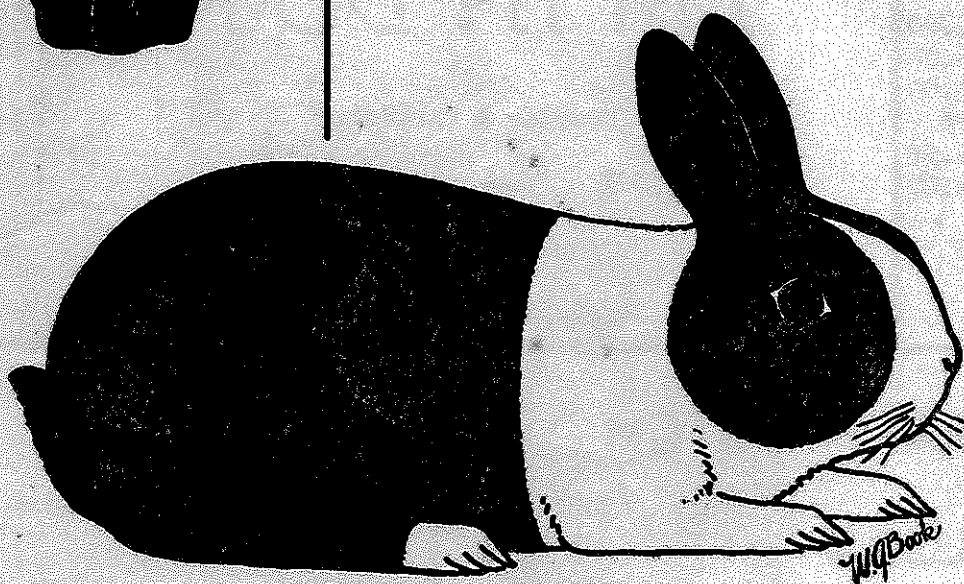


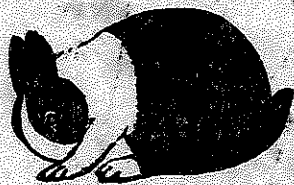

### DUTCH FUROR

From the "South Plains Area" of West Texas we have a write-up of a Dutch breeder of many years, L. E. (Ed) Settle.

Ed lives in Lubbock, where he has lived since he was a boy. After graduating from school and working at teaching, coaching, and several years with the State Dept. of Public Welfare, he ended with the Post Office Dept., where he now holds the title of Mail Foreman. Ed's wife, Rosa, who is also interested in rabbits, is Director of the Lubbock City-County Welfare Dept., and recently was chosen by the local Business and Professional Association as "Business Woman of the Year for 1959". Ed is active in church work, having recently served two terms as Chairman of the Official Board of a 1500 member church, and is Adult Sup't. of the Church School. He also is interested in photography and stamp collecting.

His grandchildren, of which he has five, also take some of his time and interest. Ed's two daughters are active; one is a secretary in a stat T. B. hospital, and the other is a housewife on a nearby farm.

Ed is active in local rabbit clubs, where he has held every office; and he has attended most of the ARBA Conventions since Long Beach, but missed the last two due to health conditions within the family circle.

He started raising rabbits in 1929, when he purchased a trio of Chinchillas from Ed Stahl, and still has some of the first place ribbons won at shows in 1930 and '31. Because of work commitments it was necessary to drop out of the rabbit business for a few years, but in 1943 he was back with New Zealands, but switched to Dutch on account of restricted space and hutch room. His rabbitry was called the Silver Star Rabbitry and consisted of 30 hutches. He has regularly supplied Dutch fryers to the Lubbock processing plant, which reports that the Dutch-type fryer is in good demand among its customers.

The growth of the city has covered Ed's home area and a very restricted residential district is now located where he lives; so he is no longer permitted to raise rabbits there. He recently has transferred his rabbit activities to the Scharnberg farm, where Jake and Lois also operate the Lazy Acre Rabbitry. Although they work together, Ed shows under the Silver Star and Jack shows under his own name.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

HOW WE BEAT THAT MID-WINTER BREEDING SLUMP

The summer of 1959 proved to be one of the best breeding seasons ever experienced in our rabbitry. To a point that was good. We had a fine herd of show animals and the sale of breeding stock was quite brisk, due to the fine publicity our little Dutch had been receiving on all fronts. The catch was that come the end of October our developing pens were full to running over with rabbits that couldn't qualify as either show rabbits or breeding stock. You guessed it - they were MEAT. This is the situation nearly every fall, to a lesser extent, but this year it was serious, as there were still litters with the does, both good prospects for "keepers" and just plain meat. We were faced with the usual prospect of just letting our does rest until more room was available. There is a limit to the number of rabbits a family of four can consume! Now this is bad, especially in the fall of the year, because if you let a doe rest too long at that time the chances of getting her bred back again before the end of February or March are pretty slim.

