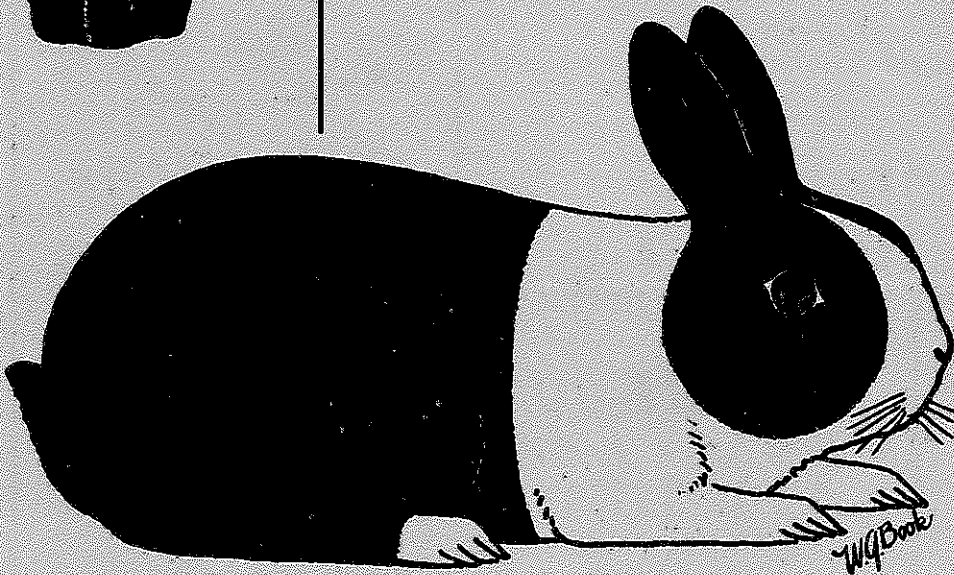
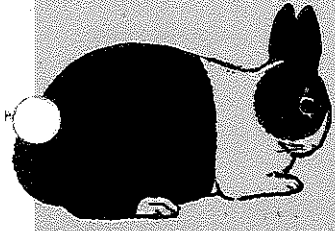

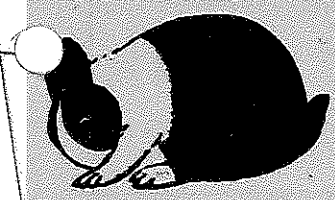

Many of the Michigan and other Dutch breeders have had occasion to meet both this month's man in the spotlight, and his rabbits. His name is Clyde L. Smith and he lives in Detroit, at 6715 Faust St.

In 1919 Mr. Smith bought his first rabbits, Belgians, from Charlie Givson, who also lived in Detroit. After a few years he acquired some of the New Zealand Reds which at that time were a lemon color, as compared to the Reds of today. This breed was followed by Flemish, Black and Tans, Havanaz, and Checkered Giants. The Checkeredreds were favored for quite a few years, but finally Ray Grables sold him a pair of Dutch with which he thought he'd experiment. After a few litters he realized that Dutch was for him, because of their beauty, ease of handling, fine in showroom, and delicious for a Sunday dinner, and only take half the hutch space of the larger breeds.

Mr. Smith is now 65 years of age and is a retired Police Officer of Detroit. His rabbitry consists of 18 holes, located in half of his garage. An extra lot beside his house takes care of his waste, and it raises a wonderful garden. He enjoys the shows, and meeting the wonderful people who are all ready to help a person in trouble (he knows from experience). He's sure he will continue to raise the little Dutchman, for "You Can't Beat the Dutch."

As you may know, if you have studied our Constitution and By-Laws, it is one of the duties of your secretary to keep the membership posted on the doings of its officers as pertains to your Club. This is to inform you that your officers have been very busy since the close of the meetings at Ft. Worth.

You were informed in the December issue of the Dutch Reporter, via the President's message that our Vice-President for many years, "Jerry" Leisenring had tendered his resignation from that office. After careful consideration this resignation was accepted by the Board of Directors. Mr. Bayliss, with the Board's approval (unanimously) chose to elevate our very active Board Member, and Chairman of the Ways & Means Committee, Clinton Dennis, to the office of Vice-President.

This appointment created a vacancy on the Board of Directors which Mr. Bayliss chose to fill, again with the rest of the Board's unanimous approval, Mr. Don Reid of Lockport, Illinois. Both of these men have accepted these appointments, so we begin the year with a full slate of officers.

Another resignation that was to take effect on Jan. 1, 1961 was Mr. Hall's as Publicity Director. This has proved to be a bigger problem, and our president has asked Mr. Hall to continue in this office for another 30 days to give him more time to locate someone willing to tackle the job. So until further notice all correspondence with regard to publicity items will be sent to Mr. Hall as in the past.

Another matter that has been acted upon by your Board was a request for the use of our Club's Emblem by the Indiana State Dutch Club, which the Board denied in the following terms: "The Board voted against any public use of any part of the Club's Official Emblem." However there was a recommendation by the Board, that a small quantity of cuts or mats be purchased and sold to interested parties at a slight profit. The cuts or mats to be of the Official Emblem, with the word "Member" incorporated into the emblem. These should soon be available through the Publicity Director.

At the same time a request by the ARBA through their secretary's office, that we (and other specialty clubs) alter the name of our club from "American Dutch Rabbit Club" to something like "Dutch Rabbit Club of America" because the name was confusing, inasmuch as the Dutch Rabbit is not American in origin and many were calling it the "American Dutch" rather than just "Dutch". It was the opinion of the Board that such a change would involve a great deal of expense, as all of our cuts would have to be replaced and much of the printed material on hand would have to be discarded and replaced, and therefore voted against any such change at this time.

