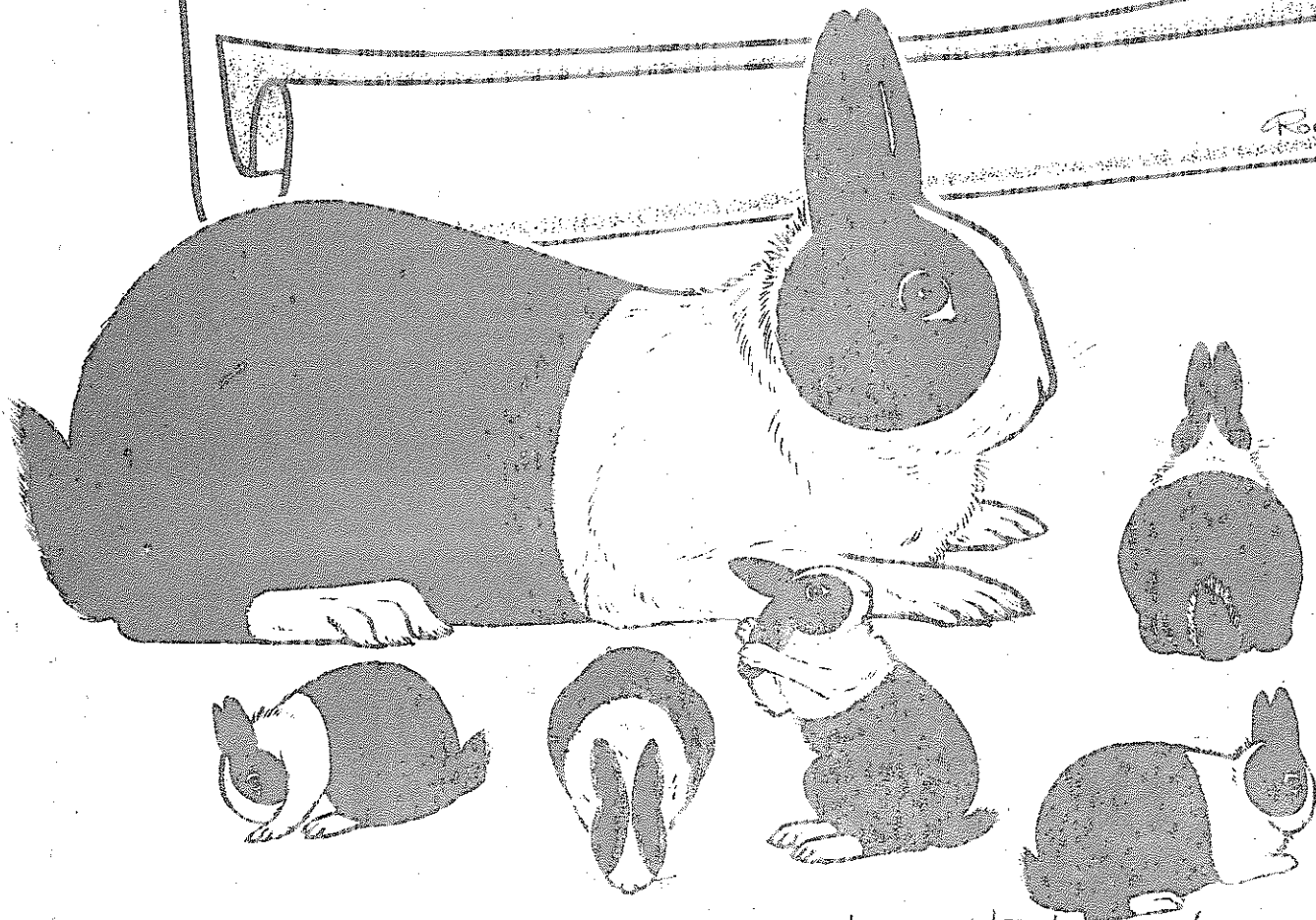

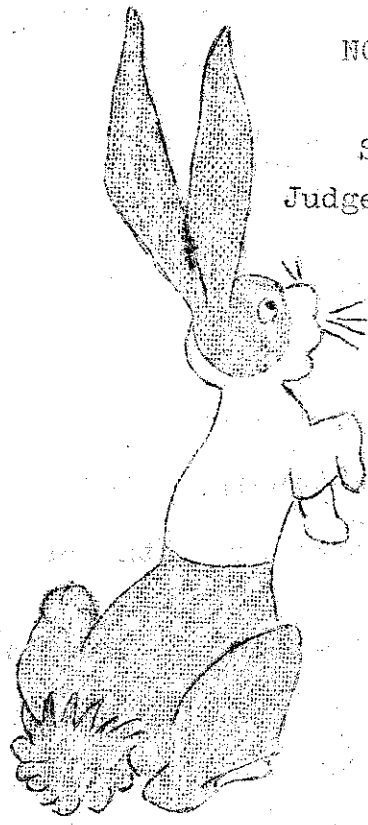

## MINUTES

Annual membership meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was held in Room 503 of the Municipal Auditorium, Kansas City, Missouri, on Tuesday, November 28, 1950, at 4:00 P.M.

Meeting was called to order by Vice-President C. W. Dugan.

Officers present were: Vice-President C. W. Dugan; Director R. J. Bernhardt; Director Lester C. Wells; Secretary-Treasurer Mrs. Lyle Neubauer.

