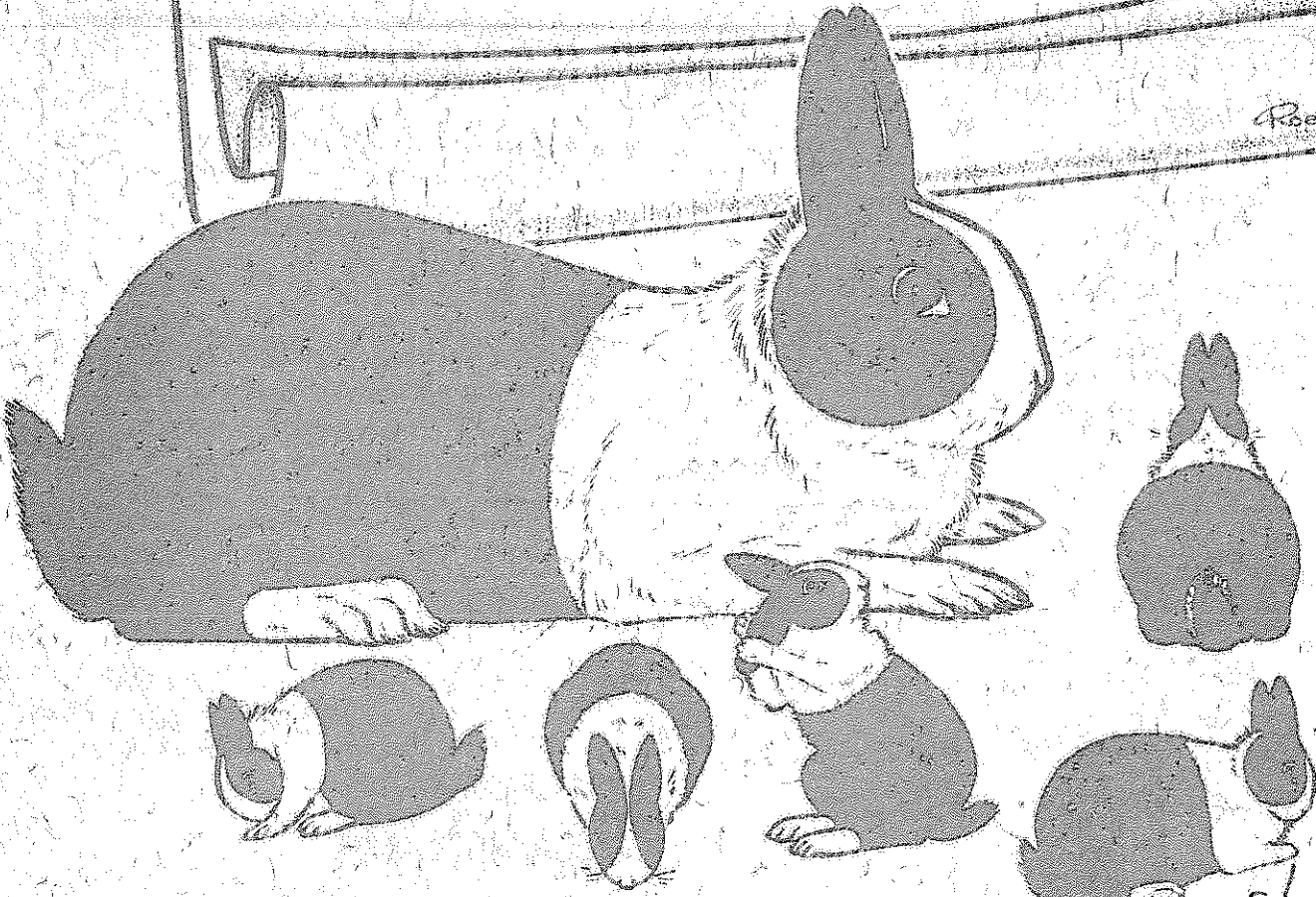

FROM YOUR SECRETARY

A few weeks ago I promised I would announce the total membership of the American Dutch Rabbit Club. I am pleased to tell you that as of August 26th. we have 467 members paid through July 1st. For a comparison, we had 287 members at the beginning of 1963. This increase denotes our members and Officers are doing a remarkable job of promoting and furthering our American Dutch Rabbit Club.

I hope to be able to announce that we are 500-strong at the American Rabbit Breeders Association Convention in York, Pennsylvania in October. To do this we shall have to retain every member we now have and add 33 new or renewed members. This should not be too difficult. Our Fair shows are in full swing. Our Sweepstake Show Reports tell us that from one to five breeders who are not affiliated with our Club are exhibiting in every Sweepstake Show. Let us all make every effort to extol the points of our Club. Invite these non-members to join us in our efforts. Let them know WE WELCOME THEM to join us. If you do not have an application for membership form with you at the sweepstake show, ask the Show Secretary for one; for with every sanction that goes out of this office five or six forms for memberships go with it. Write this office if you would like some extra forms to send out with your mail.

In the previous issue if the Dutch Reporter, President Bayliss pointed out that we must be ever alert for improvements that will benefit our Club and the Dutch Rabbit. We must not stagnate, or become inhibited. There is always a chance when there is a feeling of "glory", that we may become self-centered, and cannot see for looking. Just as a new hat boasts the parole of a lady, they say, we must be on the look-out for new services and commodities that will keep us progressive, and prepared for the really powerful organization which we are proving into.

We have received 22 new members on the application form printed in our Special Dutch Issue of April Small Stock Magazine. I believe others may have joined us through this medium, and did not use the printed form, for we did receive quite a number of new members who applied through letters during the summer months. We are happy, of course, to receive these members, and you who did join us through the Special Dutch Issue really had the invitation of the entire Club.

The "Name the Man" contest in our Special Dutch Issue was sponsored by our President, George Bayliss. This contest brought in 20 new members. Of course, the "Man" Mr. Tom Shufflebotham, entered the contest, but was declared ineligible as he was already a member. For some members who may not be acquainted with Mr. Shufflebotham we would like to say that the "nose ain't his real one", and this added proboscis mut account for our receiving guessed names such as "Jimmy Durante", and others too implicating to mention; but it was all in fun, and this contest kept our morale sky high for some time.

Mr. Leisenring is announcing the results of his membership contest in this issue. We hope we will have more of these events in the near future, as they create a lot of interest, add to the spirit of the membership, besides the end results of getting our fellow Dutch breeders to join us in our efforts in promoting our favorite rabbit.

Now that you know the situation is very bad, I am sure you will do what you can to make this show attractive, and help to protect our good name as supporters of our Club, and promoters of our Dutch. Send yours as soon as possible. And don't forget the Junior Dutch breeders. We will have to hustle to get 84 Dutch collected by Convention time, so don't put this off. Let us know what you can do, and we will publish the information in our Dutch Reporter.
