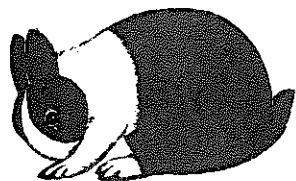

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

LATE ENTRIES

I have never contributed anything to the Dutch reporter but there is one thing that impressed me very much at one of the A.R.D.A. sanctioned shows and I thought I would mention it to all Show Secretaries as I think it is very important.

At a certain show that I attended a few months ago something happened and I do not think it is the first time it happened and it probably will not be the last time.

A certain breeder brought in several rabbits just a few minutes before the judging started and was permitted to enter them in the Show. No entry blank had been sent in before the Show. He had it with him.

It so happened that when they picked best Junior all colors they had been eliminated down to three rabbits and two of them were mine. It so happened that the third rabbit belonged to the breeder that made the entry just a short time before the judging started and this rabbit was picked as the best Junior all colors.

The point that I wish to stress is that this breeder made an illegal entry. There was a deadline on the entries at this show as there is on all sanctioned shows and it was not fair for this breeder to make this entry after the deadline.

It so happened that this breeder was a friend of mine and I simply ignored the matter but something like this can cause trouble even between friends.

Lets keep the records straight and avoid any complaining on this sort of thing. It was the Show Secretaries fault, as it was his duty to refuse this late entry, even if it was a close friend of his. Special privileges in the Show Room is very poor sportsmanship.

In closing I might say that I could have made a scene at this show and made it quite embarrassing for the Show Secretary. It so happened that I was among friends and did not press charges. However, a stranger in my position would no doubt have

looked at it from a different angle. As far as I am concerned it is a closed issue but I think it is the duty of every Show Secretary to enforce rules and regulations for his or her protection, also in all fairness to the exhibitor who has entered his rabbits and paid the entry fees before the deadline.

The average exhibitor I find can take a beating in the Show room good naturedly, Providing everything is on the up and up. That is good Showmanship.

When an exhibitor gets beat through some irregularity he is quite likely to make it rough for someone and will lose no time in advertising it.

For the welfare of all concerned as we go forward endeavoring to build up bigger and better Rabbit Shows, let us all frown upon irregularities and especially the LATE ENTRY.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

GRAY DUTCH

PODY COLOR: A uniformly ticked medium dark shade of Gray; agouti coated, carrying distinct color bands which are visible when blown into; under-color next to skin to be slate blue. Fur to carry a distinct ring color when blown into, and to be free from any brassy, or sandy tinge. Ticking to be carried evenly over cheeks, top of body, sides, down outside of rear legs, and ears. Narrow black lacing on ears desirable. Eye circles of white, or very light gray, should be narrow and inconspicuous.

BELLY COLOR: White surface color with slate blue undercolor extending from inside of rear legs over belly to the undercut. The undercut on the Gray Dutch is determined by blowing into the fur, and is the point of junction where the slate blue undercolor on the belly meets the white fur covering the forelegs and breast. The undercut should be a continuous line with the Gray ticked saddle to form a perfect circle around the body, the same as other varieties.

TAIL COLOR: Top of tail to match body color. Underside of tail to match belly color.

FAULTS: Avoid sandy, brassy, or brownish tinge in all sections. Avoid long black-tipped guard hairs.

DISQUALIFICATIONS: Undercut showing on the surface of belly color.
