fees paid and then make out an ADRC check payable in the amount of your ARBA dues and then forward it to their

office. This means that we must then pay postage costs for forwarding and your ARBA membership is not processed as quickly as it would have been if you had sent it in to their office yourself. Please keep this in mind.

May you enjoy a beautiful '88 and may the Best of Breed be yours! See you in Bloomington!

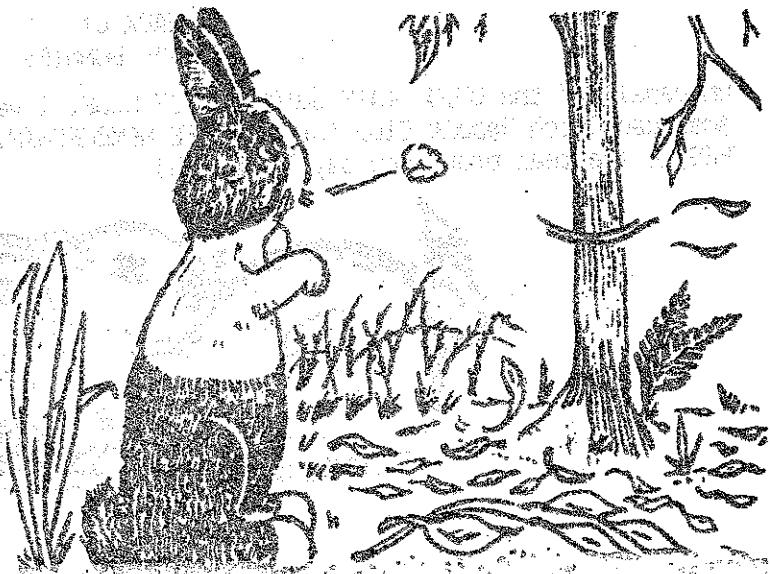

PURCHASING RABBITS

This is aimed primarily at the beginner and a controversial subject. A lot of articles have been written concerning the starting of your own herd. Stock should be acquired from a GOOD ESTABLISHED herd or line, going on from there. But how do you find these? I've been through most of this and I think most breeders have.

My first advice is to go to local shows and talk with the local breeders. Decide as to what variety or varieties you want to raise. Some parts of the country, the Dutch breeders are scarce so it's harder to go locally. Try to find some within driving distance, if possible. Of course, if they don't have any for sale -- maybe they can recommend someone. Then comes the touchy situation -- buying "SIGHT UNSEEN"! Here I think I blame 'partially' the beginner. Write or call some breeders who raise the variety or varieties you're interested in, saying just what you want. Ask if they can recommend someone where you could get what you're looking for. Check with MORE than one breeder. 'MOST' breeders are honest and will do their best to help, -- but as with most anything, -- there are a 'FEW BAD APPLES'! After you have found the breeder you want to deal with (and not necessarily one who has won lots of Best of Breeds, although that helps), but one with a lot of consistency in their herd, I know that one of the first questions will be the pedigree. Remember, the pedigree is no better than the person you're dealing with. Ask for good breeding stock, not necessarily animals that will go on the show table. You will probably get juniors after they arrive. Take extra good care of them. Get acquainted with them. They have been through a big shock, 'flying', 'new surroundings', etc. Let them grow up - see what they mature into - breed them, see what they produce. Sometimes the ones that produce the best show prospects are not the ones that are show animals themselves. Granted, you will find some faults, -- they all have some. You can't always blame the breeder you bought them from. They can't guarantee what they will grow up like and what they will produce. I've had juniors in my herd that I planned on keeping for breeders because of their heredity. But when they grew up, -- they just "didn't make it". Another thing, whether you spend \$10.00 or \$200.00 does not guarantee quality.

Please don't write, "I want a trio, 1 buck and 2 does; very good type - good head - real good markings". If I had these, it would cost an arm and a leg to get them away from me!! I'm still trying to get them!

Remember, what one person believes to be some good stock and fits with their breeding program, may not be your idea of what you had in mind. Most everyone looks at them a little different. As they say, you can get 10 Dutch breeders together and you'll probably get 8 different versions. Unless, of course, it's a 'HOT ONE'!

If you've already bought some and are not satisfied, -- maybe there was a lack of communication or maybe your expectations were too high. What works for them may not work for you. If you still feel you've been (taken), write or call the breeder you got them from and explain the situation. There may have been a misunderstanding. Don't give up! Chalk it up to experience. Maybe some of my suggestions will help.

If you have any questions, - write me, -- I have none for sale.

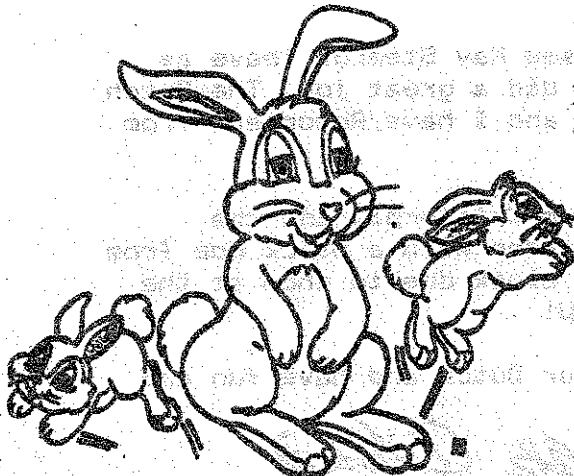

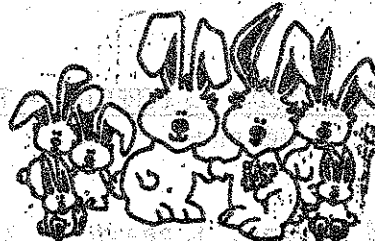

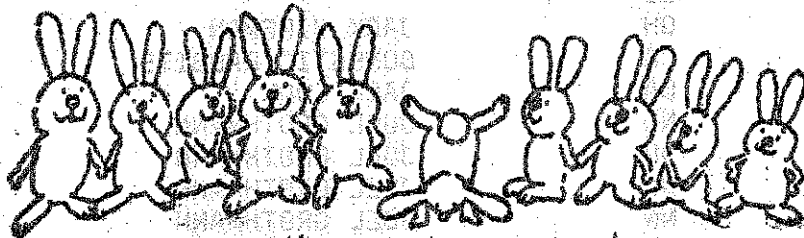

Keep your bunny side up!