Much correspondence has been carried on with regard to the revision of the Constitution and By-Laws in order to bring them up to date for publication in our forthcoming new Guide Book. One of the most important changes to be acted upon by the membership is the proposed separation of the Dutch Reporter and the Secretary's office. I have been requested to pass along some of my personal thoughts regarding such a change, by Clinton Dennis, Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee.

I would first like to state that it is my feeling that the section of our By-Laws spelling out the apportionment of funds as regards the secretary's fees is much too loosely stated. Under the present wording the Secretary COULD take half of all monies paid into the treasury with the exception of membership fees, new and renewal. As anyone with half an eye can see this could very soon prove ruinous to the Club treasury. Personally, I am willing to continue in my job, including the publishing of the Dutch Reporter, for 12½% of all membership fees, both new and renewal, and 1/2 of all show sanction fees. I realize that under the present set-up, this does not amount to any appreciable cut in the amount paid to me, but should the proposed plan of having regional members on the Publicity Committee, one of whose duties would be the securing of additional advertising for the Dutch Reporter, this could mean a very considerable increase in funds available to carry on Dutch Club business.

With regard to the proposed separation of the Dutch Reporter from this office, I would like to make this statement: I don't think there is anyone in a better position than I am to evaluate this situation. As some of you know, for several years before I became your secretary, I published the Dutch Reporter under the editorship of Madeleine Grables. Therefore, I am in a position to understand the problems such an arrangement present. So very many items having to pass through the secretary's office before coming to the publisher meant unnecessary delays not only in material being received for publication, but delay in publication due to complete lack of anything to publish. It meant a great deal of duplication of effort, many trips back and forth, both for the secretary and the publisher, many phone calls, and some errors. A separate membership file had to be set up and kept up to date, a separate file of all sweepstake shows had to be maintained and should there be any error in the published reports, this required considerable letter writing, from secretary to publisher and show secretary to pin down the source of the errors. Not the least of the problems that presents itself to me is the question of just

how the editor would be compensated for the large amount of work he/she would take on to carry out this job. No one who has ever had anything to do with a job like this could expect anyone to take it on just for the fun they might get out of it. The Dutch Reporter is not now self-supporting, so where would the funds come from to get it off the ground?

These are my thoughts on the subject and I know the committee would welcome any ideas that anyone else might have regarding this problem. The pages of the Dutch Reporter are always open for any contributions on either side of any controversial subject and I will welcome all comments as long as they are in good taste and do not reflect personal rancor.

I have finally received information that Best Junior Dutch at the Ft. Worth Convention was won by Jack Boughton with a black junior doe. The leg cups will be on their way to the winners within the next week or ten days. Please inform this office when you have received yours.

You will find elsewhere in this issue, the report of the Elections Committee with regard to the second balloting on judges for the 1961 National Dutch Show and the 19-61 ARBA Convention. I regret to state, at this time I have received acceptance from no one of these judges, so verification will have to be delayed until next month.

Dear Mrs. Weinhardt:

I am writing you about a subject that has been on my mind for a long time. I do not know how the other members feel, but I do not think the Dutch Reporter should give any, should we say "credit", to people who will not pay dues in the ADRC.

In the Reporter we publish the show reports, and anyone (member or not) who has an animal place, has their name down, but only ADRC members are given credit in the points department.

I do not think these people deserve any credit if they will not pay dues in the club.

Other specialty clubs put NAM (not Ass'n. member) in place of the name of a non-member in show reports in their newsletters.

I think the ADRC would get more new members if this idea was adopted by the Dutch Reporter. Most breeders look at the show reports when they are planning to purchase stock, therefore the people who show Dutch, and are not members, will join the ADRC to get their neames in the Dutch Reporter when they win in shows, hoping to get orders for their stock from people who read the Dutch Reporter.

I am not suggesting the Dutch Reporter adopt this suggestion because I feel I can gain personally, because I not a person who is out to sell a lot of stock.

I am just trying to build up the ADRC by getting more breeders to join and work for the ADRC.

I hope you will give some thought to this suggestion. I would like very much to hear your views on this.

Dear Mrs. Weinhardt:

I wish you would put a notice in the Dutch Reporter:

First of all Best Opposite of Variety of Dutch is entitled to a Grand Champion leg providing there are 5 rabbits and 3 exhibitors. At some shows the Best Opposite of Variety in Dutch is not picked by the judge because he is not aware that it is entitled to a leg. I suggest that the Dutch Club Sweepstake should include \$1.00 for Best Opposite of Variety in each color to be paid by the sponsoring club in addition to the \$1.00 for Best of each color, which would force the Best Opposite to be picked.

Also, I have had trouble getting show secretaries to give me a leg for Best Op-

posite of Variety because they think if it is a doe or buck there must be 5 in its own class, such as 5 senior bucks, 5 senior does, 5 junior bucks or 5 junior does. This is not correct. Best Opposite of Variety takes in all of the bucks or does. If a senior buck is picked Best Opposite, you count the senior bucks and junior bucks, also. Same if a senior doe wins Best Opposite of variety, you count the senior does and the junior does. I have enclosed a letter from Jimmy Blyth explaining this which I would like returned. Please see what can be done about this because I have seen exhibitors at more than one show walk away not knowing that they were entitled to a leg on one of their rabbits and not getting it.
