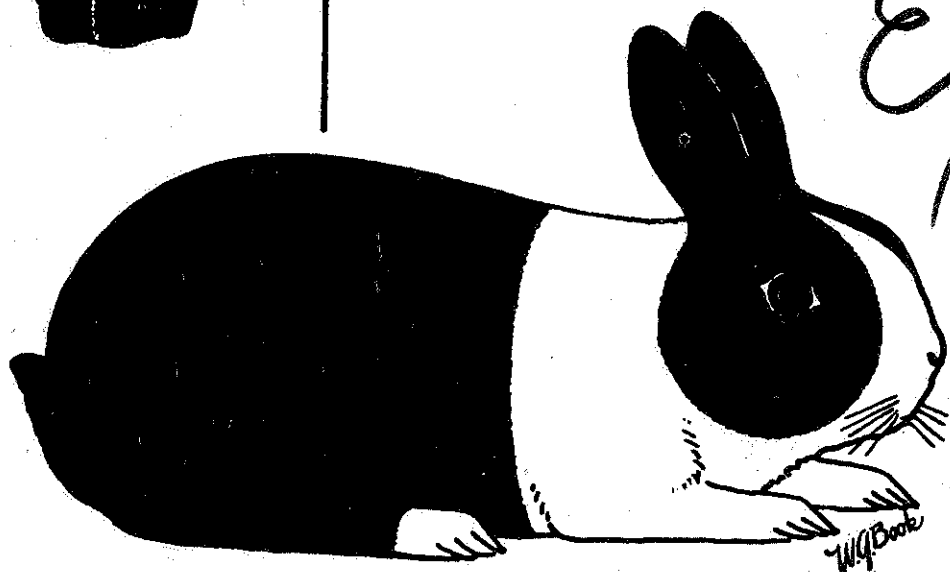

## PROFILE -----ROHRER'S RABBITRY

Rohrer's Rabbitry of Hagerstown, MD. is a composite of breeders spanning three generations - Dan Rohrer, Sr., is a retired auto service manager; Dan Rohrer, Jr., who works for the Maryland Department of Economic & Community Development; and David Rohrer, a high school junior. They show as one entry in order to make a greater sweepstakes impact. (ed: they are all individual members of the ADRC)

Dan, Sr. only maintains a few black and blue breeding does in his 20 hole outdoor hutch style rabbitry, but consistently come up with winners. Dan, Jr. and David maintain a 30+ hole rabbitry, also outdoor hutches, which includes about 18 does in black, blue, chocolate and tortoise.

The family interest in Dutch started in 1972 when David and his brother each got a Dutch doe and "Grandpap" bought a buck. David bred chocolates until recently (when he sold them all to Dad) and in all that time only ever purchased two of them, including his original mismarked doe named "Hershey" who is nine years old and the "Queen Mother" of the Rabbitry. In 1976 David fell in love with the torts, starting with a pair named Texas Don and Texas Nelle. He has now turned exclusively to torts and as a Houston OILER fan is giving them such names as "Oiler", "Houston", etc.

The family was bitten by the bug after attending a show in 1975 as observers. They have improved their show stock over their six years of showing to the point where they have placed in the top twenty in the Dutch sweepstakes for the past two years.

All three Rohrers are members of the Eastern Dutch Fanciers Club, where Dan, Jr. serves currently as vice president and editor of the quarterly newsletter. He also has been a 4-H rabbit club leader for 5 years. The family's rabbit interest is exclusively Dutch and they consider their rabbits a hobby rather than a business. As long as you use this approach, Dan, Jr. says, you can operate your rabbitry for your own pleasure and accomplishment, and are more apt to play hunches than if you constantly worry about the economics of giving a doe a second or third chance. They are firm believers in their outdoor style hutches which have produced healthy, hardy Dutch, although they'll quickly admit that a fancier rabbitry would be better for the breeders.

Even though they "placed" five rabbits at the 1980 National Dutch Show, including the Best Opposite Black, Dan, Jr. says his biggest thrill was attending his first National Dutch Show in 1976. If you love Dutch, seeing all those beautiful animals has to be a thrill whether they're yours or not, he says. It also presents the opportunity to talk ship with a wide variety of Dutch breeders, who are the absolute greatest.

As a footnote, Dan, Jr. says he was first captivated by the beauty of the Dutch about 22 years ago at the York, PA Fair. As his wife finally got him away from the Dutch cages he said, "If we ever breed rabbits they're going to be the Dutch." After all the pleasure derived from them for the past nine years, he's sorry it took so long to fulfill that promise.

EDITOR: I hope that all of you are finding these breeder profiles as interesting as I am. Our President, Don BRady is responsible for securing all of these and I for one would like to thank him for the idea and for following through on these. I like Dutch as well as any of you, but I like "Dutch People" even better. They are a group of unique people who have the ability to "hang in there" and it is great to be able to get to know them a little better.

I just had to stop typing this stencil and answer the telephone and talk to another "Dutch" person. The call was from Ohio and the question was "What is the youth membership fee in the ADRC. Answering the telephone around here is a real experience. I never know where the next call will come from. Oh, yes, the answer to the question is \$7.00 because Adults and Youth have the same rights and responsibilities in the Dutch Club.