Minutes of meeting of May 5, 1950, at Pueblo, Colorado, were read and approved.

Reports of officers: Mr. Wheelus, Publicity Director, stated that his report was made out but that he did not bring it because he was not sure he would be able to attend the meeting due to the terrific snowstorms over the eastern half of the nation. He stated he had been lax in getting out publicity stories but that much of his time had been devoted to making up new things for the Dutch Booth. He said that if the plates used in Mr. Bernhardt's article in the Guide Book can be sent to Mr. Blair of Small Stock Magazine, the entire article will be published by Mr. Blair free of charge. Discussion followed this statement; many members believing that the entire article would detract from the value of the Guide Book and would result in loss of membership sales due to the fact that a person would not have to join the Club in order to get all available information on Dutch rabbits and some members thought it might be well to use only one set of the article's cuts in a publicity story as a sort of teaser for obtaining members. Mr. Wheelus further stated that the articles for sale in the Dutch Booth included cast aluminum Dutch rabbits which could be used as paperweights or collectors' item and it was suggested that this particular item could be used on bookends and further discussion brought out the suggestion that a small engraved plate could be attached to such bookends and the bookends could be used as trophies. Such bookends would cost about \$6.00; they would cost a trifle more with an engraved plate. The motion, made by Mr. Lester Wells and seconded by Mr. Lyle Neubauer, that Mr. Wheelus should go ahead with a free hand in working up his ideas for items for the Dutch Booth was passed unanimously.

Mr. Dugan thanked the members for having elected him to the Presidency of the Club for the year 1951 and stated he would do his very best for the Club.

Financial report was read by the Secretary-Treasurer and accepted.

The Secretary reported that the new Guide Books had been mailed to all members in good standing as of October 1st and that the Guide Books had been mailed out about a week before the Convention started. It was also reported the total membership was 308 as of November 1st and that this figure included 15 October expirations. In the new membership contest for the trophy offered by Mr. Wheelus, it was reported that Mr. Dugan had obtained 12 new members, Mr. Walborn 4 members and Mr. Neubauer 4 members as of November 1st.

Unfinished business: The following Resolution from Mr. D. M. Burkhiser was read: "Any Dutch Club member to be eligible for the Sweepstakes Championship or Trophy must enter and show at least one Dutch in the A. R. & C. B. A. Convention show and the A. D. R. C. Final Sweepstakes Show during the year he (or she) is competing for the Sweepstakes Championship." Discussion followed in which it was stated that this would be working a hardship on breeders who might not be able to show at either of the two shows mentioned but might be able to exhibit in other sweepstake shows. It was further stated that such a ruling would hurt the members of the organization and lose memberships.

It was brought out that many members lived in sections where there were not many Dutch and that a different system of figuring sweepstake points might be devised wherein points would be given a person shipping a few head from a long distance and fewer points given a person living near the show and exhibiting a large number of rabbits; and points given on this basis would add up fast and give everybody an equal chance at the trophy. The resolution died for lack of a second.

New business: It was stated that some members believe The Dutch Reporter devotes too much space to sweepstake show reports, and members were requested to give their opinions. It was brought out that the show reports kept members advised of what breeders are doing throughout the country and that the reports could be in some manner condensed but it was the consensus of opinion that all information, as now given in the reports, should be continued to be given.

It was brought out that if Show Reports took up most of The Dutch Reporter, it was because some of the members were not taking enough interest to write articles.

Upon motion by Mr. Wheelus, seconded by Mr. Wally Wallace and carried, The Dutch Reporter is to contain a page by the President, a page by the Secretary, a page by the Publicity Director and a page by a Director, each of the six Directors to have two pages each year, one page in the first half of the year and one page in the second half of the year; all pages to contain articles and information of interest to Club members; these pages to be contained in each issue.

It was brought out that the price of paper was going up and, therefore, the cost of The Reporter would be increased. It was suggested that we might get someone to furnish all the paper for The Reporter in return for an ad in each issue and that an exclusive ad, say, from a feed company, would be the only way. It was stated we need about 3000 sheets of paper per month. The Chair appointed Mr. Wells and Mr. Wheelus to look into this matter and to report their findings.

Working standards for two new colors of Dutch were read. 1. Ruby-eye Palomino Dutch. A uniform light cream color throughout the colored portion, running deep toward the skin; free from lemon, brassiness, or shadings is desired. Under portion of tail, inside of hind legs and belly to be as near the body color as possible. Eyes to be an expressive bold bright pink. 2. Red Dutch. The colored portion to be a rich reddish cream color with credit being given for the nearest possible approach to a rich reddish buff. Free from light or dark ticking, frosty or smudgy effects and as near the same shade over all surface as possible, due allowance being made for a lighter shade of color on the belly. Eyes to be an expressive bold bright pink to correspond with body color. These proposed working standards were submitted by Mr. George "Cy" Letchak. Discussion followed in which the majority of members expressed the opinion that there were already too many colors. Upon motion by Mr. Lester Wells, seconded by Mr. S. T. Wheelus, Sr., and carried unanimously, the proposed working standards were rejected.

Upon motion by Mr. Lester Wells, seconded by Mr. Robert Sprague, the meeting adjourned.

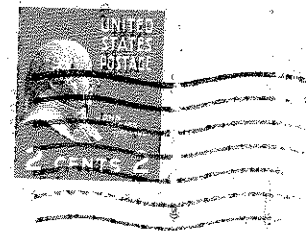