DUTCH IN MY LIFE

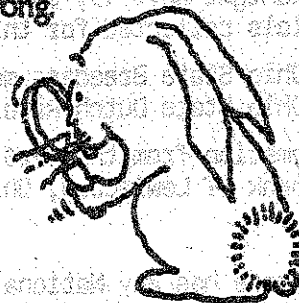
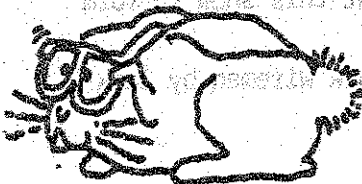
While visiting Great Britain this past October your reporter and his wife had the pleasure and privilege of visiting the premier Dutch breeder in the country. George Robson has been raising Dutch for 38 years, and his strain has won every award that the British Rabbit Council and the United Kingdom Dutch Rabbit Club can offer. We spent the better part of a morning with George and his wife at their home in a small village in Yorkshire. A friendly, courteous couple in their early seventies, they treated us to buttered scones and tea before taking us to his rabbitry in the back yard.

George has 18 wooden hutches in a small shed, where he has bred grand champions for decades and has never introduced outside blood into his stud. "I've never found any animals I have liked better than mine," he explained. He has freely sold stock to other breeders, however, saying that he doesn't mind getting beaten by his own strain. His animals are distinguished by their uniformity in balance, type, fur, color, and markings, as well as by their vigor. The buck's heads are masculine, while the does have oval, finely drawn heads. He has no problems with buck teeth. The length of ears are such that they slightly extend above a hand clenched around them at the base. (George, a respected judge as well, is very much against the rounded heads and short ears associated with "dwarf" Dutch.)

To maintain good color George believes in breeding like colors except perhaps now and then at about the fourth generation. The depth of color should go as close to the skin as possible, with fur short and dense to give crisp markings. George can tell the age of a young rabbit by the progress of the moult on the rabbit's head, starting at the nose and ending at the top of the blaze by age four months. Yet even with the consistent type he has developed over almost four decades, there still is from time to time inexplicable inconsistency in fur characteristics.

His herd had excellent markings. He thinks of the Dutch as a dark rabbit with white markings, and the white to dark ratio should be in thirds. For example, the saddle should be in the forward third of the animal, and the stops should be in the forward third of the rear foot. He does not feel that cheeks should be "well rounded" as the whisker bed is vertical and the cheek color shape is to conform to its border. His stud has an almost equal number of bucks and does, allowing him to "mix and match" to get the best combinations. Each doe produces perhaps three litters a year, preferably in the winter and early spring, and he will not breed a moulting animal as the results are never as good.

He considers them to be good mothers and babies are easily fostered. He first breeds a young animal at 4 1/2 months. Weights are kept from 4 1/2 to 5 pounds, and he does not show does for too long a period before using them as full time breeders. Some of his stock is long lived: one buck is 6 years old and still going strong.



George makes no special preparations when it is show time. Quality is bred into an animal, he believes, and it should always be ready to exhibit. He does, however, clip the toenails as this adds a neater appearance and also keeps a doe from injuring her young. As with most British breeders, he feeds a commercial mixture of grain, pellets, and organic supplements. I mentioned in the last issue that the British pose their animals much differently than we do in America. As a judge, George has a good memory of every rabbit that came before him, can recognize an "altered" animal, and afterwards he is always willing to discuss his assessments with the exhibitors. He is very critical of judges who leave the shows as soon as they have ended and do not stay around to talk with the breeders.

So it was a most enjoyable and informative visit, and we shall always consider it one of our happiest memories. And we are pleased to be able to share our experience with our fellow breeders in the hope that perhaps we can always learn something new from colleagues in other countries.

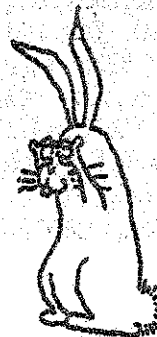

Please don't get me wrong, I'm not the rabbit raiser here, but I hear him speak his opinions many, many times and I do know a good Dutch from a bad one. I will pop my buttons now! When he is getting ready for a big show, he always comes in (the Dear one) and asks me to come out to the barn and look at his herd and help make the choices. We have lots of fun doing this! We so often speak of all the most wonderful friends we have met in this hobby, for that is what it is to Dale. 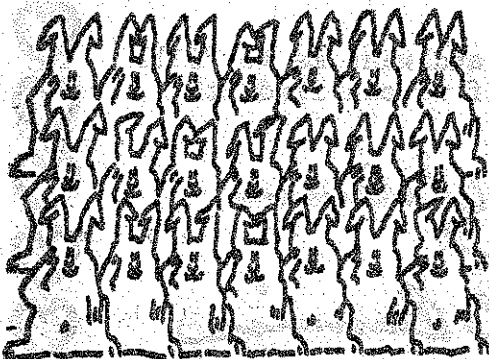

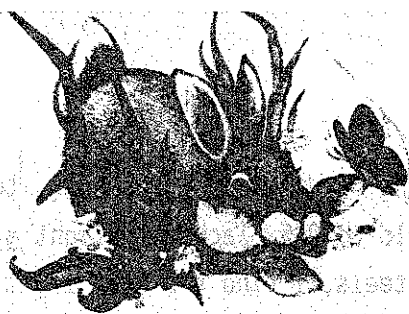

Raising steel Dutch is more challenging by far, than the self varieties. Since purchasing good steels or grays is more difficult than blacks, blues, chocolates or tort's, I started our steel herd with one Jr. buck that I purchased from the Seller's Class in Orlando, Florida. I brought him home and when I couldn't locate steel does of like quality in our area, I bred him to blacks and blues. With the first few breedings, we had several nice quality jr. bucks born but couldn't seem to raise even one doe that was a keeper. One of the nicer Jr. bucks was selected Best Jr. Steel in Youth at York, PA. He was purchased through the Seller's Class, taken to Ohio and bred to a group of black Dutch does. We then purchased a son and daughter from those matings.

Steels are easily recognized in the litter - from the moment of birth they can be distinguished from blacks by checking the inside color of the ear. Blacks will show black skin where the inside hairs stop but the steel will have pink skin inside the ear. Grays can be identified by the lack of an undercut. The entire underside of a gray will be the same color.

When breeding grays and steels together, you occasionally get a blue fawn. For those of you who have never seen a blue fawn, they would most resemble an opal in a Dwarf or lop. While this animal can't be shown, it can certainly be used in your breeding program. Like any animal that doesn't meet the standard, you must use the blue fawn within limits.

The more I breed steels and grays, the more I'm convinced that the ideal goal is to breed grays to grays and on occasion blues while breeding steels to steels who carry a goodly amount of black in their background. As my herd reaches the type and markings desired, I will try to keep steels and grays separate.

