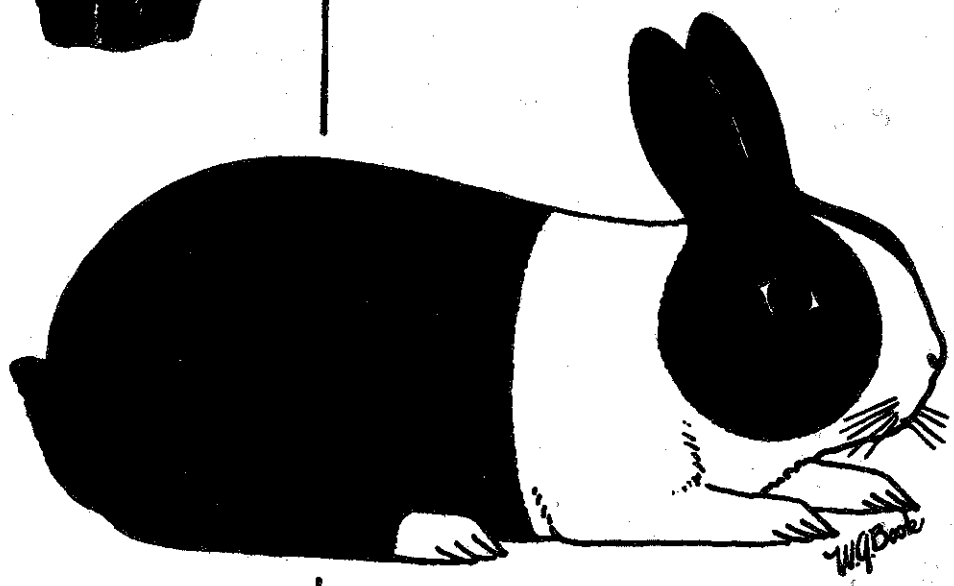

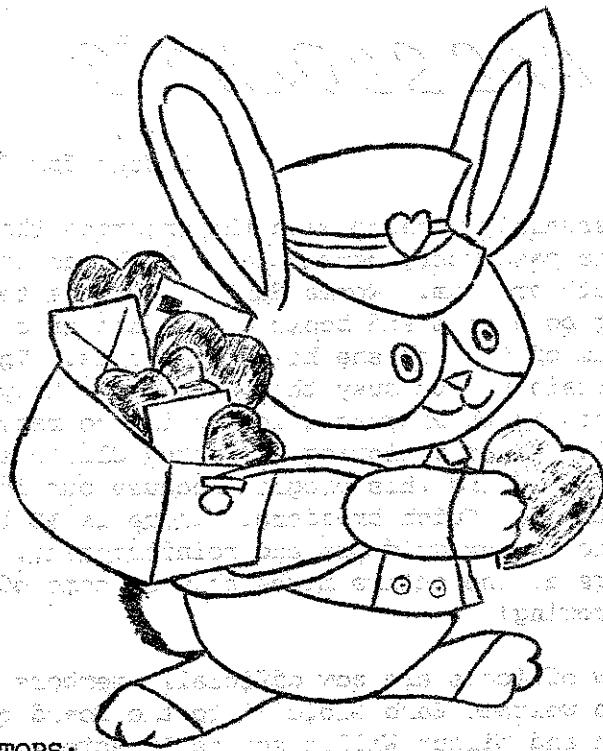

There is NO limit to what our young members can do with the proper guidance and reinforcement. The size of our youth membership is as large as the entire membership of some of the smaller specialty clubs. Let's keep growing!

The new officers are now officially members of the executive committee. The show sanctions for 1982 numbered 583. We can be extremely pleased with this number as it appears that more clubs are sanctioning Dutch. The Sweepstake Contest has already surpassed some of the totals of last year's contest, more proof that Dutch numbers are increasing in good competition. Don't forget we also have Dutch Youth show sanctions available through the secretary-treasurer's office, so you youth can also show off your Dutch.

