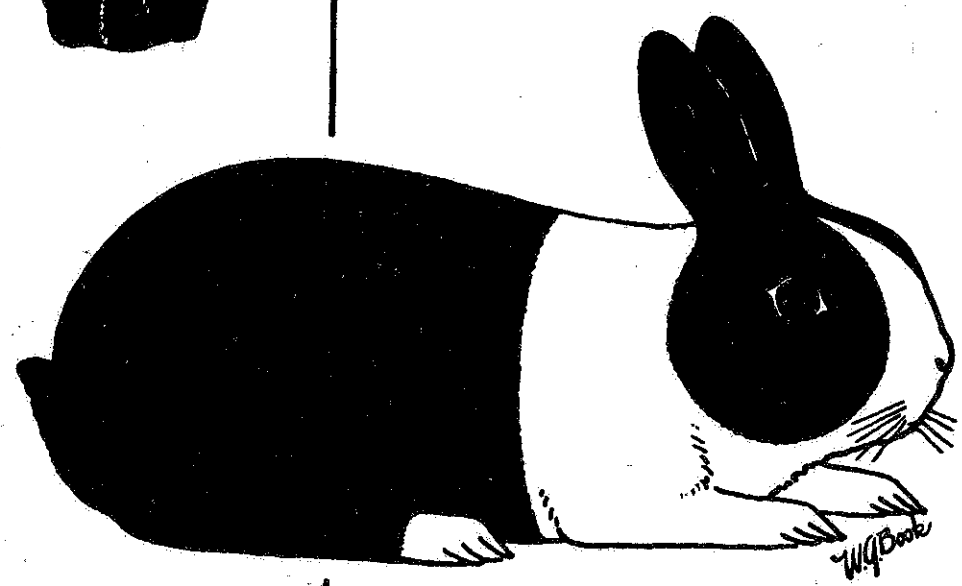
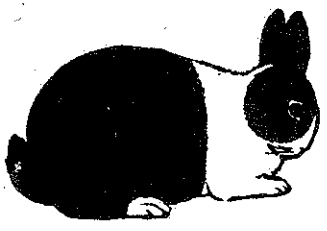

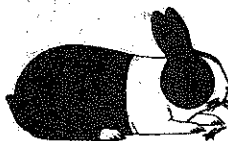

Received the Dutch Reporter and was surprised to see my name under the new business in the minutes of the board meeting at Syracuse. To those who voted for my honorary life membership, I am deeply grateful.

Guess this is only the second Convention I've missed for a long time and it was not an easy week for Bonnie and I as we had the Convention and our Dutch people on our minds all the time and things just didn't seem normal. Fortunately my two days at the Mayo Clinic turned out quite well in some catagories anyway. WHY DUTCH?

Many articles have been written about breeding and raising Dutch but not much attention has been given to the question: "Why Dutch?"

The most common answer may be: "Because Dutch present the challenge in not only breeding for type, fur and color but also markings." The fact that the Dutch rabbit is distinctively marked along with the six standard colors encourages a wide variety of people to try their hand at raising them. No one to my knowledge has yet produced a perfect specimen, but I know several people who are dedicated in trying to do so.

The word dedication reveals another important quality of Dutch fanciers. All of the "Dutch Folks" I have met are dedicated to their Dutch rabbits and the Dutch club. As a result of this fact, the American Dutch Rabbit Club is a progressive organization. The membership cares about the breed, the club, and probably most important each other. The friendship and camaraderie is one of the most pleasant aspects of showing Dutch and being a part of the Dutch fancy. Admittedly, we have been through some rough and bumpy times but we all pulled together and resolved our differences. By working

together, there is NO task beyond our grasp. I would like to see our membership grow to 1,000 plus. How can we accomplish this goal?: Promote Dutch in your area, when you sell a Dutch make sure the buyer will be a satisfied customer, give a membership with the sale and help the new fancier with any problems. Promote the benefits of being a member of the ADRC.

What does the Dutch rabbit itself have to offer?

1. Six colors or varieties to appeal to a wide variety of people.
2. The hardiness of the Dutch rabbit is second to none. In other words, Dutch are easy keepers.
3. The markings of Dutch offer the opportunity for each breeder to engineer matings which result in prime show specimens. (HOPEFULLY)
4. Dutch require less space than other larger breeds of rabbits and consume less feed than these larger breeds. Therefore, a Dutch is more efficient.
5. Many people claim that the meat from Dutch rabbits has a distinctly pleasant flavor. Those people prefer Dutch rabbit meat over any other rabbit meat.
6. The disposition of a Dutch is generally very good. They are reproductively efficient animals with a tremendous mothering ability.
7. Raising Dutch appeals to a wide age group of people. The size, space requirement, disposition, and feed intake of the Dutch rabbit make them affordable for anyone to raise.
8. Last but not least, the people who comprise the membership of the ADRC make it rewarding to breed, raise, and exhibit Dutch. Some of my most enjoyable memories have made me proud to be a part of the Dutch Fancy ! !