Body size seems to be one of the hardest things to control on steels and even more so on the grays. The Dutch standard asks for the ideal size to be 4½ pounds. These two varieties are harder to maintain the correct size in. It is not unusual to have a 3 pound rabbit or one that is over 5½ pounds. As proven before, breeding a 5½ pound doe to a 3 pound buck does not give you a 4½ pound offspring, it gives you lots of small and big rabbits.

Fur on these two varieties seems to be much more dense with beautiful fly back. A black Dutch who carries steel in the breeding will have the nicest fur you'd ever want to see.

The hardest part of steels, to my mind, is getting the correct color. They should be 90% black with light gray tipped hairs evenly distributed. On most of my steels, I find the term light gray to be a poor color description, brown gray would more closely describe the color of ticking. When first born, the steel who looks very dark is the closest to what our standard describes. However, every time a steel moults, it losses some of the ticking - to the point of being too black. If the lighter kit is kept, it will be faulted as a Jr. but by the time it reaches 1 to 3 years of age, it will be the most correct color. Which steel should be kept for future generations? I'm still working on that problem!



GRAY DUTCH by Noël Palmer, New York

The following is strictly my opinion on the breeding of Gray Dutch.
First of all, after you have acquired your first pair or trio, did you go over your check list such as:

- ___ NO DISQUALIFICATIONS
- ___ GOOD MARKINGS
- ___ NICE COBBY TYPE
- ___ RIGHT COLOR



It seems that most of the time, the last one is often overlooked. I often see Grays that have 2 to 4 different shades of gray on them and no, they weren't in molt! I've also seen a couple that had dark bellys, thus lacking the white/cream color surface called for in our standard. I've had a couple of these pop up in litters and the only possible cause for this, in my line, was the amount of black in the bloodline. I'm now using Blues to try to lighten the belly color.

If you're not sure about the right color your grays should be, just look in your ARBA Standard of Perfection or ADRC Guidebook. There now, wasn't that easy! If you don't have the right color you might try the following:

#1) Look at the pedigree. Is the line overused? (ex: brother to sister - sire to daughter matings throughout the pedigree) Try looking for another line to introduce to yours.

#2) Do the lines vary too much? (ex: non-relatives, more than 5 bloodlines on one pedigree) Try re-introducing an old line. Say, there's "Smith's Gray" as the GGSIRE, - go buy a nice gray from Mr. Smith, (if you can find him - the right Mr. Smith) and introduce it back into your line. You may have to take the old hit and miss route, because of the different bloodlines.

When you finally get your first litter of Grays, look closely for uneven, ragged, or drags in the undercut. Since you really can't see the undercut, look at the sidesaddle and if it starts to go off course, chances are good that there is something wrong with the undercut. Also look at the stops. Sometimes you can't see splits because the color isn't dark enough. You'll notice this with Torts! I hope you end up getting the right color in the long run, - I'm already making progress.

A JUDGE'S VIEWPOINT - WHAT CAN THE SHOW SPONSOR DO TO MAKE YOUR JOB EASIER?

It is always appreciated when a show sponsor, or an individual at the show, extends extra effort to assist the judging obligations by "caring" about the judges. In addition, the more comfortable and the "easier" things are made for him/her to perform the duties expected, the higher the quality of judging job the show sponsors will receive. This is for the benefit of the club, the exhibitor, the judge and the entire fancy.

A quality judging performance depends upon some of the following factors:

1. Knowledge of the Standard of Perfection and the ability to apply that knowledge
2. Ability to communicate "reasons of placement" to the exhibitor that conform to the Standard of Perfection.
3. Ability to handle rabbits in an accepted manner.
4. Ability to concentrate.
5. Proper attitude toward the daily assignment.
6. Proper physical facilities (table, holding coops, lighting, ventilation, and many other items)
7. Knowledgable and efficient table secretaries.
8. Prevention of excess tiring by proper "pacing" of the workload.

The actions of the show sponsor cannot do anything to alter the judge's knowledge of the Standard of Perfection, or how he/she applies the Standard to the judging assignment. All the other factors listed can, in one way or another, be affected in varying degrees by the actions of the sponsoring club.

JUDGE PROCUREMENT

Sponsoring clubs can procure the services of an American Rabbit Breeders Association licensed judge in many ways. The most common practice is through the use of the "judges bid form" or the "offer to hire" form provided by the ARBA. The manner in which this relationship is initiated has an affect upon the attitude of both parties. The judge should respond to the sponsoring club promptly informing them of the requested financial arrangements, that the judge wishes not to judge that show, or that he/she has an obligation on that date. Whatever the response, the judge should respond to the sponsoring club within an appropriate amount of time (10-15 days).

The sponsoring club should respond to all judges responses in appropriate time (not more than thirty days) either rejecting the bid or confirming the acceptance of the arrangements provided.

OBLIGATIONS PRIOR TO THE DATE OF JUDGING

If the "contract" includes air transportation and lodging, the show sponsor should garner the necessary information to make the flight plans that are agreeable to both parties. These arrangements should include a confirmed itinerary as to the arrival time and whom will meet the judge at the airport, whom to contact if the flight is delayed and all other information concerning the stay in the sponsoring club's locale.

It is imperative that the sponsoring club forward each judge a copy of the show catalog with explicit directions to the show site well in advance of the exhibition date. This is a practice that is often omitted by the sponsoring club. By forwarding a catalog to the officiating judge in advance of the show date will prevent many misunderstandings and severes to reconfirm the original contract.

The manner in which the contract and other arrangements prior to the exhibition are handled will have a great affect upon the attitude of the judge to his obligation at the show. This can subconsciously affect the judge's quality of judging.

SHOW DAY OBLIGATIONS

The show sponsor should expect the judge to arrive at the show room and be prepared to initiate judging at the designated hour. The show sponsor should be prepared to start judging on time.

In my opinion, most judges appreciate meeting with the show superintendent prior to the show and discussing areas of that show that may have its own characteristics. In addition, most judges appreciate knowing the approximate number of animals they are expected to judge on that day so that he/she may pace themselves accordingly. This information can be provided to the officiating judge in this meeting.

It should be plainly understood that the judge is working for the sponsoring club and the show superintendent is the judges "boss" on that particular day. Any decision concerning entries, changing entries, late arrivals and so forth is the decision of the show superintendent and the judge will follow the direction of the show superintendent as long as it does not interfere with the constitution and by-laws, or the show rules, of the American Rabbit Breeders Association.

PHYSICAL FACILITIES

Providing proper and ample judging facilities is probably one of the most important items to make a judges job easier. In addition, improper judging facilities probably causes a lower quality job of judging than most exhibitors realize. Improper judging facilities affects the concentration and the attitude of the officiating judge.