The 1983 National Dutch Show is not very far away. Remember the date and place, May 7 & 8 in Canton, Ohio. The Ohio crew is sure to put on another great National Dutch Show. We are fortunate to have the services of Glen Carr and Wenton Carlton hired by the Ohio group to judge the entries. With two such capable judges, the show is bound to be a phenomenal success. I know that Ohio will be glad to receive any specials you may want to contribute. Let's all pitch in and help make this N.D.S. one to remember.

Many of the rabbits for the 1983 National Dutch Show have been or are about to be born. Somewhere, the Best of Breed is huddled up with his/her littermates; it could be outside in your hutch. Keep those does working, because the A.R.B.A. Convention in Colorado Springs is not too far away. As an incentive to breed more Dutch for Colorado Springs, I am going to offer 25¢ per Dutch rabbit shown at the convention in both open and youth. The money generated from this incentive program will be used for special awards to be given out at the 1983 Convention. Nothing would please me more than to have over 400 Dutch shown. So, start making vacation plans now. Let's show the other breeds that Dutch are dominate!

SECRETARY'S MESSAGE



What a start for 1983! Going back over the records from last year, I found that 30 sanctions had been issued in January. Since the first of this year, 72 have been issued.

The ADRC youth membership has grown to a total of 226 and is continuing to grow at a rapid pace. The Youth Committee's efforts have not been in vain! A youth seller's class is being introduced at the 1983 NDS. We hope this will help to benefit both the youth and adults (as the adults will be able to bid in this auction, and are encouraged) to acquire some excellent stock! The youth seller's class will be governed by the same rules as the open. Pedigrees MUST accompany the rabbit to be sold. The seller will receive $\frac{1}{2}$ the amount the rabbit is sold for and the ADRC receives the remaining $\frac{1}{2}$. First place youth seller's class will receive a trophy and 1 yrs. membership to the ADRC. So, join in and share the excitement! It is my understanding, at this time, that the seller's class will alternate with one from the open being auctioned and then one from the youth. Remember youth; -- it's time to show off your stock - Bring a rabbit for the class, along with it's pedigree, and allow someone the chance to purchase some quality Dutch! The adult membership is asked to do the same. This class benefits all - the breeder, the seller, the buyer and the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

I know that Ohio crew has an excellent show planned for all of us. If it's at all possible, do try to attend!

Since it's a new year, rules are going to be strictly adhered to. The top priority is the deadline for articles to be published in the Dutch Reporter. All articles MUST REACH this office by the 15th. of the month preceding publication or they WILL NOT BE PRINTED! Exceptions will be allowed only with advance notice. Remember this when you get ready to send that article in. Be sure that it will be in this office by the specified date. If it isn't here by that time, your article may be "old news" by the time it gets printed in the following issue. This is the only way that the DR can keep some type of mailing schedule without being sent out 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ weeks late. I receive articles on the 25th. of a month for that issue due out. I must lay out the DR, type approximately 60 stencils, run off all of the pages and then collate, staple and address all of them. They must then be sorted by zip code and tied for mailing. This takes longer than five days! Your cooperation in this matter will be most appreciated by myself and the membership.

Every show report in this office, at this time, has been printed in this issue; -- AMEN: If you should find an error in your points, please write this office so corrections can possibly be made. Due to the way many show reports are turned in to this office, it is impossible to always list the correct winners and their points. Show secretaries, please be sure to fill in all of the spaces provided! Remember to list all eliminated or disqualified rabbits. I receive many that have, (for example) 3 Black Sr. Does, and then only have one placement listed. Without the proper information our members do not receive credit for all of their points. Without this information from the show secretary, we are unable to credit accurate points. The winning animal will only get the amount of points for what is listed on the report form. If there are 3 Black Sr. Does listed, and only the first place animal is listed on the sheet, it can only receive 6 points instead of 18.

You will also find that this year you will be receiving B.O.B. and B.O.S. ribbons instead of rosettes. The ribbon will measure 3" X 10". The rosette must be folded to send out and are sometimes in sad shape when they are presented to the winners. If they are not awarded, they are again folded and flattened and sent back to this office. Some look so bad when returned, that I hesitate to again send them out. The ADRC will also have a savings of approximately \$880.00 per year. (This figure

based on the amount of sanctions issued in 1982) The savings is due to the price difference from the rosette to the ribbon, and also in the lesser amount of postage needed to send these out to sponsoring clubs. They should also arrive in much a more better shape. Taking all of the above into consideration, the change was approved. The variety ribbons will stay the same.

