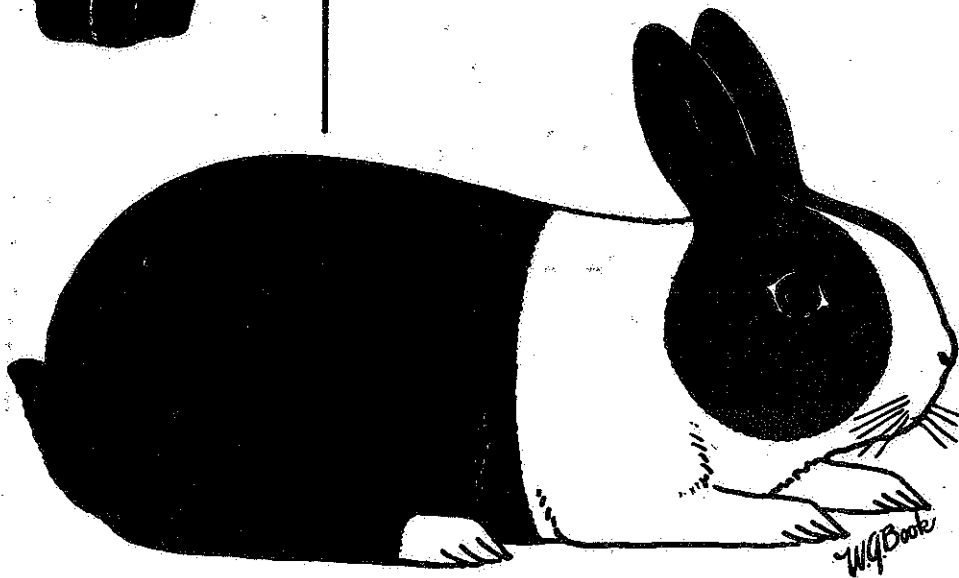

Minutes, Regular Meeting

Pomona, California, October 25, 1965

The meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order at 3:00 P.M. by President Bill Summers. Officers present were: President Bill Summers, Directors Tom Shufflebotham, Don Reid and Don Lovejoy. Not present were: Vice-President, Jack Boughton, Secretary-Treasurer Jessie Weinhardt, Directors Clinton Dennis, Don Guthrie, and Wm. Hobin. President Summers asked Dorothy Bayliss to act as Secretary-Pro-tem.

A letter was read from Secretary Jessie Weinhardt sending best wishes for a good convention to the club members, as she could not attend.

The minutes of the meeting at Atlanta, Georgia, April 14, 1965 were approved as read, by motion Don Reid, 2nd. Walter Cook. Motion carried.

Under reports of Committees Don Reid, of Standard Committee, reported that the Gray Dutch standard had been settled and that the compromise standard will be published.

The report of Election Committee Chairman, Al Meier, was read.

The current Financial Report as provided was read to the members assembled. A motion by Don Reid that the Secretary keep three separate accounts. Motion seconded by George Bayliss, and carried. The accounts to be as follows: (1) Dutch Reporter, (2) Sweepstake series, and (3) General fund.

Tom Shufflebotham, Chairman of Guide Book Committee reported that he has turned a complete financial report of funds collected for the Guide Book to the Secretary, but there has never been any report published on this as to how many of the accounts are still due &/or collectible.

Don Lovejoy reported that he needs more articles for the Dutch Reporter. He reported that all articles are to be sent to the Secretary as committee chairman and that she sends debatable articles to the other committee members for acceptance. Mr. Shufflebotham stated that he would like to know why an article of his was not published when it had been approved for publishing. He advised that he re-wrote and re-submitted the article and that it still had not been published.

It was announced that the sellers class entries should be submitted to Leonard Weir. The class will be handled at the conclusion of the judging of the Dutch in the showroom.

Mr. Bayliss spoke on the cover of the Dutch Reporter and advised that it was copyrighted and that the Canadian Reporter is copying our cover, without clearing the use

Mr. Youngblood and Chas. O'Dell announced that the National Dutch Show would be held at Amarillo, Texas on April 22-23-24, 1966 and that they were issuing an invitation to all to attend.

Mr. Shufflebotham brought to the attention of the group the fact that the National Dutch Club Shows only have about 100 to 125 entries with from \$200 to \$300 for premiums, while our National Convention has from 200 to 300 Dutch and only around \$50 to \$60 given for specials.

Mr. Paquette spoke on the situation which is current in most of the Annual ADRC shows -- that is that they are more or less local affairs and what is needed is reciprocal entries to and from other areas.

Mr. Toebe announced that the 1966 Annual ARBA Convention will be held in Louisville, Kentucky next year and asked the club for their help and their suggestions for breed chairman.

Discussion was held regarding putting out another Special Dutch Issue of Small Stock Magazine. Don Lovejoy suggested that each area should be organized and canvassed for obtaining ads and material.

A motion was made by Don Ried and seconded by Ron Gilbertson that the President appoint a special committee to start the wheels in motion toward putting out the Special Issue of Small Stock.