The judging coops and holding pens should be adequate in number to hold the largest class that the judges will be requested to judge and should meet the necessities of the breeds to be judged at that facility. These facilities should be clean and free from material that will stain the animal's coat. They should be in good repair so as not to allow for possible injury to the animals.

The judging table should be at the proper height, judging coops should be the proper distance from the front of the table, and the holding coops should be at least eighteen inches off the floor. There is a range of measurements that most judges can tolerate without being uncomfortable. Therefore, it will not be necessary for the sponsoring club to build facilities for each specific judge.

Each judge should be provided an accurate set of scales with test weights. This is a very important item of show equipment and if not provided to the judge, can allow for inconsistent judging that reflects upon the judge and the show sponsor.

It is greatly appreciated by most judges that ample materials be made available to clean the recently deposited urine and fecal material from the judging coops so other

animals will not become soiled or contaminated in the dirty judging pens.

Lighting is a very important item that can be greatly improved, without additional cost, simply by proper placement of the show table within the existing facility. Adequate lighting is extremely important and a judge cannot perform to his/her optimum ability without proper lighting. It is totally impossible to correctly evaluate fur color, spots in the eye and other entities without proper lighting.

Ventilation is an item that should be given consideration in extreme weather conditions. Adequate ventilation will prevent the judge from tiring easily and prevent the judge from "worrying" about the health and welfare of the animals. Again, this is important so that the concentrating efforts of the judge is not interfered with at that time.

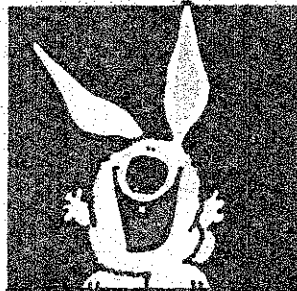
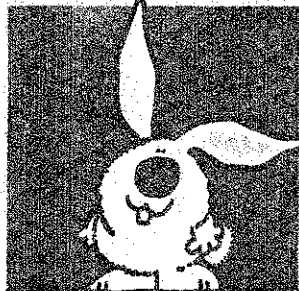
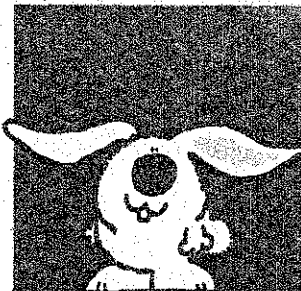
Although not a part of the actual physical facilities, but closely related, if the show sponsor provides "carriers" at the show, they should be sure that the carriers are properly trained in how to handle and carry the rabbits. It is very frustrating for most judges for carriers to handle the rabbits in such a manner that they may become injured or the fur and show condition is altered due to improper handling.

TABLE SECRETARIES

In conjunction with the physical facilities, the efficiency of the table secretaries are the two most important items that can make a judging job easier. It is essential that at least one of the table secretaries has some experience. Ideally, it is most convenient if the same table secretary can write for the same judge the entire day. This allows this individual to become accustom to the judge's habits in giving comments and it further allows the judge to be accustom to the table secretary's habits. This allows for the most efficient job. It is very important that the table secretary be aware of the importance of recording the proper placement and animals.

Prolonged waiting time between classes can become very discouraging. When this time is excessive, it allows for the judge to lose his/her concentration, allows for excessive visiting with exhibitors that may be misinterpreted, and decreases the number of animals that can be comfortably judged in the allotted amount of time. A good, conscientious table secretary prevents prolonged waiting times and makes the judges job much easier whether he/she is required to judge one hundred and twenty-five rabbits that particular day or in the excess of two hundred and fifty rabbits that day.

In summary, the above mentioned items are a few of the considerations that the show sponsor can do to make the day of judging easier and more enjoyable for the judge. However, a more important benefit from making the job easier and comfortable, is there is an improvement in the quality of judging and this is very important. For a judge to perform at the best of his/her ability, they must not only have the knowledge of the Standard of Perfection and how to apply that knowledge; but, they must have the proper attitude and the ability to concentrate. This is the area where the sponsoring club's actions can be of great assistance.