IF YOU MEMBERSHIP IS NOT UP TO DATE (within 30 days) YOUR NAME WILL NOT APPEAR ON THAT LIST. You may receive this Dutch Reporter, but you won't get your ballot. Why? because your ADRC membership has a grace period of 60 days, and that is the criteria I use when addressing Dutch Reporters, that is also the time I use when processing renewals. Our By-Laws however only allow 30 days grace period for voting, so if your membership will expire any time before March 1, 1981 and you do not renew, you will not receive a ballot.

I would like to take this opportunity to urge you to vote, it is your right and your responsibility, but also to vote wisely. It might be worthwhile to dig back into your Dutch Reporters for the past year and note the involvement of some of our Dutch Fanciers. It could be in the way of articles, or ads, or maybe in showing at some Dutch sanctioned shows. We have a multitude of Friends in the Fancy who jump in with both feet and support the association and the Dutch. So, consult your DR's and then vote.

WHAT OFFICES ARE WE NOMINATING FOR? Good question. Check the title page of your Dutch Reporter. On that page is the usual list of the officers of the American Dutch Rabbit Club. Please note that after each elected member of the officer roster is either '81 or '82. All offices marked '81 will be voted on in this election, namely, President, Directors Geitzenauer, Watters, & Williamson.

Because Dutch People really care about their association, we normally get an unusually high percentage of nominations. That is what helps to make our club the strong one that it is. We need your involvement. PLEASE VOTE!! Another thing, read your voting directions carefully. It would be a shame if your ballot were not counted because you failed to follow the directions.

So, Vote wisely and well!!

Have you made arrangements for the NDS? Better hurry, those Illinois Dutchmen and women are a beehive of activity. I'm sure this will be a NDS to remember. They have worked hard, don't dissappoint them.

## DIRECTORS KORNER

Those of you that need help in developing your strain, thru breeding, showing or medicating please feel free to contact YOUR staff of the ADRC! As you probably are aware, to exist and grow, the elder members of any group must pass on to newer members what we have found in our years of investigation. The heartaches we have suffered, the successes we have found.

We also must be listeners, submitting to new ideas of newer breeders who have become members to aid our fellowship. Their voice is just begging to be heard and we dare not shut out their ideas. Granted, some of the ideas are not usable but again some of our ideas are not much better. Yes, we are not perfect but we of the Dutch Club must never have a closed society. If this results, we no longer will grow and prosper but will wilt and die in our own infertility.

Yes, 1980 was not much different than 1979 or 78 or ----- . Lets hope that we all can grow a little bit more this year and work on our three weakness's. If we don't, we are progressing just a little more backward every year.

Today we get a letter. Please sell me a trio of Dutch? They should be -- and send them airfreight. Thank you!!!

Years ago you used to go to a breeders house to see all the stock, pick the one/s you wanted, see the sire and dam and off you went running. If you were a kid, the Dutch was most likely given to you for free or for a dollar and the friendship did not stop there. The breeder asked you where and how you were going to raise the dutch. If the answers were not right the breeder would go over to your place and set it up with your help. He would then continue to "Look in on you", insuring that any mistakes would be immediately corrected. This went on for 2 to 3 years, maybe longer if the new breeder was very young. You would and he or she would visit on Saturdays observing the feeding or medicating, the culling and breeding of our dutch. It was a period of apprenticeship!

The real old timers had some of what today is called weeds hung up in the shed that were dried to cure a sick rabbit, either then soaked in drinking water or fed like hay.

Yes, you were shown how to feed the animals when sick or well. Rarely did you have a rabbit with scours or any of the other fancy named diseases of today.

The minus 30 degree weather of today was nothing to the winter. The old-timers used to bed their hutches with sawdust, shaving, hay chaff and other insulators that preserve bodyheat. When it came time to kindle they filled the pen or big box full of hay, really rull with a fist size hole made in it. The dutch doe then shaped and reshaped the opening until it fit her body. The does had their litters in there and then covered the opening in the straw with their fur. It made an insulated igloo! You never knew how many were in there because you didn't poke around in the winter time especially, until they started coming out of the box, to take a look at their world.

The does were big, strong dutch, good milkers because of their size, raised their young and were prized for their mother-liness. If they didn't fit the bill they just weren't worth keeping around no matter how they were marked.

Now a days the breeders raise the young and not the mother doe. If the breeder does not like what he or she sees in the young fry, they kill them. The oldsters raised everything to a couple of pounds then ate the culls. There were other rabbit breeders who bred their rabbits to dutch just for the milking qualities. The dutch is or was the greatest milking machine, the rabbit world ever produced!

