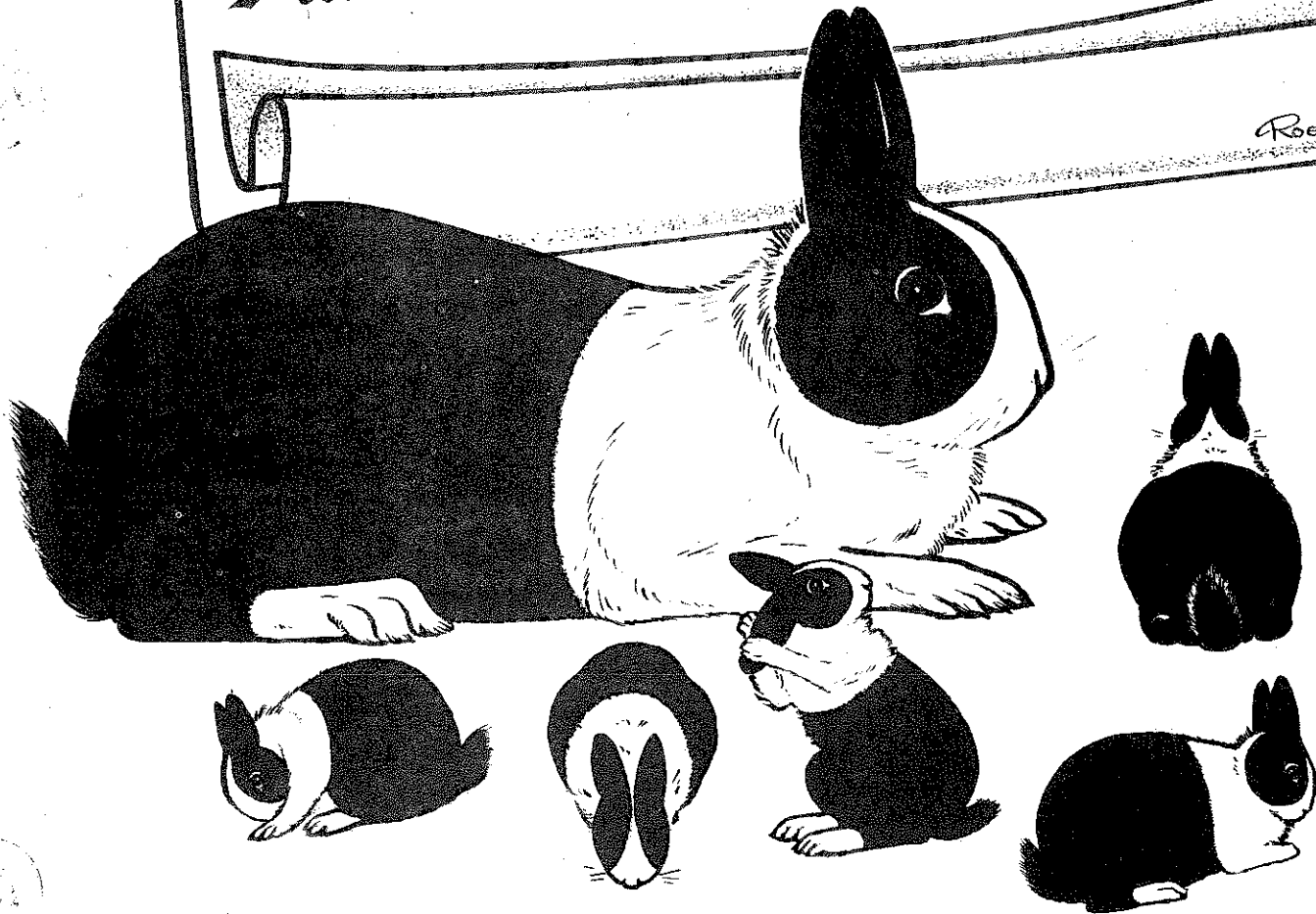

LILAC DUTCH NOW

Did you save the old Dutch Guide Book? If you did then turn to the chapter on Chocolate Dutch written by Chas. C. Lewis. It is here that you will find that the grand Chocolate began its exhibition Trials in A. O. C. Classes. That is where the Lilac came to light. But is it good enough for the Reds? No! they must start as no other color started in this country with a standard written before any of them reach the show room, and all because a couple of breeders have a pipe dream (both admitted to the fact that they have little to show at this time.)

On page 42 of the A. R. C. B. A. Guide Book there is a regulation covering the admission of a working standard on any new breed and I quote "When a breeder has found that he has produced a new and distinct breed, he should write up a standard to cover same and mail to the Chairman of the Standard Committee, advising him that he has a breed worthy of recognition, stating that he will make a display of this new breed at the next annual convention show of the American Rabbit and Cavy Breeders Association Inc. requesting the standard committee to examine the breed, and if found worthy adopt a working standard to cover same! If this is the case then somebody is going to have to take a little water. For I see no other way for this party or parties to exhibit the little Reds except in A. O. C. Classes.

I have extended a Standard on the Lilac Dutch. I have exhibited Lilac Dutch at Local Shows and at the Annual Convention Show of the A.R.C.B.A. I have also ask others in addition as to what they thought of the Lilac and the Lilac Standard, and I have recieved their approval of it as it was written. Now I am going to ask that any one interested in the Lilac Dutch go back and read that Standard in the October issue of the Dutch Reporter and write their approval, disapproval, or amendments to this Standard. From here I will know just what to do. I can still show my Lilacs in A.O.C. classes for I HAVE THEM TO SHOW NOW.

I know that several breeders will cry that the Lilac is the product of indiscriminant breeding, but there will always be some dissenters on any question that is brought up before any group. So this can be expected.

I want both the Beattloys and John Griffiths to understand that I am not trying to obstruct any progress that each is trying to make. I have as much regard for their product as I have for Chocolates or any other color of Dutch. I do think that they should be able to stand the strain of any exhibition of Reds in A.O.C. Classes. If it meets the approval of the judges there, then they still have plenty of time to get that pot of Gold at the end of the rainbow.

In conclusion I wish that every one interested in the Lilac Dutch and a Standard for this color, please write me at 624 North Anthony Blvd., Fort Wayne 3, Indiana and let me know so that your name may be listed with the others approving it.