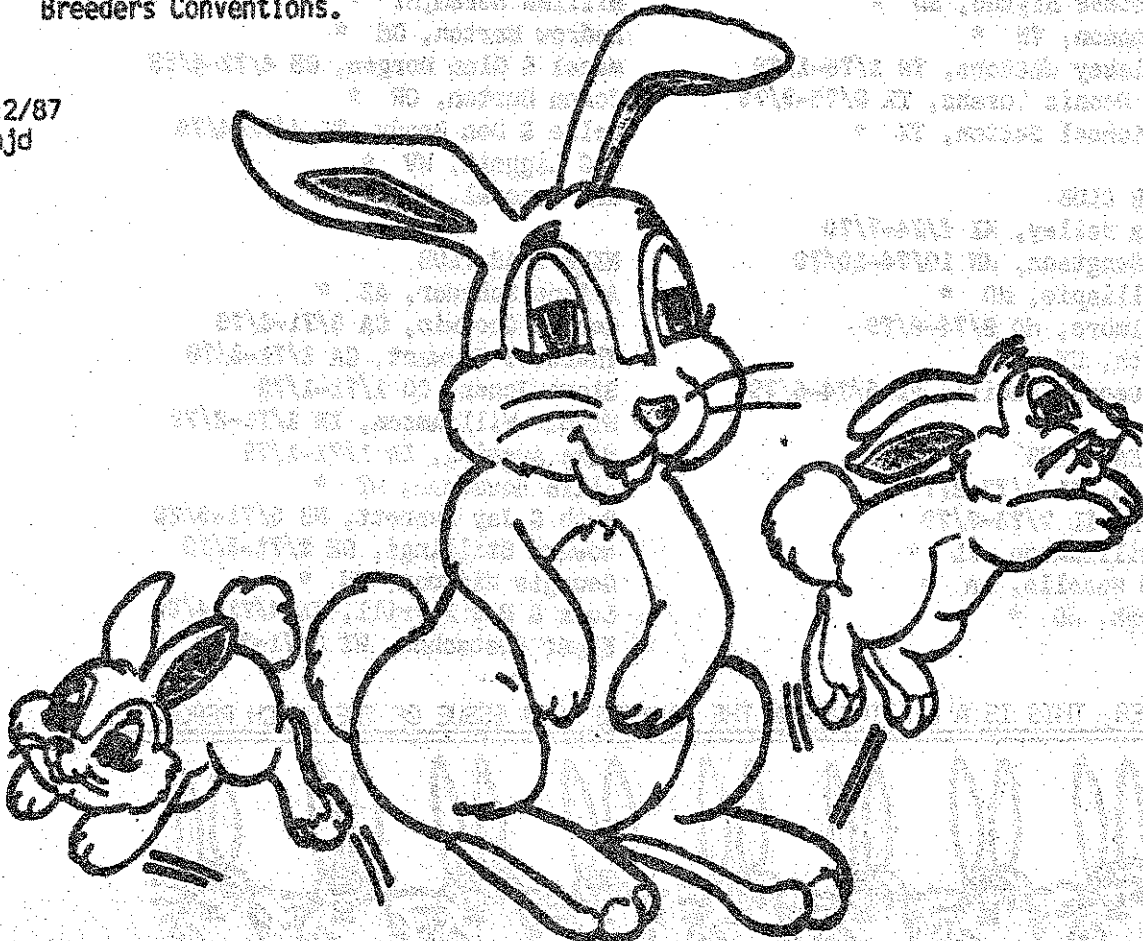

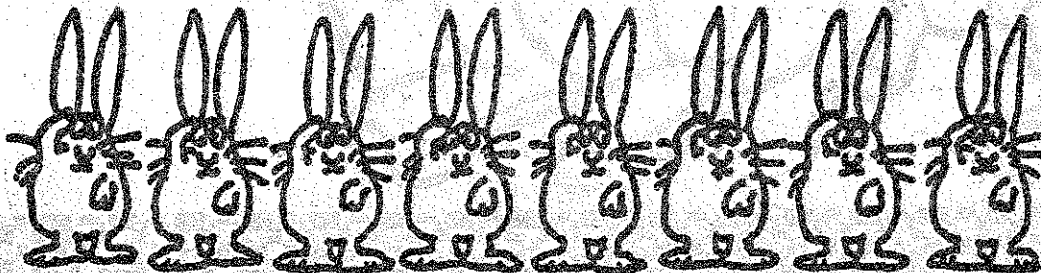

California Dutch Rabbit Club

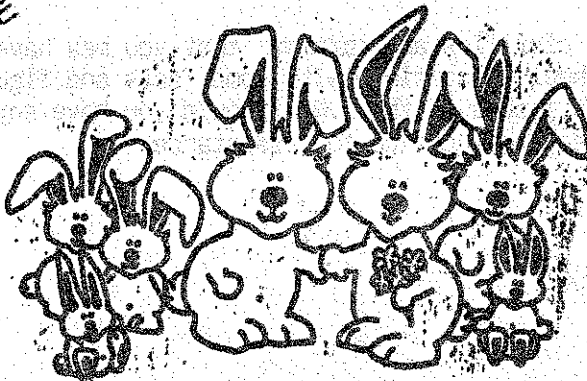

SECRETARY AND EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Norma Hart

I would like to take this opportunity to clarify a statement that appeared in your last issue of the Dutch Reporter. It was stated that the Secretary/Treasurer's job had also included the sweepstakes chair and Dutch Reporter Editor job at one time. It further stated that we now had a separate Sweepstakes Chair and Dutch Reporter Editor but the Secretary/Treasurer remuneration remained the same.

The Secretary/Treasurer position arrived here in January of 1982. At that time, Dick Gehr was appointed sweepstakes chair with no remuneration. Your Secretary/Treasurer also took on the Dutch Reporter with a remuneration separate from the Secretary/Treasurer. The Secretary/Treasurer receives compensation for the processing of sanctions and memberships ONLY!

In 1982, I received \$75.00 per copy for each issue of the Dutch Reporter. At the end of the year, I received an extra \$1.00 for each sanction issued through the year over 450. This made the TOTAL Editor's fee for 1982 \$583.00. In 1983, I received \$75.00 per issue and \$1.00 for each sanction issued over 450 at the end of the year. The total fees paid in 1983 were \$739.00. In 1984, the \$1.00 per sanction over 450 ceased and the Editor received a raise. For the Jan/Feb and Mar/Apr issues, I received \$50.00 per issue plus 10¢ for each copy mailed. The May/June, July/Aug, Sept/Oct and Nov/Dec issues paid the current \$200.00 per issue. The Dutch Reporter left here for 1985 at my request, and with it's leaving, the fee for this service ceased and the new editor received the proper fees.

The first remuneration of any kind for keeping the sweepstakes since I have held this position was in 1987. This was a one time small remuneration fee paid at that time. There is now \$1.00 per open sanction paid our sweepstakes chairperson. This payment took effect January of this year.

This office is not receiving any compensation other than the same percentage on the same things since 1982 and prior to even then! Also note that \$1.00 is taken out of each membership for the ADRC Contingency Fund BEFORE the secretary commission is figured. The Secretary/Treasurer commission listed on the ADRC Financial Reports is only from the processing of sanctions and memberships. THERE IS NO PAYMENT FOR ANY OTHER SERVICE PROVIDED FROM THIS OFFICE!

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

Constitution:

ARTICLE I - NAME: The name of this Club shall be the AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB, INCORPORATED.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT: The object of this Club shall be to promote, encourage, and improve the breeding of Dutch rabbits by maintaining an organization to study standards, encourage exhibitions, and offer service to its members.

ARTICLE III - AFFILIATION: This Club shall be affiliated with the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP: Any person of good character and reputation and in accord with the object may become a member of the Club upon presentation of a signed application together with membership fee for at least one year to the Secretary-Treasurer. Term of membership to be one year from date on membership application, providing application is received within five (5) days of this date. Each member shall be provided with a copy of the latest A.D.R.C. Guide Book, if available, and a one year subscription to the Dutch Reporter.

SECTION 2: Any member having paid thirty-five (35) consecutive years adult membership regardless of age, or that has twenty-five (25) consecutive years membership in the ADRC upon reaching the age of sixty-five (65), shall be awarded a life membership.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS: SECTION 1: The elected officers of this association shall consist of a President, Vice-President, and nine (9) Directors, who shall be elected for a three (3) year term, by and from the membership. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be appointed by the President, approved by two-thirds majority of the Board of Directors, excluding the Secretary-Treasurer. The appointment of the Secretary-Treasurer shall be for three (3) years. Any member, to be eligible for office, must be an owner and breeder of Dutch rabbits.

SECTION 2: The Secretary-Treasurer may be reappointed by the Board of Directors, who may also remove him/her from office, for cause, by a two-thirds majority, during any term of office. The Secretary-Treasurer will be an active voting member of the Board of Directors, except in the appointment or removal from the office of Secretary-Treasurer. The Board of Directors therefore, consists of the: President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer and nine (9) Directors. The term of any office shall begin on January 1st. of the year following each election.