We were lucky in that a local processor began suddenly to beg for meat rabbits. I talked the situation over with him and he said that he thought he could build his market up to where he could use all of the rabbits he could get. He agreed to take ours first, if we would go all out to produce as many as we could.

At that time we had already waited too long and our does were either refusing service or not catching when the did. There hadn't been a challenge such as this offered since back in the war years of the mid-forties, and we were bound we wouldn't be licked! I had been reading everything that came out in the magazines on various types of colony raising of rabbits and certain phases of it had appealed to me. We have a large barn on our farm but do no farming ourselves, so do not need much storage space. Our granary is built with four large bins, about six by ten feet in size, so I decided to see what would happen if I put about ten does and a buck into one of these pens and let nature take its course.

We began by sorting out all of the young bucks we had and turning them over to the processor and holding back the does, even though we couldn't pedigree them - we were primarily interested in producing meat at this time. We selected a vigorous young buck about six months old and several does that were expendable, should the experiment prove a failure. The does weren't checked over the first time until the pen had been set up for two weeks. By palpation, we found only a couple of the does that were definitely bred and these were removed to breeding pens. At this point we learned that we had made our first (and only) serious mistake. A couple of the does we had put into the pen were apparently too young and were pretty badly chewed up. These were also removed and put into single holding pens to heal their wounds. We added some more old does to make up the number in the pen (we have never exceeded twelve does at any one time). From this time on the does were checked once ev-

ery week or ten days, with two or three more being bred the second time. On the third examination there were EIGHT BRED DOES removed and the average has been very high ever since.

We make it a practice to change the buck about every three or four weeks, just because it seemed like a good idea. At this point we are being much more selective as to the rabbits being placed in the pen - earmarking all of the does and keeping careful records as to just when they were put in (if they have not been bred after six weeks, we consider them loafers and off they go to the market). We also keep a record of just when a buck has been removed and a new one introduced so that all but a few litters that might kindle within 27-32 days of such a change can be pedigreed should we want to save any of them. I suppose another and perhaps better plan might be to wait about four days before putting the new buck in.

One of the more remarkable things about this system is the high percentage of these does that have saved and raised their litters! Other winters, we have considered ourselves very fortunate if even half of the does that kindled in cold weather saved their litters, but at this writing we have lost ONLY THREE LITTERS! I am inclined to think that the reason for this is that having the freedom of such a large space, combined with the presence of a buck, these does don't get a chance to sit around and accumulate fat, but come out of the colony pen in good hard flesh condition.

I have not myself, nor would I advise anyone else using this system, to discontinue hand breeding for several reasons. One of these is that I would not risk some of our best bucks in a pen of this type, and also it is not good policy to have all of your does bred to just a few bucks as is the result of this practice. Our system is to start attempting to hand breed our better does about the time the litter is six weeks old (or earlier if she has a litter of three or four). We remove all of the young bucks at this time, and at eight weeks, we remove the does and if the doe is not bred back, we try her again. At the end of ten days, if we cannot feel the young and the buck in the colony pen is at all compatible (that is, one that we would not mind having this doe bred to) into the colony pen she goes, releasing her pen for another bred doe. Believe me, breeding pens are ALWAYS at a premium around here this winter, as the fellows just can't keep up with the need for them by building new ones or remodeling old ones, so any loafers just have to go!

We have just set up another bin for a colony pen so that we can put two colors to work at one and the same time, and I have a nice lot of young does that will soon be ready to get started. You will find a few battle scars on your does by this system, so I wouldn't advise the inclusion of any does that you plan to use for future shows, but if your aim is for more youngsters at a time when most breeders are becoming discouraged by far too few litters, you might give it a try. Who knows how many grand champions may have been conceived in our granary this winter, besides that, for the first winter in many years our meat rabbits have been more than paying the feed bill!