The hour is late, and the hands and mind (?) are tired. Hope to see you all in Canton in May. Why not give that Best of Breed winner a little something extra on the 14th. of February?

The Soul of 1982

When reviewing the year of 1982, our thoughts must of necessity be one of which we, as individuals, are best inspected by our peers. This is, of course, at the show table.

It seems that the same complaints were recorded such as; it has poor type but won, stops are uneven, cheeks too high, etc. The socializing is better than ever, even under the preceding groans. We have become a club of pessimists at the table and sometimes for good reason. The bottom line lies in interpretation of wording by our judges. Even though I can say that in the East, my interpretation of the judging has improved, particularly in detecting cow hocks, pinched hindquarters and crooked legs. The correspondence received from other sections of the country (particularly the Southwest) denotes that there has not been improvement on one noticeable part. Perhaps it is not our judges' fault after all, but again one of failing descriptive wording. What is prominent or pinched or severe? When is a bone crooked, to be called crooked and disqualified?

Sorry to say, but our newer breeders of 2 to 3 years now are saying that the back legs are acceptable at the 45 degree angle, - and really believe it! When shown differently one young "lad" of 26 disagreed strongly and his argument was that if it was bad why did it win best of variety in a large show? I ask myself why also. Why did a black win B.O.V. at a national show with an obvious crooked right back leg? Well, yes, - nobodys perfect and even though this is an exception, we all must catch this in the nest box or culling process.

We are not fooling anyone and are doing our club a great injustice in selling stock to others even as pets. Too often, these pets get bred and result in more crooked legs on the table. Yes, it must be a darn tough job to be a Dutch judge. You're expected to be perfect, but who is?

Another point made in 1982 was the point system. Seems that there are those that continued.....

would like to see the points for place as it is now but not multiplied by the number in the class. As you are aware, many are entered in a class that are known beforehand to be "also rans" but do fill the class for points. Can remember one man that entered 12 in one class of does! Don't really believe this problem will ever be resolved in that:

1. The entry fee was paid in cash
2. Cash pays judges & expenses of the show
3. The more stock entered, the less expensive the entry fee can be. Can you see a club putting on a show that draws 400 Dutch from 40 exhibitors, many with more than one in a class, many with only 1 variety now entering only one in each class of one variety? The show would now be reduced to 125 head. Could the sponsoring club still only charge 3.00/head when the judges alone cost \$300.00 along with the hall (2 days) at \$100.00 per day. It would be the end of the club sponsoring a show unless the entry fee was raised to 8 or 9 dollars. Then how many would be entered?

Hopefully the gray problem will be resolved in May but again interpretation will be the detergent in the resolution of this. There are too many now that are saying do this or that, who don't breed gray and are choosing sides when the right is not there. Perhaps a survey of gray Dutch breeders would be in order to see what they want. After all, without them, there is no gray shown under any interpretation.

This writer will act as survey compiler if those of you would like to write me what color you have in gray, or wish to see. I will present it at the directors' meeting in May, 1983. Now that you have everybody's attention, please stand up and say your piece. Mr. Carr will be most happy to hear from you gray members in formulating a workable shade or wording it so all will understand, if that is possible. We can't expect a decision without a majority input. If it doesn't come out to your satisfaction, blame no other.

Well, 1982, we must have improved a little bit because of our youth movement. When you have a bull dog of a man with a task (bone) set between his teeth, it will be done! Thank you Wilbur, from all of us!

Also thank you Dutch breeders from the state of Washington who understood why most of us couldn't make it to the show. I think Norma's statement in the DR was the reason. No, it's not that we didn't think you guys/gals aren't the best. Personally received a letter on this but couldn't afford \$600.00 plus. Am only on a school teacher's salary - not very gratifying monetarily wise, but a necessity in attempting to develop people out of children. Getting tougher all the time.

Well, you can make us eat "crow" by all coming to Canton in May. We attempt to move this, and ARBA shows around each year by 500 - 1000 miles to allow all to participate once in awhile.