SECTION 3: The President and one (1) Director representing each district will be elected for a three (3) year tenure. The Vice-President and one (1) Director from each district will be elected the following year for a three (3) year tenure. Finally, the Secretary-Treasurer will be appointed and the final three (3) Directors, each from a different district will be elected the third year to serve a three (3) year tenure. Directors may be from the same state and district as other officers: President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer. The Directors representing each district will be elected by a vote of only those members living in that district.

SECTION 4: Vacancies in office shall be filled by appointment by the President, subject to approval by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Board of Directors. If filling the office of Director, a person from the same district the vacancy is in, shall be appointed.

SECTION 5: Directors shall be elected from three (3) districts divided as follows:

- R1 - Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Vermont, Virginia, West Virginia
- R2 - Alabama, Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Tennessee, Wisconsin
- R3 - Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington, Wyoming

* Note: No Foreign member will be eligible to hold office.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTION PROCEDURES: SECTION 1: A petition shall be requested from the Secretary of the ADRC by any member who wishes to run for an ADRC office. The petition must be returned to the Secretary by June 1st., prior to an election with a required fifteen (15) signatures, all of whom are American Dutch Rabbit Club members. All candidates must be current American Dutch Rabbit Club and American Rabbit Breeders Association members. Those signing a petition may only sign one (1) petition for the office of Director within your District.

SECTION 2: Two (2) final ballots and two (2) ballot envelopes shall be included in each July-August Dutch Reporter mailed. All members with voting privileges shall remove their ballot from the Dutch Reporter, and upon completion of voting, place it in the ballot envelope and seal it. This ballot envelope shall be placed in another envelope addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc., with the voters name and return address on the envelope. Upon receipt of the envelopes, the Secretary-Treasurer shall verify the eligibility of the voter. The Secretary-Treasurer shall open and discard the outer envelopes. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive these ballots until the 15th of September, at which time the polls shall be closed. The ballot envelopes shall then be packaged and sent to the Chairman of the Election Committee, and he/she will assemble the Election Committee, open the ballot envelopes, count the ballots, and certify the results to the Secretary-Treasurer, President, and Dutch Reporter Editor by the 25th of September. The Election Chairman shall then package the final ballots and send them to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc., and they shall be retained for a period of one (1) year, at which time they may be destroyed. These ballots, while in the hands of the Secretary-Treasurer, shall be accessible to any member in good standing, provided proper arrangements are made with the Secretary-Treasurer.

SECTION 2A: No one (1) person can run for more than one (1) office during any election.

3)

SECTION 3: The Secretary-Treasurer shall then inform the candidates and the Board of Directors of the results and shall declare the candidate having the highest number of votes elected. The officers-elect shall assume offices on the following January 1 and serve their elected terms or until their successors have been elected.

SECTION 4: Any member, to be eligible for office, must have received at least ten (10) votes to become a candidate for office of President or Vice-President; he/she must have received at least five (5) votes to become a candidate for office of Director. Any member, to be eligible for office, must have been in continuous good standing at least two (2) years prior to certification date of election, September 20, and all candidates shall remain in good standing with membership fee paid in advance at least through date of assuming office, January 1.

ARTICLE VII - DISCIPLINE: SECTION 1: The Board of Directors may, by a two-thirds majority, suspend or expel any member or reject an application for membership or renewal, providing charges have been preferred by another member. Less than a two-third majority shall constitute acquittal of the charges.

SECTION 2: In the event of preferment of charges, the member against whom the charges have been made shall be fully informed by the Secretary-Treasurer and given thirty (30) days to reply before action is taken by the Board. If reply is made, it shall be considered by the Board along with the charges.

SECTION 3: Any person expelled, suspended or otherwise rejected shall not be eligible for reinstatement for a period of at least one year and then only upon authority of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 4: An Officer whose membership has expired shall be notified by the Secretary-Treasurer by registered mail, with signature receipt requested, and if the renewal has not been made in thirty (30) days from the date of expiration, said office shall be declared vacant and it shall be the duty of the President to fill by appointment the unexpired term of office.

SECTION 5: An Officer who shows lack of interest in his official duties, who fails to answer correspondence of Club matters from his fellow Officers, shall be asked by the President to resign said office. In case of failure to do so, the Board of Directors by two-thirds vote shall declare the office vacant. It shall then be the duty of the President to appoint an Officer to fill the unexpired term of office.

SECTION 6: An Officer who shall willingly or otherwise give up the breeding of Dutch rabbits during his term of office shall automatically resign his office and it shall be the duty of the President to fill the vacancy of the unexpired term of office by appointment.

SECTION 7: No member or candidate for membership may infringe upon the name of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc., or that of any other member or his rabbitry. This also applies to State Dutch Rabbit Clubs.

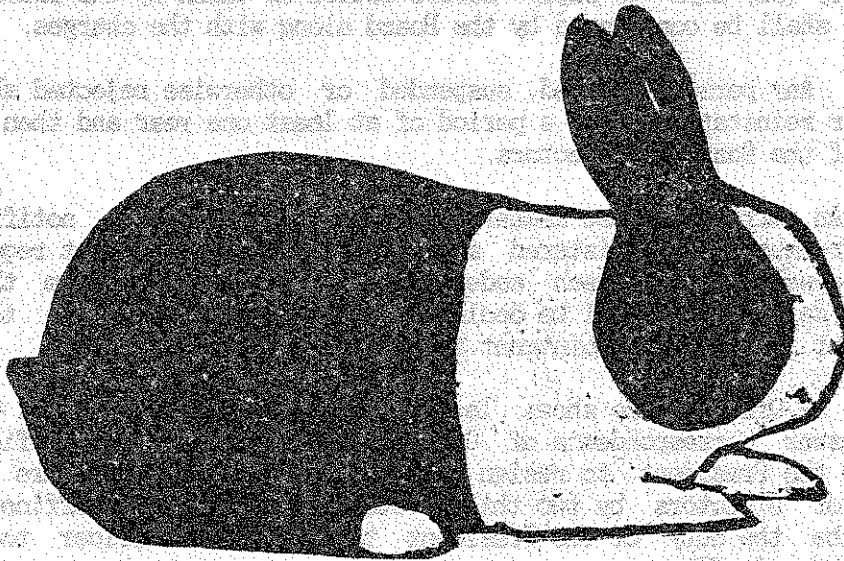
ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS: SECTION 1: The annual membership meeting shall be held during the annual Convention of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc.

SECTION 2: A regular membership meeting shall be held during the National Dutch Rabbit Show; however this meeting shall in no way replace the annual meeting unless the two are concurrent.

