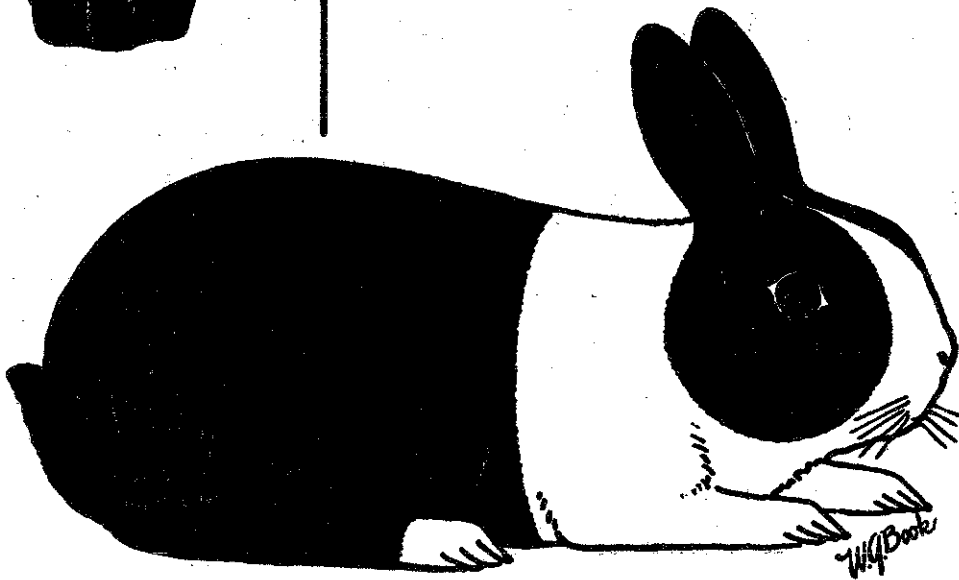

YOU CAN 'T BEAT THE DUTCH

RABBITS AND A BOY, AND HOW THEY GREW

All phases of life, be they good or bad, must have a beginning somewhere. My life with rabbits had its start way back in 1927, along with my brother Al's, when one of our older brothers was given a doe. Although we weren't the owners, this doe and the seven multi-colored babies that she soon produced were so fascinating that we both realized that rabbits were most interesting and beautiful. I was only seven and my brother six at that time. By 1929, we were started in business by a young chap who was paying court to our second oldest sister, who gave us (Al and myself) each a young doe. Al's was brown spotted and mine a solid steel. These rabbits were sisters and when they grew big enough to be mated, a couple of our older brothers contacted a benevolent neighbor and we had our does serviced. Subsequently followed what was one of the longest periods of my life. The does each had their nest boxes early. At the beginning the waiting was mostly out of curiosity, but when we first noticed the does carrying straw we were just brimmed with excitement, and not once, but dozens of times each day our petite hands would explore the nest box without much satisfaction, until one morning the happy occasion - not just one but two rabbits had rewarded our patience with litters of seven and nine! Immediately our dreams began to formulate our first strategy. We were not going to keep just one of the young, but make coops for all of the girl rabbits! It was this happy event that really put us on the trail of rabbit keeping.

The early thirties, when our family had to abandon farming, creat-

ed a struggle for keeping our cherished pets, which was often taxing, but never discouraging. I can still picture myself, sweeping up alfalfa leaves at the Stockyards and policing grain cars for some dusty feed. This was necessary, because being a large family and going through a National Depression made parental financial aid an impossibility. We often used to get up in the wee small hours of the morning to go to the railroad switch track to gather slats which had been used in refrigerator cars, to supply us with lumber to construct our hutch- es. We managed to keep our animals through the mid-thirties and until after our High School graduation. When war broke out and I was called to serve my country, I had to leave behind my small stock farming. I never left my love for them.

Came 1945 and wars end, I wasted little time in resuming my assoc- iation with the rabbit kingdom of the pet field. This was, however, interrupted only temporarily by the early stages of married life.

I am a great admirer of the enthusiasm children display in small stock and I take pride in the fact that, never has an enthusiastic child been encountered, that I would't slash prices, or give a rabbit outright, to help a child get started. I feel safe in saying that I have given more small stock away than most dealers ever thought of selling. This I do for the love of children and of animals.

The Good Lord blessed my with many, many pleasantries within the animal world, of which not the least is the chance to pass my exper- iences along to some child.

'Tis true that rabbits, pigeons and chickens keep me financially impoverished, but I know I live a richer life because of them. It matters not how much, or little, my financial gains might have been, but rather, that at the end of my trail, I may look back on a highway of happiness, fruitful with joys given and received. In reality I may die poor, but because of these things I shall have lived richly.

In conclusion I leave you with this thought, "If a little freckled faced boy comes into your yard and hangs his nose on the door of one of your rabbit coops, please don't shoo him away, instead offer to help him start with the beautiful Dutch." Believe me, the reward is there for the taking.

Some shows, al though they will charge you a dollar entry fee, if there are only one or two in a class will pay back no money at all.

It is my feeling, that if a club cannot put on a good show, they should save their efforts. If you have to drive any distance to reach a show, it costs plenty for gas, food and if you have to stay overnight motel fees, besides your entry fees, and like as not, someone will come around with their hand out for a donation for something or other. You like to start out with at least some hope of being able to win enough to help foot the bill, unless you are "loaded" as most of us are not.

I am talking about the so-called "big shows", not the small one

day table shows that most clubs put on to raise money, usually for the purpose of putting on a bigger show.

Most of us Dutch Breeders just can't afford to show and lose money every time, even when we win, just to get points. Some of the shows you can't hope to break even, even if you win everything. The shows that pay out on an equitable basis come out ahead in the long run, because they have the largest number of entries.

Thanks, a million, Mr. Early, for breaking the ice, now perhaps we will hear more breeder's opinions on this subject.

We all enjoy showing our Dutch, and it is sure frustrating to look over a show catalog and have to say, "I'd sure like to take in this show, but I guess I just can't afford it."