We all have our thoughts for 1982, some fond and gentle, others repulsive and grating, but still experiencing. Resolve to discuss your ideas with all of us so that others will "feel" your agitations. Yes, we grew a little in '82, now for 1983-----

Who Are We to Judge?

Recently, a breeder friend wrote inquiring about stock he'd like to purchase. Although his prime interest was breeding stock, he preferred top quality show animals as he was not at all convinced using mis-marks or animals with disqualifications perpetrated anything but more of the same. At Gioielli's Rabbitry we don't hold 100% to either theory because over the last six years we've gotten some excellent show rabbits from parents most breeders wouldn't have and some garbage from parents who were Grand Champions; but we've also had the reverse. We feel the bottom line is know your rabbits; not just what you can see outwardly but what's inside, what has made the animal in question.

Allow me to tell you the story of Pegleg: A few years ago one of our does kindled and among the kits was a gray. Mama rabbit was a bit zealous in cleaning baby rabbit and bit off 1/3 of it's right rear foot. Old softy, me, found said bunny happy and lively and didn't have the heart to get rid of it. Baby grew and thrived and soon we could determine it was a buck. Now, aside from having only one foot, baby's blaze wasn't good, his cheeks were way too low and the stop on the one foot he had was way too short, split in fact.

Well needless to say, there was no way he could go as pet stock; who'd want a one footed rabbit for a pet and since I couldn't dispose of him as a couple of days old, how could I zap him now that he was friendly and pre adult? Oh well, he just stayed around and matured. From the viewpoint of he's here, let's use him to breed and see what happens; he produced his first offspring. Hmmm, not bad; let's do it again and again and so on.

Alas, poor Pegleg died this past summer but in the time he was with us, he became one of our best stud bucks producing numerous winning rabbits including the 1st. place junior steel doe and best junior steel at the 1982 NDS.

Certainly I'm not saying this will always be the case but I am saying don't be hasty or short sighted; you never know and never will with out giving it a try.

Author's Note: We classify the disqualifications in the above story as harmless in breeding. Under no circumstances do we recommend or approve the use of animals with the following disqualifications:

1. buck teeth
2. spots in the eye
3. wrong color eyes
4. white on the ears

The 1983 National Dutch Show is just around the corner. It is an event that I look forward to all year long. I know, that at my job, I take alot of good natured kidding, etc., about being a rabbit raiser and rabbit breeder etc., but at a National Dutch Show, everyone there has the same common interest as you, an affection for the Dutch rabbit.

Recently I attended the fall '82 Ohio State Dutch Club show - there were about 160 Dutch shown with a very high proportion of quality animals. I mention quality

because high numbers of animals shown doesn't always mean quality animals, sometimes I think we tend to look at how many were shown instead of what was shown in judging if the show was successful. I would much rather see 80 to 100 quality animals at a show than 200 when 175 of these should be culled, etc. One thing I try to follow in entering rabbits is, does that rabbit look like how I want my Dutch to look - does it have a chance of winning it's class, etc.? If it doesn't, I feel I'm wasting my money.

To me, the top ranked rabbit shows, and the ones I gear my rabbits toward are:

- #1. The National Dutch Show
- #2. ARBA Convention
- #3. State Dutch Club Shows
- #4. State Convention Shows

I feel within this group of shows, you are usually going to have judges who are familiar with the Dutch breed and Dutch fanciers who are dedicated.

The March/April issue of the Dutch Reporter will contain an updated rules list for the "Seller's Class" for the National Dutch Show and ARBA Conventions.

Hope to see everyone in Canton in May!

COMMITTEE FOR YOUTH

Wilbur Williamson, Chairman

The Committee for Youth living in the midwest met on December 12, 1982 and came up with several ideas for the youth program. An important procedure was also decided to present these at the National Dutch Show in Canton, Ohio for open discussion. These programs will be explained in detail to all of the youth and interested parents with time for questions. Anyone with additional ideas should be prepared to present them there. All the youth will be presented with a "Comment Sheet" with these ideas on it and room for their comments. For those who cannot attend

the NDS, they will also have a chance for input as all of these ideas will be published in the DR immediately following the NDS. Following are the different programs or contests we would like the youth to think about:

