

A beginner just starting out with Dutch enjoys seeing his name or, rabbitry appearing in a National publication taking a fifth place almost as much as the more experienced breeders do as, BOB, BOS or Best Color. I definitely believe this move is a step in the wrong direction, more especially since our Editor doesn't seem to mind the complexities involved in compiling this data. Since there could possibly be others that regret this change as I do, I would suggest this be included in the next ballot put out for membership vote.

Dear Mrs. Weinhardt:

Although I'm only in my second year of ADRC membership, I'd like to comment on the cutting down of the show reports in the Dutch Reporter.

Every month I'd be the first out to the mailbox looking for my Dutch Reporter. When I first started I rarely won a BOB or BOS, so my thrill came in seeing my name under second or third -- I'm sure many new members feel this same way and I'm sure even old members enjoy seeing their names and seeing who beat them or vice-versa.

So I say let's not ruin a good thing and cut up the show reports so no one enjoys them.

The following letter was sent to me with these comments, by Chas. O. Lewis of New York: "Just received the enclosed letter from E. Mitchell the man from whom I bought the first Chocolate Dutch to come to America and the following year a trio of Blacks which started me on my merry way.

"Thought you might be interested in the contents and perhaps a mention of their problems might be of interest to our American Dutch breeders. Mitchell has always been my idea of a perfect fancier. After I had imported the Chocolates I corresponded with him and at that time was doing good with Blues, but the boys from Binghamton, N. Y. were trimming me in Blacks which I told him. He wrote me suggesting that I let him obtain a trio of Blacks from Mr. Phillips whose Pytchley Queen had been best Dutch the past two years at the big Crystal Palace show. The first time the same Dutch made it twoce in a row. At that time I was not in too good financial shape and told

him that I would let him know when I was ready. That was during the summer. Then about a week before Christmas I got a letter from him advising me that he had shipped on the Cunard line, a trio of Black Dutch from Phillips and told me what broker to contact for clearance in New York City. I phoned the broker and gave him the details. I heard nothing more 'till the day before Christmas when my wife and I, on returning from our late shopping that afternoon, found two crates on our back porch containing a trio of Black Dutch. There I had a trio of Dutch and had not paid anyone one cent! Nothing for the animals, the shipping charges, the brokers fees and the local shipping charges. Some Christmas present, eh? I immediately wrote Mitchell and his first letter just said the Cunard charges were \$7.50. I had to write again and after a month I finally got word from him that the cost of the trio was \$25.00. In the meantime the broker and local express received their charges. Just imagine, a trio of Blacks for \$25.00 plus Cunard only \$5.50. Broker \$2.50 and local express less than one dollar. Try to match that today. Under those circumstances wouldn't you say that Mr. Mitchell was a real fancier?" Following is Mr. Mitchell's letter:

Dear Mr. Lewis:

Thanks for your Xmas card. Sometime ago (it seems ages now), I sent you a parcel of Fur & Feather which I trust you received as I have had no letter from you to that effect. I am making up another one immediately after Xmas. Shows are getting worse now to attend. Rail charges are up 300%. Feed way up in the same proportion. This together with the craze for Chinchilla breeding is knocking the old fancy breeds very hadly. Dutch club has gone down from 1,000 to about 450 (members). I cannot understand this new fad lasting so very long when quite a lot of novices gave as much as \$750.00 for a start in the new fancy (buck & 2 does -- Chinchillas). I hope they don't burn their fingers in the process of trying to make their fortunes out of something they don't understand.

We have had a most miserable year so far as the weather goes. Nasty cold winds making gardening anything but a pleasure. The fog has gone now after taking severe toll of elderly people. I have taken the precaution of being indoors this winter. At 82 one has to make up ones mind to go slow and not take liberties.

GREAT RABBITS, GREAT SHOWMEN

(Editor's Note: The following article, also appeared in my mail. It first appeared in the Dec. 1, 1962 issue of the "Arizona Farmer-Ranchman" along with a very nice picture of Ernie Parks, Nicholas Romley, C. E. Lewis and Jess Williams each

holding what I take to be their favorite Dutch rabbit. Of course, after reading the Arizona State Fair show report, I might surmise the one C. E. is holding belongs to his lovely wife, Marjory, but I won't tell anyone! The magazine was sent to me by Jess Williams.)

Believe it if able, but the champion Dutch rabbit showmen of the whole U.S. live and breed rabbits right in Arizona's Salt River Valley.

Maybe they're the nation's champion Dutch rabbit breeders, too. Nobody who knows Ernest R. Parks and Nick Romley would put it past them. They have done the impossible so often in the past that rabbit fanciers have lost their capacity for astonishment.

That Ernie and Nick won first and second honors for 1961 in the American Dutch Rabbit Club, and that they are conspiring to bring the Club's 1964 convention to Phoenix, came out after they had won more ribbons and other awards than they could count at the Arizona State Fair.

Annually the ADRC awards prizes to the members who exhibit in the most shows and win win the most points. As mentioned, Parks was first in 1961 and Romley was second, on the strength of winnings at more than 20 shows in Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado and California. They'll probably wind up in the same positions this year, for they have extended their scope of activities in Texas.

Parks and Mrs. Parks operate Parks' Petland, northeast of Glendale on Lateral 19½, giving full time to rabbits and pigeons and Lord knows what else. But Nick's Rabbitry at 2701 N. 21st. St., Phoenix, is a side issue with the Romley familey. So Mick claims, although it seems that he can always get away from his regular empolyment whenever there is a chance to compete in another rabbit show.

Precious Cargo

They load their prize stock into Parks' especially fitted truck and take off, usually with 400 to 425 rabbits aboard. In summer they have to travel at night, at least until they get out of the lowlands, since rabbits are notorious for low heat tolerance. In all the dozens of trips they made they haven't lost one bunny. Other breeders just can't believe this, and at the 1962 Dutch Club convention they just couldn't believe it when the official tabulation showed that two Arizonans had won more ribbons and money than anyone else.

For two or three years before that, Parks and Romley had been placing high in the tabulations and 1961 they were away out in front. There's hardly a doubt that they'll repeat in 1962.

At the same 1962 convention they put in an early bid for the 1964 gathering. Their campaign will be pushed vigorously next April when the Club's annual membership meeting is held in Bakersfield, Calif. There they'll have the help of Jess Williams, Phoenix, president of the Central Arizona Rabbit Breeders Ass'n. and himself an enthusiastic Dutch man.

Incidentally, there's still another organization, Arizona Rabbit Fanciers, of which Ernie Parks is president. It is restricted to breeders of purebred rabbits, while the CARBA is open to anyone who raises rabbits for the market or just for the fun of it. If that 1964 convention does come to Phoenix, both groups will participate in making arrangements and entertaining the delegates.