When and how do you get a well organized Youth Program started in the ADRC when it covers such a vast area? I have been contemplating these questions ever since Don Brady appointed me the Chairman of the Youth Committee. The answer to "when" is easy now that previous discussions have taken place---at the NDS. The "how" is the task because of the wide spread location of the Committee and the shortness of time. Right or Wrong we are going to move ahead. If we make mistakes we'll just have to correct them as we go and grow. With the in-put of ideas from members, youth and adults, I'm sure we can have a nice program. If anyone has any ideas or complaints, write to the Committee about it, don't just complain about it and not let us know. We hope to get the Youth Program started at the NDS which is April 16-18. Listed below are the purposes, goals and Committee members for the Youth Program.

PURPOSES OF THE YOUTH DIVISION OF THE A.D.R.C.

1. Promote the raising and showing of the Dutch rabbit in 4-H and open shows.
2. Motivate and encourage youth to accept a good challenge in the raising and showing of the Dutch rabbit.
3. Provide guide lines for the youth so they may become more knowledgeable in raising, judging and teaching others about the Dutch rabbit.
4. Teach the youth to communicate with adults and youth in their areas and other regions of our Country about their Dutch rabbits.
5. Provide a good program so that parents and their children may work together to overcome problems that occur in raising the Dutch Rabbit.
6. To give a child something to do in raising a fine animal- a Dutch Rabbit. There are many things children can learn from raising rabbits in addition to just raising the animal.

GOALS OR OBJECTIVES "SHORT TERM"

1. Sanction Youth Shows (fee to be approved by Committee)
2. Lower membership fees for Youth (already approved---\$5.00 for Youth under 18 years of age.)
3. Youth judging contest at NDS and Nat'l. Conv. (Dutch Only)
4. The DR to have a section for youth news: (Youth Corner or Talks By Youth)
5. Youth Show Reports (Seperate from open reports)
6. Youth Sweepstakes (Cut off to be same as open, runs from the weekend following the NDS until the NDS of the following year.)
7. Sweepstake awards to be given out at the ARBA Conv. to those present--balance to be mailed out.)
8. List top five Youth Show winners throughout the USA in the DR.
9. Ribbons to: BOB-BOS-BOV---sent to winning members AFTER receiving show reports but mailed out quarterly. (Saving postage this way.)
10. Awarding Grand Champion Certificates to Youth Dutch Breeders.

GOALS OR OBJECTIVES "LONG TERM"

1. Issue a pamphlet for youth on the "Dutch Rabbit."
2. Scholarship awards--National and District Levels.
3. Achievement or Activity book contest--rules and regulations drawn up later. This endeavor to be incorporated into the scholarship program.

- 5. Registering Contests--Youth rabbits that are registered.
- 6. Youth Hall-Of-Fame Pictures and essays of accomplishments.



POSTAGE

A question may arise as to why the Dutch Reporter was sent Bulk Rate instead of Non-Profit Bulk Rate. The Post Office here requires a number of records to be sent, including the first copy of the DR being mailed from this town, to obtain a non-profit status from their supervisors for this organization. This is a timely process, as these records are sent to Chicago, where they are screened, then forwarded to another office where the decision is made as to whether or not we are a "Non-Profit Organization." We have been assured by our Postmaster that we will be granted the non-profit stamp, but in order to get the DR out on time, we are forced to use the Bulk Rate. When we are issued the non-profit status, we will be reimbursed for each piece of mail that has gone out under the Bulk Rate Stamp. The difference is, 10.9¢ per piece of mail at Bulk Rate, and 5.9¢ per piece of mail at non-profit rates. A refund of 5¢ per DR mailed. "N"

First, I'd like to provide you with some information about Rocky Mountain High Shows (RMHS). RMHS was organized as a statewide association for the purpose of presenting a bid to host the 1983 convention and ultimately hosting the convention. RMHS has selected some of the key Convention Committee Chairman. Colorado Springs is the site of the 83' Convention. The city is nearly surrounded by the majestic "ROCKIES" and has numerous tourist attractions within a thirty minute drive. Although the Springs is nestled at the foot of the "ROCKIES" the weather is exceptional. There is sunshine an average of 310 days per year and our average daytime temperature is 62 degrees. Since Colorado Springs has a tourist based economy (the tourist season is basically over at the end of September) I'm sure there will be numerous bargain prices on rooms, banquets and the likes.