Special donations for Dutch at National Convention at Louisville were made by members and turned over to President Summers.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

SECRETARY'S CHIT CHAT

FORGIVE ME! FORGIVE ME! FORGIVE ME! I find I made a grave error in copying the Convention show report from the official copy furnished me by the show committee and instead of listing the placements for the Chocolate Junior Bucks, I let my eye stray down to the next set of placements and gave the list of Tortoise winners instead! You will find the correct listing of the Chocolate placements and a corrected set of Sweepstake Points on another page. I'm sorry I still do not have the list of placements for the Seller's Class but hope to obtain them from the Dutch Breed Chairman, Leonard Weir before the January Dutch Reporter is published.

You will find enclosed in this issue of the Dutch Reporter a slip sheet for your use in placing your ad in the 1966 National Dutch Show Catalog. Please note that all ads are to be mailed to Max Henrix; 2911 S. Marrs, Amarillo, Texas and all Specials to: Mrs. Floyd Hustead, Show Secretary, R# 3, Box 199, Amarillo Texas. Come on fella's lets show by our contributions and other support that our National Dutch Show ISN'T just another regional Dutch show such as those put on by the various State and area Dutch Clubs, out it is in truth a NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW, supported by everyone of us. Surely YOU can spare one dollar, at least.

Bob Byrne promised me some interesting clippings from "Fur and Feather", the publication of the British Rabbit Breeders and he fulfilled his promise along with these words: "Here are the two Fur and Feather clippings on Dutch too large. Note Leeds show report on Dutch at Yorkshire -- also Lancashire Dutch and North West English Clubs report." I quote the Leeds report as follows: "Best in show went to a Tortoiseshell buck shown by Mr. Bentley.

"A very noticeable feature was the bulkiness of many of the blacks. Most in this category failed badly in type and one or two were really coarse in addition. It would appear that much more attention should be paid to type. If not, we shall soon find 90 percent of the breed will fail badly in this respect. Odd exhibits in some of the other colours were not without faults in this respect.

"Colour was not as good as it could be in several colours, while many cheeks were more or less faulty. Chocolates were disappointing with only one entry. There is a good

opportunity for breeders to take up this colour."

Much the same story is reported by the Dutch judge at the Lancashire Dutch Adult Stock Show held at Rochdale on Oct. 23. "It was a day for the heavyweights at the Lancashire Dutch Club's s s at Rochdale. When we have lost the compact and cobby animal then the Dutch has lost its beauty, to us of the older end of Dutch breeders at any rate. If it comes to having to take a pair of scales to judge Dutch then it is time to keep them at home and start again.

"The markings are there to work from, there is no doubt, and with a little more care and study I am sure we shall arrive at the beauty of Dutch of years long passed. A few I had to put among the coddling cards because they had been stripped of their pads to try to make the stops look shorter. There is a happy medium in these things, so do not go beyond that. If you do your chances are lost.

"I found that I am not the only Dutch breeder who is troubled with those pulls on to the shoulders. We can, and must, try to get rid of these, using all the brains and thought at our disposal. After all, this is the interest in breeding."

Aside from the obvious fact that the breeders in England are having the same problems that we are (which I will comment on in greater detail later), the above is extremely thought provoking to me. First, and I think most important, is this thought -- after all these many, many years of breeding and showing which has been done by the breeders of England, they still consider an important part of EVERY show report (which by the way, I believe are made by the judges) are such comments as those above made by the judge on the over-all quality of the exhibits. I gather that to them breeding good Dutch is a serious business and their judges are the experts who can, and try to guide them toward perfection. We either go to a show, listen to what the judge has to say and go home and forget it, or send our rabbits and get them back, along with their coop tag bearing the judges remarks on ONE rabbit only! We have learned little except this one individuals strength or weakness (or perhaps the judges personal likes and dislikes). How many times have you heard it said of any one show or judge -- "Oh, Well, that is only one man's opinion." Here is the point I am getting at -- we, the membership of the American Dutch Rabbit Club select what we believe to be the very best judges of Dutch in the country to do the honors at our National Dutch Show and the ARBA Convention show each year. Why shouldn't it be required of these judges, as part of their job to sit down and analyze those classes handled by them for publication in this bulletin? I've often hear it asked, as when the National Dutch Show was held in Wilmington, Delaware, and now when it is going to Texas -- "What kind of Dutch do they have there?" Perhaps such a report would help to answer this question, and more important it would help to standardize Dutch all over the country so one would not have to ask such questions. I'd like to see some good, sound discussion on this subject via these pages, wouldn't you?

Now to go back to the remarks on markings -- I've been much impressed the last couple of years by certain breeders whose rabbits (mostly blacks, but I've seen it in other varieties) seem to be wearing a stole. They may have good color, good clean blazes and cheeks down to the jaw -- nice clean necks (in the back), but on the sides the color just seems to spread and spread and spread. Sure it has a nice round line, but it just didn't know when to stop. Believe me, a half inch too much on the sides can spoil the whole effect of an otherwise well marked rabbit. The worst part of it is, I don't believe the breeders who are affected with this fault even realize it. That's one problem -- what's yours?

How are your winter babies coming? Say, I found one in the nest on New Year's morning that just better live to grow up! Like to take it to Amarillo -- just might beat Chet Roberts.
