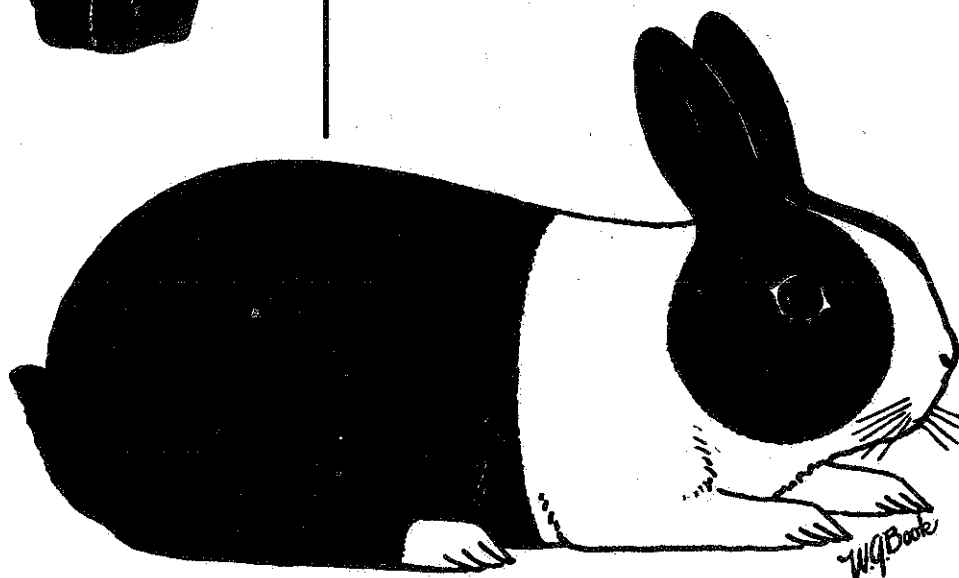

Hello, there everybody out in Dutchland! We Buckeyes of the Ohio State Dutch Club hope that all of you, and we do mean all of you, will take your vacation the last week-end in April in 1967 and come out and visit with us. Of course we want you to bring all of those nice Dutch that I've been figuring points on. Do you know that Jessie has a bigger job than I thought! There sure are a lot of you, and quite a few of you must have some real nice ones from what the show reports have listed. So bring them all to Wilmington in April and we'll see if Don and Tom can get home by the middle of March.

I've always wondered what a theoretical-all-inclusive show would be like. It probably couldn't happen but wouldn't it be fun if all of us could get together sometime in one place with all of our good ones? It would sure take a lot of planning for each one of us would have to prepare well in advance for our vacation on a certain date. No one would dare get sick or let their close relatives get ill. THE STEEL-GRAY DUTCH RABBIT

The secretary of the American Dutch Rabbit Club has asked me to write an article on the Steel-gray Dutch. This I will attempt with some misgivings, even though I have

bred this color for some time (Sandstorm Rabbitry won the Water Wonderland Trophy for Best Steel at the National Dutch Show in 1954) and also because there seems to be a need for a better understanding of this very challenging and beautiful color.

For several weeks now, I have been doing some research on this matter and have discussed it at length with breeders here and abroad. I sincerely believe there must be a change in the wording of the standard before we will come to a real steel-gray color. The recognition of the blue-gray to exhibition circles would also help this matter along. Let me show what I mean by a comparison of the definition of this color by comparing the ADRC Standard and the United Kingdom Dutch Rabbit Club Standard. We must remember that these two "official" documents are describing the same color, or are they?

The ADRC Standard says of Steel-Gray on page 45 of the present Guidbook; "A dark uniform steel-gray. This color is brought out with a moderate amount of light gray tipped guard hairs evenly distributed over the entire colored sections of the rabbit. Color to resemble a fresh break in a piece of steel, with slate-blue undercolor carried down to the skin. Under portion of tail, belly, and inside of hind legs to be as near the body color as possible."

The UKDRC Yearbook for 1965 says of the Steel Gray on pg. 23: "Dark steel gray merging to pale slate blue in the under colour. The whole interspersed with black guard hairs. The medium bright and evenly ticked shade is the one to aim for and the extreme tips of the fur will be tipped with steel blue or gray. The mixture to carry well down the sides, flanks and hind feet. Belly colour will be a lighter shade varying with the top colour: underside to tone with the belly colour. Ears to match body. Eyes deep hazel."

One of England's Steel breeders writes this of breeding steels, and perhaps he sums up several things in his remarks. Jack Cliff, winner of the 1963 Steel Cup Award says of steel breeding. "Several methods are used to breed the Steel-Gray Dutch rabbit, some of which produce Steel-Greys with a pronounced brown gray color on the hind feet, a fault which in my opinion has spoilt an otherwise good specimen. So, some years ago, I decided to experiment in otherwise unorthodox methods and after a fairly few attempts I found that I could produce the colour desired by using the following method.

"Mate a Black buck that is black and blue bred, preferably whose sire and dam are blacks that carry blue blood on both sides, to a Pale Grey doe that is Steel Gray bred on both sides. From this mating a small percentage of steel grays will emerge of good colour which should be kept if the markings are reasonably good. However, one can expect to get at least one blue or blue-gray. If one does and it is a doe by all means hang on to it and mate this rabbit to a black buck that is pure Steel grey bred and you will get the true Steel grey colour.

"Once you have acquired this you can breed Steel to Steel for about five generations after which the colour will start to appear dull. So once more a dash of blue must be introduced. This can be done by using a pure black and blue bred black buck bred to the best coloured Steel doe you have and you are then all set for a few more generations.

"I must add that I am a firm believer in only using stock of a good short coat and as well marked as possible. This method has proved itself to me over the years and I pass it along as being a very successful one.

"I have also found that any Blacks bred from these matings are of good colour that lasts and have a deep eye colour which eliminates the chances of specked or wall eye.

"If what I have written helps anyone to success, I will be most satisfied for the time spent writing."

These remarks will not answer all the questions concerning the Steel-gray Dutch, but they should make us think about our own standard, our rabbits, and our methods of producing steels. Truly, do we have many steels, or lots of very dark grays?

As I see it, the best and quickest things we can do to really improve our Steels are the following:

1. Re-word the standard to really describe a steel, not a dark gray.
2. Recognize the Blue-gray as an exhibition animal.
3. Realize that we need what is called "gun metal blue" and not black in our steels.

These three steps would bring almost immediate results to those who are breeding Steel Dutch. It would not hurt the Grays either since the re-wording of their standard in recent months.

Shall we give this very beautiful color its just due or shall we continue to make it a secondary color to some others. It is one of the best, so why relegate it to secondary?

I have just finished compiling a list of the Best Dutch & Best Opposite Dutch from the 51 shows reported in the last 2 issues of the Dutch Reporter. I t ought maybe our fellow Dutch Raisers would like to see the results, so here goes: Black Best Dutch, 29 out of 51; Black Best Opp., 31 out of 51; Blue Best Dutch, 10 out of 51; Blue Best Opp. Dutch, 11 out of 51; Chocolate, Best Dutch 5 out of 51; Chocolate, Best Opp. Dutch 5 out of 51; Tortoise, Best Dutch 3 Out of 51, Tortoise, Best Opposite, 1 out of 51; Steel Best Dutch, 3 out of 51; Steel Best Opposite, 4 out of 51; Gray, Best Dutch, 1 out of 51; Gray, Best Opp., 0 out of 51.

As the above results show the Black & Blue combination won top honors 81 out of 102 in Best Dutch & Best Opposite Dutch.