SECTION 3: The President, or in the absence of the President, any elected Officer present may call a meeting of the Board of Directors at any time during the annual Convention of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc., or the National Dutch Rabbit Show. The presence of five (5) Officers at such a meeting shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS: SECTION 1: Any alteration of, or amendment to the Constitution shall be made by way of a resolution. This resolution to be submitted to the Secretary of the ADRC with the signatures of twenty-five (25) adult members in good standing of the ADRC. Said resolution to be submitted no later than January 1st. of the year in which the resolution will be voted on. The Secretary shall send copies of the resolution to each officer of the ADRC, and shall have the resolution printed in the January/February issue of the Dutch Reporter so that the membership shall have ample time to form an intelligent opinion on the resolution. The resolution shall also be printed in the issue of the Dutch Reporter containing the final ballots on which the resolution will be voted. The ADRC voting membership shall then cast their ballots by mail. The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of all eligible votes cast. All amendments shall take effect January 1st. of the year following their acceptance.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - DUES: The membership dues shall be seven dollars (\$7.00) per year payable in advance, with a combination membership being provided for husband and wife at nine dollars (\$9.00) per year, expiring with the same date. One dollar (\$1.00) of each yearly membership fee is to be placed into a separate account called the "Guide Book/ Contingency Fund" and the provisions of ARTICLE III - SECTION 1 and 2 of the By-Laws shall not apply to these monies. A single paid life membership may be purchased for the sum of one hundred forty dollars (\$140.00), payable in advance. A husband/wife life membership may be purchased for the sum of one hundred eighty dollars (\$180.00), payable in advance. All deductions from paid life memberships are excluded. After membership has expired, the member may renew within a period of sixty (60) days; otherwise upon sending in membership fees, the member will be given a new membership unless they specifically requests that their membership be dated back more than sixty (60) days to the original expiration date in order that they may keep their original membership number. Any member having been delinquent sixty (60) days or more, whether requesting old membership number or not, shall be deprived of all sweepstakes points accumulated prior to the expiration date.

All junior members of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. shall pay dues at the rate of \$2.00 (two dollars) less per year than a single adult membership. They will retain all privileges as adults except voting. A junior member shall be defined as being a youth under the age of 18 (eighteen) years on the date of applying for membership.

ARTICLE II - DUTIES OF OFFICERS: SECTION 1: The President shall preside at all meetings of the membership or Board of Directors, appoint all committees, fill all vacancies in office by appointment and perform such duties as pertain to the office.

SECTION 2: The Vice-President shall perform all duties of the President in his absence or disability. In event of vacation of the office of President, the Vice-President shall automatically succeed him in office.

SECTION 3: The Secretary-Treasurer shall be custodian of all general funds; shall maintain a bank account in the name of the Club; shall maintain a set of books and records suitable to the Board of Directors; receive and act on all membership applications received, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors; maintain Sweepstakes Show records; consult and advise the Board of Directors on all unusual matters; furnish them with quarterly reports showing the general condition of the Club; furnish the Board of Directors with semi-annual audited reports, all these reports to be published in the Club's publication; keep an accurate record of all meetings; and perform such other duties as may be assigned by the President or the Board of Directors. The Secretary-Treasurer shall furnish an approved bond covering the assets of the Club. The premium for said bond to be paid for out of Club funds, with the bond to be delivered to the President within ten (10) days after assumption of office.

SECTION 4: It shall be the duty of the Secretary to edit, or cause to be edited, THE DUTCH REPORTER. If for any reason the Secretary is unable to perform this duty it shall be the duty of the President to appoint an editor and the Secretary shall cooperate with the appointed editor by giving such news from the office as would be of interest to the membership.

SECTION 5: The Board of Directors shall have power to transact all business of the Club between meetings; act upon charges brought before them; formulate rules; award the location of the National Dutch Rabbit Show; and decide upon all questions of policy brought before them.

ARTICLE III - APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS: SECTION 1: The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive 25% of all membership dues including renewals, and 25% of Sweepstakes fees as full compensation for his/her services.

SECTION 1A: The sweepstakes chairperson shall receive one-dollar (\$1.00) per open show sanction paid from the open show sanction fee as remuneration to compensate for time and effort spent by said chairperson in calculating, tabulating, and recording all show results. The sweepstakes chairperson shall provide the Dutch Reporter editor with a typed copy of each show report listed chronologically and sweepstakes standing for both open and youth divisions listed numerically; top twenty (20) open and youth divisions as well as the top five (5) from each district.

SECTION 2: The dues shall be further divided with 12 1/2% to be allotted for the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. Publicity Department. These monies are to be placed in a separate account retained by the Secretary-Treasurer. Any portion of these monies may be transferred to the Publicity Department, or to any American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. purpose, upon approval of a majority vote of the Board of Directors. The remaining 62 1/2% shall go to the General Fund. All percentage payments are to be paid on a monthly basis.

SECTION 2A: An annual allotment of \$500.00 (five hundred dollars) from the General Fund shall be awarded to the sponsors of the National Dutch Rabbit Show, with further stipulation that the American Dutch Rabbit Club receive recognition for this allotment. Said money to be sent by the Secretary/Treasurer to the sponsors on or as near to January 1 preceding the National Dutch Show for that year. Show sponsors must have all National Dutch Rabbit Show judges secured before any ADRC allocation is made. The ADRC requires three (3) open judges, chosen by and from the membership, at each National Dutch Show. The ADRC Board of Directors has the authority to change the number of required judges if deemed necessary according to the entry. If a third open judge is required, the ADRC will make payment for this judge up to two-hundred fifty (\$250.00) dollars. The open judges at the National Dutch Show shall be the top selections from the ballot if possible.

SECTION 2B: An annual allotment of \$150.00 (one hundred fifty) shall be paid out of the General Fund towards the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention, with further stipulation that the entire amount be used for open Dutch specials.

SECTION 2C: An annual allotment of \$50.00 (fifty dollars) be paid out of the General Fund towards the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention, with further stipulation that the entire amount be used for youth Dutch specials.

SECTION 2D: All of the above allotted specials to be advertised as being donated by the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc.

SECTION 3: The President shall receive the sum of \$50.00 (fifty dollars) for

attendance at each annual, regular, or special meeting, provided that meeting is not held in the town in which he/she resides, in which case there shall be no payment. In no case shall the payment be in excess of the sum of \$100.00 (one hundred dollars) per calendar year. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive the sum of 20 cents (twenty cents) per mile round trip, or round trip coach air fare, whichever is less expensive, for travel expenses to the National Dutch Rabbit Shows and the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Conventions. Should the National Dutch Rabbit Show or American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention take place within 125 miles radius of the Secretary-Treasurer's home, only the sum of \$50.00 (fifty dollars) will be paid. In the case that the National Dutch Rabbit Show or American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention should be held in the town in which the Secretary-Treasurer resides, he/she shall receive no payment for expenses.