1. FAMILY CLASS (maybe a Jr. contest)
Sire, doe and litter. The litter would have to have: a maximum and minimum age limit; minimum number in litter to be shown; -- All to be table judged for uniformity of size, markings, color and type.
2. GET OF SIRE CLASS - (Sr. contest)
A sire with three direct offspring - preferably 2 does and 1 buck. One of the offspring to be 6 months of age, the other 2 to be 2 - 6 months of age. All pedigrees to accompany animals shown. All animals in this contest to be scored according to the points in the Dutch Standard.
3. JUDGING CONTEST - (Sr. contest)
Teams would be formed with contests starting in local areas and progressing to the State Conventions, National Dutch Show or ARBA Convention.
4. ACHIEVEMENT CONTEST - (Jr. & Sr. contest)
This contest was designed because many of the youth can not attend the NDS. This contest would give every child the chance to tell of his activities in life and especially with the Dutch Rabbit. The Nov/Dec '82 issue of the DR, on page 20, listed the different activities involved.
5. MEMBERSHIP CONTEST - (Jr. & Sr. contest)
This would be done by states or districts. Points could be given for any new member signed up by the youth.
6. SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST - (Jr. & Sr. contest)
This could also be done by state or district and ending either at the NDS or ARBA Convention. It would be based on showing ability, and knowledge of the Dutch rabbit.
7. QUALITY CONTEST -
This would involve a given number of points on "Best Of" winnings, such as BOB, BOS, BOV, and BOSV.

In response to three letters received in late 1982, will endeavor to state my views on the subjects. One letter stated that after sending two letters to an "official" of the ADRC, there was not any reply. I know the feeling as am still awaiting two letter replys', the first posted about August. Can only say that all are not letter writers so either you will have to call them long distance preferably between 12 midnight and 6 AM (to save money) or discard the idea and communicate with others that return correspondence. You may then tell others about the situation and perhaps there will be more communication after the next election. In reality, this is an exception as most ADRC officials, I am familiar with, do answer their correspondence.

Another piece of news received is that of a well known breeder selling stock that produces nothing but buck teeth. After having talked to the seller who would not reimburse the cost of the stock and would not be willing to take it back, there is little you can do either through our club or the ARBA. A suggestion would be to "show" others in your area the products of this persons stock to act as witness's. Then call or write the offending breeder stating that you are morally right and will notify others of his devious business relations. Personally all breeders I am acquainted with, that add up to many score, are morally straight people who endeavor to right a wrong even when they were not aware of any problem.

The third letter was one of a very damaging nature. It seems as a couple of rabbits were purchased from a long time Dutch breeder who when they got them home were a little sickly looking but thought they were perhaps "carsick". To make a long story short, most of the stock purchased was dead within 2 weeks and presumably infected the man's herd causing 11 deaths in less than 3 weeks. The selling breeder does not know of this and will probably never know as the purchaser does not deem to create trouble. As you all know, purchased stock must be isolated from the herd for a period of 2 to 4 weeks so that these things don't happen. From the symptoms, it sounds like coccidiosis. It is sure hard to control but cannot be eliminated entirely as all herds have some degree of it. Keep them clean and remove all the droppings each time you clean insuring that each coop's matter goes no where near another. Wash each coop with something strong like ammonia (keep well ventilated when doing this) cleaning off the "tools" used in the previous cage to prevent the secondary transfer. I use creosote but must let it dry one (1) day before placing the stock back in. This is good if you have extra cooping or hutches to use. If it continues, particularly in a litter of youngsters that seem to suddenly die when 10 days to 5 weeks old with scours, it could be that they are becoming infected through their mother. Normally, cocci are spread in this manner but the immunity is built into the fry if the strength is not too strong for them. Many are carriers (adults) so be extra diligent before it wipes you out.

To all of you, I say, experience sometimes hurts, but it makes us stronger each time. This is where our experiences are air'd to help all of you-in the Dutch Reporter. Thanks again for your inquiries. A Point of View ----- WHAT IS A GOOD STEEL?

