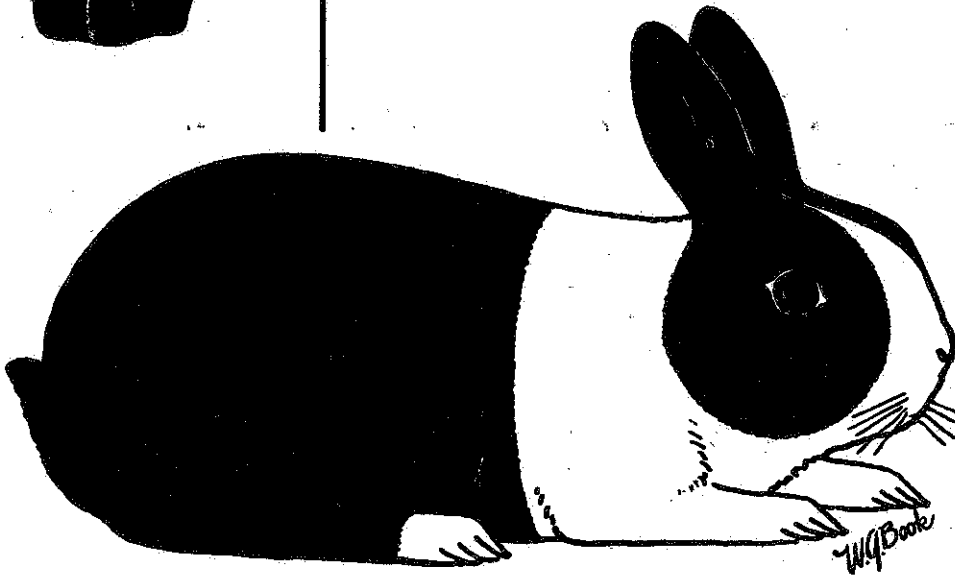

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Spring is just around the corner and it's time to start breeding those does for summer and fall show animals. Haven't heard much from Stan Goeglein about the National Dutch Show to be held in Fort Wayne, Indiana, April 26-28. I plan on going and Bob Harris tells me he's coming along too. Plans for the National Convention to be held in Pueblo, Colorado the second week in October are coming along nicely. I wrote Clyde and Doris Jones to be breed chairman and secretary and was pleasantly surprised by their enthusiasm in accepting. There are a lot of people out this way who feel that this will be one of our finer conventions. I hope to see Dutch from the Eastern, Mid-Western, Southwest and West Coast at this convention. As show superintendent I can assure you that your rabbits will receive the best of care.

Alan Miller has been appointed to the position of Sweepstakes Director. This change is being made to allow our secretary more time to devote to the Dutch Reporter. I have asked Jessie to have each issue in the mail 10 days prior to the first of the month. In this way even with the slowness of the mail you will receive your Reporter the same month for which it was intended.

I've always been interested in different breeding programs and whenever I visit someones rabbitry I llok their animals over closely to see how they're doing. A breeding program has been likened to mixing paing and to a certain extent this is probably true. For instance you must have in the background of your breeding animals all the elements that you would like to combine for your ideal animal. You can't create the good points of an animal unless they are in the background to begin with. If they are not in the background then you must introduce them through another animal. The measure of your success in a breeding program will depend on the quality you begin with. Take a look at your own stock and ask yourself what is the main failing in your herd. I try to evaluate my herd each year and select animals for future breeding stock that do not have the failings that hurt me the year before. If I have a failing that seems to be pretty general throughout the herd then is the time to go outside the herd for help. I've been watching a friend of mine putter with Tortoise for some time now. To begin with he was getting nicely colored and marked animals but the type was on the rangy side. In order to improve the type he made several different types of outcrosses. The result has been that he now has mach typier animals but the color and markings are off. In my opinion his herd is in much better shape now as he has all the essential elements to work with. From now on it will be a matter of selection to combine the best points in the herd and eliminate the undesirable.