SECTION 3A: The Publicity Chairman shall be paid \$100.00 (one-hundred dollars) for each National Dutch Rabbit Show and American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention which he/she transports American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. publicity items for sale at the Club booth; such funds to be paid from the Publicity Fund.

SECTION 4: Each Officer, along with the Chairman of the Publicity Department, shall have the Dutch Reporter mailed to them by first class mail in lieu of any postage.

ARTICLE IV - STANDING COMMITTEES: SECTION 1: The Publicity and Promotion Committee shall consist of a Chairman and State Representative, and shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years. The Chairman of the Publicity and Promotion Committee shall be known as the Publicity and Promotion Director, and shall have charge of all publicity and promotion work for the Club except for the editorship of the Club's publication. He shall be custodian of and be responsible for the Publicity funds and give a financial report at each annual and regular meeting.

SECTION 1A: A quarterly report of the Publicity Department shall be submitted to the Secretary-Treasurer for publication in the Dutch Reporter.

SECTION 2: The Standard Committee shall consist of a Chairman and four (4) members, at least two (2) of whom shall be licensed American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. judges. The Standard Committee shall all be members, in good standing, of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. They shall be responsible for maintaining continuous study of the standards, receiving any requests for a working standard on a new variety, and transmitting any proposed revisions or additions to the entire American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. Board. Upon majority Board approval, the Secretary shall cause such proposed revisions or additions to be sent to each member in good standing with a mail ballot so that they may register their vote for or against each change, revision, or addition. If these changes, revisions, or additions are approved by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the ballots cast, it shall be the duty of this Committee to submit them to the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Standard Committee with the recommendations that such changes, revisions, or additions be adopted.

SECTION 3: The Election Committee shall consist of a Chairman and two other members, none of whom shall reside in the same county as either the President or Secretary-Treasurer. The Election Committee shall be appointed annually by the President, from the membership, with majority approval of the Board of

Directors. The Election Committee shall assemble and open the ballots, tabulate the results, and certify these results to the President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Dutch Reporter Editor within ten (10) days after the closing of the polls. If all three (3) members of the Election Committee are unable to meet to carry out these duties, the President shall be notified immediately, and different Election Committee members appointed, as needed, prior to the opening of the ballots. It is necessary that the signatures of all three (3) members of the Election Committee accompany the results as sent to the President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Dutch Reporter Editor. No member of the Election Committee shall be eligible for election to any office. Any member serving on the Election Committee shall not be eligible to serve on this Committee again for a period of three (3) years.

SECTION 4: The Auditing Committee shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) members, no two (2) of them shall either be Officers or reside in the same county as the Secretary-Treasurer. Their duty shall be to make a semi-annual audit of the fiscal period, preceding the National Dutch Rabbit Show, and the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention, of the Secretary-Treasurer's books and make a report there-on at these meetings. The Committee may recommend, if deemed advisable after examination, that the books be audited by a certified public accountant. The above Committee to be appointed from the membership present at the above mentioned meetings.

SECTION 5: Any special Committee deemed advisable by the President, or authorized by the Board of Directors or membership, may be appointed by the President and given specific assignment. At the completion of their assignment, they shall be discharged.

ARTICLE V - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY: The rules of parliamentary procedure in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern the proceedings of the Club.

ARTICLE VI - ORDER OF BUSINESS: The order of business shall be:

- 1 - Call to order.
- 2 - Roll call of Officers.
- 3 - Reading of Minutes.
- 4 - Report of Officers.
- 5 - Report of Committees.
- 6 - Unfinished Business.
- 7 - New Business.
- 8 - Good of the Order.
- 9 - Adjournment.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS: SECTION 1: Any alteration of, or amendment to the By-Laws shall be made by way of a resolution. This resolution to be submitted to the Secretary of the ADRC with the signatures of twenty-five (25) adult members in good standing of the ADRC. Said resolution to be submitted no later than January 1st. of the year in which the resolution will be voted on. The Secretary shall send copies of the resolution to each officer of the ADRC, and shall have the resolution printed in the January/February issue of the Dutch Reporter so that the membership shall have ample time to form an intelligent opinion on the resolution. The resolution shall also be printed in the issue of the Dutch Reporter containing the final ballots on which the resolution will be voted. The ADRC voting membership shall then cast their ballots by mail. The By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of all eligible votes cast. All amendments shall take effect January 1st. of the year following their acceptance.

FROM THE SWEEPSTAKES CHAIRPERSON

I'm really excited about my appointment to the post of sweepstakes chairperson. My husband and I are finding that although the job is somewhat more time-consuming than we had anticipated, it is a very interesting and satisfying task to compile and report the show results. We are trying very hard to do a good job and serve the ADRC membership well. Please keep in mind, however, that this job is new to us and we will probably make a few mistakes. (Don't ever tell my mother that I admitted that!) Check over the reports carefully and let us know if we have erred. If you believe we have made a mistake, we will be more than happy to go back to the show reports and membership lists and try to rectify the error if one has been made. Please be specific by naming dates, names of sponsoring clubs, etc. In any case we do promise to get back to you to let you know that we have either corrected the error or that we believe the report is correct.

We are also finding that there are a few things the exhibitors can do to help make our job easier. The first thing is to enter your rabbits under the same name at all times. I realize that this, for one reason or another, may not always be possible. For example, husbands and wives who both belong to the ADRC under a joint membership may choose to enter rabbits separately for some reason. In that case I would really appreciate it if you would call me or drop me a line to let me know how you would like to have your points calculated--separately or together.

Another way to help us out would be to let us know if you enter your rabbits under a rabbitry name. As we have gotten into preparation of reports and the figuring of points, we have discovered that we have inadvertently listed some people as non-members when actually they were entering the rabbits under a rabbitry name rather than under their own names. If you have been a victim of this please let us know so that we can fix it. Again, please list shows specifically in order to make it easier for us to find the necessary papers and give you the points to which you are entitled.

In short, we are really enjoying doing this job and want to do all we can to do it well. You can help us, the club, and yourselves by keeping a watch on our work, keeping us informed about how you enter your rabbits and want your points tallied, and letting us know as soon as possible when our figures don't coincide with yours. And please always remember and never forget--"One can disagree without being disagreeable."



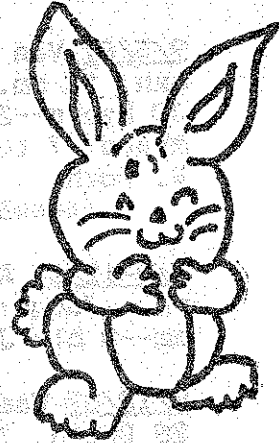