Good color on a steel Dutch, a plauqing question seldom fully or adequately answered. Our standard tries to create a mental picture for us but really, how many of us have ever seen or have access to "a piece of freshly broken steel?" Not I. Since Gioielli's Rabbitry specializes in Steel Dutch, I like to think over the last six years we've become a wee bit of an expert on the color. That statement is conjecture, of course, but this article is about what we look for in steel and has brought us much success on the show table.

We "make" our steels by interbreeding Black, Blue, Steel and Gray; at least these are their visible colors. Inside, whether Black, Blue or Gray, they have steel in the background, usually on both sides. Because of this, when a doe kindles, we can expect the kits to be a mixture of these four colors. We have found, however, as the generations go by and more and more Steel is in the background, our percentage of Steel kits in a litter has risen sharply. We've had as high as 98% Steel and, of course, this has been our goal.

Patience is not only a virtue, it is an absolute necessity if you are raising Steel. When kits are born, you will be able to tell if there is a Blue or a Gray among them but you will not be able to tell if the others are Black, Steel or some of each. At ten to fourteen days you may be able to see a slight difference in shading between the Black and Steel, however, even this takes practice. If the color difference between the two is very obvious and the Steel looks like a dark Gray with an undercut, it is not and never will be a good Steel.

We make no further decision on color until the young are at least five weeks old. At that point in time, a prospective good Steel still looks Black from a distance of four or more feet, but when you put it on a work table and really look at it you will see it resembles a black object that had confectioners sugar spilled all over it, was shaken to clean and a very light residue remains. A strange analogy? Perhaps, but I'd venture to say almost everyone can picture that in their minds eye.

When the animal reaches three months of age there should be no doubt about what color it is. If it looks "washed out" black or a dark gray with a smutty cast, forget it, this is not what you are looking for. The prospective good Steel at this age looks brightly and heavily "silver tipped" all over. Note even at three months we are still saying prospective good Steel. We don't make the final decision and judgement on color until the animal has completely molted and is carrying the adult coat.

When the animal is in full adult coat, it's color should appear very dark slate gray with an even, light, silvery tipping over all. Many times, adult Steels have a stripe, head to tail, that looks very dark, almost black because of lack of ticking, what I referred to as silvery tipping. Also, we have noticed as a Steel progresses in age, two, three or four years, their color has a tendency to darken causing them to lose or lessening the desired ticking effect. This seems to be a slow process and we believe it occurs through their molting.

We have tried, through this article, to create a mental picture which we hope will aid Steel breeders and encourage new ones. Many times we have been told "I thought about raising Steel but I'm not even sure what they should look like."

We would enjoy responsive articles from some long time Steel breeders and judges. The goal of all of us is to raise our Dutch to conform to the Standard; but, the Standard must be interpreted by judges so it will be a big help to know hoe they describe good Steel color.

Dear Norma and Fellow Dutch LOvers,

The Dutch Reporter really made my day! It is just beautiful - every page is so colorful and Christmasy! I belong to other specialty clubs, but the Dutch Reporter really is top quality to their newsletters. Keep up the good work!

I have only been in Dutch for a year, but feel I may have a little something to contribute to my fellow Dutch breeders.

I raise Black and Blue Dutch, and show at about 6 shows a year. I sell good quality young rabbits to 4H and FFA kids at fair prices. I am trying to improve the quality of kids' rabbits by getting them started raising purebred rabbits that are far better quality than the mongrels that some of them raise. I love to work with young people and their rabbits!

My biggest problem promoting Dutch in my area seems to be the fact that very few people even know what a purebred Dutch is supposed to look like. People are used to a large, almost New Zealand-sized rabbit with Dutch markings, and to them, this is a Dutch. These rabbits were probably a Dutch/New Zealand cross somewhere back in their ancestry. These people felt that my little Dutch were sickly runts and were not something one would want to raise. However, the more I heard how

people felt, the harder I worked to change their minds. In a year of raising Dutch, I have started a number of young people and adults raising good, quality Dutch. I feel that I have greatly improved the quality of the Dutch rabbits in my area, and also opened some peoples' eyes as to what a good purebred Dutch really should look like. I would like to hear if other people have similar problems to overcome.