Rocky Mountain High Shows has selected the ANTLERS HOTEL, which is in downtown Colorado Springs, as the CONVENTION HEADQUARTERS HOTEL. The Antlers is a four star rated facility complete with a very professional staff anxious to serve the needs of the ARBA convention attendees. I would like to point out that the ARBA will be the sole occupants of this hotel during the convention. Although final negotiations have not been completed with the hotel, I feel the room rates will be quite reasonable and I know they will not exceed \$47.00 per day PER ROOM. The Antlers have reserved 225 rooms for the ARBA Convention. If your club would like to reserve a block of rooms I would suggest doing so at the earliest possible date, as I don't expect these rooms to last long. At the present time this request should be directed to the General Chairman.

The Antlers also has several meeting rooms which will be available at no charge for specialty club meetings. These meeting rooms are able to accomodate groups of very few to 700 people, and again RMHS would appreciate knowing your requirements in this matter as soon as possible in order that we may begin preparing some tentative meeting schedules to submit to the specialty clubs for their consideration.

I would also like to take this opportunity to recommend the Antlers Hotel as a possible site for specialty club banquets. If you can submit a projection on the number of people you expect to attend your banquet and a suggested price range per person, I will get this info to the right department head at the Antlers Hotel and you will be provided with some suggested menus to select from by the Antlers Catering Staff. Again, the hotel is capable of hosting your banquet, wether it be twenty people or 500. I'd almost forgotten to mention, the Antlers Hotel is located only a short, quick elevator ride from the Convention Showroom.

The Convention Showroom will be in the Chase Stone Center parking garage. The actual showroom will be the third UNDERGROUND level of the garage. There will be 150,000 square feet of exhibition space for the rabbits and booths. The existing flourescent lighting is adequate for exhibition purposes and all judging areas will be supplemented with additional lighting. Although this facility is unheated, it maintains an average temperature of 60 to 68 degrees due to geographical location underground. I'd also like to emphasize that the

existing power ventilation system is more than adequate to provide proper exhaust and fresh air supply. There is also an existing fire sprinkler system. RMHS will be renting the ARBA convention cooping equipment and will supplement this cooping from local resources as the entries indicate.

It is the goal of Rocky Mountain High Shows to host a most exciting and memorable convention in 1983. To accomplish this goal, RMHS feels that we need input from the National Specialty Clubs so we will know what your requirements are and what you would like to have or see at the ARBA National Convention. Please realize that unless you tell us what your needs are we have no way of knowing, and can't possibly assist you in YOUR area of CONCERN - Your BREED!

I would like to suggest that each Specialty Club begin selecting your Breed Chairperson and Judges for the 1983 convention, NOW! RMHS would like to have these selections prior to the 1982 convention, in order that we may select any additional breed chairmen and judges which, may be necessary. RMHS will attempt to hire the judges recommended by the Specialty Clubs. I would like to remind you that judges should not be expected to judge more than 200 entries per day so each club should select sufficient judges to complete all judging in one day. When making your selection for Breed Chairman, Please make every effort to select someone who does not reside within the state of Colorado. RMHS intend to utilize the ACTIVE rabbit fanciers in other areas of hosting the convention and feel the specialty clubs interests would be better served if their breed chairman had no other responsibilities. Again, RMHS would appreciate the name of your breed chairman prior to the 1982 convention and urge you to make this selection with the same careful considerations as you use in picking your judges!

Rocky Mountain High Shows is now offering "MEMBERSHIPS" nationally. These "MEMBERSHIPS" are available at the following costs: Booster-\$25.00; Sustaining-\$50.00; Associate-\$75.00 and Charter-\$100.00. These memberships are available by sending your check or money order to: Mrs. Anna Smart 2610 Hyacinth, Pueblo, CO 81005. At the conclusion of the 83' convention these "MEMBERSHIPS" will, hopefully, be returned with interest. There is a \$100.00 limit that any individual family or club can purchase. Realizing that it requires a substantial amount of capital to host a successful convention, Rocky Mountain High Shows would greatly appreciate your assistance in helping us promote our "MEMBERSHIP" in any manner your Specialty Club could provide.

In closing, I would like to assure you and your members, Rocky Mountain High Shows wants to serve your specialty club to insure your members of a very memorable experience --- the 1983 Convention! RMHS will appreciate your comments, suggestions and ideas about the ARBA National Convention and will try to utilize as many of these suggestions as is practical. Please direct YOUR input to the General Chairman. Thank You...

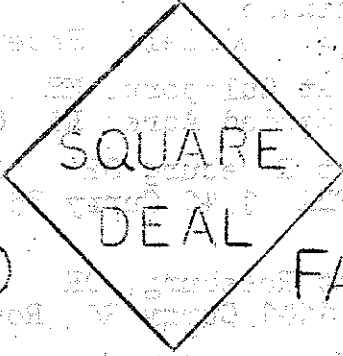
