I M P O R T A N T   N O T I C E !

This issue of the Dutch Reporter has been mailed to all persons whose names appear in the membership card file that we received from Mrs. Leibel. Many of these are long expired and unless they are renewed prior to the next issue of the Dutch Reporter, they will be dropped from active membership. The next issue of the D. R. will contain the official membership list and election nominating ballots will be sent out around May 1, 1975. A new Guidebook, bigger and better than ever, should be ready for mailing to the membership in April-May of this year.

Starting March 1, 1975, we will be sending out expiration notices for members. You can save the ADRC the cost of sending you a notice by renewing promptly, hopefully even a month or two early. We are also accepting multiple-year memberships - send in \$10.00 for (2) two years, \$15.00 for (3) three years, etc. For combinations, just multiply the one-year cost by the number of years desired.

N O T I C E - - - - MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL POLICIES

According to the Constitution and By-Laws, the following apply:

1. After membership expires, the member may renew within 60 days, otherwise a new membership will be started, unless he/she specifically requests membership to be back dated to the original expiration date to keep the original number.
2. Any member having been delinquent sixty (60) days or more shall lose all sweepstakes points accumulated prior to their expiration.

Due to the problems of not having the ADRC records during January, we were forced to use a new membership numbering system. This system will be continued for new members, but for renewals the original number will be continued. If we inadvertantly gave you a new number when you should have had your old number continued we are sorry. This will be corrected automatically the next time you renew, but if you wish this corrected sooner, please write and let us know. As for any problem a member inquiries about, please be sure to include all the particulars necessary for action.

We encourage you to write us for membership complaints or suggestions. We can not correct a problem that we are not aware of, and we would like to improve things, so we are always open to suggestion. Letters from the members so far indicate that they care about their club, and that they are willing to help where ever they can. I feel there are some changes that need to be made and so do others. Not sweeping changes, like dropping blacks in favor of golds, but still changes. Be an active member of the club, participate in club activities and be a Dutch Booster. Take it upon yourself to assist new breeders and members. Thanks.

FROM SEC. DORIS LEIBEL: In a sincere effort to inform you of the things you will be asked to vote upon I am publishing the following and inserting it as a fly sheet in the D.R. that was handed out at Ventura.

DEWLAP - A DISQUALIFICATION????

Shortly you will receive a ballot enabling you to vote for or against a prominent dewlap being a disqualification. Disqualified rabbits are ineligible for registration. This does not specify a small, medium large or very large dewlap.

I feel the causes for a dewlap are as follows:

- 1 - Genetic Breeding
- 2 - Judge or carrier is improperly trained in handling rabbits
- 3 - Yourself, the way you handle your own rabbits.

Improper handling can loosen the hide from the flesh, thus fat accumulates.

I personally feel our standard should remain as is, "A severe cut for prominent Dewlaps" and perhaps stressed under body type as well as weight and condition.

Note: The Board of Directors recommended that the question of a prominent dewlap shall be a disqualification be added to the ballots for your consideration. Mr. Hand felt that you, the voters, should be informed of this in advance of the ballot voting and I agree with him, Doris.

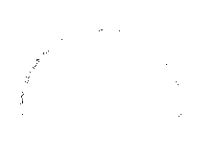

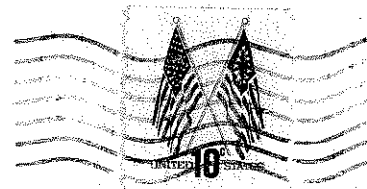