While I am writing, I would like to make a comment to Bill Geitzenauer's article. I have in my years of raising rabbits tried both removing the litter from the doe at weaning, and removing the doe from the litter. I have found little difference in the performance of the young in either situation. However, I agree that removing the doe from the litter would certainly be less stressful to young ones, even though they may not appear to be stressed.

Also, the vinegar in the water is an absolute necessity to get some does bred. Just a little vinegar put in the doe's water for three days, and she will breed.

I also have a comment for Franco and Beth's letter (Lucky Foot Rabbitry). I don't want to ridicule your way of doing things, but I don't know how you can palpate a doe while she is lying on her back. How accurate are you in your palpation?

I have been palpating does for only four years out of all of the years I have raised rabbits. I decided I was wasting a lot of breeding time by not knowing how to palpate. I could find no one in my area to show me how to palpate. Even breeders of many years didn't palpate; they just took their chances. Finally, I got out a good rabbit raising book which described palpation. Through much trial and error, mostly error, I feel I am quite capable in my palpating now. However, there are always does that are too fat, or for some unknown reason can "hide" their litters up inside themselves. These does are extremely hard to palpate, and then most of the time you don't know if they are pregnant or not. Then, there are does that you can always tell if they are pregnant or not. These are the does that give us our self-confidence in palpating. Most of my does are easy to palpate, thank goodness. I don't want to cause any hard feelings, but thought I would offer my suggestion.

Lastly, I have a suggestion for all breeders of any number of years rabbit-raising. For years, I suffered through the heartache of disposing of a nest box full of dead chilled bunnies when the night temperatures got too low for the little guys. I put cardboard in the bottom of the nest box, which helped most of the time when the temperatures weren't too cold. However, I still lost a lot of nice bunnies even when the does made good nests. I seemed to always worry about the bunnies, whether it would be too cold for them or not. Anyway, I subscribe to the OSU Rabbit Research Center, and read in their Journal of Applied Rabbit Research on several occasions that they do research with does and litters. They say that litters normally nurse only once a day, usually in the morning. I thought that if the Research Center could separate does and litters between feedings, why couldn't the same thing work in a non-research rabbitry. I started out by taking the nest boxes with the litters away from experienced good mothers, even from birth if the temperatures were cold out. I put the nest boxes on the semi-heated porch where the temperature is usually about 45°. (I write the doe's ear number on her nest box.) In the mornings, before I do any chores for the rabbits, I put the nest boxes of bunnies in with the does so they can feed their babies. Most of the does jump right in to feed the babies without hesitation. Other does would wait a few minutes to feed the little ones, but would feed them. I check the babies after a few minutes (most does have fed and cleaned their babies in 10 or 15 minutes), to see if their tummies are full. I was confident enough to try this on first-litter does who usually don't save their litters anyway. This even works with most of them. The does seem to accept the fact that their babies aren't in the cage all of the time (they probably enjoy the extra cage space).

I start leaving the boxes of bunnies in the cages with their mothers when the bunnies are about two and one half to three weeks old. Hopefully, the day and night temperatures are fairly mild at this time.

I find this management practice works extremely well. I no longer have to worry about the dead or chilled bunnies. I can save those show bunnies now. This works not only this time of year and in the cold early spring, but I have done this in the heat of the summer when other breeders are losing nest boxes full of bunnies to the heat. I realize that this practice is a lot of work, carrying nest boxes back and forth, but it seems to be the only way I can raise bunnies when it cold without a heated rabbitry.

I hope that I have helped someone with any of my suggestions. I thought I should give some input to our fine organization, no matter how significant or not. I welcome anyone's comments, good or bad, about my ideas.

There are only a few judges in our area that even consider color when it is time to place the entries. I can agree with a remark that Jack Wireman made, "Monkey see-Monkey do."

It is getting to the point that you win by what the judges personal likes are, rather than what the standard asks for. It does seem that something could be done to bring the mind of the judge back to the standard. If we are trying to breed and exhibit by it, then the judges should be required to judge by the standard.

I will begin working towards my registrar's license this spring, and hopefully in two more years, a judges' license. If I can become a judge, please ask me to judge by the standard and not by what the others think is right. If each judge is as honest with the exhibitors as he should be, the color problem, along with the markings will be cleared up soon.