Yes, one of the biggest complaints from new breeders today is that they breed a buck and a doe expecting to produce show stoppers everytime! The old timers did most of the culling of the new breeders stock, both picking out the savers and telling why certain ones were saved. It may take a year or two to start producing a strain. Most newcomers must be made aware that it is an exception when one produces 2, 3 or 4 show dutch in one litter. And this is the way it is whether one who has bred dutch for 20 years or 20 months. People just cannot wait to produce and develop a key combination. This is the reason we have new breeders of one year, quitting! Now a days if we want something, we go to the store and buy it, either with cash or a charge. If you have enoughtmoney, it can be done by buying the best dutch of a good breeder at \$50. to \$150. each. This does not insure you either that the doe and buck you bought will produce show stock, even if you bought them from a breeder who wins at the biggest shows. Most have 50 to 150 breeding does in a color and only have a couple that do exceptionally well. Just think that out of 100 does producing 7 fry, four times a year (minimum or better) or 2800 possibilities, they arrive at 3 or 4 perhaps 10 that win!

Consider the breeder who has 4-10 breeding does that places 1 or 2! Now who is the master breeder? Who would you want to get started from? No, all breeders who have a large dutchery are not coarse. I know of one in particular (a she & he) that really discriminately select breeding pairs and take care of each rabbit like it were part of the family!

Yes, times have changed, but animals not unlike humans still possess their basic characteristics. Those of you that feel you are master breeders please help these beginners out until you feel they are able to handle themselves. You newer breeders search out the older breeder who does care not only for the monetary value but for you!

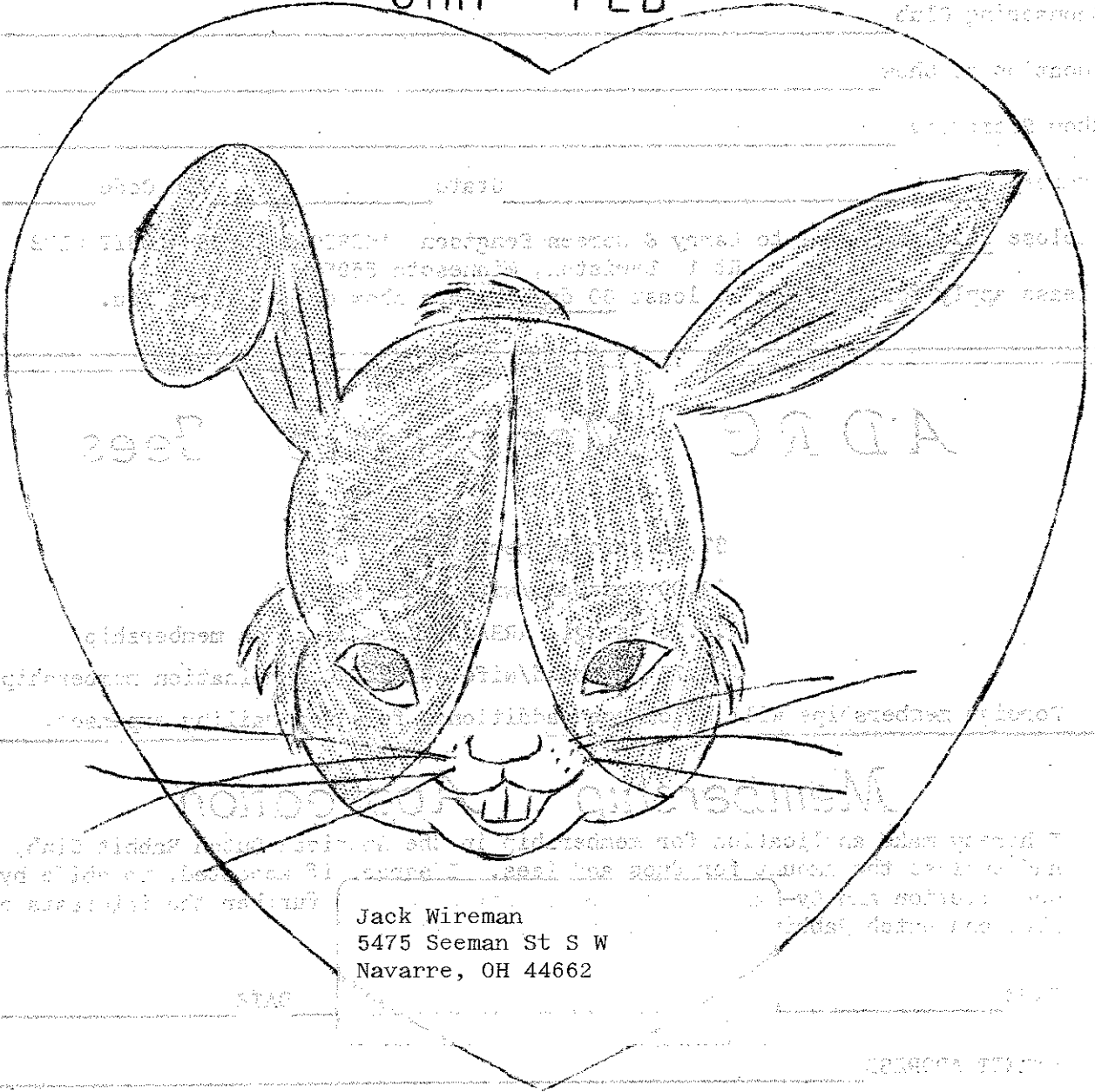
