

It enables us to exhibit our DUTCH in competition with the finest in the land; it gives us all a chance to get-together with other Dutch breeders from all parts of the United States and Canada; also, to meet and visit with and discuss our problems and opinions in person with the officers of our A. D. R. C.

A trophy or award of any kind won at a "National" may well be cherished for a win in competition with the best DUTCH the world has to offer certainly is a fine achievement. Our National Dutch show this year to be held in the "Motor City of the World", Detroit, Michigan, should certainly attract a very large and enthusiastic group of Dutch breeders from all localities not only due to the excellent centralized location, but because of the many comfortable accommodations such as fine Hotels, Motels, and food establishments, all reasonable in price.

Ballots have been received and tabulated for election of Judges and the members' choice by vote were James Blyth, Senior Judge, and George Bayliss, Junior Judge, two very capable men.

The M. S. D. C. in sponsoring the 1954 Show has left no stone unturned in their sincere efforts to make your visit in Detroit not only enjoyable, but a very memorable one - climaxed by the Grand Finale Banquet to be held at our Hotel headquarters - The Hotel 'Detroiter's beautiful Flamingo Room on Saturday evening. Don't miss the 1954 National 'Dutch' Show, or you will regret it, I'm sure. Meantime, I will be looking forward to a 'gabfest' with all of you in Detroit.

WE DO HAVE A TRADITION -- D E T R O I T !!

There are many reasons why we feel it is imperative for us to do our utmost to put over our National Dutch Show in good style this year.

One of the chief assets of the Notre Dame football team is their TRADITION. The place in the tradition of the American Dutch Club, held by the Michigan and Detroit Dutch fanciers is one of equal importance. I believe the Michigan Dutch breeders have done more for the Dutch Club than most of us realize. I should like to briefly review the history of the National Dutch Show, as we know it today.

It was the Michigan Dutch Club which first started the event. The first National Dutch Show was held in Detroit in 1932, and was held THERE annually until the outbreak of the second World War. At this time it was abandoned for a few years and was revived by the Indiana State Dutch Club and held in Indianapolis in 1944. Since that time it has been held in Muncie, Indiana; Dayton, Ohio; St. Louis, Missouri; Eaton, Ohio; Indianapolis, Indiana; Pueblo, Colorado; Beaumont, Texas; Abilene, Texas, and now returns to its CRADLE - DETROIT!!

At the time the first National Dutch Show was held in Detroit, the members of the Michigan Dutch Club constituted practically the entire organized effort for our breed. Our National Dutch Club was inactive and almost dead. The only active Dutch Clubs were the Michigan and New York State Clubs. The Michigan Club had some very active and alert members, and at the Michigan State Fair of 1953, I had the pleasure of renewing acquaintances with several of them who are still active in the Dutch fancy, Charlie Race, Lyle Pelkey, John Barnowski, and John Adair. The latter has no Dutch at present, but is still interested in the fancy.

The American Dutch Club was reorganized in 1934, and the President of the Michigan Dutch Club, Matt Welling, took office as secretary of the National association. The National Club had some of its best years while Matt served in this capacity.

I can honestly say that I saw some of the best Dutch I have ever seen while the National Shows were being held in Detroit. I also had the pleasure of making many friends who are still very dear to me. True, they did not have the quantity of Dutch at that time that we see today, but I honestly believe that the quality was better.

I have in front of me now a full report of the National Dutch Show held in Detroit in 1936, which was the Fifth Annual Show. Jim Blyth was judge of this show. Among names still prominent in Dutch circles; Best black, Best Dutch, Charles Williams; Best opposite black, Tom Shufflebotham; Best blue, Best opposite Dutch, Chas. J. Lewis; Best tortoise, Charles Williams; Best opposite tortoise, Joe Barnhart; Best a.O.C.; Ring #262, the first Chocolate imported to this country, owned and imported by Chas. O. Lewis. Also among the winners were John Furrer, Doug Prudomme, the Strickland Brothers. I call attention to these names simply to drive home the point "once IN DUTCH, always IN DUTCH." There were 165 Dutch exhibited by 23 exhibitors. At this time the total membership of the Club was only 75: which made an average of 2.2 entries per membership. If we as a Club were to maintain this average we COULD expect 1,000 entries at our 1954 National Dutch Show in Detroit.

I contend that before there can be a good Specialty Club, there must be a good Secretary. The Dutch Club has had its UPS and DOWNS, and the UPS have always been the result of having a good Secretary. Today, the Dutch Club is very fortunate in having an efficient, hardworking Secretary in Madeleine Grebles, and her assistant, Ray. I am sure that many of us do not realize the time they have to devote to the Club and the Dutch Reporter. In this issue there are thirteen Sweepstake Show reports. To cut stencils for this alone is a good five hour job. I am sure I don't know how they manage to accomplish so much; yet on top of all this they take on the National Dutch Show! They must be crazy, little mixed-up people. They were also instrumental in re-organizing the Michigan State Dutch Club, and work very hard in that organization. Let us tohers show that we appreciate their fine effort by helping make the return of the National Dutch Show to Detroit a very outstanding event!

I feel that this show is going to be our most successful show. Our Club is gaining momentum and with the careful planning going into this show and the aroused interest in the locality, I do not see how it can fail.

As one who never missed the shows in Detroit, I can promise and assure you that you will enjoy yourself. The show set-up is really ideal; plenty of room, all facilities, and good meeting halls. The Hotel Detroiter is to be Headquarters, and the hotel staff is being very cooperative. There is nothing that is being overlooked in the plans for your enjoyment and comfort while in Detroit. There is much for the visitor to see and do in and around Detroit, and the trip will be very worthwhile for those who travel far.

I feel that we owe the sponsors, the Michigan State Dutch Club, our full support. We have used to the utmost their support and work in the past; let us support their efforts for OUR show with Specials, ads for the catalog, and entries!


